

ARCC Meeting Report

CRWC members attending the April meeting of the Alexandria Republican City Committee (ARCC) were part of two important events:

- Discussions regarding the City of Alexandria's proposed changes to Seminary Road.
- Michael Clinkscale's official announcement to the local GOP that he is running for the Virginia House of Delegates, Dist. 45.

Those present were unified in opposition to any move by the city to reduce the number of driving lanes on Seminary Road, for a variety of reasons. ARCC/CRWC members and guests show their support for keeping Seminary Road's four lanes for car traffic.

Clinkscale's announcement was well-received, and he is so far the only GOP candidate announced for any race in Alexandria's Fall 2019 elections. District 45 encompasses parts of Arlington, Alexandria, and Fairfax counties. Those present were unified in opposition to any move by the city to reduce the number of driving lanes on Seminary Road, for a variety of reasons.

Report from March Meeting by Linda App, VP Program Learning About Social Media at Our March Meeting

The CRWC dinner meeting at Glory Days Grille in March featured guest speaker Dena Espenscheid, a grassroots activist. Her presentation discussed the opportunities and pitfalls of social media, and showed CRWC members how to use Twitter to help our political candidates.

Michael Clinkscale, recent GOP candidate for Alexandria City Council, attended the meeting and said he has filed as a candidate for the Virginia House of Delegates. His campaign centers around personal liberty, responsibility, and empowerment. He also supports school choice and reduced taxes. Former Vice Mayor Bill Cleveland gave an impassioned endorsement of Michael Clinkscale while criticizing Virginia's top Democrat elected officials for recent racial scandals.




