# At the January Meeting



At the January CRWC meeting, members signed a letter to the five Alexandria representatives (all Democrats) in the General Assembly urging them to support election integrity and oppose bills that facilitate voter fraud, such as those that would eliminate voter photo ID requirements

More than 1,450 measures survived and now "cross over" to the other chamber for consideration before the legislature's scheduled adjournment on March 7. In the State Senate, Republicans may have given up control, but so far, their bill-passage rate hasn't taken a hit.

## **Republican Election Officers Needed to Ensure Voting Integrity**

Judicial Watch has identified Virginia as one of 38 states with more registered voter than citizens of voting age (CVAs) in its 2019 Election Integrity Project. Almost 90,000 registrations fit that category Virginia-wide. In Alexandria, over 6,000 registrations fit that description. Scary, right? So we must all work to ensure election integrity. Being an Election Officer is one of eight key steps to stop voter fraud, according to Judicial Watch. Our local Republican party is trying to recruit more poll workers for Election Day because most of the poll workers in Alexandria are Democrats. We need to be represented to ensure fairness. Please consider being one of those patriots willing to work up an entire day (about 5 am to 9 pm) to prevent voter fraud and ensure fair elections. Some CRWC members are Election Officers (Kimberly Pinter for one), and can let you know what it's like.
