A NURTURING MOTHERS MENTOR:

- 1. Works with mothers to manage breastfeeding challenges.
- 2. Facilitates gatherings where mothers can come together to discuss mothering, breastfeeding and nurturing. These may be informal or include a topic related to NMBAA core values.
- 3. Facilitates antenatal preparation either individually or in a structured class.
- 4. Refers mothers for ongoing assistance if needed using relevant resources.
- 5. Supports other mentors in their role, ensuring each mentor has the resources and support to mentor other mothers.
- 6. Works within the framework of the guiding documents and ethical principles.
- 7. Uses positive language as described in the language guide when talking to mothers in her mentor role.
