At the same time, we will have a **free clothing give-away** from the Cutter Clothing Closet.



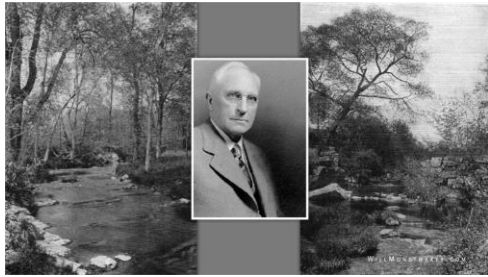
Another Low-Cost Event – hosted by Donivan Johnson
