

Sir Knight Emery J. DeWitt

February 14, 1938 – December 20, 2019

Grand Commander
Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Kentucky
2002-2003

Sir Knight Emery was raised a Master Mason in 1972 and affiliated with Bigham Lodge No. 256 in 1976, where he served as Master in 1992, and with Shady Grove Lodge No. 559 in 1990, serving there as Master in 1995. He also served Bingham as Master in 2010 and 2011, and Shady Grove as Chaplain from 2009-2012.

He became a member of the Princeton York Rite bodies early in his Masonic career, serving as Illustrious Master of Princeton Council 43 in 1995, High Priest of Clay Chapter No. 28 in 1996, and Commander of Princeton Commandery No. 35. He was elected to the Grand Commandery line in 1999, advancing to the office of Grand Commander in September, 2002. He was also a member of Shady Grove No. 505, Order of Eastern Star, the Scottish Rite, and the Shrine.

He leaves his wife of 62 years, Barbara (Martin) DeWitt; two daughters, Lucinda (Cindy) Hagan (Ron) of Lone Oak, Kentucky, and Kelly DeWitt of Huntsville, Alabama; a brother, John DeWitt of Pensacola, Florida; sisters Rose Colussi, of East Washington, Pennsylvania, and Mary Evans, of Henderson Ky; 6 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, Henry and Mabel (Knuth) DeWitt, brother, Arden DeWitt, and infant daughter Cynthia DeWitt.

Born and raised in Rib Lake, Wisconsin, Sir Knight Emery moved to Crittenden County in 1955. After graduating from Crittenden County High School in 1956, he joined the Army, traveling the world with his family until his retirement in 1979. Upon his retirement, he attended Murray State University where he earned Bachelors of Science (1980) and Arts (1981) and Masters of Science (1982). He served as an inspector for the Crittenden County Health Department, and later as a radiation health inspector for the state of Kentucky. He was active in the local community, serving on the board of directors for Habitat for Humanity and the local library. He was a teacher, a story-teller, a clown, and a friend to all who knew him.

Services were held at 6:00 pm Thursday December 26, 2019 with Masonic Rites preceding at 5:30 pm. at Gilbert Funeral Home. Burial was Monday December 30, 2019 at Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West in Hopkinsville KY.







Richard T. Nation

August 25, 1958 - December 27, 2019 Most Worshipful Grand Master Grand Lodge of Kentucky 2013-2014

Brother Nation was raised to the sublime Degree of a Master Mason on February 2, 1980, in Shelby Lodge 662 in Waddy, KY. He served as Master of Shelby Lodge in 1983-1984 became Secretary in 1996. He served the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F. & A. M. as District Deputy Grand Master of District 19 in 2003-2004, as Chairman of the By Laws Committee in 2005-2006, as Grand Senior Deacon in 2007-2008, and as Chairman of the Keepers of the Work and Bluegrass Ritualist Committees in 2009-2010. He also served on the Ad Hoc Committee on Ritual 2007-2010. He was elected Grand Junior Warden on October 19, 2010, Grand Senior Warden on October 18, 2011, Deputy Grand Master on October 16, 2012, and was installed as Grand Master on October 22, 2013.

He joined the Shelbyville York Bodies in March 1980 and that same month became a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Valley of Lexington, and of Oleika Temple, A. A. O. N. M. S. He was honored with the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) on November 16, 2013. He was inducted into the Royal Order of Scotland on September 10, 2011. He and Karen joined Rob Morris Chapter 114, O. E. S., on August 20, 2009.

He is survived by his wife of 43 years, Karen Susan Weis. He is the father of Brian Thomas (Stacy Rae), Richard Boscoe, and Quinton Ray Nation. He is the grandfather of Sophia Faith Nation, Lilyanne Grace Wieble, Aiden Thomas Manning, Ella Faye Nation, and Kara Raye Nation. He is the son of Mrs. Yvonne D. Nation and the late Ray Wilson Nation.

Rick owned and operated Nationwide Heating & Cooling for 35 years and helped his mother with Nation Used Cars. Before that, he was a part of the Nations Meat Shop. Rick was a member of Elk Creek Baptist Church in Taylorsville, KY. Rick was a pillar of the community and always was willing to help a brother in need. He and Karen enjoyed traveling and they made friends throughout the United States and Europe. Rick would always make sure to have supper ready when Karen got off work, and enjoyed grilling and cooking for her every night. Most of all, he loved spending time with his grandchildren.

All services were held at Shelby Christian Church in Shelbyville, KY. Visitation was Thursday, January 2nd with a Masonic Funeral at 7:00 p.m. Funeral services were Friday, January 3rd at 2:00 p.m.

THE MORE YOU KNOW

Dr. Mackey's 'Encyclopedia of Freemasonry' again provides us with our Educational segment this month. The following article also gives some additional insight into the discoveries of the Royal Arch Degree. - Editor

Book of the Law. The Holy Bible, which is always open in a Lodge as a symbol that its light should be diffused among the brethren. The passages on which it is opened differ in the different degrees.



Masonically, the Book of the Law is that sacred book which is believed by the Mason of any particular religion to contain the revealed will of God; although, technically, among the Jews the Torah, or Book of the Law, means

only the Pentateuch or five books of Moses. Thus, to the Christian Mason the Book of the Law is the Old and New Testaments; to the Jew, the Old Testament; to the Mussulman, the Koran; to the Brahman, the Vedas; and to the Parsee, the Zendavesta.

The Book of the Law is an important symbol in the Royal Arch degree, concerning which there was a tradition among the Jews that the Book of the Law was lost during the captivity, and that it was among the treasures discovered during the building of the second Temple. The same opinion was entertained by the early Christian fathers, such, for instance, as Irenaeus, Tertullian, and Clemens Alexandrinus; "for," says Prideaux, "they (the Christian fathers) hold that all the Scriptures were lost and destroyed in the Babylonish captivity, and that Ezra restored them all again by Divine revelation." The truth of the tradition is very generally denied by biblical scholars, who attribute its origin to the fact that Ezra collected together the copies of the law, expurgated them of the errors which had crept into them during the captivity, and arranged a new and correct edition. But the truth or falsity of the legend does not affect the Masonic symbolism.

The Book of the Law is the will of God, which, lost to us in our darkness, must be recovered as precedent to our learning what is TRUTH. As captives to error, truth is lost to us; when freedom is restored, the first reward will be its discovery.
