Also, Pastor Hugh was thinking about having six weeks on then two weeks off – which will give us two complete cycles ending just before Christmas.

By request, we will be studying women in the Bible for our first six weeks, like Eve, Rachel and Leah, Miriam, Deborah, Lady Wisdom (Proverbs), Esther and others. We can pick and choose at the "preview" sessions. Join us!

GALENA NEWS

For August, the congregation gathered a **Shower of Blessings** by collecting many needed supplies for the **Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands** in town. The Home has residents, adjusting as required to the protocols necessary for all to thrive and be safe. The donations were picked up on Wednesday, September 2nd. \$460 was received along with food, books, cleaning items and much more from the requested items. Thanks to all for their generosity.

Jane Davis, David Manley and Pastor Hugh have been working on proposals to give to the Session on technology upgrades so that we can be effective with the needs we have in ordinary times and these uncertain times. ANCHOR OF HOPE NEWS

For the next few weeks, we will be working on preparing health and hygiene kits / bags to be given to the **Women's Resource Center**. We will have a list of necessary items for you soon. The bags of donations will be received <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 27th</u>. Check with Anne Hager for more details on how you can help.

We will also be working with a local vendor to buy supplies in bulk to be given to the **Head Start** program on Apache Road in Fort Chiswell, which serves a very vulnerable population throughout our area. The needs are great and those in need are many.

We have also signed up several youth to read scripture on Sunday mornings. Enjoy!

EXTERNAL WIFI

Both churches have or are considering installing **external wifi** outside the facilities. Internet access would be available inside, to the congregation while additional and separate hardware would broadcast broadband to the outside. Details are still being worked out. AOH is having Citizens – Floyd install on Thursday the 10th; Galena is receiving the technology report this month of September and it includes the same design.

Here is the **value** – with so many children and youth going to school on-line, having access consistently with a wifi signal may be difficult. We would then be providing a legitimate and safe "hot spot" for them to use in their studies.

LET'S GET BETTER ACQUAINTED!

As part of the transition process, Pastor Hugh would like to meet with people, hear their stories, answer any questions you have, get acquainted as best we can. Here are the options for meeting: while it is still warm, meeting outside like on the porch; or in an well-ventilated 'three season-like room;' at the church; or on-line via Zoom. If in person, we will have to limit our time to 45 minutes (so the guidelines for safe interaction recommend).

We will also be asking ourselves three important questions (and Pastor Hugh will be writing down your thoughts): *Who are we as a church? What is God calling us to be and do? Who is our neighbor?* Those are good questions for any of us to ask about our faith; our pondering them right now is good in our transitional days; they set the stage for the next steps when more normal times return and we can discuss them in larger groups.
