Village eyes fix for duck difficulties

RAVENA — Dozens of ducks can be seen at times parading down village streets and elected officials are looking to do something about it.

Some local residents have been feeding the waterfowl, drawing them to the area and creating problems for their neighbors, Mayor Bill Misuraca said at the village board's July 20 meeting.

"Certain people, maybe a group of people, think they are cute. I think little fuzzy ducks are cute, too, but they are not cute when they are defecating in your swimming pool and

on your patio and creating a health hazard," Misuraca said. "Also, there is a noise factor, too."

Misuraca has received multiple complaints from neighbors on Biechman Road, Cary Street and Woodlawn Drive. The issue has been a growing problem over the past year or so, he said.

"I have been talking to people who live in the affected areas and they are upset, understandably so," Misuraca said. "We have tried to reach out to the people that are feeding them, that are enabling these ducks and keeping them around. The more they feed them, the more

they breed, and there is overpopulation. It's not

fair to the animals and it's not fair to the people."

The ducks are a federally protected species so the village cannot trap them, Misuraca said. He proposed a local law that would prohibit the feeding of all wildlife, with the exception of birds, as long as the bird feeder is at least 4 feet off the ground, so it is not accessible to the ducks.

The wording of the local law is still in the works, but Misuraca proposed a fine of \$300 for a first offense and \$600 for a second offense. The goal is to discourage the activity rather than impose fines, the mayor said.

"We are really hoping that we don't have to have the police enforce this law and that people finally get the point to stop feeding the ducks," Misuraca said. "You are not helping them and you are hurting the neighbors."

Neighbors who have excessive numbers of ducks on their property have banged pots and pans together and used air horns and other methods to try to deter the ducks, he added.

"People are trying to scare these things off their property and they

A flag for every vet's banner

COEYMANS — American flags will go up on veterans' banners this week.

The banners, posted in the village, hamlet and Coeymans Hollow, were put up around Memorial Day to honor the achievements of military service members. The banners are paid for by the family or loved ones, and some have the stars and stripes above them, but some do not.

The Coeymans Town Council in June adopted a resolution authorizing Town Supervisor George McHugh to purchase enough flags to make

sure every veteran's banner has an accompanying flag.

The resolution last month authorized McHugh to spend up to \$2,000 for the flags.

"We were well under the cap you gave me and the flags arrived today," McHugh told the town council at its Thursday meeting. "Next week we will get the highway crew to work on getting those installed out in the Hollow. I am very hopeful that in the next week or two, we will have all the banners with a flag."

While the town council resolution authorized an expenditure of \$2,000, the town spent \$1,496.88 to purchase the flags, with

the rest of the funding coming through donations, McHugh said.

"Let's give a shout out — where did the \$600 come from?" Town Councilman Daniel Baker asked.

Fundraisers by the Coeymans Hollow firehouse raised \$800 for the initiative and local resident Mary Driscoll made a contribution as well, with Carver Companies donating an additional \$1,200 for flags on Church Street, McHugh said.

"There were a lot of donations and we picked up the difference, but it is worth it and it will look beautiful when it is done," McHugh said.

Poles for the banners in the village have flags, but there are 26 in the hamlet that do not have a flag and all 25 in Coeymans Hollow, along Route 143, do not have a U.S. flag, McHugh said at the board's June meeting.

The flags are expected to be installed by the highway department over the next two weeks, with work beginning this week, McHugh said.

The banners were first posted in the village, mostly along Main Street, in 2020 by UNITAS VFW Post 9594 on what was dubbed the Boulevard of Honor. There

Rollover crash prompts DWI charges

GLENMONT — A rollover crash in Glenmont that damaged a utility pole resulted in a DWI arrest on Thursday, July 15.

First responders were called to the area of 617 Route 9W in Glenmont around 1:10 a.m. for a report of a single vehicle rollover in the area with possible power lines down.

Bethlehem Police officers arrived on the scene and reported one car that was overturned off the roadway and a National Grid utility pole damaged.

The pole was snapped in half and the top half was still suspended in the air by the wires.

No wires were down in the roadway.

The Selkirk Fire Department closed Route 9W from Beacon Road to Wemple Road for the

duration of the incident.

"Upon investigation it was determined that the operator of a 2015 Chevrolet was traveling north on Route 9W when it left the roadway and struck the power pole and overturned," according to a statement from Bethlehem Police.

The driver of the car was the only occupant and was found to be uninjured in the crash following an evaluation from Delmar-Bethlehem EMS and Albany County Paramedics.

The driver was not identified at press time.

The vehicle was removed by Robert's Towing.

National Grid responded to handle the damaged pole.

Police say the driver was arrested at the scene and charged with driving while intoxicated and was issued a ticket for failure to keep right.

are spending half of their summer scrubbing and cleaning and making sure their grandchildren aren't stepping in it. It's a nightmare," he said. "One person actually put their house on the market because they can't live like this. It's not fair."

While people feeding the ducks may think they are helping them, that is not so, Misuraca said.

According to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, feeding waterfowl causes problems including poor nutrition for the animals, water pollution, delayed migration, overcrowding, spread of disease with birds in close proximity, unnatural behavior and other problems.

"It would seem that providing food for ducks and geese would make them healthier. However, this is not the case," according to the DEC.

"Waterfowl at artificial feeding sites are often found to suffer from poor nutrition. In natural settings, waterfowl seek and feed on a variety of nutritious foods such as aquatic plants, natural grains and

invertebrates. Many of the items commonly used to feed waterfowl (bread, corn, popcorn, etc.) are low in protein and are very poor substitutes for natural foods."

Village Trustee Mary Ellen Rosato said there are other problems creating by feeding waterfowl as well.

"There's another side to it. The little ones, they are being eaten by vultures," Rosato said. "So if you think you are being kind to the ducks, you are just feeding the vultures."

The village board scheduled a public hearing Aug. 17 at 6 p.m. at Village Hall, 15 Mountain Road, to discuss the issue. The specifics of the proposed local law are still being worked out, but once completed, it will be posted on the village website and Facebook page for the community to review, Village Trustee Nancy Warner said.

She encouraged the community to come and offer feedback.

"We want everybody to come, for or against," Warner said. "You don't even have to live in that neighborhood. Please come — now is your time to speak to us."

The proposed local law

also came up for discussion at the July 12 meeting of the Coeymans Town Council.

Town Supervisor George McHugh said he met with representatives from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and a local resident who is affected by the ducks. The USDA would help remove the ducks — which are federally protected and village and town agencies can't touch them.

"They said what they would be willing to do is sign an intermunicipal agreement with the village and the town after this law went into effect and some of the feeding stops," McHugh said. "They would come and capture the ducks safely and relocate the ducks someplace else. They won't come back as long as they aren't fed."

Coeymans Police Chief Douglas Keyer said police would first give out warnings to anyone found feeding the ducks before tickets are issued. The goal is to stop the feeding habits.

"No one wants to see harm coming to the ducks, but it is not good for them," Keyer said. "This is not their natural environment."

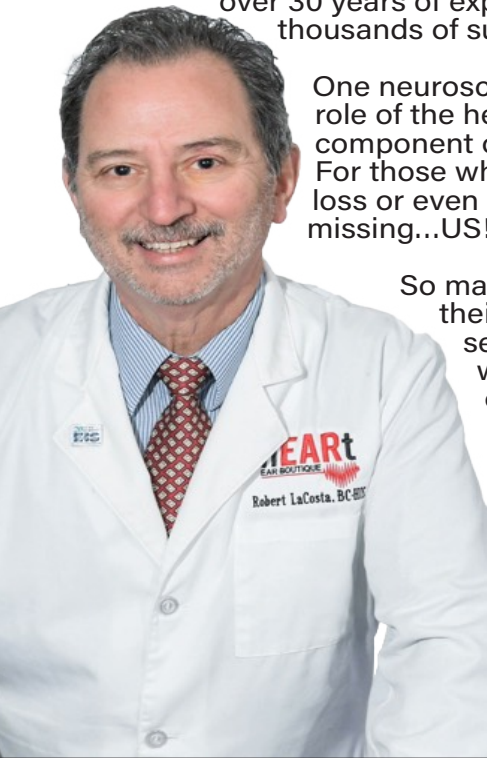

State absentee voting changes become law

ALBANY — A series of bills became law earlier this month to make casting a ballot in state or local elections easier and more accessible for all New Yorkers.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo recently signed a package of legislation passed in the Senate and Assembly at the end of session to allow residents to electronically request an absentee ballot and apply for a ballot without a signature, permit absentee ballots to be accepted if postmarked by Election Day and to require boards of elections to post changes to polling place locations, among others.

“During the past 16 months, numerous obstacles thrown up by the COVID-19 pandemic imperiled one of our most basic and vital rights — the right to vote,” Cuomo said in a prepared statement after signing the voting legislation. “This sweeping, comprehensive package of legislation will make it easier for voters, candidates and boards of elections to perform their critical functions and keep our democracy running. Elections have enormous consequences for New Yorkers across the state, and these reforms will bolster their ability to use their voices at the ballot box.”

Other legislation was signed into law requiring boards of elections to deliver absentee ballots to voters residing in nursing homes, residential care facilities and other facilities under the state Office of Mental Health, and allowing New Yorkers requesting an absentee ballot by mail until 15 days before the day of the election. In-person absentee applications can be received until the day before the contest.

Candidates who have lost a primary election can also now decline a nomination.

“Up to now, candidates

who lost a major primary literally had to die or move out of state in order to get off a minor party line on the ballot,” said bill sponsor Sen. Rachel May, D-Syracuse, in a statement. “This led to confusion and to workarounds that were bad for democracy. Voters should be able to trust that the names on a ballot represent active candidates for election. I want to thank the governor for signing this important reform to our election laws.”

The governor also signed measures into law that will conform state mailing deadlines for absentee ballots in line with the U.S. Postal Service for the timely delivery of mail and increase the number of permitted election district enrollment from 1,150 to 2,000 registrants.

The previous limit was set based on the limitations of old lever voting machines, which could only handle 1,000 votes per election. Optical scanners can read and hold up to approximately 4,000 ballots per election, according to the governor’s office.

Republican lawmakers largely voted against the new voting rules this spring after concerns of accurate voting counts in the 2020 presidential election.

Top state Republican leaders continue to question the necessity for changing state election law, but speak with confidence about New York’s election and voting security.

“We have an obsession in this state with tinkering with our election law,” state Republican Committee Chair Nick Langworthy said recently outside the state Capitol in Albany. “I think we have pretty honest elections in New York of bipartisanism ensured within our boards of elections. ...I do think that we should really take our time with all of these changes and

make sure we’re investing in the interest of fair elections and taxpayers before we start tinkering it to meet what some liberal group tells you you need to have.”

States with one-party rule or control in overseeing boards of elections and ballot counts gave some voters across the country concern about expanding early and absentee ballot access, Langworthy said.

Lawmakers debated for hours before the end of session June 10 to pass a bill that would mandate an increase in the number of early voting locations in every county. Each county’s number of early voting sites is based on the number of registered voters, according to the state Board of Elections.

Each of New York’s 62 counties is required to have at least one early-voting polling location. Counties with between 100,000 and 149,999 voters are required to have at least two early voting polling sites. Counties with between 150,000 and 199,999 voters are required to have three early voting sites, and so on.

“In reality, I think there’s a disparity between big counties and small counties on this,” Langworthy said. “The one-size-fits-all approach makes it difficult.”

More populous urban areas, like in Erie County, which includes the city of Buffalo and the surrounding towns and villages, has more than 35 early voting sites. Smaller counties under a certain population may be challenged to meet minimum early voting site requirements, Langworthy said.

“I think it’s created a burden for small counties to meet,” he added. “I think you should get it right before you start making changes. We have election professionals in the state who have an intense amount of pressure with all the changes in the last several years.”

C-GCC gifted \$310K for Greene scholarships

HUDSON — An anonymous donor gave a \$310,000 donation to Columbia-Greene Community College for scholarships for Greene County students.

The gift will assist Greene County students seeking a career in the medical field, such as nursing or medical assisting.

“A scholarship is helpful to any student,” Columbia-Greene Community College President Carlee Drummer said. “We try to help as many students as we can and certainly support from the community is so important, now especially with the pandemic, because so many students lives have been disrupted by COVID, and they’re really struggling in many cases and if we can help them pay their tuition, we’re really happy to do that.”

“The endowment will enable Greene County students who struggle financially to confidently move forward in their education and future careers, said Joan Koweek, executive director of the C-GCC Foundation. “The money will be able to help hundreds of students.”

“The scholarships that they will receive from this donation will eliminate many of the financial obstacles that would otherwise prevent them from succeeding in their goals,” Koweek said.

Students from Greene County will be able to fill out an application to apply for the scholarship, Koweek said. A scholarship committee comprised of board members from both sides of the county and faculty use a rubric and they rate the forms to determine which applications will be awarded. Koweek said names and other personal information are kept off of the forms the committee sees to keep the decision transparent.

“We are just so grateful to the donor for this,” Koweek said. “They are going to impact the lives of people, this is going to help our students which truly is going to shape their future. Its going to help ensure that they finish their degree, and they have an employable situation where they can afford to stay in the counties and live the life that they choose.”

The donation is one of the largest donations the college has received, Koweek said.

“It’s about their career choice, that they’ll be able to be in a field that they want to thrive in,” Koweek said.

Students will be able to use money from the donation starting in the upcoming fall semester.

“The Columbia-Greene Community College Foundation was the right fit for this contribution,” the anonymous donor said in a statement. “We have been witness to the good work the Foundation does for C-GCC students, and we know it will use this endowment in accordance with our wishes. We are extremely pleased to provide this funding.”

The tuition rate for in-state residents for the next school year is about \$2,484 each semester for full-time students, according to the website.

For the care of annuals

If it seems like your gardens, landscape plantings and even roadside weeds are significantly larger and more vigorous than last year at this time, it is because they are!

The near record rainfall we have had this month has spurred growth on almost everything that grows in our region. This points out the not-so-obvious fact that rainfall is far more important than sunlight in terms of overall growth. It also explains why cloudy, rainy climates, such as much of Britain, have such marvelous horticulture! Moisture is far more often a limiting factor to growth than sunlight.

Of course, there may be a problem with too much moisture in some garden situations, where poor drainage is an issue, but for the most part, our native landscape loves the precipitation. The forests and fields are sucking up the rain happily. We will see the benefits of this rainfall next season, as well. I expect bumper, mast crops, in 2022 as a result and even this year's apple, pear and peach crops will produce much larger fruit.

This is a good time to evaluate your property to learn which areas are best utilized for trees and shrubs that can tolerate these conditions. The good news is that there are many lovely tree and shrubs that can tolerate "wet feet" for extended periods of time.

There is still plenty of time to plant annuals, perennials, trees and shrubs. Soil temperature and moisture levels are as optimal as we can expect at any time. Most years, I would be reminding you to make sure your newly planted trees and shrubs get watered at least once a week, but this season has been the exception.

By now most annu-

al flowers in baskets, boxes and beds need to be cut back hard for a fall bloom, or at least deadheaded. Window boxes and hanging baskets sometimes fill up with roots by now, so it is important to continue to monitor them.

A few dry days will require you to get out the watering can once more and you may need to apply some fertilizer as well. Some annuals that have already gone to seed may have the seed pods scattered beneath them and may provide some "volunteers" for next season. Since most annuals are hybrids, don't expect their offspring to look exactly like the parents, but they will still look very good!

You can even plant some seeds of fast growing annuals that like cool weather for a fall display. Marigolds, snapdragons, calendula, pansies, dianthus can be seeded now and a few lovely, annual plants, like flowering kale and Swiss chard are also edible in addition to being pretty, as well as frost tolerant.

Flower containers of all sorts need to have drainage holes in the bottom. Adding a few inches of gravel to the bottom of large pots will also help to ensure good drainage. Since I like to grow several things in containers, from cherry tomatoes to herbs, this year, I decided to make my own potting

soil using a combination of peat moss, sand and some really inexpensive, bagged "topsoil."

I have no idea where the bagged "topsoil" came from, but it was pretty awful stuff. You can sweep up a parking lot and sell the sweepings as "topsoil" in New York state. This stuff appeared to be mostly modeling clay and rocks, with some sand mixed in. I tested the pH and it was about 7.8, which is much too high for optimal growth, but the added peat moss is acidic, so it was not a serious issue.

I have a very large tub that allowed me to mix all these ingredients together in roughly equal parts. I must say, the mixture turned out well, but it was a lot of work mixing all the ingredients together by hand! I got a pretty good arm and wrist workout!

I did not use any vermiculite or perlite in my mix as most commercial potting mixes usually do. Vermiculite is a silicate material that is brown or beige in color and has a soft, sponge-like texture. It absorbs water. Perlite is harder, white in color, and is made out of mined volcanic rock. It also floats, which I don't like seeing in my garden when rains are heavy, like this year. Perlite is also high in fluoride, which is only an issue for some sensitive plants, like lilies.

My homemade potting soil weighed about four times as much as a commercial mix, such as Pro Mix, or BX mix that is sold in bales, since there was no perlite or vermiculite in it, which are as light as a feather. At least I don't have to look at floating white pieces of lava in my pots or garden and my arms probably benefitted from the exercise of mixing it!

The life of David in the Bible is one of the more popular stories in the Christian faith. Of all the individuals other than Christ, I would guess there have been

more messages about him than any other character within the word of God.

There is a huge difference between the way we observe and judge with our natural senses and the way God perceives everything through His perfect spiritual wisdom and the key to our success is learning to see as God sees.

We begin our story in I Samuel where Samuel is a powerful prophet and is told by the Lord to select a new king to replace Saul, who had disappointed God. There was a man named Jesse who had eight sons and God told Samuel that one of Jesse's sons would be the new king and to listen carefully to God's voice.

When Samuel looked upon the oldest son

Eliab, he reasoned within himself that surely this is the one whom God would want. Eliab was physically strong and impressive, and the passage also mentions that he was very tall. Felled tree embodies village spirit

COXSACKIE — Some could view what happened to a 200-year-old Cocksackie tree as fate, divine intervention or just plain old physics. The tree on Mansion Street was torn out of the ground by its roots in a massive thunderstorm and microburst that pummeled the village of Cocksackie on July 7.

But as cleanup in the village continues, a weird quirk of fate — or science — uprighed the tree back where it came from.

“I had a worker out there with a chainsaw cutting down additional lengths of the tree because we were going to use heavy equipment to lift it,” said Paul Seney, owner of W.C. Brady’s Sons Funeral Home and the property where the tree is located. “The tree was still on the sidewalk and he was cutting length from the tree. When he got down from the tree, the tree uprighed itself back into the hole where it was ripped from, so it is standing back up,” Seney said.

The tree, thought to be more than two centuries old, stood about 100 feet tall on Mansion Street, with about 80 feet hollowed out inside the tree, Seney estimated.

The weight at the tree’s roots — which included a substantial amount of earth that came up with the roots when the tree fell — was so bottom-heavy the tree popped back into the hole, Seney said.

The return of the tree to its original space might seem like divine intervention to some, but Seney attributes it to the laws of nature.

“It sounds miraculous, but physics defeats all miracles,” Seney said.

said. “Within five minutes of the storm being over, every department was on scene, neighbors were making sure others were OK — it was very heartwarming to see civilians along with the rescue companies and the fire departments and the sheriff’s department — everyone was helping everyone else.”

The monument would take the form of an owl because that is the official “symbol” of Cocksackie. The town’s name is thought to have been derived from a Native American term that loosely translated means “hoot of the owl” and “place of owls,” according to a history of the town penned by town historian Michael Rausch.

“We will carve the biggest Cocksackie owl that we can — if it ends up being 12 foot, so be it, but we will carve our community animal, which is the owl,” Paul Seney said.

Shannon Seney said the grassroots group is looking to work with artists, landscaping companies, construction companies, gardeners and donors to get the whole community involved in the effort.

“The more people involved, the better,” she said. “The more people feel involved with this monument, the more they can claim it as their own.”

Creating a monument to the community spirit shown on the day of the storm, and in the days that followed, is fitting, Paul Seney said.

“The tree fell for a reason and it is standing again for a reason, so I think something special has to take place,” he said. “I would like to see the entire community involved and plan an event to celebrate — an unveiling, so to speak.”

Funeral assistant Jennifer McKeon, who works at Richards Funeral Home in Cairo, which Seney also owns, was there when it happened.

“When they cut one part of the top off, it stood back up into the hole. I was there,” McKeon said. “It was odd to see — the top (of the tree) came off and the tree just popped back up.”

The tree has stood as a local landmark in front of the funeral home since the business’s founding in 1840, Seney said.

The tree’s return sparked another idea for Seney — to turn the remains of the tree into a massive monument to the residents and

first responders who came to their neighbors’ aid in the wake of the storm that felled the tree. Seney, his sister Shannon Seney and McKeon are now leading an effort to raise about \$10,000 to pay an artist to carve a large owl into the tree’s remains, along with adding boulders, benches, flowers and other landscaping to create a pocket park commemorating the community’s response to the storm.

“What compelled me to do this is the immediate response not only from the community members but from rescue and fire services, law enforcement, the county, other

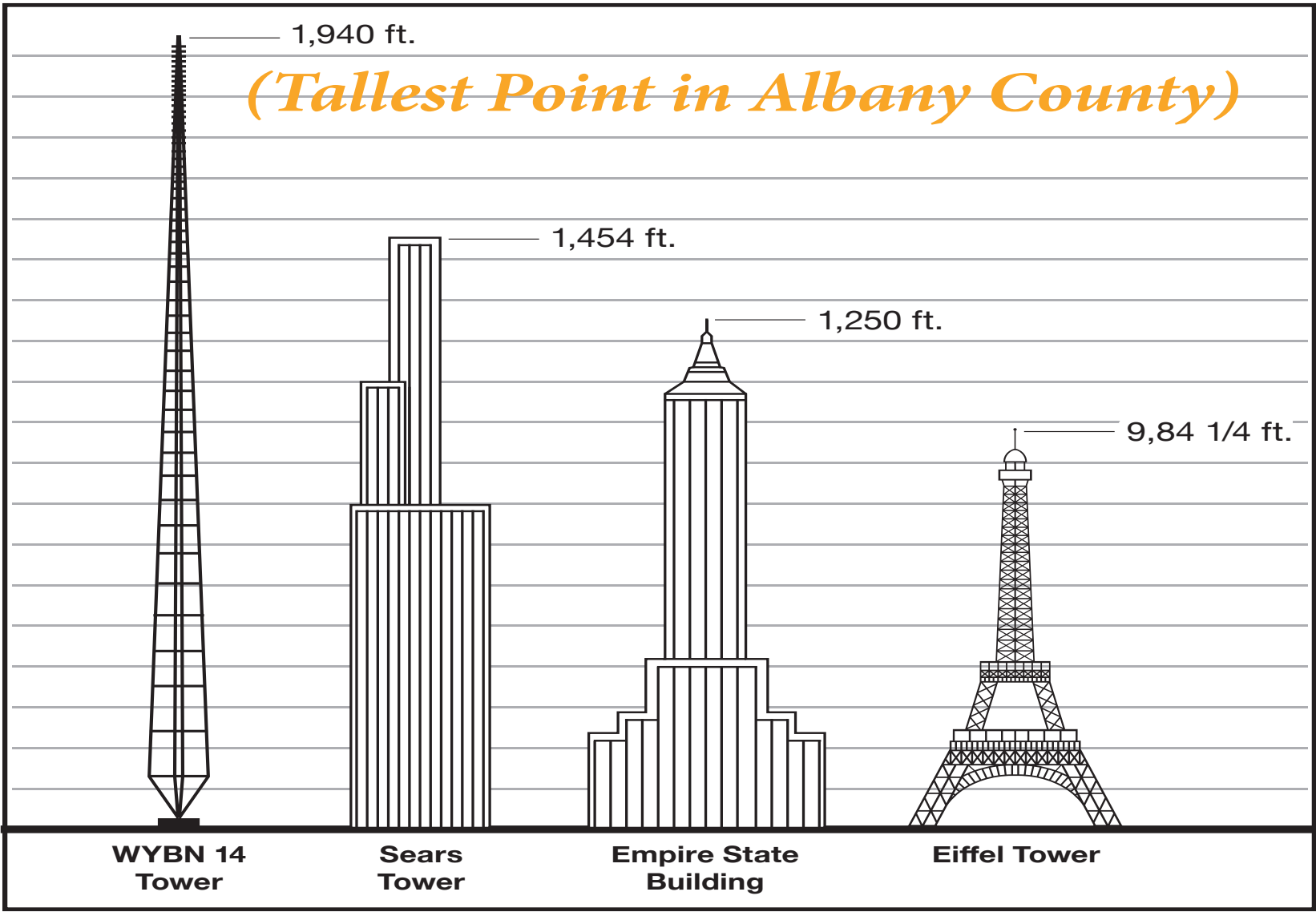
communities who came to help — everyone was on point and it was instant,” Seney said. “So I thought, what a great monument for Cocksackie, honoring the loss of the tree and the community that responded, and as an everlasting monument for that event.”

Shannon Seney said the monument would also commemorate the life of

Richard Vigilo, the funeral home’s former owner and a staple in the community, who died Jan. 10.

“We had some discussion about creating a monument of sorts to commemorate Richard Vigilo, the former owner of the funeral home, and to commemorate the camaraderie of the community,” Shannon Seney

Albany Med system applies artificial intelligence to enhance stroke care

ALBANY — New, cutting-edge software will allow the Albany Med Health System to streamline stroke care across its four hospitals.

The system will be the first in northeast New York to apply the Viz.ai computer-aided triage system, which is approved by the Food and Drug Administration, to help facilitate early access to the most advanced stroke care for patients at Albany Medical Center Hospital, Columbia Memorial Health (CMH), Glens Falls Hospital and Saratoga Hospital.

“Successful stroke treatment requires quick and decisive action, and each minute can make a difference in saving someone’s life or ensuring continued quality of life,” said Alan Boulos, M.D., chair of the Department of Neurosurgery, Herman and Sunny Stall Chair of Endovascular Surgery, director of the neurovascular section and professor of neurosurgery and radiology at Albany Medical College. “This technology will allow stroke specialists throughout the Albany Med Health System to securely communicate in order to synchronize care and determine the optimal treatment decision for the patient, potentially saving critical time in the triage, diagnosis and treatment of stroke, resulting in improved outcomes for our patients.”

When a patient who is suspected of having

a stroke arrives at the hospital, CT angiograms are typically performed to assess blood flow in the brain. When the Viz.ai artificial intelligence software detects a large vessel occlusion (LVO) — a type of stroke caused by blockage of one of the major arteries and having a greater risk of death or long-term disability — stroke specialists across the system are alerted immediately on their phones, allowing them to plan for appropriate treatment or transfer of care quicker than ever.

LVOs account for 20% of all strokes and require advanced treatment. As the region’s comprehensive stroke center, Albany Medical Center Hospital is the only hospital in the region with an endovascular neurosurgery team able to perform mechanical thrombectomy — the “gold standard of stroke treatment” — to treat these strokes by removing clots and restoring blood flow to the brain, increasing the likelihood of a better quality of life after stroke. If the software detects a LVO stroke at any of the partner hospitals, the patient will be prepared for transfer to Albany Medical Center Hospital.

This will increase the likelihood for favorable outcomes. It’s another great example of Columbia Memorial working with our Albany Med affiliates and the newest technology to benefit our local community.”

The new technology will enable hospitals across the system to streamline care for patients experiencing a stroke.

“We are excited to collaborate with Albany Medical Center on this new technology to streamline and consolidate stroke care across our system,” said Jonathan Braiman, M.D., chair of the Neurology Department at Glens Falls Hospital. “Though the best treatment for stroke is still prevention, this helps us identify candidates for acute stroke intervention more efficiently.”

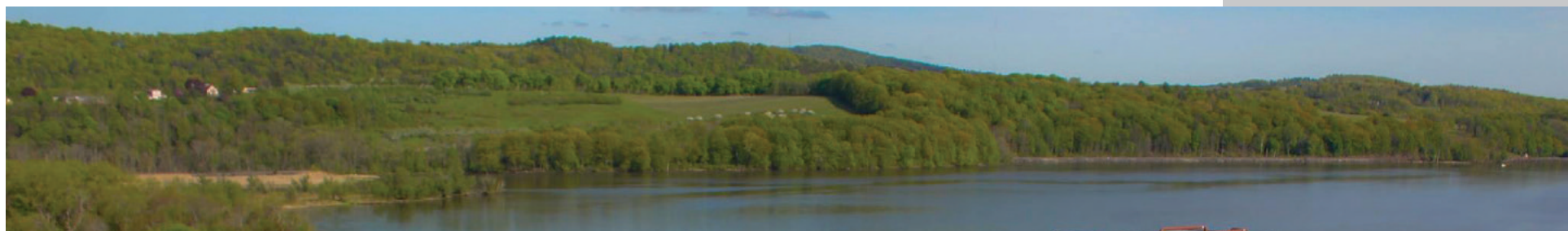

DOCCS rescinds policy under legal scrutiny

The state Department of Corrections and Community Supervision has rescinded a medical policy at the center of a lawsuit filed by a former prison doctor who treated New York’s most chronically ill incarcerated patients for more than two decades.

The department updated its Health Services Policy Manual in December 2016 to include the Medications With Abuse Potential policy, which mandated doctors or medical specialists treating people imprisoned in the state get additional department approval to prescribe certain medica-

tions that could be abused.

“The policy, which no longer exists, is part of ongoing litigation and the department has no comment,” DOCCS spokesman Thomas Mailey said in a statement.

Dr. Michael Salvana, 71, filed a lawsuit June 28 in the U.S. District Court in the state’s Northern District against the department and current or former members of DOCCS medical staff after he allegedly endured retaliation by his colleagues for speaking out against the policy to health staff and administrators.

The policy left incarcerated people with serious and painful chronic illnesses, such as multi-

ple sclerosis and sickle cell anemia, with sub-standard medical care, Salvana said. The directive required a DOCCS regional medical director to approve or deny the prescription of a list of flagged medications including Tramadol, used for pain management; Pregabalin, used to treat fibromyalgia and spinal cord injury nerve pain; Gabapentin, taken to control seizures; Imodium, used to treat diarrhea and other common muscle relaxers.

Department representatives would not answer multiple requests over several days about when the policy was rescinded.

“Your question relates to pending litigation,” Mailey said. “The department does not comment on pending litigation.”

The directive intended to prevent patients abusing prescription drugs as the nation’s opioid epidemic rages on.

Medication is kept in state correctional facilities under lock and key and may only be administered by DOCCS’ medical

staff.

The department would not answer if the policy prevented medication abuse within state prisons while it was in effect.

Leading legislators on the Senate Crime Victims, Crime and Correction Committee and the Assembly Correction Committee referred to the department, or did not know when the policy was rescinded.

State departments can create and implement policies at their discretion without legislation nor approval from Gov. Andrew Cuomo and the Executive Chamber.

“They can do whatever they want,” said attorney Carlo A. C. de Oliveira, with Albany-based firm Cooper Erving & Savage LLP — one of Salvana’s attorneys. “It’s their policy, they created it, and they can rescind it.”

Salvana said his requests for a waiver for his patients were routinely denied by DOCCS regional medical director more than 145 miles away in Albany who did not have access to a patient’s health record. The department was required to explain the reasons for the denial in the patient’s Ambulatory Health Record.

The controversial Medications With Abuse Potential directive first went into effect in March 2017. Physicians could prescribe any medication in the DOCCS pharmacy Formulary Book without pre-approval before the policy existed.

Salvana alleges his First and 14th Amendment rights were violated when he was retaliated and discriminated against

after speaking out against the policy, forcing him to resign April 28, 2020.

“I was locked out of the facility, blocked from making orders, had my orders rescinded by non-doctors who had no license to practice medicine,” Salvana said in a phone interview.

Salvana, Walsh’s former facility director, oversaw all medical staff including doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, physical and occupational therapists, radiology technicians and the pharmacy supervisor.

The doctor, of Syracuse, has practiced medicine for more than four decades and worked as a clinical physician at the Walsh Regional Medical Unit in Rome, New York, from 2003 until 2011 and again from 2014 until his resignation.

The maximum-security medical facility is located within Mohawk Correctional, a medium-security prison in Oneida County. The medical unit has 152 beds in four-bed wards to house incarcerated New Yorkers for complex, long-term medical care.

“These are very sick people,” Salvana said of Walsh patients. “These aren’t people seeking to get high on drugs, and many of the drugs part of this policy have nothing to do with opioids. They’re not opiates. The patients were denied it, and as a result, the patients suffered needlessly.”

“There’s no class action lawsuit saying ‘I went to prison and became addicted to medication,’” the doctor added.

DOCCS is an accredited member of the National Commission on Cor-

rectional Health and is required to adhere by the commission and American Public Health Association treatment standards.

“The department provides the community standard of medical care for all incarcerated individuals,” Mailey said in a statement. “All DOCCS facilities have medical staff on site and individuals have access to medical services on a daily basis through the facility’s sick call procedure. For the chronic or terminally ill, DOCCS provides specialized Regional Medical Units (RMUs) in selected facilities across the state.”

“When medically necessary, individuals may be transported to a community hospital for emergency treatment or other medical services. DOCCS has agreements with health care providers and specialists at major hospitals across the state, as well as agreements with several smaller hospitals in close proximity to its facilities to ensure the medical needs of incarcerated individuals are met. If more extensive care is necessary, the incarcerated individual may be moved to another hospital which can provide the additional services.”

The department regularly collaborates with the state Health Department about medical care within the state’s incarcerated population, according to Mailey, but the Health Department does not oversee or regulate New York prison hospitals, except for medical treatments relating to infectious diseases such as tuberculosis, hepatitis C, HIV/AIDS and COVID-19.

Glenmont roundabout construction begins

GLENMONT — Pre-work on the planned roundabout and sidewalk extension project in Glenmont is underway with the bulk of the construction beginning in August.

The goal of the project is to improve traffic flow and increase safety, according to the town website.

“To reduce traffic congestion and improve vehicle and pedestrian safety, the town of

Bethlehem is moving forward with plans to build a roundabout at the Route 9W/Feura Bush/Glenmont Road intersection and extend sidewalks along Route 9W and Glenmont Road,” according to a statement on the town website.

Project layout and survey work took place in June. Preliminary project work is being handled by contractors Rifenburg Construction and Creighton Manning.

At the beginning of July, gas lines were relo-

cated by utility company National Grid, with work being completed during both daytime and nighttime hours.

“Maintaining access to businesses and keeping lanes open for commuting are priorities during construction,” accord-

ing to the website. “To enable this, some construction is expected to take place at night in addition to during the day.”

Access to businesses in the construction zone will not be interrupted, town officials said.

Now that underground gas lines have been installed and temporary traffic signals were put up earlier this month, the town will move ahead with the major components of construction in August, according to the

town.

Construction on the long-planned project was originally slated to begin in 2020, but was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and associated shutdowns.

The cost of the project is \$4.9 million. The project is funded by a grant from the New York State Department of Transportation, according to the town website.

Construction on the roundabout is scheduled to be completed next spring, according to the town.

Erin Sheevers named chief technology officer

BETHLEHEM — At its July 6 meeting, the Bethlehem Central Board of Education is expected to appoint Erin Sheevers as the district’s new chief technology officer.

Sheevers is an educator and experienced leader in K-12 technology, having served as technology director at two area school districts for the last 10 years, including her most recent position as technology director for the Troy City School District.

Sheevers will be a familiar face to many in the district. In 2011-12, she worked as a technology integration specialist in Bethlehem and she is also a 2003 graduate of BCHS.

In her role as BC’s chief technology officer, Sheevers will oversee a professional staff of nine and a staff of more than a dozen student interns employed throughout the school year as part of



the district’s student help desk.

The department provides technology hardware, software and infrastructure, data systems, and instructional technology support to 4,300 students and more than 800 faculty and staff districtwide. She is replacing Raymond Nardelli, who announced his resignation in June.

Sheevers began her professional career as a high school social studies teacher in Baltimore,

Maryland. Her transition from classroom teaching to instructional technology and leadership, she said, was an outgrowth of her interest in professional development while still a teacher.

While in Baltimore, she helped launch a then first-of-its-kind Virtual Learning Lab in partnership with Johns Hopkins University and Lockheed Martin. She wrote curriculum and supported instructional colleagues for the learning lab that in 2009 was the first public-private partnership to introduce the use of games and simulations to improve instruction for high school students.

After returning to the Capital Region, Sheevers worked for a year at BC as a technology integration specialist and technology consultant supporting the district’s Special Education and Student Services (SESS) department. In that role, she coordinated

iPad integration for special education students providing teachers and students with an adaptive tool to help promote learning and level the playing field for students with disabilities.

Sheevers received her bachelor’s degree from Le Moyne College in political science, history and education. She holds a graduate certificate in Leadership in Technology Integration from Johns Hopkins University. She also holds a master’s degree in Instructional Technology and Curriculum Development as well as School Building Leader and School District Leader certificates from the University at Albany.

In looking ahead, Sheevers said she will be focused on applying the lessons learned during COVID to improve instructional technology in the near and distant future.

“Technology has been

integral to COVID learning but we need to know where we stand and what our technology needs are going to be moving forward,” said Sheevers. “There are definitely things we will want to keep, things we hope to refine and things we never want to see or do again.”

She also said COVID has accelerated changes in how we prepare students for college and work life.

“For so long we have been training students to go to work,” said Sheevers. “Now, work is coming to them. The traditional work environment has changed and we need our students to be prepared for a future that suddenly looks very different. The technology we use in school and how we use it can make a huge difference for a student of the 2020s.”

Superintendent Jody Monroe said she is excited to welcome Sheevers

to her administrative leadership team.

“Erin’s background is the ideal combination of experienced educator and seasoned technology leader. She has proven she can navigate a large school district through one of the most technologically demanding times in history,” said Monroe. “That experience and know-how will be incredibly valuable as we look to make post-COVID teaching and learning at BC the best that it can be.”

Sheevers said she is looking forward to what she calls a “full circle” return to Bethlehem.

“I know the community,” said Sheevers. “I left, came back, bought a house here and am raising my children here. I love Bethlehem and am ready to make a difference in the community that is my home.”

Sheevers is set to begin her new role at BC on Aug. 9.

Veteran's family pleads for bill's signature

Briana Pechacek wants all New York veteran families to be eligible for programs meant to help the loved ones of deceased or disabled service members — just like her father.

U.S. Army Sgt. Steve Pechacek, of Ghent, sustained serious, life-altering leg and spinal injuries during live-fire combat training in South Korea in the early 1980s.

Pechacek, 57, is a severely disabled veteran, but unless a bill becomes law, his children are ineligible for the Military Enhanced Recognition Incentive and Tribute, or MERIT, scholarship intended for the children, spouses or financial dependents of American servicemembers who died or became permanently disabled.

The Pechaceks were surprised earlier this year when Briana's application was denied. The award provides financial aid to the children, spouses and financial dependents of members of the U.S. military who died, became severely disabled or injured while performing military duties.

The benefit comes with an interesting cutoff: Loved ones of service members are eligible if the veteran died or was injured in duty after Aug. 2, 1990.

Steve served in the Army's infantry from 1981 to 1985.

"Seeing the date was kind of aggravating because there's so many people that don't meet the cutoff date, and no veteran or veteran family should have to worry about their kid having debt after school, especially after serving the country," Bri-

ana said. "That's something that should be automatic."

Briana, 18, is a 2021 Chatham High School graduate.

The night of her graduation June 25, Briana received an email from HESC with a heading including Gov. Andrew Cuomo's name announcing her MERIT scholarship application was approved. She was not required to reapply.

"I got it, and I'm super thankful that I got it, but I don't just want it for me," Briana said. "I want it for everybody else that's also affected by it."

After his daughter's application was denied, Steve relentlessly called and emailed his local representatives to inquire about changing state law.

"This was wrong," Steve said of the service cutoff date. "The date would affect other veterans and their families. You're leaving out Panama, Iran, Beirut, Yemen... there's so many conflicts. Who knows how many families of veterans wanted to go to school."

Families and state lawmakers have wondered why Gov. Andrew Cuomo has not signed the bill, which unanimously passed in both houses of state Legislature before the end of session, to remove the cutoff date and expand the scholarship's eligibility.

"This is one of nearly 900 bills that passed both houses this session and it remains under review by Counsel's Office," Gov. Cuomo's senior adviser Rich Azzopardi said in a statement.

Representatives with the governor's office would not answer multiple requests for comment about why the bill has not

been signed or why Higher Education Services Corporation specifically reviewed and approved Briana's case, but Cuomo has not signed the bill to expand eligibility for all New Yorkers.

"The MERIT Scholarship bill we introduced, which expands eligibility to include service prior to 1990 for severely and permanently disabled veterans and their dependents, dependents of those service members deemed MIA, and Gold Star Families, passed in both legislative houses last month, and now awaits the governor's signature," bill sponsor Assemblymember Didi Barrett, D-Hudson, said in a statement. "We have urged the governor to sign this bill as soon as possible, and I encourage others to reach out to his office as well. These service members and their families have already paid an incredibly steep price, and have waited too long for these overdue changes to the MERIT Scholarship program. New York should proudly step up and support our veterans and military families and encourage them to follow their educational dreams."

Barrett has remained in touch with the Executive Chamber since session ended to urge the governor to sign the bill, but has not received a response.

"My father, a member of the Greatest Generation, always said the squeak wheel gets the grease," Steve said. "I'm doing something that wasn't only for me. It's going to help other people."

"This has nothing to do with politics. It's our veterans."

Steve entered basic training at Fort Benning, Georgia, at 17. Steve enlisted at age 16, inspired

to serve by his father, a World War II veteran who was involved in the Normandy Invasion and the Battle of the Bulge.

"My weapon became a runaway," the Army sergeant recounted. "It was firing without my finger being on the trigger."

Steve fell off a cliff on the difficult terrain while attempting to bite his ammunition-laden belt off to prevent the firearm from continuing to fire.

"The next thing I know, I'm being medivaced by helicopter and I messed up my leg pretty bad," Steve said. "My spine is a mess."

Pechacek, the former captain of Chatham Rescue Squad, and his family have lived in the county for more than two decades.

Originally from Long Island, Steve worked in

radiology technology at Stony Brook University for several years before relocating upstate in the late '90s. He worked as an MRI and application specialist for General Electric.

Steve had 15 surgeries while enlisted.

His last surgery, his 44th, was in 2012, after a difficult procedure. He retired from work afterward.

Briana's father's injuries and ongoing medical treatments inspired her to enter the field. The Chatham High School graduate plans to study nursing at the College of St. Rose in Albany starting this fall.

"I've always been interested in being able to help people," Briana said. "I've known ever since I was really young just seeing my parents go through

a lot of medical stuff, I wanted to be able to help them, but I couldn't. But now, I know I could help."

Bill co-sponsor Sen. Dan Stec, R-Plattsburgh, said last week he is confident the governor will sign the unanimously supported bill into law.

"In fairness, he's got the rest of the year for these bills to come his way," Stec said. "I don't know the inner workings and mechanics of how the second floor and the Legislature decide what bill to send to the governor in what order, so your guess is as good as mine. But I will be absolutely shocked if the governor hasn't signed the bill. There's zero reason for him to not sign this bill."

The legislative fight to fix the issue dates back to 2006.

Creepy crawlers: Do you have parasites inside you?

Do you wake up every night between 1 a.m. and 3 a.m.? Do you suffer from skin problems, bloating, digestive issues, chronic fatigue, anemia or mental fog that won't go away?

Senate GOP requests bail reform study

State Republicans want answers.

Senate Minority Leader Rob Ort, R-North Tonawanda, sent a letter last Tuesday on behalf of 20 Republican senators in the chamber's minority conference to request the state Office of Court Administration and state Division of Criminal Justice Services conduct a thorough study and analysis of the state's bail reform laws and potential links to the violent crime surge across the state since January 2020 and publicize the conclusions.

Republican leaders across the state continue to tie the state's controversial cashless bail changes included in the 2019-20 budget, which went into effect Jan. 1, 2020, in the spike in shootings, homicides and other violent crimes since early last year.

"The timing of the recent surge in shootings and violent crime directly correlates with the implementation of changes to the bail laws passed by the majorities in the Legislature," according to Ort's letter. "...It is common sense that releasing more defendants pending trial will lead to an uptick in crime. ... many of these individuals become repeat offenders. Releasing these individuals back out onto the streets only increases the likelihood they will re-offend pending trial."

Shootings in state metropolitan areas outside New York City increased 74.5% in 2020 compared

to 2019, according to the Gun Involved Violence Elimination Initiative, which Ort cited in his letter. Shootings across the state have continued to rise an additional 41.6% this year from 2020.

"We have just received the letter and will be giving the requests by the senator due consideration," state Office of Court Administration spokesman Lucian Chalfen said in a statement.

The office did not respond to queries about the potential reasons for the crime spike, or the number of criminal cases a New York judge set bail for in 2019 and 2020.

Representatives from the state Division of Criminal Justice Services did not respond to a request for comment as of press time.

"The recent surge in shootings and violent crime all across the state have confirmed our worst fears — so-called criminal justice 'reforms' passed under one-party rule are a danger to all New Yorkers," Ort said in a statement Tuesday. "Shootings are up. Hate crimes are up. While the governor's recently declared state of emergency finally acknowledged what the Republican conference has stated all along, that violence in our cities is a serious problem [and] it ignores the very policies and rhetoric he has embraced in the past two years: Bail reform, discovery reform and a war on our police. It's time for the governor to acknowledge the consequences of his actions,

and that begins by examining his own state data — not ignoring or whitewashing it."

Representatives with Democrats in the Senate majority conference declined to comment.

Shootings in New York City skyrocketed 97% from 2019 to 2020, with shootings up another 53% from last year's levels, according to the initiative.

Shootings, homicides, burglaries and car thefts exponentially increased in most U.S. cities in 2020, while other crimes, like sex offenses, declined. Each of those violent crimes and felonies remain eligible for cash bail in New York.

Cuomo declared an executive order July 6 and seven-step plan to combat surging gun violence in New York City focused on increased funding for intervention programs to engage at-risk youth in job opportunities, support ongoing gun violence prevention services and mapping shooting incidents to targeting violent city hot spots.

Assembly Leader Will Barclay, R-Pulaski, Ort, and other state Republican leaders, including leading 2022 gubernatorial nominee Congressman Lee Zeldin, R-1, have repeatedly criticized Cuomo's administration and Democrats in saying the COVID-19 pandemic is the main factor for the state and national increases in violent crimes, and not considering bail reform as a factor.

Earlier this month, representatives with the governor's office referred to a Politifact article from August that debunked former President Donald Trump's claim that New York eliminating cash bail for certain criminal offenses last year led to the state's dramatic spike in crime in urban areas.

Experts say it's too soon to understand the factors driving state and national crime rates.

A reported 482 people arrested in New York City for robbery and burglary January and February 2020 were arrested for committing a combined additional 846 crimes, according to the New York Police Department's Citywide Crime Statistics included in the Senate GOP's letter. The initial coronavirus outbreak and hit the state that March.

About 39% of the 482 accused, or 299 people, were later arrested for murder, rape, robbery, felony assault, burglary, grand larceny or grand larceny auto. The perpetrators would have been eligible for bail prior to the changes to the bail law, which was scaled back in the 2020-21 budget in early April 2020, Ort noted in his letter.

"This state is in the midst of a self-inflicted crime crisis," the Senate leader said. "In order to come up with solutions, we must fully understand the consequences of recent policies. I believe that by repealing these policies and increasing support and funding for law enforcement, we can reverse this sharp increase in violence."
