# McHugh, Rowzee face off for Coeymans top spot

COEYMANS — Two candidates will face off in the Nov. 2 election for the town supervisor's seat in Coeymans.

Incumbent Republican George McHugh and Democrat Cindy Rowzee are seeking the town's top spot. Candidates were asked to complete a questionnaire about their candidacy. The responses are presented in alphabetical order.

# Halloween contest offers spooky good time

RAVENA — Teens offered local kids a spooky good time Saturday at the annual Halloween event at Grace United Methodist Church.

Each year, the church puts on a pumpkin carving contest and haunted house. This year the festivities were held outside in a drive-thru format due to COVID-19 concerns. Last year was the first time the event took place in the church parking lot, also due to the pandemic.

"The kids have been denied so many social opportunities because of COVID and having our haunted drive-thru gives them a chance to gather together safely and have fun because it's outdoors," organizer Kate Robertson said. "We've been throwing a Halloween gathering at Grace United Methodist Church for as long as we've been members and it's nice to be able to keep the tradition alive."

About 30 teens helped plan the event, decorating the parking lot and even a school bus festooned in "spider webs." A skeletal visitor hung out inside a blue truck parked in the lot.

As darkness fell, the teens donned spooky costumes and jumped out as vehicles drove slowly through the parking lot.

But the first thing visitors saw were the carved pumpkins made by local residents. Town Councilman Brandon LeFevre was one of the judges.

The event makes for a good time and unites the community, LeFevre said Saturday.

"This helps bring people together," he said. "Especially in these times, that is what we need — everybody is scared of what is going on in the world and this is a good opportunity to get people out and let them drop their defenses and enjoy themselves."

Some of the teens who helped organize the event have been doing it for years.

Andrew Ginder, 14, has been working on the Halloween festivities for the past four years. He planned to dress as a scary clown for the drive-thru.

"It's pretty fun. I've been friends with all these guys for years and this is something fun to do together," Andrew said.

Elizabeth Robertson, 16, wasn't sure yet what she was going to dress up as, but she knew it would be spooky.

# Library forum draws Dem candidates, GOP declines

COEYMANS — The RCS Community Library hosted an online candidates' forum Oct. 18 and half of the candidates in the November election took part.

The Meet the Candidates Forum was held on Zoom, with all of the Democratic candidates participating. The entire slate of Republican candidates declined the invitation.

Incumbent Town Supervisor George McHugh, a Republican, said the GOP candidates decided unanimously not to participate in the online forum.

"We decided to take our campaign directly to the people and let them continue to do what they are doing," McHugh said. "[The Democrats] have taken every opportunity to sling mud and we are just

not going to participate. It wasn't my decision, it was a unanimous decision of everyone running on the ticket."

Library Director Judith Wines opened the program and said it was the first time the library hosted a candidates' forum.

"This is an event that a number of organizations in the community have tried to get going and have met with a couple of roadblocks here and there, so the library decided to take it over and give it a running start," Wines said.

Residents were given the opportunity to submit questions for the candidates and each candidate was allotted an opening and closing statement, and had up to two minutes to respond to individual questions.

The Rev. Antonio Booth moderated the program and said he does not have

a stake in the election and as a Selkirk resident, will not be able to cast his own ballot in the Coeymans race.

"Any questions that are being brought up are going to be as impartial as possible. I don't have any agenda at all," Booth said.

Cindy Rowzee, Democratic candidate for town supervisor, has been town clerk for the past four years.

"My top priorities for when I am elected is I want to update the town ethics law, I want to mandate financial disclosure forms for elected and appointed officials to help with openness and transparency in government," Rowzee said. "I want to institute a multi-year plan in order to help the town stay on a more even keel, so we don't raise taxes one year and lower them the next."

She wants to work with

the business association in the village to work on a community branding campaign to bring more businesses and residents to the area, she said.

Town council candidate Yvonne Shackelton said her background in finance and data analytics, as well as her current post on the RCS Board of Education, gives her a unique perspective on local government.

"I understand what it means to have to operate in a local government according to what the taxpayers are asking for and I understand budgets and forecasting for budgets," Shackelton said, adding that one of her key priorities is ensuring the opinions of the people living in the community are heard and valued.

"I really feel that the people of the town do need a stronger voice in what happens in their

community," she said.

Town council candidate Sara Pruiksma dubbed herself the artist of the group and said she prioritizes community input into how the town is run.

"Part of my vision as a town board member is to preserve and highlight the natural and historic assets of our town," Pruiksma said of her plans should she be elected. "We have tremendous parks here, a lot of beautiful natural resources, including the river, and we have some of the most amazing architecture in the area."

Candidate Kristen Geoghegan is running to fill the 37th District seat on the Albany County Legislature.

"Coeymans deserves a strong advocate who can hit the ground running, and I believe I am a good candidate for that," Geoghegan said of her

candidacy.

Candidate Sherle Slingerland is hoping to replace Rowzee in her current post as town clerk as Rowzee seeks the town's top spot.

"I have the skills to handle the job and I would love to continue the work Cindy has started in making things more efficient in the town clerk's office," Slingerland said.

Issues discussed at the forum included truck traffic, particularly on Main Street in the village; marijuana dispensaries in the community; the town's relationship with industry; economic development; and renovation of main streets in the town and village.

developing industry and job creation, while at the same time maintaining a healthy and safe environment so that our children and young people choose Coeymans as a place to live and raise families. Quality of life initiatives, recreational opportunities, and a strong school district are equally as important as good jobs and a strong tax base. If re-elected, I will continue to work with the town board, industrial partners, and community members to think outside the box, develop plans and strategies to improve our quality of life in Coeymans, and provide an environment that our children and grandchildren find as attractive to raise their families.

Why do you think you will be a good supervisor? What are you most proud of accomplishing if you hold office?

As Coeymans town supervisor, I am proud of the work that we have accomplished in a relatively short period of time. However, no one person or elected official can make things happen – it takes a team,

and this town board has worked together as a team since day one. We have opened the lines of constructive communication between local government and our industrial and commercial residents, working to reduce truck traffic on our Main streets, find alternative routes at the expense of industry, while always striving towards a proper balance for all. The town board has also opened the lines of communication with our elected officials at Albany County, and with our partnerships with people like Sheriff Craig Apple and Albany County Executive Dan McCoy, Coeymans residents are the beneficiaries of a new sheriff substation in the hamlet, and the opening of Lawson Lake Park to our youth and summer recreational programs – all at no additional cost to Coeymans taxpayers. This town board had the foresight to update the town’s master plan, hire a town grant writer, and secured over \$1,200,000 in funding for Riverfront Park improvements and nearly \$420,000 in federal funding, which will be used in part towards permanent bathroom facilities in Riverfront and Joralemon Park, as well as expanded broadband coverage in Coeymans Hollow and Alcove. We reduced the town tax rate by 9% in 2021 and held the line on taxes in 2022, while simultaneously investing in new basketball and tennis courts and playground equipment in our town parks. I am also very proud of how we handled the unprecedented COVID-19 response in Coeymans, as we secured testing and vaccines for our residents, and maintained some of the lowest number of cases of the disease in Albany County.

If re-elected as Coeymans town supervisor, I look forward to constructing the permanent bathroom facilities in both town parks and completing the \$1.2 million Riverfront Park renovation project. Townwide broadband infrastructure expansion shall remain a top priority of my administration, as will the rerouting of trucks from our Main streets. The ultimate goal of this administration is to help make Coeymans a town where our children and grandchildren find it to be a great place to work,

live, and raise a family.

What do you think is the top issue facing your community? What would you do to address this issue if elected?

I think the top issue facing our community is the lack of economic development. If we are able to bring in more small businesses many other problems will fix themselves. More businesses will bring less vacant buildings, less crime, a more beautiful 9W corridor and Main Street, more sales tax revenue, more property tax revenue, more residents and an improved quality of life.

In order to do this I will work with the RCS Community Business Association and the Village of Ravena on a branding campaign for our area. I will also work with the people in town to see what types of businesses they want here. If we have specific goals for the types of businesses we want to bring to town we can more easily reach out and attract them here. I will work with the grant writer to see what types of grants are available for economic development and to small businesses. We can hopefully start with a Main Street grant and work from there.

Why do you think you will be a good supervisor? What are you most proud of accomplishing if you hold office?

I will bring several years of experience from different positions in different municipalities to the position of town supervisor. This gives me a unique view of seeing what has worked and what hasn’t at different levels of government. I also have the ability to look at things from multiple viewpoints and in trying to understand those views it makes it easier to find compromises. I believe that in a community that is split politically this is a necessary skill. I will represent everyone, not just those that voted for me.

As town clerk I am most proud of the updating and efficiencies that I have brought to that office. As town supervisor I want to do the same for the rest of the town. By updating how things are done the town will be more open and transparent, will work more efficiently and will be better able to plan for the future. Some of the things that I will do is to work towards a paperless office, make sure more information is posted online and available to the public, create a multi-year budgeting plan and involve the town board and the town residents in what is happening at the town level. If we utilize openness, efficiency and planning to help the community, we will all be better for it.

• A number of members from Royal Blue Rebekah Lodge attended the meeting of Royal Welcome Lodge in Albany on Wednesday evening.

• The W.S.R. Co. have regraveled their road leading into the passenger station, which is quite an improvement.

Greene County  
awarded competitive family  
planning grant

CATSKILL — Greene County Family Planning, a division of Greene County Health, received notice their competitive grant application to provide reproductive health services in Greene County was selected.

This grant provides funding to provide needed reproductive and other health services to Greene County. This \$228,770 grant was awarded by the state Department of Health for the 2022-23 year.

This funding is an increase of \$64,892 from the previous competitive family planning grants

awarded.

In 2021 so far, the clinic has seen 842 clients for 1,801 visits. The clinic offers low-cost access to same-day contraception, pregnancy testing and pre-conception counseling, testing for sexually transmitted infections and HIV, hepatitis C and screening for breast, cervical and other cancers.

Additional services include treatment for opioid-use disorder and harm reduction services including Narcan and fentanyl test strips, and counseling by a licensed medical social worker in a partner-

ship with Greene County Mental Health.

The department’s health educator provides health education to the local school districts and community college on healthy reproductive decisions and staying well.

With the continuation of funding, the department plans to increase the numbers of clients served as well as partner with Greener Pathways for mobile outreach services in local communities.

# Potato and apple season

The unseasonably warm weather has continued through much of October and I am not complaining about it at all.

It has been a wet and warm spell for several weeks now and many garden plants continue to grow. I am hoping to get a very good harvest of beets from the seed I planted on July 22, right after I harvested my garlic crop. I planted carrots on Aug. 15, and it does not look like they will reach harvestable size anytime soon, but perhaps if this warm spell continues, I may still get a decent harvest by mid-November.

Right now is the best time to plant garlic for next season. Remember that the bigger the cloves you plant, the bigger the bulbs you will harvest next July. Garlic prefers rich, well-drained, fertile soil, so take the time to till and add organic fertilizer now.

My grandson, Danny, dug some of my potatoes this past weekend and I was dismayed to see that about one-third of them had damage from either mice, voles or chipmunks. We cut off the damaged parts and had “Grand Bob’s roasted potatoes” as a side dish for dinner. Slice the potatoes thinly, and layer in an aluminum pan. Sprinkle olive oil on each layer and season with salt, pepper, garlic powder and onion powder. Bake at 400 degrees till they are soft, or broil a single layer of very thin slices for the best potato chips you will ever eat. If you have never eaten freshly dug potatoes, you are missing a treat.

The potatoes that “volunteered” this season from overlooked, unharvested, potatoes I had planted in 2020 produced some really huge “lunkers.” Planting, or neglecting to harvest whole potatoes, results in “volunteers” that are

often huge in size, but few in number. Planting smaller cut pieces of potatoes usually results in more, but smaller, tubers. A couple of these “volunteers” weighed almost a pound each. This fall I will try to make sure I dig them all, but I try to do that every year and usually fail.

The rest of this week’s column comes from Ulster County Cooperative Extension. I rarely include recipes in these columns, but this week is an exception on two counts.

Did you know apples are the official fruit of New York state? Celebrate our official state fruit during Apple Month. Zestar and SnapDragon are two newer varieties you can find in supermarkets and at farm stands and farmers markets. Zestar is zesty with a nice crunch and SnapDragon was developed by Cornell University and is sweeter with a “monster crunch.”

Are you interested in taking your family apple picking? Use this link <https://www.applesfromny.com/find-apples/pick-your-own-apples/> to find a U-Pick farm near you. Be sure to check with the farm about their hours and COVID restrictions before going to pick apples.

One large apple has 130 calories, 20% of your daily fiber needs, no sodium, fat or added sugars

and is easy to take anywhere and eat for a snack.

Here are some fun apple facts from the New York Apple Association: Apples are a member of the rose family of plants, along with pears, plums, peaches and cherries. It takes about 36 apples to make one gallon of apple cider. Apples float because 25% of their volume is air. The world’s largest apple peel was created by Kathy Wafner Madison on Oct. 16, 1976, in Rochester. It was 172 feet 4 inches long. (She was 16 years old at the time and grew up to be a sales manager for an apple tree nursery.) (Source: Guinness World Records)

Taste test apples with your children. At the farmers’ market, farm stand or local supermarket, choose two to three different varieties of apples to try. Once you get home, wash and slice each apple. As a group, try one apple variety at a time and decide which apple is your family favorite.

Recipe: Microwave Applesauce, serves seven. Serving size: half cup

Ingredients: Six apples, peeled, cored and quartered or chopped (about eight cups), 1/4 cup water, 1/4 cup sugar (or less to taste), 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon.

Directions: 1. Place apples and water in a 2 quart microwave safe dish. Cover with microwave-safe cover.

2. Cook on high for 10-12 minutes or until the apples are soft enough to mash.

3. Use a potato masher or fork to make chunky applesauce.

4. Add the sugar a little at a time to reach desired sweetness. Add cinnamon.

5. Serve warm or chilled. Refrigerate leftovers within two hours.

Qualified customers can now apply for Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) grants, a federally funded program that provides regular and emergency assistance to help pay heating and utility bills, and new this year, gas and electric utility arrears assistance grants of up to \$10,000 per household.

Both HEAP grants and Regular Arrears Supplement (RAS) program grants are available through local Department of Social Services (DSS) offices. Applications for HEAP are also available at Offices for the Aging and online at [mybenefits.ny.gov](http://mybenefits.ny.gov).

"We are pleased that additional assistance is available for families in our community who may be struggling, especially as we continue to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic," said Anthony Campagiorni, vice president of customer services and gas

operations. "We encourage all customers who are eligible to apply."

Families who qualify for HEAP grants and use electricity or natural gas as their primary heating source could receive a HEAP grant of \$350 or more toward their utility bill, depending on family income and size guidelines. For example, a family of four with natural gas heating and an annual income of \$62,988 would qualify for a \$350 grant.

Central Hudson customers who receive HEAP grants or qualify for other assistance programs will receive additional bill credits for up to 12 months on their Central Hudson bill.

As an example: A Central Hudson customer who qualifies for a Tier 1 HEAP grant and uses natural gas for heating is eligible for bill credits of up to \$30 per month; while a Tier 1 customer who has electric heating can

receive a credit of almost \$40 each month. Customers with lower incomes who qualify for higher tiers could be eligible for larger bill credits.

Campagiorni added, "Households receiving a HEAP benefit for non-utility heating fuels such as oil, propane, wood/wood pellets, kerosene, coal or corn are also eligible for a monthly credit on their electric or non-heating gas bill."

Customers who heat with non-utility heating fuels should email their current Notice of Decision letter to [careunit@cenhud.com](mailto:careunit@cenhud.com) to be enrolled and receive the bill credit.

Regular HEAP grants for the fall and upcoming winter are available from now through March 15, or until funding is exhausted. Emergency HEAP grants will be available between Jan. 3 and Mar. 15. These benefits are designed to meet an eligible house-

hold's immediate energy needs.

The Heating Equipment Repair or Replacement (HERR) program is also available to assist customers who have primary heating equipment that is either inoperable or unsafe. HERR grants are currently available and will remain so through Sept. 30, 2022.

## NEW THIS YEAR

The Regular Arrears Supplement program is a new program providing up to \$10,000 in utility arrears assistance to eligible households that are unable to pay their unpaid electric and/or gas utility arrears. This program is open to homeowners and renters and can apply to all arrears, including those accrued prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. This program only applies to electricity and natural gas, and not deliverable fuels such as home heating oil or propane. It is currently available and

will remain open to qualified customers until Sept. 30, 2022 or until funding is exhausted.

In addition to Central Hudson's bill discounts for customers receiving HEAP grants, these bill discounts are now also provided to customers who receive Lifeline; Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Medicaid; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); Federal Public Housing Assistance; Veterans Pension or Survivors Pension; and certain programs for Native Americans. This program provides a monthly bill credit for up to 12 consecutive months.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Central Hudson has suspended service terminations and is actively reaching out to customers who are experiencing financial challenges to determine if they are eligible for further assistance. In order to provide necessary documentation

for certain assistance programs, some Central Hudson customers are being proactively provided with statements showing a past due balance or a termination notice. These statements may be necessary for a customer to qualify for an emergency HEAP benefit or other charitable resources like Central Hudson's Good Neighbor Fund that provides "last resort" grants to help pay the energy bills of local residents in need who have exhausted all other forms of public and private utility assistance.

# BBB warns holiday shopping scams are a risk

BUFFALO — Online purchase scams now account for more than a third of all scam reports filed with the Better Business Bureau (BBB), and four out of five consumers who report such scams lose money, making it the No. 1 riskiest type of scam.

BBB is warning consumers ahead of the holiday shopping season to be aware of how scammers deceive consumers, whether they are actively shopping or passively browsing.

The 2021 BBB Online Purchase Scams Report examines more than 55,000 online purchase scam reports submitted

to BBB Scam Tracker between 2015 and 2021, as well as new survey research conducted in 2021 to get insights from those who reported online purchase scams in 2020 and 2021.

Online purchase scams consistently rank among the top three riskiest since 2017, and a significant number of people continue to lose money when targeted by online purchase scams (74.8% in 2021). The median dollar loss for this scam type has risen in recent years, up from \$76 in 2019 to \$102 so far in 2021.

Experts are predicting an earlier start to the

2021 holiday shopping season because of supply chain concerns, microchip shortages, and holiday hiring.

BBB warns scammers will find ways to take advantage of the situation by varying the product categories, capitalizing on what people are looking for online, and focusing on the most sought-after gifts such as electronics, toys and other trendy gift items.

Each year, the BBB Institute issues a BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report, which analyzes the previous year's data. Since the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic, online purchase scams

have jumped along with an increase in online shopping. BBB took a deeper dive into the data by surveying people who had reported scams to ask them more about their situation.

Whether a consumer was actively shopping for a product or passively browsing, it appears this activity had an impact on susceptibility. Sixty-four percent of survey respondents were actively searching for a product when they lost money to an online purchase scam. Thirty-six percent of those who lost money were passively looking or not searching.

When it came time

to placing an order and expecting the item to be shipped, 32% surveyed reported receiving shipment tracking information that seemed authentic, 30% received fake shipping information, 2% received shipping information they didn't verify, and 36% didn't receive shipping information. Several survey respondents noted that they didn't suspect a scam at first because they expected shipping delays due to the pandemic.

The analysis of online purchase scam reports submitted to BBB Scam Tracker found that more than 400 different types

of products were used by scammers to perpetrate scams.

Pets and pet supplies were the riskiest sales category in 2020. Almost 35% of online purchase scam reports were pet-related, with 70% of people losing money, and a median dollar loss of \$750. The French bulldog was the top breed used to perpetuate puppy scams.

One year ago this month, **Dave MacLauchlin**, started as manager of the **Lafarge** cement plant in Ravena – an opportunity that enabled him both to utilize his two decades of industry expertise and realize a dream of returning to his home state of New York.

But the job also presented significant challenges to MacLauchlin, 45, a Western Mohawk Valley native and Clarkson University graduate. He arrived five months after the coronavirus pandemic forced the closure of everything but essential businesses across the state.

The Lafarge Ravena plant, MacLauchlin said, shuttered briefly in April, but otherwise “operated successfully” throughout the Covid-19 crisis and never experienced an outbreak.

“That’s a testament to the workforce,” he said.

Now that the Covid restrictions have eased, MacLauchlin is focused on getting into the community and forging relationships. He is working to highlight how the local team has “evolved as an organization” and the plant has “evolved as a site.”

“Our goal is to be a good member of the community, to be a respected member of the community,” he explained. The plant is the largest employer in Southern Albany County, with 150 workers, and the largest contributor of local property taxes.

MacLauchlin often points to Ravena plant’s multimillion-dollar modernization project completed in 2017. He notes it has produced cement for many projects, including the GlobalFoundries site in Malta, which announced a significant expansion; and looks forward to playing a key role in helping New York reach its ambitious renewable energy goals.

# Voters approve \$40.7M capital project

BETHLEHEM — Voters in the Bethlehem Central School District approved by a large margin a \$40.7 million capital improvement project.

The 2021 Facilities Improvement Capital Project was adopted Oct. 19 by voters, with 2,017, or 71%, voting in favor of the project and 810, or 29%, voting against the project.

“Thank you to our BC community for turning out today to support this project,” said District Superintendent Jody Monroe. “Maintaining, modernizing and improving our facilities is essential to our mission. Many elements of this plan are designed to improve student opportunities within all four of our core district values

of academics, character, community and wellness.”

The project will mean improvements at every school building in the district.

Taxes will not increase in the district due to the project, according to a district statement. The project is expected to be budget neutral, with debt service costs fully offset by New York state building aid and significant use of the district’s capital reserve fund, according to the district.

The total estimated cost of the project is \$40,693,000. Funding sources will cover 100% of the cost of the project, with no property tax impact for homeowners. Funding sources are as follows:

- ARP/ESSER Funds: \$2,397,000

- Federal E-Rate Funds: \$543,000

- Capital Reserve Funds – 2015: \$5,100,000

- Capital Reserve Funds – 2019: \$8,300,000

- Estimated NYS Building Aid: \$24,353,106

Monroe said she appreciated the voters’ confidence in the project.

“We are always grateful for the show of support and it is important that our students see it for themselves, especially as they carry on through the pandemic,” Monroe said. “All students will benefit from the passage of this capital project.”

Construction is expected to take place in 2023 and 2024.

- BCHS cafeteria outdoor canopy

- Playground improvements

at all elementary schools

- Playground shade canopies

- Slingerlands kitchen renovation

- Hamagrael kitchen renovation

- Transportation office renovation

- Roofing replacements at BCHS, BCMS, Elsmere and Hamagrael

- Boiler replacements at BCHS, Elsmere and Hamagrael

- Security upgrades at entrances at Glenmont, Hamagrael

- Additional security cameras districtwide

- Technology infrastructure upgrades

Construction is expected to begin in April 2023.

# The basics of applying for Social Security

**Dear Rusty:**  
I am planning to apply for Social Security in May of 2022 and would like to understand how to file. I will be taking it when I am 62.

*Signed: Ready to Retire*

**Dear Ready to Retire:**  
Congratulations on your upcoming retirement!  
You should apply for your Social Security benefits about three months before you wish benefits to begin (you will tell them the month you want benefits to start when you apply).  
Since you plan to apply at age 62, be aware that you must be 62 for an entire month to be eligible for benefits — you cannot get benefits for the month you turn 62 (unless you were born on the first or second of the month). Rather, you become eligible the following month.  
Your benefit payment date will be either the second, third or fourth Wednesday of the month, depending on the day of the month you were born. Born between the first and 10th of the month, your payment will be received on the second Wednesday; born between the 11th and 20th of the month, payment will be made on the third Wednesday; born after the 20th of the month your payment will be received on the fourth Wednesday.  
You can apply for benefits over the phone by calling Social Security at 1(800) 772-1213 (or by calling your local office) and requesting an appoint-

ment to apply. However, by far the most efficient way to apply is online at [www.ssa.gov/applyforbenefits](http://www.ssa.gov/applyforbenefits).  
Here's a link to a short video about applying online: [https://www.ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim\\_r01.htm](https://www.ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim_r01.htm). To do the online application, you will first need to create your personal "my Social Security" online account, which is easy to do at [www.ssa.gov/myaccount](http://www.ssa.gov/myaccount).  
When you have that online account set up, you will see your estimated benefit amounts at several ages. You'll see that if you claim at age 62, your benefit will be 30% less than it would be at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67 (a permanent reduction), and you'll also see that your benefit at age 70 would be about 75% more than your benefit at age 62.  
Please also be aware that if you claim before your full retirement age and you continue to work, Social Security has a limit for how much you can earn before they take

away some of your benefits. The 2022 earnings limit is not yet known, but it will be something a bit more than the 2021 limit of \$18,960. If you exceed the annual limit, Social Security will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit (half of what you exceed the limit by). The earnings limit goes up by over 2.5 times in the year you reach your full retirement age and goes away entirely once FRA is attained.

Finally, your Social Security benefits may be subject to income tax if your combined income from all sources is high enough. The thresholds depend on your IRS filing status — if you file as "married/jointly" and your combined income (yours and your husband's) is more than \$32,000, then 50% of your SS benefits for the tax year becomes part of your taxable income. If your combined income as a married couple is more

than \$44,000 then up to 85% of your SS benefits will be taxable. The thresholds are less if you file your taxes as a single — in that case income over \$25,000 means 50% of your SS benefits are taxable, and income over \$34,000 means up to 85% of your benefits will be taxed at whatever your normal IRS tax rate is.

# Cranberries: The smart choice

Like most people I look forward to celebrating the holidays with family, friends and, of course, the great food! But to me, the holiday meals aren't complete without the vibrant, versatile, red cranberry.

Love them or not, cranberries definitely add some sass to any holiday meal. And while many people associate cranberries only with the holidays, there are several good reasons to consume them year-round.

So in today's post, we look at the health benefits of cranberries and how you can incorporate them into your healthy diet.

Now a popular super food due to its high antioxidant content, the humble cranberry has a unique and colorful history. Native to the swamps and bogs of the Northeast, Native Americans used cranberries as blood purifiers, laxatives, a remedy for upset stomachs, a food source and even as a textile dye.

And today, my favorite ruby-red beauties are also used for preventing cardiovascular disease, decreasing inflammation, improving immune and digestive function and may help ward off Alzheimer's disease and reduce brain damage after a stroke.

In this country someone dies from Alzheimer's disease every 65 seconds. However, a promising line of research suggests that ursolic acid found in cranberries may help protect brain cells from wasting away and also delay age-related cognitive decline.

And if you're one of the 40% of Americans suffering from high cholesterol, cranberries may be able to help there, too. According to a 2019 systematic review published in the National Library of Medicine, the polyphenols contained in cranberries can help lower (HDL) cholesterol levels and blood pressure, too! Just drinking two cups of low-calorie cranberry juice a day increases levels of good cholesterol, lowers bad cholesterol levels and also improves blood-sugar levels. However, please consult your health care practitioner before making any changes to your medication.

And if you're looking to drop a few pounds (and who isn't?), Stephanie Middleberg, R.D. states

cranberries are a a great source of fiber. As you know, fiber helps prevent blood-sugar swings, prevents bloating and constipation.

And here's something I didn't know — due to their high antiviral and antibacterial properties, cranberries are the perfect food to help cleanse your liver! So, no need to worry about drinking that extra glass of wine or vodka over the holidays!

While eating raw cran-

berries is definitely an acquired taste, my chef sister says that incorporating the versatile cranberries into your favorite recipes is easier and tastier than you think. For example, she uses cranberries in pancakes, puts a dab of cranberry butter on top and tops it off with cranberry maple syrup. I put dried cranberries in stuffing and it was so delicious! I don't know why it took me so long to do that!

My sister also suggests adding a new flavor element to your favorite cut of meat: Top a nice sirloin steak or pork chop with grilled onions, blue cheese crumbles and cranberries. Yummy!

So go grab yourself a bag of fresh cranberries and start the journey to a healthier you!

### Cashless tolling begins Nov. 1 on RVWBridge

CATSKILL — Cashless tolling will go into effect on the Rip Van Winkle Bridge beginning Nov. 1.

The New York State Bridge Authority announced Wednesday that electronic gantries installed at the bridge over the summer will go live at midnight on the morning of Nov. 1, enabling drivers to pass through the tolls without stopping.

“Motorists will experience non-stop travel under gantries with state-of-the-art sensors and cameras that read E-ZPass tags and take license plate images,” according to a statement released by the Bridge Authority on Wednesday.

Vehicles with E-ZPass tags will pay the toll as they drive under the gantry, which will read their tag and deduct the toll amount from their account. Drivers without E-ZPass will be billed by mail after their license plate is photographed by the gantry.

Construction on the gantries began July 13 and has continued through the fall. After installation, the gantries underwent testing to ensure smooth operation.

All five bridges under the jurisdiction of the New York State Bridge Authority are shifting to cashless tolling.

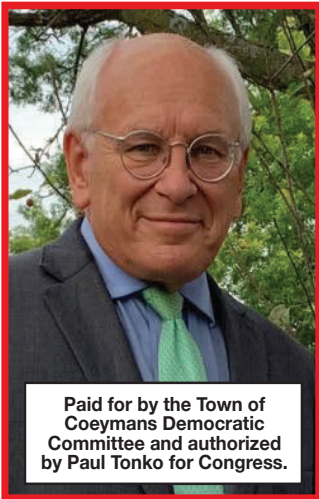

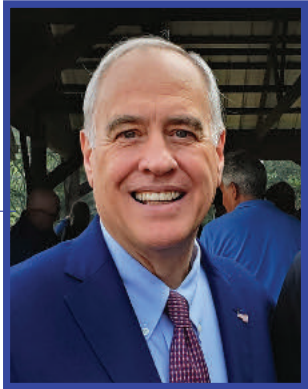

- Review your Medicare claims – When you receive statements from Medicare, look them over to make sure they’re accurate. Watch for any services billed to your Medicare Number that you don’t recognize. Ask questions about your statements if you see something you think is incorrect.

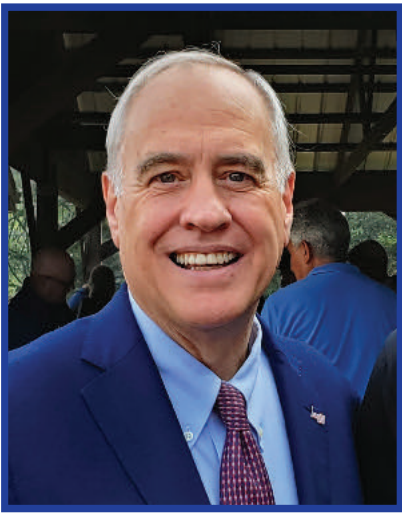
