You may be assured that IMI/NLI will continue to practice and reinforce to others basic health and safety protocols to ensure the safety of all with whom we engage:

- Require guest and visitor sign-in upon entry to the event facility
- Provide masks for optional use by visitors, guests, personnel, and contractors on the premises.
- Practice frequent hand washing with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds on both sides and between fingers.
- Provide alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol for open use.
- Request staff to avoid people who are ill and insist that persons who have symptoms of illness stay home.
- Disinfect and sanitize all facilities and high-contact surfaces, such as doorknobs and tables, shelving, desktops, office equipment, etc. on a continuous basis.
- Place signage in designated areas to remind staff and visitors of health and safety precautions.
