



# DATA BOOK

## (D.O.P.E. BOOK)

***Data On Previous Engagement (D.O.P.E.)*** is a tool and/or resource for engaging targets accurately and efficiently. You should have a data book for every gun that you shoot at long range and in some cases other guns also. This book will give you a reference to look back upon when engaging targets in similar environments that you have previously shot. Data that should be recorded in this book is as follows.

1. Date
2. Time
3. Location
4. Elevation
5. Temperature
6. Barometric Pressure
7. Humidity
8. Wind (speed and direction)
9. Light (sunny, cloudy, etc.)
10. Round Count (barrel life, cleaning)
11. Cold/Clean Bore Shots
12. Shot Groups, Hits, and Misses
