They Play **WE** Pay What Village of Summit Residents NEED to Know about the Stadium Proposal

The PROFIT DRIVEN group Diamond Entertainment has proposed to build a 3000 seat outdoor baseball stadium/ concert/ event venue on and abutting a wetland area north of the Village Hall in Summit. This is <u>NOT</u> a free community ballpark for residents/children's recreation. The proposal includes a 1200 parking lot, twice the size of the Fleet Farm parking lot so thousands can attend concerts, festivals, tournaments and as many events as possible.

What's the BIG DEAL? Why are Summit residents concerned?

Threat to groundwater:

- The proposed site is described as a 'water sensitive area' having "high groundwater contamination potential" from large amounts of storm water.
- Water usage for 3000+ attendees will be 11,000 12,000 gallons per usage day.
- A crumb rubber turf field is proposed. Legislation is pending in multiple states and municipalities to ban this field application due to links to toxic effects on water and athletes.

Traffic:

- Traffic will increase on rural roads with entrances on Delafield and Dousman, likely impact to Willow Glen, Valley Rd, Sawyer Rd, HWY 67 and others.
- Most of these rural roads are one lane each way and have no shoulder for walkers and bikers.

Financial Implications/ Taxpayer Load:

- Increased tax revenue **will not** offset the increased needs of road repair, infrastructure (round about, traffic lights and streetlights) police, fire, and EMT services.
- Should this business and *hard to repurpose structure* fail taxpayers will be left without revenue and a potential nuisance property. This is not an easy to convert building.

Noise and Light Intrusion:

- 80 ft stadium light towers for the ball field, with additional light from the jumbo Tron, concessions, and parking lights will light up the area until at least 11:00 pm during each night use.
- Complaints have been voiced about noise from residents living as far as 2 miles away from other ballfields from events including concerts, games, and festivals.
- The Village of Summit currently has no sound or light ordinance to protect residents.

Master Plan 2020 Alignment:

• This project *significantly deviates* from the Master Plan 2020 and the Village of Summit Incorporation Papers and Village ordinances.
