#### Grand Commander's Message



Companions and Sir Knights,

Often experiences are presented to us by happenstance or just plain old luck. Having just returned from the Easter Sunrise Service in Crystal City Virginia, I can tell you about one of those experiences.

Now for those who haven't ever made the trip, first let me encourage you to plan now for next year. Yes, I understand it is during Easter, and many have young children that would make the trip difficult to say the least. However, many more could find the time for this wonderful opportunity. Now during this trip, several experiences were presented to me. First is the relationship you develop with those who make the trip with you. Most often this is a good experience, but at times it can be frustrating. When twenty or so people are confined together for three days, it can present challenges to say the least. I think the bus is too cold, others think it is too hot. For some the music is to loud, but for me, and my hearing difficulty, it isn't loud enough. I don't want to visit this memorial, or eat at this particular place, but others look forward to it. And so it goes.

We often forget that all need to be accommodated. We all need to understand that everyone has different wants or needs and someone has to make the decision for all.

But then there are those positive experiences that make everything worthwhile. This year we visited Gettysburg. For me, this was a moving and sobering experience. And if you haven't made the trip there, you need to do so. Standing on Little Round Top and imaging the Army of Northern Virginia, General Lee's name for his army, trying to get up over those rocks, while being fired down upon was eye opening. And standing on the Confederate side of the open field where Pickett's Charge took place was moving. To listen to our guide describe the battle and the events leading up to it gave me chills. The fortuitous wind to clear the field of smoke to allow the Union soldiers to see and fire upon the charging Confederate troops. Colonel Warren spotting the Confederates amassing towards Little Round Top and re-positioning Union Troops there with just minutes to spare.

Then there was the Sunrise Service itself. With Commanderies from all over the East coast marching up Shooters Hill. The banners, the plumes the sight of hundreds of Sir Knights in uniform coming together for the celebration of Christ's fulfilled promise.

And while the trip and the battle may have been luck or happenstance, the Service, noting Christ's return from the dead was planned. There was no luck involved. Everything happened as foretold and promised. And because of that promise we, as Christians, have a new pathway to his Heavenly Grace.

And just as the early Christians did not know what was to come, we do not fully know what lies ahead on this pathway. But because of the promise we move on with faith and hope.

Make plans now for the opportunity to experience the events of next year. To visit the memorials of our nation's capital and to experience the moving sight of the Easter Sunrise Service. To observe the lucky opportunities and to witness the promise of Christ, with your fellow Sir Knights.

We are running this again this month as a reminder. Some of these awards require a signed and sealed nomination on vote of the body, but there is still time to get the process started. We have numerous highly qualified members who are deserving of these awards; dedicated men who have devoted years and effort and sweat to keeping our fraternity alive and proficient. Some of them have been nominated and not selected and not nominated again. Some have never been nominated. Please, get these men some recognition. Nominate them; then nominate them again if necessary. We can only recognize one per year, so if your man doesn't get selected this year, nominate him again next year. All nominations must be in to the Grand Secretary/Recorder by June 30, to ensure time for the committees to evaluate and report and the awards to be obtained before Grand Sessions. Contact the Grand Recorder's office or one of the presiding Grand Officers for questions or assistance.

#### **GRAND CHAPTER**

General Grand Chapter Medal for Meritorious Service in Bronze



This award may be presented each year in recognition of the recipient's outstanding and meritorious service to Royal Arch Masonry. The recipient cannot be a Past Grand High Priest or elected Grand Chapter Officer.

## **GRAND COUNCIL**

#### Cryptic Mason of the Year Award

The award shall be made only for exceptional and meritorious service to Cryptic Masonry above and beyond the call of duty. No Past or Present Grand Master, or elective Grand Council officer, is eligible.



#### **General Grand Council Youth Award**

Presented annually in each Jurisdiction affiliated with General Grand Council to a nominee who is a leader in one of the youth organizations recognized by the General Grand Council. (DeMolay, Rainbow, Job's Daughters)

## **GRAND COMMANDERY**



#### **Conrad H. Cates Distinguished Service Award**

This award is given for service to the Grand Commandery of Kentucky that is above and beyond the call of duty; in recognition of service over a long and sustained period of time, in recognition of total service and dedication to this Grand Commandery.



#### **Knight Templar Cross of Honor**

Given for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order, far beyond the call of duty, and beyond the service usually expected of an officer or member. No present or past elected Grand Commandery Officer is eligible for the award.






The following is the third and final installment of the GENERAL REGULATIONS from Anderson's Constitution. The Constitutions of the Free-Masons was the first masonic book published in America. - Editor

GENERAL REGULATIONS, Compiled first by Mr. GEORGE PAYNE, Anno 1720, when he was GRAND-MASTER, and approv'd by the GRAND-LODGE on St. John Baptist's Day, Anno 1721; at Stationer's-Hall, LONDON;



History, Charges, Regulations, &c. of that most Ancient and Right Worshipful FRATERNITY.



LONDON Printed; Anno 5723. Re-printed in Philadelphia by fpecial Order, for the Ufe of the Brethren in NORTH-AMERICA. In the Year of Masonry 5734, Anno Domini 1734.

when the most noble PRINCE John Duke of MONTAGU was unanimously chosen our GRAND-MASTER for the Year ensuing; who chose JOHN BEAL, M.D., his Deputy Grand-Master; and Mr. Josiah Villeneau & Mr. Tho. Morris, jun. were chosen by the Lodge GRAND-WARDENS. And now, by the Command of our said Right Worshipful GRAND-MASTER MONTAGU, the Author of this Book has compar'd them with, and reduc'd them to the ancient Records and immemorial Usage, of the Fraternity, and digested them into this new Method, with several proper Explications, for the Use of the Lodges in and about London and Westminster.

XXVII. The Grand-Wardens, or the Stewards, shall appoint before-hand such a Number of Brethren to serve at Table as they think fit and proper for that Work; and they may advise with the Masters and Wardens of Lodges about the most proper Persons, if they please, or may take in such by their Recommendation; for none are to serve that Day; but free and accepted Masons, that the Communication may be free and harmonious.

XXVIII. All the Members of the Grand-Lodge must be at the Place long before Dinner, with the Grand-Master, or his Deputy at their Head, who shall retire, and form them-selves. And this is done in order,

1. To receive any Appeals duly lodg'd, as above

regulated, that the Appellant may be heard, and the Affair may be amicably decided before Dinner, if possible; but if it cannot, it must be delay'd till after the new Grand-Master is elected; and if it cannot be decided after Dinner, it may be delay'd, and referr'd to a particular Committee, that shall quietly adjust it, and make Report to the next Quarterly Communication, that Brotherly-Love may be preserv'd.

2. To prevent any Difference or Disgust which may be fear'd to arise that Day; that no Interruption may be given to the Harmony and Pleasure of the GRAND FEAST.

3. To consult about whatever concerns the Decency and Decorum of the Grand-Assembly, and to prevent all Indecency and ill Manners, the Assembly being promiscuous.

4. To receive and consider of any good Motion or any momentous and important Affair, that shall be brought from the particular Lodges, by their Representatives, the several Masters and Wardens.

XXIX. After these things are discuss'd, the GRAND-MASTER and his Deputy, the Grand-Wardens, or the Stewards, the Secretary, the Treasurer, the Clerks, and every other Person, shall withdraw, and leave the Masters and Wardens of the particular Lodges alone, in order to consult amicably about electing a NEW GRAND-MASTER, or continuing the present, if they have not done it the Day before ; and if they are unanimous for continuing the present Grand-Master, his Worship shall be call'd in, and humbly desir'd to do the Fraternity the Honour of ruling them for the Year ensuing: And after Dinner it will be known whether he accepts of it or not; For it should not be discover'd but by the Election itself.

XXX. Then the Master and Wardens, and all the Brethren, may converse promiscuously, or as they please to sort together, until the Dinner is coming in, when every Brother takes his Seat at Table.

XXXI. Some time after Dinner the GRAND-LODGE is form'd, not in Retirement, but in the Presence of all the Brethren, who yet are not Members of it, and must not therefore speak until they are desired and allow'd.

XXXII. If the GRAND-MASTER of last Year has consented with the Masters and Wardens in private, before Dinner, to continue for the Year ensuing; then one of the Grand-Lodge, deputed for that purpose, shall represent to all the Brethren his Worship's good Government, &c. And turning to him, shall, in the name of the Grand Lodge, humbly request him to do the FRATERNITY the great Honour (if nobly born, if not, the great Kindness) of continuing to be their Grand Master for the Year ensuing. And his Worship declaring his Consent by a Bow or a Speech, as he pleases, the said deputed Member of the Grand-Lodge shall proclaim him GRAND-MASTER, and all the Members of the Lodge shall salute him in due Form. And all the Brethren shall for a few Minutes have leave to declare their Satisfaction, Pleasure and Congratulation.

XXXIII. But if either the Master and Wardens have not in private, this Day before Dinner, nor the Day before, desir'd the last Grand-Master to continue in the Master-ship another Year; or if he, when desir'd, has not consented:

Then,

The last Grand-Master shall nominate his Successor for the Year ensuing, who if unanimously approv'd by the Grand-Lodge, and if there present, shall be proclaim'd, saluted, and congratulated the New Grand Master as above hinted, and immediately install'd by the last Grand-Master, according to Usage.

XXXIV. But if that Nomination is not unanimously approv'd, the new Grand-Master shall be chosen immediately by Ballot, every Master and Warden writing his Man's Name, and the last Grand-Master writing his Man's Name too; and the Man, whose Name the last Grand Master shall first take out, casually or by chance, shall be GRAND-MASTER for the Year ensuing; and if present, he shall be proclaimed, saluted, and congratulated, as above hinted, and forthwith install'd by the last Grand-Master according to Usage.

XXXV. The last Grand-Master thus continued, or the new Grand-Master thus install'd, shall next nominate and appoint his Deputy Grand-Master, either the last or a new one, who shall be also declar'd, saluted and congratulated, as above hinted. The GRAND-MASTER shall also nominate the new GRAND-WARDENS, and if unanimously approv'd by the Grand-Lodge, shall be declar'd, saluted, and congratulated as above hinted ; but if not, they shall be chosen by Ballot, in the same way as the Grand-Master: As the Wardens of private Lodges are also to be chosen by Ballot in each Lodge, if the Members thereof do not agree to their Master's Nomination.

XXXVI. But if the BROTHER, whom the present Grand-Master shall nominate for his Successor, or whom the Majority of the Grand-Lodge shall happen to chuse by Ballot, is, by Sickness or other necessary Occasion, absent from the Grand-Feast, he cannot be proclaim'd the NEW GRAND-MASTER, unless the old Grand-Master, or some of the Masters and Wardens of the GRAND-LODGE can vouch, upon the Honour of a Brother, that the said Person, so nominated or chosen, will readily accept of the said Office ; in which case the old GRAND-MASTER shall act as Proxy, and shall nominate the Deputy and Wardens in his Name, and in his Name also receive the usual Honours, Homage, and Congratulation.

XXXVII. Then the GRAND-MASTER shall allow any Brother, Fellow-Craft, or Apprentice to speak, directing his Discourse to his Worship; or to make any Motion for the good of the Fraternity, which shall be either immediately consider'd and finish'd, or else referr'd to the Consideration of the GRAND-LODGE at their next Communication, stated or occasional. When that is over,

XXXVIII. The GRAND-MASTER or his Deputy, or some Brother appointed by him, shall harangue all the Brethren, and give them good Advice: And lastly, after some other Transactions, that cannot be written in any Language, the Brethren may go away or stay longer, as they please.

XXXIX. Every Annual GRAND-LODGE has an inherent Power and Authority to make new Regulations, or to alter these, for the real Benefit of this ancient Fraternity: Provided always that the old LANDMARKS be carefully preserv'd, and that such Alterations and new Regulations be proposed and agreed to at the third Quarterly Communication preceding the Annual Grand Feast; and that they be offered also to the Perusal of all the Brethren before Dinner, in writing, even of the youngest Apprentice; the Approbation and Consent of the Majority of all the Brethren present being absolutely necessary to make the same binding and obligatory ; which must, after Dinner, and after the new GRAND-MASTER is install'd, be solemnly desir'd ; as it was desir'd and obtain'd for these REGULATIONS, when propos'd by the GRAND-LODGE, to about 150 Brethren, on St. John Baptist's Day, 1721.
