Coast Guardsman recalls Pearl Harbor on 80th anniversary

Stanley Maltzman, of Greenville, remembers being in the kitchen of his parents' New York City home painting when news of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor came over the radio.

At 7:55 a.m. on Sunday, Dec. 7, 1941, the Japanese launched 353 aircraft from four aircraft carriers with bombs targeted for American ships, aircraft and military bases on the Hawaiian island of Oahu. In addition, 61 ships of the Japanese fleet supported the surprise attack.

"My mother came out of the kitchen crying because she figured I was going to go," Maltzman said.

Like many other young men around the nation, Maltzman did indeed want to enlist. He chose the United States Coast Guard because there was a neighbor who was in that service.

"He used to come home every other weekend, and he would tell us these stories," Maltzman said. "As a kid, we would eat them up."

On Dec. 8, Maltzman went to the Coast Guard recruiter to sign up. When he did not hear anything after two weeks, he went back.

Meanwhile, Oahu's civilian and military population was reeling from the devastating attack that killed 2,403 U.S. personnel, including 68 civilians, and wounded 1,178 others. The bombing destroyed or damaged 19 vessels, including eight battleships. Fortunately for the Americans, the Navy's aircraft carriers assigned to the U.S. Pacific Fleet were out at sea on maneuvers.

When the Coast Guard called Maltzman up for service in March 1942, he packed a bag and said goodbye to his parents.

"My father took me down to the trolley car and took me down to Third Avenue somewhere, and then I took the subway downtown," he said.

Following boot camp at Manhattan Beach, the Coast Guard assigned Maltzman to Hoffman Island Signal School,



where he learned visual communications, including blinker lights and signal flags. He did that job in Groton, Connecticut, signaling submarines as they returned to base, and he petitioned the Coast Guard to assign him to sea duty.

It took six requests before Maltzman was assigned to the original crew of the USS Cen-

taurus (AKA-17), an Andromeda Class attack cargo ship commissioned on Oct. 21, 1943, at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. An original crewmember of any vessel is called a "plank owner."

After the ship's commanding officer, Captain George Evans McCabe, trained his brand-new crew, the ship made its way south to the Panama

Canal. The journey to the Asiatic-Pacific Theater had its difficult moments.

"We had a pilot that came aboard to direct us," Maltzman said. "He almost ran us aground crossing the equator. The captain threw him away and took over."

"We got into the Pacific Ocean," Maltzman said. "We didn't know what we were doing and where we

were going yet. We had a hell of an ocean ride."

Centaurus made its way to Pearl Harbor where the military was still repairing the damage to its ships and aircraft.

"It was kind of a thrill to be at Pearl Harbor and see all the ships," Maltzman told interviewers from the Veterans Oral History Project. "They were still getting mud and stuff out

of the battle wagons [battleships], the few that they raised, and smoke was coming out and oil was coming up from below the Arizona. It was kind of sad in a way, but yet it showed a determination the way that people were attacking rebuilding the

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Main Street gets boost from new brewery

RAVENA — A full house turned out Friday for the grand opening of Rail to River Brewing.

It was wall-to-wall customers as the village's newest business opened its doors, the latest in the local Main Street revitalization effort.

Steven and Tracy Douglas are local residents who have been working for years to renovate a long-empty building at 109 Main St. to house their nanobrewery.

A nanobrewery is the smallest form of brewery — smaller than a

microbrewery — and is becoming an increasingly popular option for brewery owners, according to americancraftbeer.com.

Friday's grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony had dozens of customers packed into the new business, with more lining up outside to get a taste of the Douglas' new brews.

"We have been working on this for three years, from inception to opening night," Steven Douglas said after cutting a red ribbon in front of the storefront. "It is frightening and satisfying at the same time."

Local officials helped launch the new business at its grand opening. Mayor Bill Misuraca welcomed the crowd, which filled

the inside of the building to capacity and then spilled outside for the ribbon cutting ceremony, and thanked them for support-

ing a new local business.

"The village, our trustees, are beyond ecstatic to have you invest here and to take this chance," Misuraca told Douglas. "I know you are going to have the best success — seeing this outpouring of support on opening night is wonderful. Just keep it rolling."

The nanobrewery will offer a range of beers and other alcoholic beverages.

"We have a number of English-style ales and American ales, and we also have local hard cider and local sangria," Steven Douglas said. "I make my own brews —

it's called Rail to River — and it's stouts and IPAs and blondes, a number of different styles."

IPAs are India Pale Ales, which get their flavor largely from hops and herbal, citrus or fruity flavors.

The brewery will not serve food, and Douglas encourages customers to bring their own, particularly from nearby eateries.

"We have Trackside restaurant behind us and occasional food trucks. People can bring in anything from peanut butter

ships. It was a wonderful sight.”

Of the eight battleships anchored at Pearl Harbor on the morning of the attack, the Navy was able to repair six, while two, the USS Arizona (BB-39) and USS Oklahoma (BB-37) were damaged beyond repair. The battleships were Japan’s main targets.

The USS Centaurus did not remain long at Pearl Harbor. From Hawaii, it sailed west to take part in the invasion of Kwajalein in the Marshall Islands at the end of January 1944. Maltzman, then a Signalman 1/C, with a crew of six others, would take a position on the ship’s flying bridge near the smokestack using signal flags and blinking lights to communicate with other ships.

“It was the highest part of the ship,” Maltzman said. “It was kind of nice to be up so high.”

As an attack cargo ship, Centaurus had 12 landing barges aboard. As the U.S. Pacific Fleet made its way from island to island, capturing them from the Japanese, Centaurus’ crew loaded soldiers and Marines, along with equipment and supplies, into its landing barges and delivered them to the islands, including the Admiralty Islands, Guam, New Guinea, Peleliu, and Okinawa Gunto, among others.

“We would land in the nearby vicinity of the island and lower the landing barges,” he said. “Then the marines or soldiers would climb overboard on rope and go down and aboard the landing barge.”

Three or four of Centaurus’ crew members would then deliver them to the island.

In total, Centaurus participated in six campaigns and received six battle stars for its World War II service.

“I was lucky my ship never got hit,” Maltzman said.

Maltzman has a keen memory of the Battle of Okinawa, which took place from April 1 to June 14, 1945.

“All the guys went ashore and everything, and it was very quiet because the Japanese had gone up over the mountain, away from the beach,” he said. “They had quite a fight. We were on duty 24 hours to watch for invasions, the battles of the planes coming in to get us. That’s when we shot down two Japanese kamikaze planes.”

When all was quiet, Maltzman’s shipmates put him in the bosun’s chair and lowered him over the side of the ship to document the events.

“It was quite a thrill. They all knew I was an artist or trying to be an artist, so they got me to paint the Jap flags on the side of the ship,” he said.

Maltzman carried his sketch book and pencils with him during his service.

“I wanted to be an artist, and I was drawing things — invasions and so forth,” Maltzman said.


At some point during its wartime service, the crew nicknamed the ship “Centaurus-Maru.”

“All the Japanese ships were called something ‘maru,’” Maltzman said.

Japanese sailors often attached the suffix “-maru,” which signifies

“something beloved,” to its vessels.

When Centaurus took over a hundred Japanese prisoners of war aboard to transport them back to Pearl Harbor, Maltzman got permission to sketch one of the prisoners.

“He signed my sketchbook,” Maltzman said. “He liked it, except that I made the eyes a little too

slanty.”

He remembers that the prisoners liked being aboard the Centaurus. “They were very happy with us, the Japanese,” Maltzman said. “We would allow them to come topside, on the main deck upstairs. They bathed every day. They washed with ocean water. It was nice in a way.”

Maltzman left Centau-

rus when it arrived back at Pearl Harbor after the U.S. victory in Okinawa, but he wishes he could have remained on board. The ship continued to Japan for occupation duty and then went on to serve in China.

“I would have been tickled pink to go to China and draw pictures,” he said. “I’m sorry I missed it.”

Through ship reunions, Maltzman kept in touch with shipmates and got to know those he did not know well during his time in the Coast Guard.

The American Legion Post 291 will be holding a Pearl Harbor Remembrance Ceremony at 6 p.m. on Dec. 7 at its building at 54 Maple Ave., Greenville. The public is invited to attend.

RAVENA — The annual Ravena Turkey Bowl has become a rite of passage for RCS alumni.

The game is not for the faint of heart.



Second man charged with robbery, unlawful imprisonment

COEYMANS — A second man has been arrested and charged with robbery and unlawful imprisonment in connection with an alleged incident Nov. 16 in Coeymans, according to Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple.

Paul Farley, 50, of Waterford, was arrested Nov. 23 by the Albany County Sheriff's Office and faces multiple charges stemming from the alleged robbery.

"Farley is accused of assaulting the victim with a weapon causing physical injuries, forcibly stealing property from the victim, while unlawfully preventing the victim from leaving the residence," according to a statement from Apple's office.

Sheriff's deputies learned of the incident after a nurse at St. Peter's Hospital in Albany alerted officers to the alleged victim's injuries, according to the statement.

A Ravena man, Brian Bagley, 55, was arrested in connection with the same alleged incident on Nov. 17.

Farley was arrested

by officers out of the sheriff's substation in Coeymans.

Farley is charged with two counts of second-degree robbery, a class C felony; one count of second-degree assault, a class D felony; one count of first-degree unlawful imprisonment, a class E felony; one count of fourth-degree grand larceny, a class E felony; one count of petty larceny, a class A misdemeanor; one count of second-degree menacing, a class A misdemeanor; and one count of fourth-degree criminal possession of a weapon, a class A misdemeanor, according to the sheriff's office.

Farley was arraigned in Coeymans Town Court and was released on the supervision of probation.

Federal funding in place for past-due water, sewer bills

ALBANY — Low-income residents who owe back payments for their water and sewer bills may be eligible for federal funds aimed at avoiding service interruptions.

Gov. Kathy Hochul on Monday announced \$69.8 million in federal funding became available Dec. 1 to help low-income New Yorkers pay their drinking water and wastewater bills that are in arrears.

The program is administered by the state's Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance.

Dubbed the Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program, the funds will provide eligible individuals and families with up to \$2,500 for drinking water arrears and \$2,500 for wastewater arrears, Hochul said Monday.

The state's moratorium on service shutoffs, imposed during the COVID-19 pandemic, expires in late December and regulated utilities have agreed to hold off on service disconnections through the New Year's holiday.

But service shutoffs may resume after that.

"As New Yorkers make their comeback from the devastating effects of the pandemic, struggling

households should never be left wondering whether they will be able to afford critical utilities like water and sewer service," Hochul said. "Over the course of the pandemic, utility affordability has too often become a prohibitive obstacle to the financial stability of a household. This assistance will help ensure New Yorkers do not have to worry about losing these basic necessities as they fight to make ends meet."

The assistance program is aimed at low-income households, particularly those paying a high proportion of their income for water and sewer bills, Hochul said. The program is intended for households will service bills that are at least 20 days past due.

Payments will be made directly to the utility company.

Approximately 105,000 households are expected to be aided by the program statewide, Hochul said.

Eligibility for the program is determined by household income, size and the amount that is past due. To qualify, a household of four would need to have a gross monthly income of \$5,249 or less, according to the governor's office.

U.S. Rep. Paul Tonko, D-20, who represents

Coeymans and Ravena, welcomed the assistance program.

"Water affordability is a challenge for many New York families, which has only become exacerbated by the COVID-19 public health crisis," Tonko said. "Congress provided water utility assistance funding in recent COVID relief packages, and I will continue pushing for federal funding that ensures every American has access to safe, clean water."

Residents can submit applications online and by mail. Visit otda.ny.gov/lihwap for more information.

Individuals enrolled in the Home Energy Assistance Program or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or who receive Temporary Assistance or who live alone and receive Supplemental Security Income, are automatically eligible, but still need to apply for assistance, according to the governor's office.

According to state surveys, as many as 15% of households have past-due water bills in some parts of the state, owing an average of about \$250. Nationally, the average combined drinking water and sewer bill is \$1,200 a year, according to the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics.

and jelly sandwiches to prime rib — they can bring their own food," he said.

RCS Business Association Chairwoman Joy Iafallo said Main Street's newest business will mesh well with the community.

"I am thrilled for this. I feel like they did a lot of things that weave in nicely for what we want to see on Main Street," Iafallo said. "They are two great members of the community and they want to do everything they can for this area. They have invested time, money, blood, sweat and tears into the business so I think they are a perfect fit."

The brewery may also benefit other local businesses, she said.

"I think the taproom is a perfect fit because it can draw on other amenities in the community because they don't serve food, so

they will be drawing on other restaurants, which I think is very cool," Iafallo said.

Rail to River Brewery is located at 109 Main St., a half block from the railroad tracks. The building has been vacant for many years.

"I remember a store here when I was a kid — it was some kind of thrift store or an antique store," Iafallo said. "It has proba-

bly been at least 20 years since there has been a business in this building."

Douglas said getting the business up and running has been quite a journey, and a gratifying one.

"We are opening a nice new business here on Main Street," he said. "We are a veteran-owned business, we are here for the community and this is to help revitalize Main Street."

The Princess has no trouble ordering and loves lingering over her choice and chatting with her friends for hours, so I guess it is a good thing.

Coffee has come a long way since I first became aware of it. My mother and father always started the day with a cup. Becoming a coffee drinker was a rite of passage — when your parents

2021 Garden, Part 2

GARDENING TIPS

I returned to the Sunshine State recently, just before an early snowstorm deposited an inch of the white stuff on my driveway in Conesville.

I was not at all unhappy to have missed that first dusting. I had just put a 3-inch layer of straw on my asparagus, carrots and beets, hoping they will overwinter for an early harvest next April. The wet snow will hopefully hold the straw in place.

I also mixed a full bale of peat moss with the soil in one of my raised beds and added about 20 pounds of rabbit manure on top, for good measure. All vegetable gardens will benefit by the addition of organic matter such as peat moss or compost. Tilling a 3- to 4-inch layer into the topsoil each fall is perhaps the most important step you can take to maintain or improve your garden soil.

The 1,438-mile drive to Bradenton, Florida, was mostly uneventful, but a bit more expensive than last year, with gas prices ranging from \$3.59 in New York to just about \$3 in South Carolina and Georgia. Florida is about \$3.20 right now. That works out to about 40 gallons for my thrifty Subaru, costing me about \$130 for the drive.

The fall foliage in the mountains of Virginia and North Carolina was at its peak, making the drive more enjoyable. It is cool here, by Florida standards, with morning temperatures in the low 50s, but 70's in the afternoon.

I brought down some of the onions that I grew from transplants, set in the ground on May 21. I prefer growing transplants to onion "sets" since they seem to perform much better for me. Most seasons the onion tops start to topple over by early August, signaling harvest time, but this

year some of them continued to grow right up until November.

These "Sweet Sandwich" onions grew very well for me, as usual. Some of the bulbs weighed a half pound!

I also stuck a half dozen scallions, purchased at the supermarket, into my window box in mid-May. I harvested fresh scallions all season long from these six plants, since cutting the tops back just allowed them to grow new tops.

I also planted Yukon Gold and Norland potatoes on May 21 and they also grew very well. By August, I noticed that critters had made tunnels in many of my raised beds, including the potato bed.

I saw chipmunks and moles going in and out of the holes, but I did not give them much thought. Moles are carnivores, eating worms and grubs and not plant roots. Chipmunks will eat almost anything and everything in the garden, including insects, but they are generally not considered a major pest of root crops.

I was dismayed to spot a vole using the tunnels though in late August and when I finally got around to digging the potatoes, in October, 90% of them were partially eaten. I should have harvested in August, before the voles moved in! I had hoped to bring 30 pounds of spuds down here with me, but I

ended up with only about two pounds!

My next planting was on June 6, when I transplanted four more "Big Beef" tomatoes and also direct seeded zucchini and winter squash from seed I harvested from last year's winter squash crop.

A few days later I set out my "Marketmore," slicing and pickling cucumbers at the bases of my 6-foot-tall tomato cages, made out of sturdy, steel rewire. I have used the same tomato cages from more than 40 years now and they should last forever, although "forever" for me is not likely another 40 years.

The cucumber vines climb the tomato cages, allowing me to "double crop" the same space each year. This system works well for me, but occasionally I will miss seeing a hanging cucumber amongst the tomato foliage inside the cages until it is 1 foot long.

The cucumbers did well with the first harvest on July 28 and they pretty much continued to grow right up until October. I know some readers have problems with cucumber plants succumbing to disease or insect pests, which transmit disease each year. The trick to getting a good cucumber harvest is to spray them as soon as set out and keep spraying them weekly with a fungicide, until they start to set fruit. I do the same for my tomatoes with excellent results.

My first tomato harvest was Aug. 7, for both the early transplanted ones (May 21) and those I set out on June 5. The two-week planting delay did not delay the first harvest at all, once more demonstrating there is little point in setting out tomato plants before the soil has warmed to 70 degrees or higher.

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


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
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Passing judgment

I don't know if it was the way the actor said it or the statement itself, but it got me thinking.

I initially found myself judging people who judge others. Then I realized I'm judging others for judging others, which led me to think about how judgmental I've been in my life.

I've been guilty of judging public figures, strangers, co-workers, friends and family, practically everyone, especially when I've witnessed one of their worst moments. I've written people off who probably didn't deserve it.

After a few minutes of beating myself up and feeling guilty, I realized I was judging myself. Does it ever end?

I suppose we all judge people. It's only natural. We judge people the moment we meet them. The moment somebody walks through the door, we instantly make judgments about their appearance, their demeanor, the way they talk, the way they walk, the rumors we heard about them, and much more. How could we not?

Is all judgment bad? If we don't judge a person's character the right way, sometimes it could lead to disastrous consequences. That's not the type of judgment I'm attempting to write about.

What is judgment? Is it just an opinion based on the present moment, or is it a conclusion about someone that causes us to think about them or mistreat them?

How often does our judgment allow us to give someone a second chance? How often do we judge people in a way that causes us to write them off?

When I judge someone based on a rumor I heard, their physical appearance, the way they talk, or even something I know they did when they were younger, is that fair?

What happens when we witness someone's worst moment? Is that their true character shining through, or are they just having a bad day?

People act the way they do because of a combination of factors and we don't know what they go through that leads them to behave the way they do. We usually aren't seeing the complete picture. People are more complex

than that.

I don't think it's possible to live a life where I never judge anyone, but how often have I judged someone to find out later I was wrong?

How often have those judgments led me to a negative mindset where I'm holding a grudge against a person and thinking negative thoughts about them? Is it healthy for me to be carrying around negative opinions about people?

I think the evidence is clear that harboring negative thought patterns about others harms us in various ways and is often unfair to the person we are judging.

Although real change sometimes takes years, we all are capable of change. I would hate to be judged because of some-

thing I did or said 10 or 20 years ago. Although I'm the same person, I am pretty different now. I have different opinions, different behaviors, different thought patterns. I've changed quite a bit. I'm sure you have, too.

Maybe when we're reflective about our own lives, and we think about our own worst moments, it might allow us to give someone a second chance who maybe deserves one.

It's been said our judgments about another person probably say more about our character than the character of the person we are judging. Is that true? I'll leave it for you to decide.

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County COVID hospitalizations highest since February

ALBANY — Albany County’s COVID hospitalizations are the highest since Feb. 23, Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy said Tuesday.

The total number of confirmed cases of COVID-19 countywide stood at 34,237 since the beginning of the pandemic, with 131 new positive cases reported Monday, McCoy said.

As of Tuesday, the county had 582 active cases, including 11 new hospitalizations for a total of 57 county residents hospitalized with the virus. Thirteen were in the intensive care unit, an increase of nine from Monday, McCoy said.

Two additional COVID deaths were reported Tuesday, including a man in his 70s and another man in his 90s. A total of 334 Albany County residents have died from the virus since the pandemic began in mid-March of last year.

The rising number of cases and hospitalizations are concerning, along with an escalating number of deaths from the virus, McCoy said.

“Our numbers continue to move in the wrong direction, with hospitalizations at their highest level since Feb. 23, and the loss of two more county residents to COVID complications,” McCoy said. “There have now been

20 COVID deaths in the county during the month of November, compared to 18 in October and nine in September of this year, and 16 in total during November of last year.”

McCoy urged residents to get vac-

inated if they have not done so yet, and get booster shots if they have completed the vaccination series. The vaccine is the best way to avoid the most severe cases of COVID, he said.

“We know our best defense against

the worst symptoms and illness caused by COVID is the vaccine and the booster shot,” McCoy said. “Of the 57 county residents currently hospitalized with the virus, 61% haven’t received a single shot, 4% are partially vaccinated and 35% are fully vaccinated.”

Residents can receive free Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines and booster shots Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., every week at the Albany County Department of Health, 175 Green Street. Walk-ins are welcome on Wednesdays, but appointments are now needed for other days, by visiting albanycounty.com.

As of Monday, 75.5% of all county residents have received at least the first dose of the vaccine, 67.7% have been fully vaccinated, and 84.8% of county adults have been fully vaccinated, McCoy said.

Coeymans Hollow remains among the lowest vaccinated communities in Albany County with 33% of residents completing the vaccination series, according to the New York State COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker. Alcove has the highest vaccination rate at 100%. Coeymans has 67.4% of residents fully vaccinated and 62% of Ravena residents have completed the vaccination series.

State police warn of phone scam from fake state trooper

The New York State Police are warning against a phone scam where callers are claiming to be state troopers.

During the calls, scammers say they are a member of the New York State Police and that charges are pending against the person. The scammers then request money or bank information.

Neither the state police, nor any agency authorized by it, will ever solicit for money or ask for personal information over the phone, according to state police.

The New York State Office of the Attorney

General investigates illegal and questionable telemarketing operations in New York state.

Anyone who receives a solicitation by telephone, mail, email or in person, from someone seeking money and who claims to be a representative or employee of the

New York State Police, or suggests an affiliation with the New York State Police, is advised to get as many details as possible about the caller and to report this to the New York State Attorney General’s Charities Bureau or the nearest Attorney General’s Office.

As a matter of crime prevention, state police advise people should be wary of solicitors who:

- Do not provide an address or phone number;
- Demand immediate payment or payment in cash;
- Seem vague as to how contributions will be spent;
- Refuse to provide financial information about a charitable organization; and,
- Appear angry or impatient when asked reasonable questions about the organization they represent or the programs for which contributions will be used.

During the height of the Covid pandemic last summer, TCI NY was deemed an essential industry for New York state and was allowed to stay open. “The expansion shows when local government and industry work together, there is nothing we cannot achieve,” said George McHugh, Coeymans’ Town Supervisor. “The result of this collaboration is good paying jobs with benefits to employees, many of whom are Coeymans residents.”

Tom Bronchetti, TCI’s Controller says, “Our operation is beneficial to the regional economy through our employment, tax payments and spending with other local businesses. TCI pays a living wage with strong benefits.”

Providing jobs in the community promotes growth and stability for all of those who live in the area. The company pays approximately \$75,000 per year in local taxes, and spends more than \$250,000 annually with local businesses, from grocery stores and diners to gas stations and hardware stores.

Recycling and the Environment

“We strongly believe in our obligations to our neighbors and to our community,” says Mr. Hemlock. “We are committed to operating our business in a manner that is safe, unobtrusive to our neighbors and protective of the environment.”

Today, 99% of all the materials from transformers are recycled, re-purposed or refurbished. It used to all go into landfills. It is a true American success story. One that has benefitted many lives and protects the environment.

Hard Hat meets Textbook

TCI works with RCS High School to create good paying internships

that can lead to full time jobs upon graduating from high school. The company awards scholarships to RCS High School Seniors, supports the school’s drama and athletic programs.

“We decided to pay students because they do a great job and deserve to be compensated,” Mr. Hemlock says. “We require the students to keep their grades up while working here.”

Lisa Patierne, Principal at RCS, said, “It’s a great partnership and a great opportunity for students who elect not to go to college. TCI gives these students worked based learning opportunities through internships that can lead to a promising career.”

Committed to Community

During the challenging summer months last year, TCI stepped up to sponsor the Kindness for Kids Summer lunch program, which provides thousands of lunches to kids with need. TCI and its employees also work with the Hope Full Life Center Blessing Bags, Helping Harvest, VFW Post 9594, RCS Library, Ravenna Rescue Squad, Historical Society, and the Ravenna Friendship Festival.

Every year TCI assists the Riverview Baptist Church annual Block party, youth programs and summer camp. The campers learned how TCI built its state-of-the-art facilities and how electrical transformers are recycled. They meet administration and operations staff, some of whom are family members and neighbors of the campers.

Pastor Roxanne Booth said, “It’s important for our kids to see what’s on display at TCI. It is a national company proud to be in Coeymans and a successful, growing business operation. Plus, the folks at TCI make it a fun excursion.”



Training Center

TCI goes to the utilities with specialized trailers to pick up transformers and then off loads them at the plant where they go onto highly modernized production lines to separate the materials. The process requires highly skilled workers who are trained and educated. There needs to be strict attention to detail. It has been challenging finding people to fill the slots.

“Many businesses including ours are struggling to find the workers to run our operations,” says Mr. Hemlock. “I felt we needed to do something drastic and decided a training center was essential to creating a sustainable pipeline of workers for our businesses.”

Mr. Hemlock approach Carver Laraway from Carver Companies to partner on a new initiative. The Joint Training and Certification Center is now in the development stage to provide training and job opportunities to underserved communities in the region.

“What will make the JTC Center unique is the combination of paid internships, multiple certifications and upon successful completion of the program a guaranteed job offer,” said Mr. Hemlock.

The company is committed to Coeymans and will continue to invest in the community with further expansion plans in the works.

Indians' historic season comes to a close

RAVENA-COEY-MANS-SELKIRK — The RCS Indians came up short Saturday in the Class B state semifinals, but that doesn't detract from the historic season the team had on the gridiron.

The Indians were defeated by the Pleasantville Panthers 15-7 at Faller Field in Middletown on Saturday, but came within inches of tying the game in the final minutes of the fourth quarter.

With minutes to go, the Indians made it to the Panthers' 9-yard line when a fourth down attempt had to be measured by the referees to see if the Indians had made first down.

The play came up short by inches and the Indians turned the ball over to the Panthers, who took the ball to midfield before running down the clock to end the game.

Faller Field was filled with RCS fans who chanted and cheered on the team, which made local history by making it to within a single win of the state Class B finals. A victory on Saturday would have sent the Indians to the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, but it was not to be.

A slow first half left the Indians scoreless after the Panthers scored a touchdown on a 46-yard punt return and a safety in the second quarter to take a 9-0 lead into the locker room after the first half.

The Indians got on the board in the third quarter with a 52-yard touchdown pass to senior Ryan Southworth and the extra point attempt was good to bring the score to Panthers up 9-7.

A fourth quarter rushing touchdown by the Panthers and a failed 2-point conversion sealed the deal for the final 15-7 score.

Southworth and Xavier Bermudez each had three receptions in the game, for 79 and 48 yards, respectively.

Bermudez led the team in rushing yards with two carries for 15 yards. Franky Broadhurst had 14 carries for a total 7 yards.

Quarterback Luke Misetich had six completed passes for 127 yards.

Saturday's loss to the undefeated Panthers doesn't take away from the team's historic season that saw a 10-3 record overall and brought the team to within a single game of the state championship matchup in Syracuse. The Indians captured the imagination of their community.

Firearms season for deer, bear hunting begins

ALBANY — New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Commissioner Basil Seggos announced that regular firearms season for deer and bear in the Southern Zone began Nov. 20.

DEC encourages hunters to review new safety regulations and changes this season that will enhance their hunting experience.

"New York's hunters are among the state's most important conservationists," Seggos said.

"Hunters help to balance deer and bear populations with local habitats and land uses while providing more than 11 million pounds of quality, locally grown, organic meat to sustain families. With more opportunities to venture afield this season, I encourage New Yorkers to continue practicing the key tenets of hunter safety for a safe and enjoyable time outdoors."

Regular firearms season for deer and bear in New York's Southern

Zone runs from Nov. 20 through Dec. 12.

The Southern Zone regular hunting season is New York's most popular hunting season, and approximately 85% of New York's 550,000 licensed hunters participate. Harvest during this season accounts for nearly 60% of the total statewide deer harvest and 30% to 60% of the statewide bear harvest.

Following the regular deer and bear seasons in the Southern Zone, late bowhunting and muz-

zleloading seasons run from Dec. 13 through Dec. 21, and again from Dec. 26 to Jan. 1, the latter of which is an extension from past years. Hunters taking part in these special seasons must possess a hunting license and either bowhunting or muzzleloading privileges.

In the Northern Zone, the regular deer and bear hunting season opened Oct. 23 and closes Dec. 5. The Northern Zone includes the Adirondacks, Tug Hill Plateau, Eastern Lake Ontario Plain, and the Champlain and St. Lawrence valleys. A late bowhunting and muzzleloading season for deer will be open in portions of the Northern Zone from Dec. 6 to Dec. 12.

New this year, 12- and 13-year-old hunters can hunt deer with a firearm when accompanied by a licensed, experienced adult in counties that "opted in" to the pilot program. Established by the New York State Legislature through 2023, this pilot program applies only to upstate counties that choose to participate. The program does not apply to Westchester or Suffolk counties; Erie and Rockland counties did not opt in to participate. The remaining 52 upstate counties opted in.

Also new, DEC extended the daily hunting hours to run from 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sunset, allowing hunters to utilize the full daylight period. Hunters should check the sunrise and sunset times before hunting each day.

All hunters pursuing deer or bear with a firearm are now required to wear fluorescent orange or fluorescent pink clothing, either a hat, vest, or jacket visible in all directions. New York hunters have an excellent safety record, but this change will make hunting even safer.

Hunters are reminded to follow the basic rules of firearm safety:

- Point your gun in a safe direction;
- Treat every gun as if it were loaded;
- Be sure of your target and beyond; and,
- Keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.

When hunting in tree stands, hunters are advised to use a safety harness and a climbing belt, as most tree-stand accidents occur when hunters are climbing in and out of the stand. Also, hunters should never climb in or out of a tree stand with a loaded firearm.

By choosing to Let Young Bucks Go and

Watch Them Grow, New York hunters now see and take more older bucks than ever before. Older deer have larger antlers and yield more meat, vocalize more, and create more rubs and scrapes.

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) continues to spread in other states, and hunters can help to prevent CWD in New York, which is fatal to deer. If introduced, CWD could spread rapidly and be practically impossible to eliminate once established. Hunters can help protect New York's deer herd from CWD by following these tips:

- If hunting any type of deer, elk, moose, or caribou outside of New York, debone the animal before bringing it back. See CWD Regulations for Hunters. DEC will confiscate and destroy illegally imported carcasses and parts;
- Do not use deer-urine-based lures or attractant scents, as these could contain infectious material. Choose synthetic lures instead;
- Dispose of carcass waste in a landfill, not on the landscape;
- Report any deer that appears sick or acting abnormally; and
- Hunt only wild deer and support fair chase hunting principles.

IMPACT OF EHD

The outbreak of epizootic hemorrhagic disease (EHD) that killed deer in portions of New York this summer and early fall will impact the experiences of hunters in the hardest hit areas.

EHD is a viral disease caused by a biting midge that affects deer but is not infectious to humans. The outbreak ends when frost kills the midges. New York had its fourth and largest EHD outbreak this summer, with about 2,000 dead deer reported.

The hardest hit areas were in eastern Ulster, western Dutchess, and western Columbia counties. The disease does not affect deer populations uniformly, and hunters may see variable impacts with few deer on some properties hit hard by EHD and plenty of deer elsewhere.

DEC will continue to monitor the impact of EHD through the hunting season and make any necessary management adjustments next year.

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Why is my Medicare Part B premium so high?

Dear Rusty: Social Security is deducting \$297 per month for my Medicare Part B coverage.

I have what's called a "Windfall Elimination Provision" because I receive a pension from my former state employer. Prior to my 65th birthday in July of this year, Social Security was paying me \$764 per month, but when I turned 65 they reduced my amount to \$467 per month. I read that the Part B premiums for 2021 are \$148.50, so I wonder why I'm paying double that amount?

Could it be that I never enrolled in Medicare Part B and they just automatically started deducting that amount? Some sort of penalty? If so, it seems kind of high.

Can you explain why I'm paying so much for Medicare Part B?

Dear Curious: Your Part B premium of \$297/month has nothing to do with the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). WEP affects (reduces) your Social Security retirement benefit amount, but doesn't affect your Medicare premium.

Your Medicare Part B premium is \$297/month because of a different Medicare rule known as "IRMAA," which is the "Income Related Medicare Adjustment Amount." Here's how IRMAA works:

Medicare determines your Part B premium amount each year using your combined income

(from all sources) from two years prior, so your 2021 Part B premium is based upon your 2019 income. The income amount used to set your Part B premium is called your Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI), which is your normal Adjusted Gross Income on your tax return plus any other non-taxable income you may have had (including half of your SS benefits, non-taxable interest, etc.). If your MAGI is over a certain threshold, your Part B premium is more than the standard \$148.50.

The IRMAA thresholds at which you pay a higher Part B premium depend upon your tax filing status. A married couple filing jointly with MAGI under \$176,001 pays the standard premium (\$148.50 for 2021), and a single tax filer whose MAGI is under \$88,001 also pays the standard Part B premium, but income exceeding those thresholds means a higher Part B premium. How much higher depends upon how much

your MAGI exceeds the base amounts above.

The Part B IRMAA premium increases on a scale relative to how much your MAGI exceeds the base threshold and, from what you've shared, it appears that your 2019 MAGI resulted in a 2021 Part B premium of \$297/month.

Since you were already collecting Social Security when you turned 65, you were automatically enrolled in Medicare Part A (which is free) and Medicare Part B (for which you pay a premium), which is why your Medicare premium increased at that time.

If you also have "creditable" health care from either your or your wife's employer ("creditable" is a group plan with at least 20 participants), you can disenroll from Medicare Part B by filing form CMS-1763 and having an interview with Social Security. That way you could save that \$297 monthly Part B premium for as long as you have other "creditable" employer coverage, and then re-enroll in Part B during the Special Enrollment Period, which starts when your employer coverage ends (or shortly before to avoid a gap in

health care coverage).

If you have retired from working and your combined income in 2020 was much lower than in 2019, Social Security will automatically adjust your 2022 Medicare Part B premium as appropriate for your combined income reported to the IRS on your 2020 tax return.

If you retired in 2020, you might also wish to submit form SSA-44 (www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-44-ext.pdf) to claim a "life changing event," which may result in a smaller Part B premium for 2021 as well.

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An underestimated powerhouse

I love nuts! And one of my favorites is macadamia nuts.

Unlike most nuts that are high in inflammatory omega-6 fatty acids, macadamia nuts are chock full of healthy monounsaturated fats like the kind found in avocados and olive oil.

And because they're rich in monounsaturated fatty acids, they help reduce cholesterol and triglyceride levels, lowering your risk for developing cardiovascular disease. A 2008 study published in the Journal of Nutrition concluded people with high LDL (bad) cholesterol levels should incorporate this super nut into their diets because of their cholesterol lowering properties.

And there's more good news — macadamia nuts are also packed full of the plant compounds flavonoids and tocotrienols. According to recent studies, these compounds may help fight or kill cancer cells by destroying damaging free radicals in the body.

Aside from their potential ability to fight cancer, tocotrienols also have brain-protecting effects. One study found that supplementing with tocotrienol may help protect brain cells from free radical damage.

Macadamia nuts are also rich in palmitoleic acid, which could help you drop a few pounds. According to a 2010 study published in the

American Society for Nutrition, "Plamitoleic acid increases fat metabolism, which in turn reduces fat storage" and "may have positive effects on preventing metabolic syndrome."

Macadamia nuts are a whole food with plenty of good fats, vitamins and minerals. However, they are not a magic bullet for treating health conditions without making other complimentary lifestyle changes.

In moderation, macadamia nuts are, no doubt, a delicious and healthy choice in a well-rounded diet. However, despite the many benefits of macadamia nuts, it's important to be mindful of your serving size. Just one cup of macadamia nuts contains 950 calories, which might be half of your daily calorie requirement.

And not all macadamia nuts are healthy choices, as some contain added sugar, salt and oil. So be sure to read the label first.

Finally, if you have a tree nut allergy, or live with someone who has nut allergies, well, you must steer clear of them. Even inhaling tiny particles of nuts can be enough to trigger an allergic reaction in some people.

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Conversation is key in caring for loved one with Alzheimer’s

WASHINGTON, DC — More than 6 million Americans have been diagnosed with Alzheimer’s disease and that number is growing at too fast a rate — the projection is that the number of Alzheimer’s patients will more than double by 2050.

According to the Alzheimer’s Association, 11.2 million Americans are volunteer caregivers for loved ones with the disease. In fact, family members and friends account for 83% of all Alzheimer’s caregivers.

The pros are trained to know what to do, but “civilian” helpmates may need help.

“Three of the main reasons [novice] caregivers

provide assistance to a person with Alzheimer’s or another dementia are: (1) the desire to keep a family member or friend at home (65%), (2) proximity to the person with dementia (48%) and (3) the caregiver’s perceived obligation to the person with dementia (38%). Caregivers often indicate love and a sense of duty and obligation when describing what motivates them to assume care responsibilities for a relative or friend living with dementia,” according to the Alzheimer’s Association.

It’s a daunting task that requires commitment and perseverance and that’s where “love and a sense of duty and obligation” enter into the equation, according to the organi-

zation.

Day-to-day assistance with hygiene, dressing and incontinence as well as routine activities of daily living are difficult enough for amateur caregivers. But, perhaps, as challenging as these routines may be, it can be frustrating at best for novice helpmates to engage in conversation no matter how simple the chat may seem.

Bear in mind that verbal give-and-take is a critical element of taking care of someone with Alzheimer’s.

The disease impairs both the patient’s ability to verbalize their thoughts and his or her ability to understand what you are saying. In addition, in many cases, especially as the disease progress-

es, they can’t remember words or things that have happened in their lives nor, perhaps, recall who you are.

The individual’s capacity to communicate fails them and, as a result, it might hinder their ability to “maintain their dignity and self-esteem.”

Many amateur caregivers who have been at it for a long time understand the importance of conversation. But, if you are new to it, here are a few recommendations, courtesy of the Alzheimer’s Association:

- Engaging the person in one-on-one conversation in a quiet space that has minimal distractions.
- Speaking slowly and clearly.
- Maintaining eye

contact to show you care about what he or she is saying.

- Giving the person plenty of time to respond so he or she can think about what to say.
- Being patient and offering reassurance to encourage the person to explain his or her thoughts.
- Asking one question at a time.
- Asking yes or no questions. For example, “Would you like some coffee?” rather than “What would you like to drink?”
- Avoiding criticizing or correcting. Instead, listen and try to find the meaning in what the person says. Repeating what was said to clarify.
- Avoiding argu-

ing. If the person says something you don’t agree with, let it be.

- Offering clear, step-by-step instructions for tasks as lengthy requests may be overwhelming.
- Giving visual cues by demonstrating a task to encourage participation.

This transformative legislation cuts costs for families by making childcare more affordable and extending the Child Tax Credit, a vital benefit that delivered \$30.8 million in total payments to Capital Region families in the month of November alone, Tonko said.

“Investments in our kids have unparalleled benefits for our communities, our economy and the future of our nation,” Tonko said. “In the richest country in the world, there is simply no excuse for us to abandon any of America’s children, and with the strong investments House Democrats passed under Biden’s Build Back Better Act, we are ensuring no kid is left behind. I was proud to vote to pass this legislation that will put money back in the pockets of middle- and low-income parents so they can

pay for childcare, put food on the table, pay for utilities, and spend money at our local businesses. I’ll continue pushing for these critical investments that enable Americans to support and grow our local economy while building better lives for their families.”

The Build Back Better Act expands on Democrats’ work to support families including extending the successful Child Tax Credit, according to Tonko. Analysis based on data from the Census Bureau shows that following the July payments, there were significant declines in the share of households with children reporting financial hardship and food insufficiency, the congressman said.


Families continue to use the expanded CTC tax cuts to meet the needs of their household, he added. Among those who responded to the Census Bureau’s survey: 56% spent their CTC tax cuts on food, 33% spent it on internet and other utilities, 30% spent it on mortgage/rent, 30% spent it on clothing and 11% spent it on childcare, Tonko said.

Investments in the Build Back Better Act:

- Give more than 35 million families a major tax cut by extending the Biden Child Tax Credit, including supporting an estimated 120,000 Capital Region kids.
- Save most families more than half their current spending on childcare, ensuring most families will have to pay no more than 7% of their income for childcare.
- Establish universal preschool for all 3- and 4-year-olds with expanded access to pre-K for more than 6 million children.
- Establish a universal and permanent paid family and medical leave program, providing four weeks of paid parental, family caregiving, and medical leave.
- Cut the cost of postsecondary education, with such steps as increasing the maximum Pell Grant.
- Extend the Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) to ensure that low-income children will always have access to quality, affordable health insurance.

- 2 cups halved green, red and black California grapes

Smoked Chicken and Grape Bruschetta

- Yield: 24 pieces
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
 - 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 French bread baguette
 - 8 ounces smoked chicken breast (1 3/4 cups), shredded or cut into bite-size strips
