## Top 5 Stories of 2021

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** As 2021 comes to a close, it's time to take a look back at the victories and challenges that faced our communities.

When looking for the top stories of the year, we considered issues that had the most impact, that moved our communities forward or challenged them in new ways, and stories that changed how we live. Below are the top five stories of 2021.

### 1: COVID PANDEMIC

The COVID-19 pandemic was unrelenting in 2021, though many of the features of the outbreak that marred 2020 — economic shutdowns, canceled graduation ceremonies and sports seasons, a move to fully remote classrooms and so on — were largely absent this year.

But that didn't mean the pandemic was over. Far from it. The year started on a hopeful note, with vaccines to fight the virus launching in December 2020 to select groups, such as health care workers.

Below left, vaccines early in 2021 and boosters late in the year were among the top tools health experts advised to fight the continuing COVID-19 pandemic.



The availability of vaccines became more widespread in early 2021, and by spring all adults were eligible, though vaccines for children ages 5-11 would not be approved until late in the year.

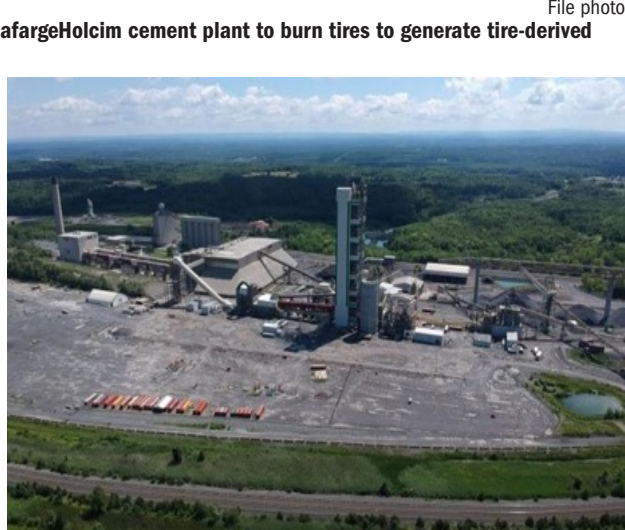
After a winter surge early in 2021, virus infections slowed dramatically for a time, but the decrease in cases was short lived, picking up again when the delta variant became the prominent variant worldwide and led to a sharp

increase in cases and, once again, deaths.

Booster shots became available to all late in the year and are now viewed by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and other health experts as one of the most important tools in fighting the latest variant of the virus, omicron.

Face masks came and went for the most part in 2021. While mask mandates from the state let up over the summer and

since the outbreak began, according to Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy.

**2: RCS INDIANS CHAMPIONSHIP**

Among the biggest local stories of 2021 was the Section 2 Class B championship run of the RCS Indians' varsity football team.

The Indians team captured the imagination of the community, making its first championship run

since 2004 and getting to within one game of the state finals in Syracuse.

The team was on a tear in the postseason, defeating the Peru Nighthawks by a 39-21 score to make it to the state semifinals before being defeated by the Pleasantville Panthers in a game that was close all four quarters.

In the regular season, the Indians had a 10-2

former planning and zoning board of appeals member Marisa Tutay is expected to be appointed to the town council at the Jan. 1 swearing-in ceremony.

Tutay will replace Town Councilman Zachary Collins, who will leave the board effective Dec. 31 to move on to the Albany County Legislature.

The town board accepted Collins' resignation at the Dec. 23 meeting.

"This is a bittersweet moment for me because we ran together in 2019 and won together, and I think I have talked to you twice a day every day since then," Town Supervisor George McHugh told Collins. "It's bittersweet in that I will miss you terribly here because you were a great asset to this board and this town, but it's sweet in a way because you will move on to the county level and will be a great asset to us there."

Collins, a Republican, won the vacant seat on the Albany County Legislature in the November general election and resigned his post on the town council in a letter dated Dec. 1.

His seat on the board is expected to be filled by Tutay, who will be sworn in to office Jan. 1, McHugh said.

"Marisa has been on the planning board for a couple of years now and when we had a vacancy — when [former Town Councilman] Kenny Burns left — she was one of two folks that we had entertained appointing to the board, the other person being Linda Bruno," McHugh said. "It was one of the hardest decisions we had to make for sure, but at that time we knew that Marisa was definitely

## Town, state officials honor champion Indians

**COEYMANS** — Town and state officials put an exclamation point on the RCS Indians football season Thursday with a quartet of awards honoring the team's accomplishments.

The varsity team became the first Indians squad since 2004 to become the Section 2 Class B champions and came to within one game of making it to the state finals in Syracuse

in November.

"It's always thrilling, with a great group of kids to put an exclamation point on the season," Head Coach Gary VanDerzee said of the team's winning season.

Town officials presented the coaches and players with four plaques and proclamations at the Dec. 23 meeting of the town council.

"What a great season you had," Town Supervisor George McHugh told the athletes and coaches seated in the audience. "We are very proud of you, certainly as a town board and as a community. It was the talk of the town for several weeks. You deserve the accolades and the recognition. We are very hopeful that you can do it again next year and hope you enjoyed it."

The coaching staff — VanDerzee, Defensive Coordinator Michael Ker-

rigan and Offensive Coordinator Bob Dorrance — joined town officials as the awards were read and presented by each of the town board members in attendance.


"I can't think of somebody who is a bigger cheerleader for RCS in the community — no matter which sport — [Head Coach Gary] VanDerzee

record. The team had a place of honor on a float in the Christmas parade in December and was honored by both the village and town at the end of the year for their accomplishments on the field.

It was a season the team — and community — won't soon forget.

### 3: LAFARGE TIRE-DERIVED FUEL

An ongoing controversy in Coeymans for the past couple of years has been plans by the Lafarge-Holcim cement plant on Route 9W to burn tires to create tire-derived fuel, with the state forcing a change in May of this year.

In 2019 the town council, under a former administration, adopted stricter environmental and emissions regulations under the Clean Air Law in a split vote. The law was first proposed in 2018 and put limits on how much the plant's kiln could burn and put emissions over-

sight under the control of town officials. Lafarge had been issued a permit back in 2006 from the state Department of Environmental Conservation but had not yet begun burning tires.

In 2020, the new town council administration enacted an amendment to the Clean Air Law in November, modifying the law and putting responsibility for regulating emissions into the hands of state and federal officials.

The amendment became moot in May 2021 when the DEC withdrew authorization for the plant to burn tires for fuel.

"The Lafarge facility currently lacks the infrastructure to burn TDF (tire-derived fuel), and has not, nor has it ever, completed the steps necessary to burn tires pursuant to this permit," DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said in a May 2021 statement.

"DEC uses every tool at our disposal to ensure all of New York's communities are protected," Seggos

said. "That is our goal and what drives everything we do and why we rigorously review every permit application and require compliance with stringent standards using the latest and best available science to ensure public health and the environment are protected."

Environmental advocates lauded the DEC's withdrawal of the permit to burn tires as a victory.

### 4: GRITTY DUSTING

Several incidents of a "gritty dusting" that coated areas of the village caused concern among residents this year.

The substance, found most recently around Halloween weekend, was said to be difficult to wash off, Deputy Mayor Nancy Warner said in November.

In December, the DEC determined the substance found in Magnolia Circle around Oct. 31 was salt, but could not identify the source of the material.

"Our investigation into potential sources is ongoing," DEC Regional

Director Anthony Luisi wrote in a letter to Mayor Bill Misuraca.

While the DEC identified the substance as salt, Misuraca said in a December village board meeting that he wanted a "second opinion" should another dusting take place.

"Could some of it have been salt? Absolutely, clearly from the analysis — that's what it says," Misuraca said. "In other instances, I'm not so sure. So the next time this happens, I will probably recommend that the village bring in another — and I'm not saying anything is wrong with DEC's analysis — but I would love a second opinion because this is an important issue."

There have been no further dustings found in the community at press time Monday.

### 5: LANGDON RESIGNS

Albany County Legislator George Langdon, who represented Coeymans, resigned in April following controversial comments he made on

video about homosexuality at a March 27 seminar in Voorheesville.

The video, which was posted on YouTube, drew criticism from both sides of the political aisle and led to a rally in Albany and repeated calls for Langdon's resignation.

In the video, Langdon stated: "This whole gender issue. Everything God does is sustainable. It's sustainable. It goes on and on and on. It's perpetual. Sorry, when you have homosexual relationships, it's not perpetual. Give them an island — they'll be gone after 40 years. God created us to be this way. There's so much common sense that needs to be applied to our policies, our procedures, the things that we do in our government."

After the furor erupted, Langdon issued an apology.

"I sincerely apologize to the LGBTQ community and all others for the hurtful remarks recently made at a conference," Langdon said in April. "I have

never been homophobic nor do I think any individuals should be placed on an island. I deeply regret my foolish off-the-cuff comment that has caused so much pain. I commit to doing a better job of respecting diversity. I hope my years of past public service demonstrate genuine concern for all individuals. I will be taking time to reflect on how to best serve moving forward."

Advocates in the LGBTQ community and elected officials, such as Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy, said an apology is not enough and continued to demand Langdon's resignation.

Langdon resigned April 5 and former Albany County Legislator Rick Touchette, a Democrat, was appointed to the seat. Touchette did not run for election in November. The seat will be filled by Republican Zachary Collins, who won in the November general election and will take office Jan. 1.

Baker presented VanDerzee with an award from U.S. Rep. Paul Tonko, D-20.

Town Councilman Zachary Collins presented the team with a proclamation from state Sen. Michelle Hinchey, D-46.

"Head Coach Gary VanDerzee and all members of the coaching staff worked hard to hone the skills of this championship team, teaching these outstanding athletes les-

sons which will prove invaluable both on and off the field," Collins read from the proclamation.

"Proudly donning the school's colors of green and yellow, family and friends and the community at large loyally and enthusiastically supported the Indians throughout their journey as they ended their season with an impressive 10 and 3 overall record," Collins continued.

Town Councilwoman Linda Bruno presented a plaque from Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple.

"Congratulations on a great 2021 season from all the residents of Albany County," Bruno read from the plaque.

McHugh presented the players and coaches with a proclamation from the town.

"The RCS 2021-2022 varsity football team

gave their community the gift of pride and spirit and became the Section 2 Class B champions. Battling injuries, tough opponents and the pandemic, RCS showed us how to persevere and come out on top," McHugh read. "We want the team to know just how much their community appreciates the example of sportsmanship and leadership they have given us."

**Town gives out COVID at-home tests, masks**

COEYMANS — As COVID-19 infections surge with the spread of the omicron variant, town officials handed out hundreds of face masks and at-home test kits last Friday.

Town Supervisor George McHugh and Town Councilman Daniel Baker were at town hall for two hours on the morning of Dec. 24, distributing KN95 face masks and at-home antigen rapid test kits from iHealth, which received Emergency Use Authorization from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration during the pandemic.

“We gave out 78 boxes of tests, which is actually double that because there are two tests per kit, so we gave out a total of 156 tests,” McHugh said Friday. “We gave out about 250 masks.”

The test kits and face masks were provided by a joint effort of Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy and Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple.

“The omicron variant continues to drive up our infection rate in Albany County, and I’m proud to partner with Sheriff Apple and municipal leaders to distribute masks and at-home test kits to control the spread of the virus,” McCoy said. “Our cities, towns and villages will be responsible for getting 138,000 KN95 masks and more than 10,000 test kits out to the general public and I look forward to continuing to work with Gov. [Kathy] Hochul and the state to secure even more test kits for future distributions in the near future.”

The masks and test kits were provided by the county at no cost to

the town or to residents, McHugh said.

Some supplies were left over when the giveaway concluded Friday, so the town is expecting to distribute more.

“We still have some more left and we will do this again after Christmas, and we are hoping to get more in the coming weeks,” McHugh said. “As we get more, we will continue to hand them out.”

The at-home test kits enable users to test themselves from home and get a result in 15 minutes.

“You swab the lower part of your nose, both nostrils. There is a fluid that you put in [the tube] and then you put the swab inside and close it,” Baker explained. “Then 15 minutes later it will read either positive or negative. It’s very easy to follow.”

McHugh urged residents to take the continuing pandemic seriously and take precautions to help prevent the spread of the virus.

“Everybody should recognize that we are surging right now and that vaccinations are very important, as are tests and the use of masks,” McHugh said. “Everybody wants this to be over as soon

as possible, but I think that unless we are diligent with the masks and with prevention, it’s not going to be over anytime soon so we need to continue to be diligent and work towards getting more vaccinations out there and making people aware of how bad this is.”

As of Friday, Albany County reported a total of 38,668 confirmed cases of the virus since the beginning of the pandemic, with 332 new cases identified between Thursday and Friday, according to McCoy, and the county’s seven-day average of new daily positive cases was 242.4. There were 1,057 active cases in the county on Friday, with 2,002 individuals under mandatory quarantine and 55 hospitalizations due to COVID-19, with five of those patients in the intensive-care unit. There have been 469 deaths due to the virus in the county since the outbreak began.

“Everybody needs to understand that this is very serious,” Baker said. “It is not going away — it’s going to be with us, so people need to recognize the symptoms. If you have symptoms, try to get tested and stay home to limit the spread.”

## Ways to reduce textile waste

Summer has long gone and Jack Frost is knocking at our doors, signaling winter's arrival as we put on jackets, sweaters and gloves.

Changing seasons and changing trends spark closet clean outs, buying new items, or both. Fashion's impacts are important to keep in mind though since, according to the UN Alliance for Sustainable Fashion, the clothing and textile industry is responsible for approximately 2% to 8% of the world's greenhouse gas emissions, according to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

In the United States, textile waste is one of the fastest growing waste streams with the average person throwing away 81 pounds of clothing each year. While we recycle around 15% of post-consumer textiles, 85% ends up as waste in landfills and incinerators. Many of these materials can be reused or recycled providing social, environmental, and economic benefits.

To help reduce textile waste and the impact it has on the planet, try these tips and tricks:

### TAKE CARE:

- Check fabric care labels. Washing and drying according to care instructions helps cloth-

ing last longer, improves color retention, and decreases the chances of an item shrinking.

- Protect delicate or favorite items from stretching or tangling by using a garment bag. Some garment bags also double as microfiber catchers.

- Make sure zippers, buttons, and other clasps are closed to reduce friction and catching on other clothing.

### REPAIR

- Have a stain? Check how to best treat the material and type of stain. Some stains require cold water while others require hot. Pretreating stains before washing can also help with stain removal.

- Loose hem but no time to fix it? Double sided tape can help secure it in a hurry.

- Become part of the #RepairRevolution. Visit a Repair Café near you for help mending certain items.

### RECYCLE

- Textiles recycling is best utilized for items that no longer have a useful life.

- Items can be dropped off for textiles recycling in any condition (torn, worn, stained, missing buttons, broken zippers, shoe without a mate,

etc.) as long as they are clean, dry and odorless.

- Find a textiles recycling location near you. Locations on this list either accept textiles for recycling, donation or both, so it's best to check what types of items are accepted in advance.

- Due to the pandemic, it's important to call a location prior to your arrival. Textiles recycling or donation locations in your area may not be currently accepting items and/or may have new protocols in place. If you can't find an outlet for your items right now, hold on to the items if possible until options reopen.

### WHEN BUYING CLOTHING

- Choose timeless over trendy when possible.

You'll be less likely to want to buy something new when styles change.

- Shop secondhand at local thrift and consignment shops.

There are also several online retailers that focus on secondhand clothing.

- Takeback and repair programs: If buying new, check to see if the retailer offers a takeback program or repair options for their clothing.

You may also want to investigate whether the retailer uses sustainable practices when manufacturing their products.

an up-and-comer and we knew that when there was another vacancy it wouldn't be very difficult for us to make that decision.

"With Zach's resignation effective Dec. 31 and moving on to the county, it's going to leave a vacancy, at which time Marisa Nunziato Tutay will be appointed Jan. 1 to fill that vacancy on the town board," McHugh said. "That is why she is leaving the planning/zoning board of appeals."

Tutay is a lifelong resident of the town and lives on the western edge of the town with her husband and three children, on property the Tutay family has owned for over 100 years, McHugh said. She is a 1987 graduate of the Ravenna-Coeymans-Selkirk school district and has a bachelor's degree in elementary education from The College of Saint Rose and a mas-

ter's degree from SUNY Albany.

Tutay has been teaching for 31 years and currently works as a curriculum content specialist for math and science and a math interventionist at A.W. Becker Elementary School in Selkirk. Before coming to work in the RCS district, Tutay taught elementary school in the Guilderland district for 12 years.

She has taught religious education at St. Patrick's Church and has volunteered with the Coeymans Hollow Volunteer Fire Corporation's Ladies Auxiliary, having served as both president and vice president. She has also volunteered with Riverfest for two years and was a member of the advisory panel to the town board for the Clean Air Act.

Town Clerk Cindy Rowzee bid farewell to the town board at the Dec. 23 meeting. She ran unsuccessfully for town supervisor in the Novem-

ber election and will be replaced by Laura Jane Barry, who was elected to the position last month.

"Since this is my last meeting, I would like to say what a pleasure it has been to serve the residents of Coeymans these past four years," Rowzee said.

Rowzee said she and her deputy clerk, Bonnie Keyer, worked hard for the town.

"We definitely left the office in better shape than we found it," Rowzee said. "In the past four years, we have gone through hundreds of boxes of records, gotten rid of over 250 boxes of obsolete records, we have organized and scanned and modernized the office. We have cut costs and you need much fewer staff than we did before in that office. It has been very rewarding work and I am glad I have had this opportunity."

The town's swearing-in ceremony for incoming officials will be held Jan. 1 at 9 a.m. at town hall.

## Amaryllis: A family tradition

It was a relatively mild, late fall, and the weather is just starting to brisk up. No significant snowfall or ice to speak of and some unseasonably warm and windy days last week, as well. I know this because I stream the local Albany news from here in sunny Florida.

I try to keep up with your weather, but I certainly don't miss it! I am very happy to be wearing a T-shirt and spending at least two days a week boating on the Gulf of Mexico.

Years ago I began a family tradition during gift-giving season that continues to this day and has become greatly cherished in my family.

Every year I get an amaryllis bulb for my daughter, who lives in sunny Florida. She plants them outside in her backyard and they bloom outdoors faithfully for her every year. They are not at all hardy in our region and must be kept indoors when temperatures drop below 50 or 60. Most amaryllis plants are more correctly called "Hippeastrum." There are more than 90 species and 600 cultivars.

These true bulbs were brought to Europe in the 1700s and have been known to bloom for up to 75 years. These beautiful plants produce from one to several huge, brilliant colored, lily-like flowers on a single, sturdy flower stalk. The flowers may be as large as 10 inches in diameter and they come in various shades of red, white, orange, pink or striped combinations of these colors. When the flower stalk appears, it grows so rapidly, you can almost see it grow! The warmer the environment, the

quicker they grow and the flowers generally last for about three weeks indoors.

Amaryllis bulbs are sold in several different sizes. Most are as large as an orange or even bigger. In general, the larger the bulb, the bigger and more numerous the flowers. Prices may range for less than \$10 from a big box store to \$25 or more for a really spectacular bulb. I suggest you start your shopping at a local garden center. You can also order them by mail order from several companies, but with supply issues being a problem this winter, it might be better to try to buy it in person.

The bulbs take about a month to come into full bloom if the bulb is completely dormant when purchased. If one is started now, it will be in bloom during the dark days of February, when most northerners are in desperate need of something pretty to look at!

Buy the biggest bulb you can afford. Most amaryllis bulbs will come pre-potted in a plastic or clay pot. They like to be root bound, so it is not necessary to repot them every year. After three or four years you may need to repot.

Within a few days

to a week after the initial watering, the bulb should sprout a flowering stalk that will grow very quickly. Within a month the huge flower buds will open and you will be treated to a spectacular display! Cut the individual flowers off with a sharp knife as they fade and keep the plant in full sun or shade when forced such as this. When all the flowers have faded, cut off the flowering stalk near the base of the bulb. Long, strap-like leaves should appear next. Keep the soil moist and apply a houseplant fertilizer about once a month while the leaves are growing. Provide as much sunlight as possible.

Many people put them outside in a full sun location during the summer. When the foliage begins to turn yellow and die back, omit the fertilizer and cut back on the watering. Although a cold period is not required to re-bloom, many gardeners put the bulb in a cool basement after the leaves begin to turn yellow.

About one month before the desired bloom time cut back the leaves to within an inch of the bulb. Water, drain and put the pot in a sunny location to repeat the flowering cycle. You will need to buy a bigger pot about every other year if all goes well. It is not unusual for amaryllis bulbs to last as long as 50 years with proper care.

My daughter's amaryllis collection is becoming pretty impressive after so many years and I hope they remain as important to her, as giving them to her is to me.

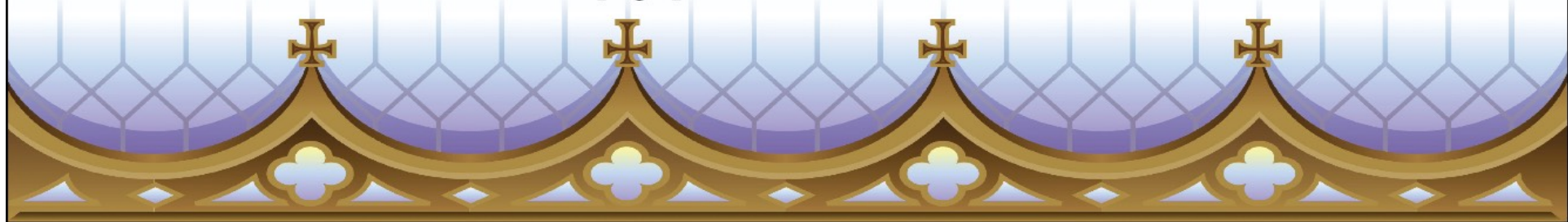

# AG: Report price gouging of COVID test kits, other in-demand items

NEW YORK – New York Attorney General Letitia James issued a consumer alert to New Yorkers concerning potential price gouging of over-the-counter COVID-19 testing products for at-home use, as well as other in-demand essential products.

The alert comes in light of a surge of COVID-19 cases due to the omicron variant, which has resulted in the rise of New Yorkers seeking to use at-home testing kits.

“As New York sees an exponential rise in COVID-19 cases, more and more New Yorkers are looking for at-home tests and other tools in the fight against the coronavirus,” James said. “If New Yorkers see exorbitant price increases on testing kits or other goods vital and necessary for health, safety and welfare, they

are encouraged to report it to my office immediately. And fraudsters are on notice that if they attempt to price gouge during this new surge, we will not hesitate to take action.”

The Office of Attorney General (OAG) has received complaints of COVID-19 testing products being sold at double or triple their retail price. A standard BinaxNOW brand test kit at a New York store costs appropriately between \$14 and \$25 for a package of two tests, however there have been alleged reports of the same products being unlawfully sold for more than \$40 and up to \$70 per package.

New York law prohibits merchants from taking unfair advantage of consumers by selling goods or services that are vital to their health, safety or welfare for an “uncon-

scionably excessive” price. An excessive price would be represented by a gross disparity between the price of the product immediately prior to and after such an occurrence.

Last year, a law was passed that substantially strengthened James’ ability to bring charges against individuals and entities violating New York state’s price gouging statute, as they sought to excessively increase prices on essential goods and services during pandemics or other emergencies.

The OAG continues to monitor entities across the state for deceptive practices and price gouging schemes.

Any New Yorker who is aware of or believes that they have been the victim of price gouging is encouraged to file a complaint online or call 800-771-7755.

## McCoy announces first of its kind HS equivalency program

ALBANY — Albany County Executive Daniel P. McCoy recently announced a new program that will allow individuals engaged with the Albany County Department of Probation the educational opportunities necessary for easy access to earn their High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma.

The new criminal justice initiative is a partnership between the County Executive's Office, the County Probation Department, Capital Region BOCES, the Capital District Educational Opportunity Center and the State University of New York.

Partners gathered at the County Probation Department in Albany to cut the ribbon on the state-of-the-art computer lab and classroom that participants will utilize.

"Albany County is constantly asking the question, what prevents someone on probation from starting a career and making better choices?" McCoy said. "Today, we're answering that with one word: Education. There's an \$8,000 median salary difference between those with high school diplomas and those without. On top of that, there is an average 52% loss of earning because of a history of incarceration."

The goal is to provide individuals with easy access to education to improve access to the job market and a higher standard of living.

"This program, the first of its kind that enlists BOCES, will help to break the cycle of those involved in the criminal justice system who are trapped in low-paying jobs and struggling to get their lives back on

track, and ultimately prevent future crime. What's more — we already have more than 100 individuals interested in getting their diplomas," McCoy continued.

There are currently 307 Albany County probationers who lack a high school diploma, representing approximately 24% of the total eligible population engaged with the County Probation Department.

A survey conducted determined that 105 of these probationers are interested in participating in a program at the department to earn their High School Equivalency diplomas.

The program will require a minimum of 10 to 12 hours per week once started. An educational assessment will be conducted at the beginning of the course to determine the level of schooling that will be required to complete the course, which could take anywhere between three months to a year for participants to complete.

The program will officially launch Jan. 5.

"I want to thank County Executive Dan McCoy for his vision to embrace new ideas in community corrections, along with my Probation staff and our partners at BOCES and the EOC who helped bring this new policy to fruition. Many probationers find their court mandated employment unsatisfying, so we wanted to create a system that provides greater opportunities for stable and reliable employment, which can often come from education. This can deter individuals from negative

choices and reduce their chances of recidivism," said Albany County Probation Department Director Bill Connors.

"This is another great example of how Capital Region BOCES and Albany County partner to bring services to County residents," said Joseph P. Dragone, Capital Region BOCES Senior Executive Officer. "We're excited to continue to expand our program locations and bring services to areas where they are most needed."

Fifteen workstations equipped with computers provided by the county will be available in the classroom, with one being designated for use by an on-site teacher. These computers will be available for students to complete assignments or to remotely access services provided by the Capital District Education Opportunity Center.

BOCES programming will be staffed by a certified teacher provided by Capital Region BOCES, as well as the program coordinator.

As this programming will be scheduled for late day, possibly into the evening hours, BOCES and the EOC will provide all testing and instructional materials. The County Probation Department will provide the classroom space, computers and internet service for students to access educational resources.

The classroom will be available three days/nights per week for BOCES instruction, and EOC students will access the classroom during regular business hours for remote instruction.

# Ruso: Infrastructure funding, expertise sorely needed

ALBANY — Funding and expertise for water and sewer infrastructure are sorely needed in New Baltimore and other area communities, New Baltimore Town Supervisor Jeff Ruso told lawmakers at a legislative forum hosted by state Sen. Michelle Hinchey, D-46.

The forum focused on examining the challenges facing New York communities with regard to drinking water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure.

A bipartisan panel of state legislators spoke with representatives from local government, labor, environmental and conservation groups, and professional associations to identify long-term solutions for the infrastructure issues facing communities.

Ruso spoke of a major water main break that affected a small group of New Baltimore water users, but cost hundreds of thousands of dollars to repair.

“On the evening of June 1, 2020, right in the middle of the [COVID-19] pandemic, I got a call late at night because we had a water main break for our District 2,” Ruso said. “District 2 serves 32 homes. District 2 gets its water from the village

of Coxsackie, who bills the town, and we in turn bill the users. The water main break was under the New York State Thruway, southbound lane. In the middle of the pandemic, in the middle of the night, the break could not have been in a worse place or a worse time.”

The town declared a state of emergency, brought in tankers to provide water to the residents, and the break — which also damaged the Thruway roadway — took months to fix.

“We replaced the pipe — it was 100-plus-years-old. It cost \$330,000 for 32 users. That’s a lot of money, and of course my constituents are none too happy,” Ruso said.

The only section of the pipe that was replaced was under the Thruway, so the remaining century-old pipe — still underground on both sides of the thoroughfare — remains.

“I can’t imagine how much longer that will last,” Ruso said, adding it would take another \$500,000 or so to replace the rest of the 100-year-old pipe.

The infrastructure problems plaguing New Baltimore and communities like it include paying for repairing or replacing old or damaged systems, as well as the expertise to resolve the issues.

“We need funding and

we need expertise,” Ruso said.

Athens Village Mayor Amy Serrago also addressed the legislative panel and detailed similar problems.

“The majority of our water and sewer mains date back to the 1930s and are in need of replacement,” Serrago said. “We still have lead pipes in our system and a few clay pipes. Most of our pipes are made of cast iron and they are decaying. In addition, because of years of build-up inside them, most 6-inch pipes now have a capacity of only 3 inches to carry water. We routinely face water main breaks, approximately six in the last year, and last night, after I sent in my testimony, I was informed that we are aware that we have a leak right now. We don’t know when, but it’s coming — it will bust through and we will patch it up like we always do, but we are on watch.”

Athens also has a unique problem — in some areas of the village, water and sewer pipes are “inches apart from one another,” Serrago said.

“Modern standards for separation of these conveyances is a minimum of 10 feet,” she told the panel, adding that the risk of contamination is high, but it costs roughly \$250 a foot to replace water and

sewer mains.

Hinchey said the testimony of officials like Ruso and Serrago will be used to draft a Senate report detailing the biggest issues, as well as potential solutions.

“Access to clean water is a fundamental right, but in communities across New York state, that access is under constant threat by aging and, in many cases, decaying 100-plus-year-old infrastructure due to decades of underinvestment,” Hinchey said. “The state of New York’s water infrastructure has led to severe illness, furthered the climate crisis, increased the cost of living, and hurled many local governments into debt.”

Clean water should be accessible to all New Yorkers, she said.

“Our communities cannot endure another decade of underinvestment in our water systems, and it’s incumbent upon us to deliver real, meaningful progress to address these detrimental and often avoidable problems,” the state senator said.

Environmental advocacy group Riverkeeper estimates the 46th Senate District, which includes Coeymans, Ravena and all of Greene County, would need nearly \$80 million for water infrastructure repairs.

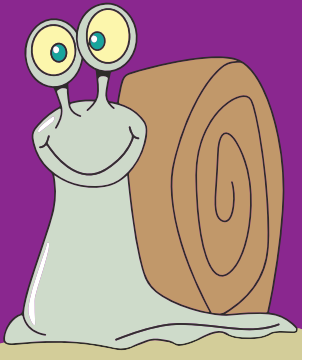

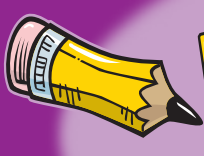

What do you want to be when you grow up? HVAC technicians help keep us warm when it's cold and cool when it's hot!

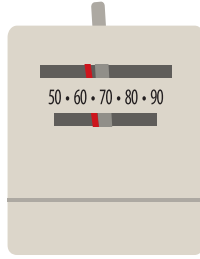
Does your classroom or home have a heater and/or an air conditioner? If so, you can thank an HVAC technician!

HVAC stands for Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning.

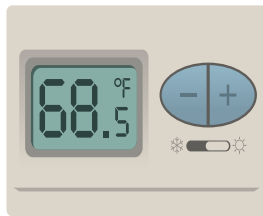
An HVAC technician installs, repairs, and maintains heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems that control the temperature and air quality in buildings.

If your home has central heating or air conditioning, you probably have something in your house called a thermostat. The **thermostat** is where you can change the temperature in your house.

The word thermostat comes from two ancient Greek words: *thermo* (meaning heat) and *statos* (meaning to stay the same). A thermostat is something that "keeps heat the same."



Thermostats come in different shapes and sizes. Do you see one on the wall of your home or classroom?

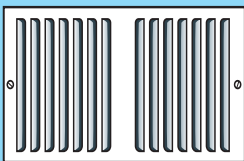


Newer thermostats can save energy (and money) by being programmed to only turn on heating or cooling systems when needed.

**Warning:** Your HVAC system uses a lot of energy. You probably have seen the thermostat that can change the temperature of your home or classroom. Only change the thermostat settings when you have permission from an adult.

## What is ventilation?

Ventilation is the movement of air in a house or building. An example of ventilation is a window open in a house. But sometimes the air outside is too cold or too hot to open the window. HVAC systems circulate fresh air in a building while keeping the temperature comfortable.

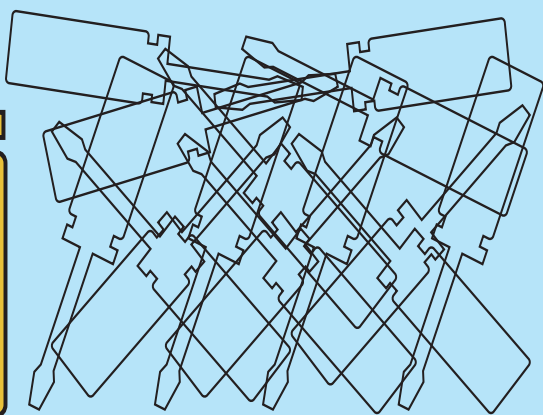

# TCI NY committed to community every day

Investing in Coeymans, creating new jobs, and helping those with need

During the height of the Covid pandemic last summer, TCI NY was deemed an essential industry for New York state and was allowed to stay open. Their customers are the power companies and utilities that keep our lights on. This little-known company located right here in our back yard is making a big impact.

"We were fortunate to remain open, but it was a challenging time for everyone not knowing the outcome of the pandemic and working to keep people safe," says Brian Hemlock, President TCI NY. "We decided to continue moving forward expanding our business and increasing efforts in the community to help people with need."

### Investing in Coeymans and Creating New Jobs

TCI's first plant in Coeymans opened on September 14, 2014, and the company hasn't looked back since. Last August TCI built a new expansion facility a 35,000 square foot, state of the art addition that added new capability to the existing plant. New jobs were created. Jobs that used to go out of state were brought to Coeymans.

"When we came to Coeymans, we only had 10 employees. Now we have 40 and as far as we are concerned, this is only the beginning," said Mr. Hemlock. "We have a philosophy to promote from within. This shows our people they can move up through hard work."

Brett Margiasso came to TCI through the Albany BOCES program affiliated with RCS High School. He interned two years ago, was hired full time and now is responsible for offloading all the trucks containing transformers.

"It's a huge responsibility," says John Barr, Operations Manager. "Brett inspects the product and determines what can be salvaged and repurposed. It can be very demanding. He is twenty years old."

"The expansion shows when local government and industry work together, there is nothing we cannot achieve," said George McHugh, Coeymans' Town Supervisor. "The result of this collaboration is good paying jobs with benefits to employees, many of whom are Coeymans residents."

Tom Bronchetti, TCI's Controller says, "Our operation is beneficial to the regional economy through our employment, tax payments and spending with other local businesses. TCI pays a living wage with strong benefits."

Providing jobs in the community promotes growth and stability for all of those who live in the area. The company pays approximately \$75,000 per year in local taxes, and spends more than \$250,000 annually with local businesses, from grocery stores and diners to gas stations and hardware stores.

### Recycling and the Environment

"We strongly believe in our obligations to our neighbors and to our community," says Mr. Hemlock. "We are committed to operating our business in a manner that is safe, unobtrusive to our neighbors and protective of the environment."

Today, 99% of all the materials from transformers are recycled, re-purposed or refurbished. It used to all go into landfills. It is a true American success story. One that has benefitted many lives and protects the environment.

### Hard Hat meets Textbook

TCI works with RCS High School to create good paying internships

that can lead to full time jobs upon graduating from high school. The company awards scholarships to RCS High School Seniors, supports the school's drama and athletic programs.

"We decided to pay students because they do a great job and deserve to be compensated," Mr. Hemlock says. "We require the students to keep their grades up while working here."

Lisa Patierne, Principal at RCS, said, "It's a great partnership and a great opportunity for students who elect not to go to college. TCI gives these students worked based learning opportunities through internships that can lead to a promising career."

### Committed to Community

During the challenging summer months last year, TCI stepped up to sponsor the Kindness for Kids Summer lunch program, which provides thousands of lunches to kids with need. TCI and its employees also work with the Hope Full Life Center Blessing Bags, Helping Harvest, VFW Post 9594, RCS Library, Ravenna Rescue Squad, Historical Society, and the Ravenna Friendship Festival.

Every year TCI assists the Riverview Baptist Church annual Block party, youth programs and summer camp. The campers learned how TCI built its state-of-the-art facilities and how electrical transformers are recycled. They meet administration and operations staff, some of whom are family members and neighbors of the campers.

Pastor Roxanne Booth said, "It's important for our kids to see what's on display at TCI. It is a national company proud to be in Coeymans and a successful, growing business operation. Plus, the folks at TCI make it a fun excursion."



### Training Center

TCI goes to the utilities with specialized trailers to pick up transformers and then off loads them at the plant where they go onto highly modernized production lines to separate the materials. The process requires highly skilled workers who are trained and educated. There needs to be strict attention to detail. It has been challenging finding people to fill the slots.

"Many businesses including ours are struggling to find the workers to run our operations," says Mr. Hemlock. "I felt we needed to do something drastic and decided a training center was essential to creating a sustainable pipeline of workers for our businesses."

Mr. Hemlock approach Carver Laraway from Carver Companies to partner on a new initiative. The Joint Training and Certification Center is now in the development stage to provide training and job opportunities to underserved communities in the region.

"What will make the JTC Center unique is the combination of paid internships, multiple certifications and upon successful completion of the program a guaranteed job offer," said Mr. Hemlock.

The company is committed to Coeymans and will continue to invest in the community with further expansion plans in the works.

## Student to represent NYS in U.S. Senate Youth Program

BETHLEHEM — He is a published author, a podcaster and a political enthusiast who just happens to still be in high school.

Now Henry Reichman, a junior at Bethlehem Central High School, is about to spend time with the president of the United States, members of Congress, and a justice of the Supreme Court as part of a prestigious national scholarship and leadership program known as the United States Senate Youth Program.

The U.S. Senate Youth Program is an extremely competitive merit-based program for high school students who are interested in pursuing careers in public service. Two delegates from every state in the nation are selected to visit the nation's capital in March for an intensive week-long education program and are each awarded a \$10,000 scholarship to be used at a college or university of

their choice.

The program and its scholarships are funded by The Hearst Foundations.

Reichman is one of the two student delegates who will represent New York state in 2022. Due to the pandemic, this year's program will be held virtually. The delegates will still get to meet and learn from the highest level elected and appointed officials in Washington while attending briefings and meetings throughout the week.

Past delegates to the

United States Senate Youth Program include U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, U.S. Senator Susan Collins, Democratic National Committee Chair Jaime Harrison, and former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie.

"I really cannot wait for the actual week-long program in March," said Reichman, who said he has already met and befriended some other states' delegates from across the country in group chats online. "In March, I'll be very excited to meet some Cabinet members, a Supreme Court justice, and President Biden."

According to the district's Social Studies supervisor, Nick Petraccione, Reichman is one of only a handful of Capital Region students to be selected for the United States Senate Youth Program in its 60-year history.

"This is an incredible honor for Henry and for

our school district," said Petraccione, who helped Reichman navigate the application process. "You can count on one hand how many students in our area have earned the right to participate in this program since it began way back in 1962. This will be the second time for Bethlehem since 2012. We are very proud."

Reichman described the application process as "interesting and comprehensive."

"We were tasked with writing an essay on a topic of our choice; I did congressional ethics, analyzing the effects of how immoral stock trading and use of public funds affected voter apathy toward Congress," said Reichman. "After that, I had an interview, and I was then selected as one of two delegates."

Students must also demonstrate leadership within their school community. Reichman is involved in several

activities both at school and outside of school. Most notably, Reichman has published a book entitled "The Excitement Complex" about political enthusiasm, advocacy and activism.

"(In my book) I analyze the reasons why voters emotionally invest themselves into issues that don't directly impact their lives, and how to refine advocacy to be more effective," said Reichman. "It's available for purchase on Amazon and I'd love to hear feedback from anyone who checks it out."

If listening is more your style, you can also catch episodes of the podcast, "Generation Elect." Reichman hosts the show and has interviewed several nationally known figures including Sen. Doug Jones, presidential candidate Lawrence Lessig, and author Jonathan Haidt. The podcast features a panel of BCHS students who join Reich-

man to analyze current events and issues. In his free time, Reichman is a member of the high school's Debate Club. He also enjoys reading about 20th century history and plays jazz piano, performing at local restaurants as part of a group.

As far as the future goes, this high school junior has big plans that go well beyond voting in his first election in 2022.

"I very much plan to study political science and international relations (in college), perhaps with a minor in musical studies," Reichman said. "I want to branch out into many disciplines of public service and politics after that, working on campaign strategy, public policy for the National Department of Education, op-ed journalism and writing, perhaps academia."

"A cabinet position would be a long-shot, but a dream," said Reichman.



# Red Cross: Donate blood to help patients avoid delays in care

ALBANY — As holiday celebrations continue, concern is rising for the nation's blood supply, which has now dipped to concerning levels and could force hospitals to hold off on essential blood and platelet transfusions for patients.

Historically low blood supply levels not seen in more than a decade persist for the American Red Cross, which supplies about 40% of the nation's blood.

The ongoing decline comes at a time of year when donations typically fall. Holiday get-togethers, school breaks and winter weather often lead to lower donor turnout, potentially further compounding the situa-

tion.

Potential donors are urged to schedule an appointment now by using the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting RedCrossBlood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). If there is not an immediate opportunity available to donate, donors are asked to make an appointment in the days and weeks ahead to ensure the Red Cross can replenish and then maintain a sufficient blood supply.

In thanks, all who come to give through Jan. 2 will receive an exclusive Red Cross long-sleeved T-shirt, while supplies last.

Those who come to give blood, platelets or

plasma in January will automatically be entered for a chance to win a getaway to Super Bowl LVI in Los Angeles. As an extra thank-you from the Red Cross, those who come to donate in January will also be automatically entered to win a home theater package and a \$500 e-gift card. Terms apply; visit RedCrossBlood.org/SuperBowl for more information.

Each Red Cross blood drive and donation center follows the highest standards of safety and infection control, and additional precautions — including face masks for donors and staff, regardless of vaccination status — have been implemented to help protect

the health of all those in attendance. Donors are asked to schedule an appointment prior to arriving at the drive.

Donors can also save up to 15 minutes at the blood drive by completing a RapidPass. With RapidPass, donors complete the pre-donation reading and health history questionnaire online, on the day of donation, from a mobile device or computer.

To complete a RapidPass, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood.org/RapidPass or use the Red Cross Blood Donor App.

To donate blood, individuals need to bring a blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identifi-

cation that are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent, where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also must meet certain height and weight requirements.

At a time when health information has never been more important, the Red Cross is screening all blood, platelet and plasma donations from self-identified African-American donors for the sickle cell trait. This additional screening will provide Black donors with an additional health

insight and help the Red Cross identify compatible blood types more quickly to help patients with sickle cell disease who require trait-negative blood. Blood transfusion is an essential treatment for those with sickle cell disease, and blood donations from individuals of the same race, ethnicity and blood type have a unique ability to help patients fighting sickle cell disease.

Donors can expect to receive sickle cell trait screening results, if applicable, within one to two weeks through the Red Cross Blood Donor App and the online donor portal at RedCrossBlood.org.

# Why is my Medicare Part B premium so high?

**Dear Rusty:** Social Security is deducting \$297 per month for my Medicare Part B coverage.

I have what's called a "Windfall Elimination Provision" because I receive a pension from my former state employer. Prior to my 65th birthday in July of this year, Social Security was paying me \$764 per month, but when I turned 65 they reduced my amount to \$467 per month.

I read that the Part B premiums for 2021 are \$148.50, so I wonder why I'm paying double that amount? Could it be that I never enrolled in Medicare Part B and they just automatically started deducting that amount? Some sort of penalty? If so, it seems kind of high.

Can you explain why I'm paying so much for Medicare Part B? **Signed: Curious About Medicare**

**Dear Curious:** Your Part B premium of \$297/month has nothing to do with the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). WEP affects (reduces) your Social Security retirement benefit amount but doesn't affect your Medicare premium.

Your Medicare Part B premium is \$297/month because of a different Medicare rule known as "IRMAA," which is the "Income Related Medicare Adjustment Amount." Here's how IRMAA works:

Medicare determines your Part B premium amount each year using your combined income

(from all sources) from two years prior, so your 2021 Part B premium is based upon your 2019 income. The income amount used to set your Part B premium is called your Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI), which is your normal Adjusted Gross Income on your tax return plus any other non-taxable income you may have had (including half of your SS benefits, non-taxable interest, etc.). If your MAGI is over a certain threshold, your Part B premium is more than the standard \$148.50.

The IRMAA thresholds at which you pay a higher Part B premium depend upon your tax filing status. A married couple filing jointly with MAGI under \$176,001 pays the standard premium (\$148.50 for 2021), and a single tax filer whose MAGI is under \$88,001 also pays the standard Part B premium, but income exceeding those thresholds means a higher Part B premium. How much higher depends upon how much

your MAGI exceeds the base amounts above.

The Part B IRMAA premium increases on a scale relative to how much your MAGI exceeds the base threshold and, from what you've shared, it appears that your 2019 MAGI resulted in a 2021 Part B premium of \$297/month.

Since you were already collecting Social Security when you turned 65, you were automatically enrolled in Medicare Part A (which is free) and Medicare Part B (for which you pay a premium), which is why your Medicare premium increased at that time.

If you also have "creditable" health care from either your or your wife's employer ("creditable" is a group plan with at least 20 participants), you can disenroll from Medicare Part B by filing form CMS-1763 and having an interview with Social Security. That way you could save that \$297 monthly Part B premium for as long as you have other "creditable" employer coverage, and then re-enroll in Part B during the Special Enrollment Period, which starts when your employer coverage ends (or shortly before to avoid a gap in

health care coverage).

If you have retired from working and your combined income in 2020 was much lower than in 2019, Social Security will automatically adjust your 2022 Medicare Part B premium as appropriate for your combined income reported to the IRS on your 2020 tax return. If you retired in 2020, you might also wish to submit form SSA-44 (www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-44-ext.pdf) to claim a "life changing event," which may result in a smaller Part B premium for 2021 as well.

# The forgotten vitamin

When you think about vitamin supplements, which ones automatically come to mind? Most people will say vitamin C, D or E.

But of the 13 vitamins essential for optimal health, we rarely hear about the importance of vitamin K and its vital role in the prevention of cardiovascular disease, cancer, Alzheimer's, diabetes and osteoporosis.

While it's not known to be one of the most common deficiencies (like vitamin D), it can be very serious, causing issues like bone loss, excessive bleeding in the GI tract, blood in urine and more.

"And older adults — particularly older men — are the age group that consumes the least amount of vitamin K," said Sarah Booth, Ph.D., from the Jean Mayer USDA Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging at Tufts University.

Discovered in 1929 by Danish scientist Henrik Dam, vitamin K is actually a group of compounds, the most important ones being vitamin K1 and K2.

Produced by plants, vitamin K1 plays a key role in helping the blood clot and is also essential for building strong bones and osteoporosis prevention. Vitamin K supplements are not absorbed well by the body. So your best bet is to include lots of vitamin K-rich foods such as broccoli, Brussels sprouts and dark leafy greens in your diet.

Vitamin K is also a natural cancer fighter and is effective in reducing the risk of prostate, colon, stomach, nasal and oral cancer. One study found that high doses of vitamin K helped patients with liver cancer stabilize and improve their liver function.

A study in Integrative Medicine points out that vitamin K helps prevent hardening of arteries because it keeps calcium out of the arteries, not allowing it to form into hard, dangerous plaque deposits. Studies have also shown that people who increase their intake of vitamin K have a lower risk of cardiovascular disease and stroke mortality.

Can vitamin K stop Alzheimer's disease or dementia? Not neces-

sarily, but studies have shown that eating leafy greens keeps individuals' minds a decade younger. In a cognitive study of over 950 older adults, researchers found that individuals who ate one or two servings of mustard greens, spinach, kale or collards daily had the same mental ability as individuals 11 years their junior.

There is mounting evidence that vitamin K2

can improve bone health and reduce the risk of bone fractures, especially in postmenopausal women who are at risk for osteoporosis. According to recent research, men and women with the highest intake of vitamin K2 are 65% less likely to suffer from a debilitating hip fracture compared to those with the lowest intake of vitamin K2.

Vitamin K2 is produced by the good bacteria in your gut and can also be found in high-fat dairy and fermented foods such as sauerkraut.

Just like salt goes with pepper and wine goes with chocolate, vitamin K should always be paired with vitamin D whenever possible. However, if you use blood-thinning medication, please consult your health care practitioner.

## State seeks public input on contamination sites

ALBANY — New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Commissioner Basil Seggos has announced proposed changes to the state's regulations for the clean-up of contaminated sites that will advance efforts to revitalize communities and protect public health and the environment statewide.

The proposals are available for public comment until April 21, and would create new cleanup standards for the oversight of the emerging contaminants perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctanoic sulfonate (PFOS), strengthen the implementation of

the state's Brownfield Cleanup Program, and enhance State Superfund and other cleanup programs.

"New York is a national leader in our commitment to address the threat of emerging contaminants and our sustained efforts to clean up legacy contaminants in communities statewide," Seggos said. "The proposed changes to New York's regulations are instrumental in advancing DEC's efforts with the latest science and data about public health and the environment while supporting the revitalization of former industrial sites to create economic opportunities and stronger communi-

ties."

The proposed changes to the 6 NYCRR Part 375 regulations that pertain to the state's Environmental Remediation Programs would increase consistency across programs administered by DEC's Division of Environmental Remediation and provide DEC with the tools to effectively implement these changes, including:

- **E n h a n c e d** requirements for the Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Remedial Program (also known as State Superfund Program);
- Updates to the State's Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs) to reflect the latest scien-

tific input of experts at DEC and the New York State Department of Health. Revisions include the creation of SCOs for PFOA, PFOS, aniline, and nitrobenzene to reflect the designation of these chemicals as hazardous substances and codify existing guidance in regulation to provide the State with a greater ability to conduct enforcement against polluters; and

- Proposed changes, clarifications, and modifications to the regulations based on DEC's experience during the first decade of implementing the Brownfield Cleanup Program.

DEC encourages the public to participate in

and submit comments during two virtual hearings on the revised rulemaking. The hearings will be held at 2 p.m. on April 5, 2022, and 5:30 p.m. on April 7, 2022.

Participants should provide their first and last name, address, and telephone number and reference the Part 375 public comment hearing.

### Butter Pecan Waffles

Yield: about 6 waffles (4 inches each)

#### Browned Butter:

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

- 1 cup Pearl Milling Company Original Pancake & Waffle Mix
- 3/4 cup milk, plus additional if necessary, divided

- 1 egg
- Pearl Milling Company Syrup, for topping
- toasted pecans, for topping (optional)



Banana Walnut Pancakes

To make browned butter: In small skillet over low heat, place butter. Increase heat to medium-low, stirring butter with heat-proof spatula. Cook and stir until butter reaches desired brown color. Remove from heat and stir in pecans.

Pour batter into lightly greased waffle iron. Bake until steam stops or as directed by waffle iron instructions. Top with syrup and toasted pecans, if desired.

### Banana Walnut Pancakes

- Yield: about 20 pancakes
- 2 cups Pearl Milling Company Original Pancake Mix
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 2 bananas, mashed

#### Homemade Whipped Cream:

- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons sugar

- Toppings:
- 1 banana, sliced, for topping
- 2 jars (5 ounces each) walnuts in syrup
- 24 ounces Pearl Milling Company Syrup

Place skillet over medium heat. In large bowl, stir pancake mix, milk, eggs, oil and mashed bananas.
