No advance preparation is necessary. Roles to be cast include the Pied Piper, Sara, the Mayor’s Kids, the Mayor’s Council, the Hamelin Administrative Team, Barbers, Cooks, Towns kids and the troublesome rats. Assistant Directors will be cast, as well as actors, to help with technical aspects. Cost to each participant to be in the production is \$30. However, **scholarships are available!**
