Trail system to link park and country club

COEYMANS — Town officials are working with a local business to build a trail system for walking, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing.

Officials met Sept. 9 with management of Sycamore Country Club to map out a new trail leading from Joralemon Park through the adjoining property at Sycamore Country Club.

"I met at Joralemon Park this week with our Parks Department, our Superintendent of Highways Scott Searles, and Kevin Reinisch from Sycamore Country Club," Town Supervisor George McHugh said at the September meeting of the town council. "We marked off the trail that is going to extend from Joralemon Park into Sycamore Country Club."

"We talked about the extension of the trail system that they are going to put onto their golf course

according to the company's website. The facility's restaurant would remain open year-round, the town supervisor said.

"It's going to be really nice," McHugh said.

Town Councilman Daniel Baker said the new trail system would be a great new amenity for park users.

"It will be very nice to go to Joralemon Park and maybe cross country or snowshoe around and over there, maybe get a bite to eat and come back," Baker said. "That will be pretty cool."

Town Councilman Zachary Collins asked where the park and golf course would be connected.

"It will tie in right between the fifth green and the sixth tee, just to the left of the memorial if you are coming from the Joralemon side or right of it if you are on the sixth tee," McHugh responded.

Lord's Acre Auction, Fair makes its return

COEYMANS HOLLOW — After being canceled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Lord's Acre Auction and Fair made its return Saturday.

This was the 65th year for the event. Held at Trinity United Methodist Church, the fair looked a little different this year, volunteer Melanie Collins said Saturday.

"We are having our annual Lord's Acre Auction and Fair and we added the car show this year," Collins said. "We are trying very hard to be safe and very conscious of COVID and the parameters and the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) guidelines we have to work within."

The event drew a sizable crowd eager to get out and about on a picture-perfect Saturday.

"So far, so good, and we are having a good turnout," Collins said. "We have ice cream and a bake sale, lots of flea market items, crafts, the thrift shop and games for the kids."

Each year, the auction and fair are held to raise money for the church.

"This is to benefit the church and to benefit the missions that the church supports," Collins said. "Since we are a rural church, we have a small population and a small population means smaller income, so we have to supplement it."

Proceeds from the sale of the items, both at the fair and auction, goes to the church, volunteer Phyllis Buckley said.

Buckley usually handles the book sale at the fair, but this year the book sale was not held.

"We didn't do the books this year," Buckley said. "We are a little short-handed this year because there is a dinner going on and garage sales, so we are a little short-handed today."

This year also had another change

are well-built, better than the new cars." Crafter Sue Fink was the only outside ven-

dor selling her wares at the fair and she has been doing so for a long time. "I have been doing this for many years,"

Fink said. "It's nice company — there are plenty of people to talk to. People enjoy the handmade crafts and it's fun."

Several requests have come in to the town offices about whether snowmobiling would be allowed, the town supervisor said.

"This trail system is not necessarily for snowmobiling, however Sycamore management has informed me that they are planning on marking off areas for snowmobiling on the Sycamore Country Club property, but making sure the greens are fenced off so that there is no damage to the greens," McHugh explained. "But they do want snowmobilers to have access to their clubhouse and to the restaurant and lounge all year long, so they are making provisions for snowmobiling on Sycamore property."

The trails that are being mapped out at this time are for activities like walking, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing between the park and the

country club, he added. "But there will be provisions made for snowmobiles as well," McHugh said.

In other park news, the finishing touches are being put on upgrades made by the town to Joralemon Park. The tennis and basketball courts have been under construction and are being replaced.

"Today the first basketball hoop was installed at Joralemon Park," McHugh said at the Sept. 9 meeting. "The next step is we are waiting for the second hoop to come and that may be a few more weeks."

Components of the project have been delayed due to impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, which led to delays in trucking and manufacturing, McHugh said.

Fencing is being put up, and after the second basketball hoop is installed, the final layer of the

court's surface will be completed and striped.

"Hopefully we will be done with everything by the end of the month or the first part of October," he added.

More equipment is also pending.

"The playground equipment is still on order," he said. "They are hoping that in the next two to three weeks that will arrive and they plan to have that in before the end of September."

The park project, which has been going on for several months, is coming together, McHugh added.

"It is moving slowly but surely," he said. "But seeing the basketball hoop up today was refreshing and at least gives me some optimism that this might actually happen."

The town board is expected to have further information available on the park project's progress at the next meeting Sept. 23.

Fourth annual Albany Book Festival, Sept. 25

ALBANY — The fourth Annual Albany Book Festival, presented by the NYS Writers Institute at the University at Albany, will be held Sept. 25 on the university's Uptown Campus, 1400 Washington Ave., Albany.

The annual festival will be held in-person for the first time since 2019. Events will begin at 10:30 a.m. and conclude at 5 p.m. All events are free and open to the public.

"We are proud to announce that we are returning to a live, in-person and on-campus event for our fourth annual Albany Book Festival. We've worked hard to restore all those things we missed, which make a live and in-person Albany Book Festival so magical," said Writers Institute Director Paul Grondahl.

"After the coronavirus pandemic caused us to pivot to a virtual book festival last year, we are grateful to bring together a community of readers, writers, editors, publishers and booksellers once again in a celebration of literature."

The festival will kick off with an awards ceremony honoring the New York State Author and the New York State Poet at 7:30 p.m. Sept. 24. The names of the laureates will be announced later this month. In addition, the winner of the inaugural Bruce Piasecki and Andrea Masters Award on Business and Society Writing will also

be announced Sept. 24.

The book festival will comply with all COVID-19 protocols and follow the guidance of health officials. Up-to-date information will be posted at albanybookfestival.com. While the September 25 book festival is planned to be an in-person event, some festival features are going online.

"We are expanding accessibility by offering our free writer's workshops online this year," said Grondahl. "It means the best of both worlds."

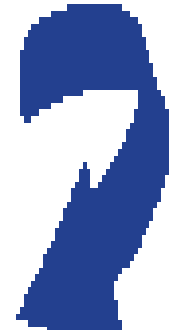

Time to bring the houseplants indoors

GARDENING TIPS

I recently returned from a week-long road trip to southeast Ohio and western North Carolina.

I spoke at a landowners' conference that was held at the United Plant Saver's Goldenseal Sanctuary, near Athens, Ohio. It was beastly hot and humid, but the participants did not seem to mind at all.

If you have not visited that part of this country, I encourage you to do so. The vegetation will look very familiar but much more vigorous than ours. Roadside plants such as New York ironweed, Joe Pye weed, wingstem, and tall coreopsis towered above my head, growing several feet taller than the roadside plants we have here. That part of Appalachia has all the wild plants we have here plus many more! The diversity of an area that was never glaciated is worth the trip in itself.

Most of our region escaped the really heavy rain last week, but parts of Greene and Ulster counties received up to 7 inches of rain, causing local flooding once again. This season has been quite different than last year in terms of precipitation. In general, our forests and fields are far healthier when it rains.

Within a few short weeks, parts of our region will have had their first frost. The days are noticeably shorter now and the evenings much cooler.

If you have tender crops such as tomatoes, beans and peppers at risk, you may want to cover them with a cloth (not plastic) blanket when frost is threatened. I had a great tomato crop that is starting to peter out now. I think I got the fertilizer rate pretty close to perfect this season, to allow most of the fruit to ripen in August. Tomato plants that get too much nitrogen fertilizer often fail to

or three nodes. (Nodes are the places where leaves come off the stems).

Cut off any flowers and dip the cuttings into a rooting hormone powder for best results. Stick the cuttings, three or four at a time, into a 6- or 8-inch plastic pot that is filled with moist potting soil. Don't use the black-colored, heavy potting soil that is sold in plastic bags. Instead, use a lightweight, soilless mixture comprised of peat moss, vermiculite and perlite.

After sticking the cuttings, put the whole pot in a clear plastic bag that is sealed on top and place it in a shaded indoor location. The cuttings should root in about two weeks and the plastic bag may be removed. After they are rooted, the pots should be placed in the sunniest windows you have available.

This is also a good time to propagate some perennial flowers. A general rule of thumb is to divide fall blooming perennials in the spring and spring flowering perennials in the fall. Right now you can dig up and divide peonies, but make sure you replant the divided clumps with the pink buds no more than one inch below the soil level. Peonies planted too deeply will not flower properly.

You may also dig up and divide bleeding hearts, columbine, Dutch iris and any other spring blooming perennial. Enjoy the current display of our wild, fall-blooming asters and consider transplanting some to your perennial garden.

Spring flowering bulb planting begins in earnest next month, but now is a good time to buy the bulbs when the selection is best. I am looking forward to the upcoming display of fall colors that is just now beginning.

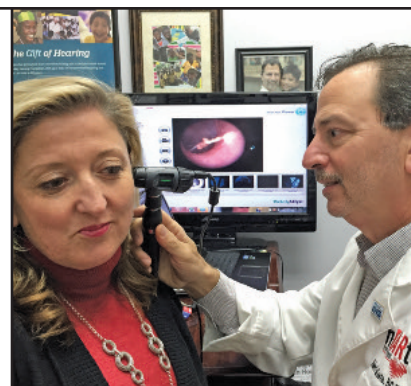

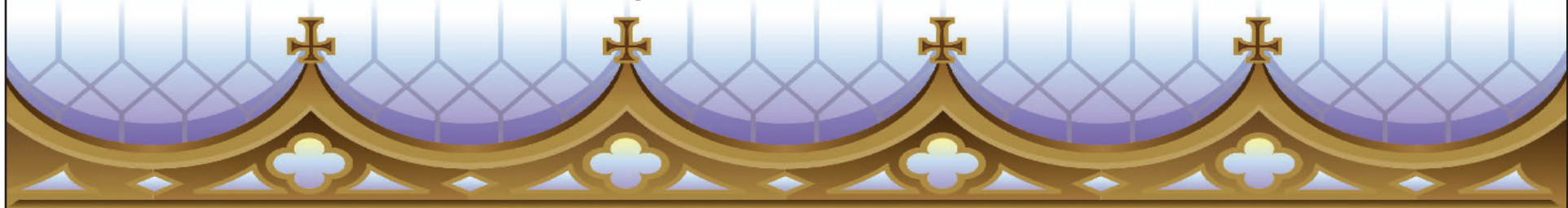

Dave MacLauchlin

One year ago this month, Dave MacLauchlin, started as manager of the Lafarge cement plant in Ravenna - an opportunity that enabled him both to utilize his two decades of industry expertise and realize a dream of returning to his home state of New York.

But the job also presented significant challenges to MacLauchlin, 45, a Western Mohawk Valley native and Clarkson University graduate. He arrived five months after the coronavirus pandemic forced the closure of everything but essential businesses across the state.

The Lafarge Ravenna plant, MacLauchlin said, shuttered briefly in April, but otherwise "operated successfully" throughout the Covid-19 crisis and never experienced an outbreak.

"That's a testament to the workforce," he said.

Now that the Covid restrictions have eased, MacLauchlin is focused on getting into the community and forging relationships. He is working to highlight how the local team has "evolved as an organization" and the plant has "evolved as a site."

"Our goal is to be a good member of the community, to be a respected member of the community," he explained. The plant is the largest employer in Southern Albany County, with 150 workers, and the largest contributor of local property taxes.

MacLauchlin often points to Ravenna plant's multimillion-dollar modernization project completed in 2017. He notes it has produced cement for many projects, including the GlobalFoundries site in Malta, which announced a significant expansion; and looks forward to playing a key role in helping New York reach its ambitious renewable energy goals.

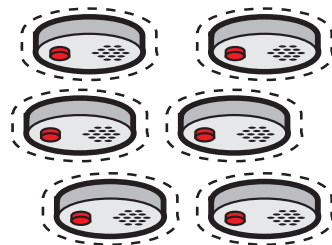
Smoke Sniffers!

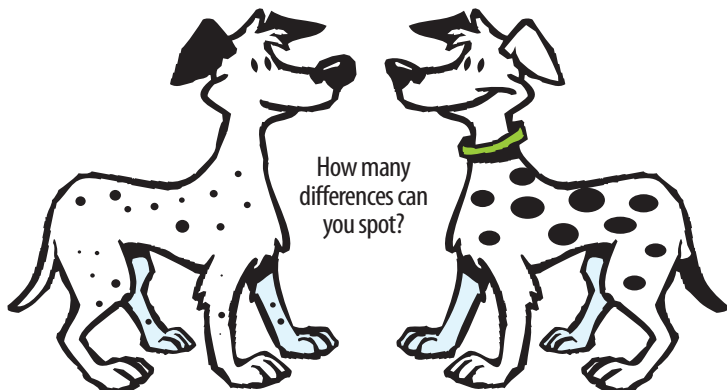

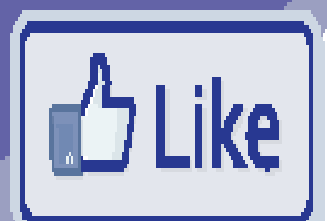

Virus suspected of killing 700 deer in seven counties

A lethal disease may be responsible for taking the lives of more than 700 deer over a seven-county area, state Department of Environmental Conservation spokesman Jomo Miller said last Friday.

DEC has confirmed cases of Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease in Columbia, Greene, Dutchess, Ulster, Nassau, Oswego and Suffolk counties. They are also tracking suspected cases in Albany, Jefferson, Oneida, Orange, Putnam, Rensselaer, Rockland, Sullivan and Westchester counties, Miller said.

The disease is not transmissible to humans, Miller said.

In New York, EHD virus is typically fatal for deer. It is transmitted by biting midges, small insects sometimes called “no-see-ums” or “punkies.” The disease is not spread from deer to deer and humans cannot be infected by deer or bites from midges, Miller said.

Once infected with EHD virus, deer usually die within 36 hours, Miller said.

EHD outbreaks are most common in the late summer and early fall when midges are abundant, although initial cases this year were

detected in late July. Signs of the virus include fever, hemorrhage in muscles or organs, and swelling of the head, neck, tongue and lips. A deer infected with EHD may appear lame or dehydrated, Miller said.

Frequently, infected deer will seek out water sources and many succumb near a water source.

There is no treatment for EHD and no means to prevent it. Dead deer cannot pass the infection to other animals.

The virus has been in New York since July and has had time to circulate and spread prior to the first killing frosts. As a

result, it has been more widespread this year than during previous outbreaks, Miller said.

EHD outbreaks do not have a significant long-term impact on regional deer populations, but deer mortality can be significant in small geographic areas.

Outbreaks occur sporadically and deer in New York have no immunity to this virus, so most EHD-infected deer in New York are expected to die. The first hard frost is expected to kill the midges that transmit the disease, ending the outbreak, Miller said.

Sightings of sick or dead deer that are suspected of having EHD

can be reported to DEC with a new online reporting form that is available at dec.ny.gov/animals or by contacting the nearest DEC Regional Wildlife Office, Miller said.

The presence of the EHD virus was first confirmed in New York state in 2007 with relatively small outbreaks in Albany, Rensselaer and Niagara counties, and in Rockland County in 2011. From early September to late October 2020, a large EHD outbreak occurred in the lower Hudson Valley, centered in Putnam and Orange counties, with an estimated 1,500 deer mortalities.

Will retiring early affect my Social Security?

Dear Rusty:
I stopped working at age 55, well before my full retirement age of 66 years and 10 months. I had over 35 years working prior to retiring from work.

I don't intend to start collecting Social Security until my full retirement age. Will I be penalized for all those years between when I stopped working and my full retirement age?

Signed: Planning Ahead

Dear Planning Ahead:
Will you be "penalized?" No, because whenever you claim your Social Security benefit, it will be based upon the highest-earning 35 years over your entire lifetime (with the early years adjusted for inflation).

Would your benefit be higher if you had continued to work and have high earnings longer? Probably, because earnings in the latter part of one's career are usually considerably higher than those in the early years. But everyone's situation

is different.

Higher earnings today don't necessarily replace those in earlier years because of the inflation adjustment. For example, someone with \$50,000 in 1990 earnings would need to earn more than about \$115,000 in today's dollars to replace the earlier year. And keep in mind that your benefit computation uses only the dollars which you paid SS taxes on. So, someone earning \$500,000 this year would, for benefit computation purposes, only get credit for \$142,800 in earnings because the latter amount is what Social Security FICA (or Self Employment) taxes were paid on.

It is from your highest-earning 35-year

history that your Average Indexed Monthly Earnings or "AIME" is determined, followed by yet another formula to convert your AIME to your "primary insurance amount" or "PIA." Your PIA is what you are entitled to in the month you attain your full retirement age (FRA).

If you claim before your full retirement age you'll get less than your PIA, and if you claim after your FRA, you'll get more than your Primary Insurance Amount. If you delay claiming past your full retirement age, you'll earn delayed retirement credits (DRCs) up to age 70, at which time your benefit could be as much as 29% more than your PIA. Of course, you can also claim at any time

between your FRA and age 70 to get all DRCs you've earned to the point you claim.

So, as you can see, the Social Security benefit you get will be determined by two main things — your 35-year lifetime earnings history, and the age at which you claim. You can't do much now to change your 35-year earnings history (short of returning to work and having very high current earnings), but you can control when you claim. And that decision, of course, should consider your health and your life expectancy, how badly you need the money, and your marital status. Your marital status is important if your spouse can collect a spousal benefit from your record, or if

you are concerned about the amount your survivor(s) will receive if you die first.

Helping Harvest is a program of Hope Full

Life Center Inc., a charity also located in Faith Plaza. The charity's mission is to provide a helping hand, not a hand-out, to improve life for neighbors. Helping Harvest is largely run by volunteers.

"Families who live paycheck to paycheck often aren't able to buy all the food they need for a week in one shopping trip. Being open six days

instead of four days each week will help families have more access to low-cost, nutritious food," said Rebecca Marion Flach, executive director of Hope Full Life Center.

Helping Harvest has nearly 500 active members and has served more than 1,450 families since 2010. Many are the working poor or senior citizens. The program

remained open throughout the pandemic and sent home an estimated \$200,000 worth of groceries with struggling families in 2020.

Helping Harvest carries a variety of dry goods, frozen products, dairy, meats and produce. The store is located down the mall hallway using the exterior entrance between China King and

Ravena Pizza.

Individuals and families interested in shopping at Helping Harvest are encouraged to stop by and fill out a simple membership application. Membership is free.

Remember, God did not give us a spirit of fear. "I prayed to the Lord, and he answered me. He freed me from all of my fears." Psalm 34:4.

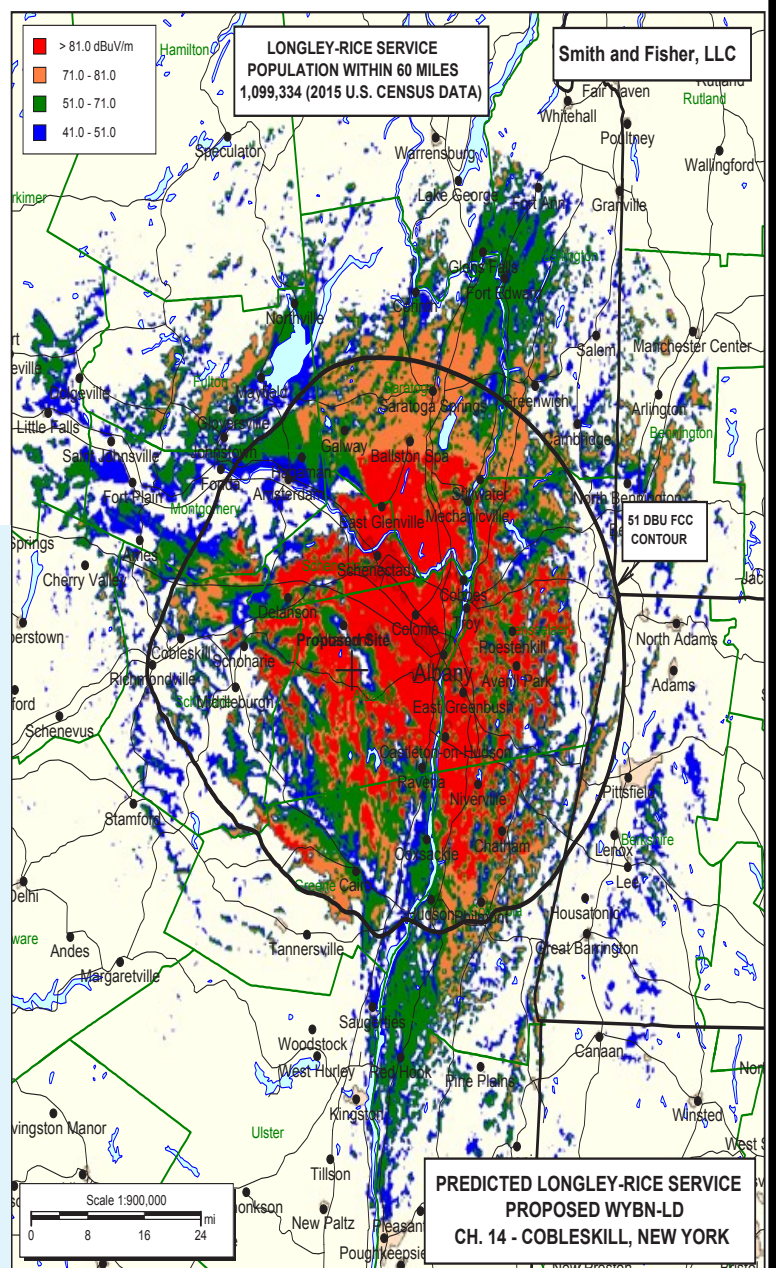

Firefighters face new risks as tech advances

As the United States moves to new, greener technology, fire departments are learning of the dangers associated with it, specifically solar panels and electric cars.

"The risk of electrocution is there, when fighting fires around roof-mounted solar panels," Greenport Fire Chief John Onufrychuk Jr. said.

Solar panels are always charged, even if they're disconnected.

"Power is always contained within them," said John Greco, training officer for the Athens Fire Department.

At many fire scenes, firefighters cut holes in the roof to ventilate the building. That process cannot be done if the roof has solar panels mounted on it, Hudson Fire Chief Anthony Demarco said.

The Greenport Fire Department will cut holes on both sides of the eaves instead, Onufrychuk said. The panels weigh several hundred pounds.

"You don't want to cut holes in the roof and weaken it with all that weight up there," Greco said.

Some firefighters in Greene County recently attended a class on fighting fires involving solar panels. The class was run by the Cossackie Fire Department, Greco said.

Electric vehicle fires pose safety risks to first responders, according to the National Transportation Safety Board.

The risks of electric shock and battery fires

arise from the stranded energy that remains in a damaged battery, the agency said.

It takes several thousand gallons of water to extinguish a fire in an electric car. A gasoline-powered car might take 300 gallons to extinguish, Greco said.

Fighting fires in electric vehicles is much more difficult. They require a lot of water, and a larger hose, to get them out, Onufrychuk said.

Electric cars rely on a bank of lithium-ion batteries similar to batteries

found in a cellphone or computer. But unlike a small phone battery, the large batteries found in the Tesla Model X, for example, contain enough energy to power an average American home for more than two days, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The batteries are also located in areas that are often difficult to reach, such as under the back seat or buried in the trunk of the car, Demarco said.

The NTSB is calling

for manufacturers to write vehicle-specific response guides for fighting battery fires and limiting chemical thermal runaway and reignition.

Cleanup after an electric car fire is more difficult as well, due to the substances in the lithium-ion batteries, Greco said.

Officials at the Firefighters Training Facility in Ghent are planning to schedule more training classes involving electric car fires in the future, Keeler said.

Hinchey bill targets brain injury care

State Sen. Michelle Hinchey, D-46, is proposing legislation that would mandate a study to improve access to care for New Yorkers living with traumatic brain injuries.

Traumatic brain injury, or TBI, affects how the brain works and is a major cause of disability and death nationally, with about 166 Americans dying each day from TBI-related injuries, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Hinchey's bill, if adopted, would look at ways to improve access to TBI care, particularly in rural and underserved areas.

"We have written a bill that will become the first statutorily mandated comprehensive study on the regional delivery of TBI care in New York state," Hinchey, who represents Coeymans and Ravena, said during a Zoom press conference. "Our bill requires the Department of Health and OPWDD (Office for People with Developmental Disabilities) to evaluate the regional disparities in care that are leaving entire communities behind, like the Hudson Valley."

The study would look at regional differences in TBI care, the administrative process for approving or denying requests for TBI services, the quality of TBI service delivery and training for providers, and emerging trends in TBI to improve scientific understanding, Hinchey said.

"According to the CDC, an estimated 2.5 million people sustain a traumatic brain injury annually, making TBI a leading cause of disability and death in the United States," Hinchey said. "The situation is even worse for adults and children living in rural areas who are more likely to die from a TBI because of health care barriers, which include the grueling administrative difficulties and long delays in receiving TBI care."

The situation is more dire in rural and upstate communities where there may be gaps in the delivery of care, Hinchey added.

Hinchey has been working on the legislation with input from Hannah and Katherine Berryan.

Hannah Berryan, 23, suffered a traumatic brain injury following an accident and her mother, Katherine, has been trying to obtain necessary medical services and supports for her.

"Seven years ago, our lives changed forever," Katherine Berryan said Wednesday. "I thought our fight would be saving Hannah's life, but sadly that

was not the case. Upon being released home, our journey would really begin. It has been six years since Hannah has been home. It has been six years since Hannah has received TBI services and supports."

The Berryans have been denied services that would promote Hannah's recovery, she said.

"Hannah has only ever wanted to be seen and acknowledged as a relevant resident of New York state who has the right to live a quality of life with access to TBI-appropriate interventions," Katherine Berryan said.

Many New Yorkers face a similarly

bleak situation under the present system, Hinchey said.

"So many people like Hannah are in the shadows in this situation and have been for decades," Hinchey said.

Attorney March Gallagher represents the Berryans in their quest for adequate care for Hannah from the state.

"Thousands of New Yorkers with traumatic brain injuries lack the opportunity for community-based treatments that would improve the quality of life that actually would save thousands of taxpayer dollars," Gallagher said on the Zoom conference call Wednesday.

An example of a service that would save money in the long run is a seizure service dog, Gallagher said. Hannah suffers from seizures, some of them severe enough to require hospitalization.

"If Hannah had a seizure service dog, there are possible hospitalizations that could have been avoided," Gallagher said. "This bill will encourage OPWDD to examine the full range of services available to all New Yorkers with TBI."

Barry Dain, president of the board of the Brain Injury Association of New York State, said legislation aimed at assisting New Yorkers with traumatic brain injuries has been a long time coming.

His organization has been advocating for people with the condition for 40 years.

"There are many unmet needs — the biggest one is housing," Dain said.

Services may be available but not easily accessible, he said.

Hinchey said the legislation would be a step in the right direction in making appropriate services available to New Yorkers living with traumatic brain injuries.

"This will help us start to get the answers we need to be able to move forward and move life forward for so many people across our communities," Hinchey said.

DiNapoli: 'Digital divide' plagues rural NY

HUDSON — The state Comptroller's Office released a report last Tuesday looking at broadband, household access and availability.

"Reliable, high-speed internet is a necessity to effectively work, communicate and learn in our society and that was made crystal clear during the COVID-19 pandemic when millions of New Yorkers turned their homes into schools and workplaces," Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli said during a news conference at Hudson City Hall in Columbia County.

"The state has taken significant steps to make broadband available to most New Yorkers, but there is still a digital divide in rural parts of New York and for low-income New Yorkers who don't have access or are unable to afford a home subscription," DiNapoli said.

Broadband can be looked at in two ways, DiNapoli said: One is availability or the geographic region that is wired for broadband. The other is access to broadband. One in three New York households with an income less than \$20,000 lacked access to broadband at home, according

to the report.

New York is ranked second in the nation in percentage of the population with broadband availability in their neighborhood. The report found there are more than 1 million households, or 13.8% of households in the state, that do not have access or a subscription to home broadband services.

"What are the solutions? The state needs to craft a detailed strategy that can leverage the federal funding provided by the American Rescue Plan and any new funds that may be provided under the infrastructure bill currently before Congress," DiNapoli said. "And were

very hopeful."

Large swaths of the population in New York state still do not have widely available access to broadband.

"We need street level analysis," U.S. Rep. Antonio Delgado, D-19, said. "A far more accurate methodology."

Using Census block data for broadband availability maps does not give an accurate depiction of an area's availability and access to broadband, Delgado said.

The congressman also talked about the need for faster internet speeds. He said the old 25 megabytes per second is no longer fast enough to do what

people learning and working from home need from their internet, and that speeds of 100 megabytes are needed.

All the speakers noted how important having broadband became in the home during the pandemic when students were learning remotely and adults were converting living rooms to office space.

"We all know all too well life in the age of COVID made it alarmingly clear to every New Yorker just how essential broadband is," Assemblywoman Didi Barrett, D-Hudson, said. "To live, to learn, to work,

to play and to stay well and healthy in the 21st century."

Access to high-speed broadband is a public need, state Sen. Daphne Jordan, R-Halfmoon, said.

"It's so important to advance an agenda that puts the people's needs first, and access to affordable, reliable high-speed broadband is exactly that," Jordan said. "A public need, a public benefit, a public good — that's what state Comptroller DiNapoli has done in advancing his comprehensive, thoughtful new report which is a must read for anyone."
