### PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such head gear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted

## RULES AND INFORMATION

1. All Dressage at Pepper Creek Shows and every class offered herein are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and the CDS Standing Rules and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
2. ENTRY PROCEDURE: Entries must be submitted online at <https://entry.foxvillage.com/>. Paper entries will be accepted but they must be made on the entry form in this prize list and must be filled out completely. This includes all signatures, membership numbers, classes entered, etc. Only the entry form and signature page in this prize list will be accepted. The USEF entry agreement WILL NOT be accepted. Mail entries to: Pepper Creek/Jessie Harlan 385 Creelman Lane Ramona CA 92065. Make Checks Payable To: Pepper Creek
3. MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: CDS Members in good standing shall be eligible to participate as riders, owners or trainers. A non-member may also participate upon payment of a \$25 CDS non-member fee. All participants must be a CDS member or pay the non-member fee. Scores earned by non-members will not count toward CDS awards or qualification for CDS Championships, Regional Adult Amateur Competitions or Junior Championships. WDAA encourages Western Dressage riders to provide their membership number and their horses ID number.
4. PROOF OF VACCINATION: Proof of vaccination for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) on or after November 17, 2025 is required for all horses. Proof of vaccination must be on 1) the US Equestrian Vaccination Record (available at <https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/xUbu-pT8eLM/equine-vaccination-record>), 2) the vaccination record from the horse's passport or 3) a complete copy of a report from the administering veterinarian may be provided, if it includes the name of the veterinarian, the name of the horse (the name on the entry), the name and lot number of the vaccination and the date administered. See the USEF Rulebook (GR844) for the specific requirements. Please bring the original records to the show in case there are questions. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.
5. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are filled. All entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry shall be assessed a late fee of \$50.00. Any entry changed after the closing date will be accommodated at Horse Show Management's sole and absolute discretion and will incur a \$35.00 change fee. Riders will ride with their classes, unless riding multiple horses, in accordance with Federation rules. Each competitor is responsible for supplying Horse Show Management with Rider's full name and CDS number; Horse's name; Owner's full name and CDS number; Trainer's full name; Coach's full name (if applicable) & copies of each applicable membership card, BEFORE the day of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward qualification for the CDS Finals, RAAC or Jr Championships (see CDS Omnibus).
6. CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show; its Directors

and Employees, and Pepper Creek Equine Center; its Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident, to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise.

7. **CLOSING OF ENTRIES:** All entries close at midnight (Pacific Time Zone) on May 3, 2026, (the “Closing Date”). Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are filled. Mail-in entries must be received on or before the closing date. Electronic entries must be received not later than midnight on the closing date. All entries received after the closing date will be considered late entries and will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry shall be assessed a late fee of \$50.00.
8. **INCOMPLETE ENTRIES:** Entries are considered incomplete if any of the following are not provided: signed entry agreement (with signatures of rider, owner, trainer, coach (if applicable) and parent (if applicable)); proof of vaccinations; and proof of CDS membership of rider and owner. Entries incomplete at midnight on May 3, 2026 will be charged a \$15.00 incomplete entry fee at check-in. Documents not included with the original entry submission may be emailed to the Show manager at [peppercreekequine@gmail.com](mailto:peppercreekequine@gmail.com).
9. **WAIT LISTED ENTRIES:** Management reserves the right to stop accepting entries if the show fills before the published closing date. Entries received after that date will continue to be accepted, if the competitor desires to be wait listed. Entries placed in a wait list status will be prioritized based upon date and time of receipt. Any entrant whose entry is placed in a wait list status will be contacted by the Show Secretary via email or phone. In the event that an entrant scratches his/her entry, wait listed entrants will be contacted. Any wait listed entrant that refuses to move to an active entry status will be removed from the wait list and the next wait listed entrant will be contacted.
10. **REFUSAL OF ENTRIES:** Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitors.
11. **REFUNDS, CHANGES AND SCRATCHES:** Scratches made prior to the closing date will receive a refund, less the office fee. It is the rider’s, owner’s or trainer’s responsibility to inform the Show Secretary via email, text or telephone call of their intention to scratch. Absolutely no refunds for scratches after the Closing Date. Class changes or additions after the closing date will incur a \$35.00 change fee and will be made only at the discretion of Horse Show Management. Scratches made after check-in at the show must be made in writing on Scratched Ride Form at least two rides before the scheduled ride time so that the judge may be notified. Scratches made ringside will be considered a No Show and may result in automatic scratch from any remaining rides for the day (see DR126.2.b.3.)
12. **RETURNED CHECKS:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be charged an additional 10% penalty (\$35.00 minimum). Accounts will be given ten (10) calendar days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into CDS for further disciplinary action.
13. **RESPONSIBILITY:** All owners will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, and their agents or employees, to buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be handled accordingly.

14. **DISCIPLINE:** Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials of this show by the owner, exhibitor, agent, lessee, trainer, coach, groom, rider, handler or family of the above, will result in disqualification of the horse from the show. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to remove a horse, owner, exhibitor, agent, lessee, trainer, coach, groom, rider or handler from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.
15. **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions with regard to or arising out of incident at the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, with their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to: refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claim for damages, cancel or combine any classes, reschedule classes and rotate judges in order to facilitate the time schedule.
16. **CANCELLATION:** In the event of rain or inclement weather prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to call the Horse Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are not canceled due to rain unless footing is deemed unsafe. If this show is canceled for any reason, a \$50.00 per day fee will be retained from each entry fee.
17. **SHOW OFFICE:** Exhibitors are encouraged to check-in promptly upon first arrival on the show grounds. The show office will open approximately 2 hours before the start of the show and until approximately 1 hour after the last ride of the day. Horse Show Management can be reached at (760) 300-8296 or (760) 644-6322.
18. **TESTS:** Current USDF, USEF, FEI and WDAA tests will be used.
19. **SCORED TESTS** will only be distributed to riders, or their authorized representatives, after the results have been finalized for the class and the awards presented. The winner of each class is the competitor having the highest total points. Ties will be broken as stated in the USEF Rulebook (DR123.3 or WD127.3).
20. **READING TESTS:** Reading tests is acceptable at our shows as stated in the USEF Rulebook (DR122.1 and WD126.1). Readers should be a MINIMUM of 6 feet away from any perimeter of the dressage court. Readers may stand near "E" or "B".
21. **NUMBER OF TESTS:** Horses may compete in no more than one Recognized Competition on the same day(s) and are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level, and a maximum of 3 rides per day for WDAA tests.
22. **RIDE TIMES:** Final ride times will be available at <https://foxvillage.com/> by the Thursday of the week of the show. Please call Show Management for times if you are unable to access the website. Ride times will also be posted on the show grounds at the show office during the show. Be sure to check your times at the show office on the morning of the show to make sure nothing has changed.
23. **RIBBONS & AWARDS:** In each class, the first place winner will receive an award. Ribbons are given first to sixth place for each division (Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider),

24. JUDGES: If for any reason a judge fails to attend the show or to perform his duties, the Horse Show Management reserves the right to substitute a judge of the same or higher rating for one who was officially designated in the Premium.
25. JUNIORS: All minors/juniors must be supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall identify, defend and hold CDS, USDF, USEF and Horse Show Management harmless there from. All juniors must wear properly fitted protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) while riding anywhere on the showgrounds. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian of the junior exhibitor, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use and is properly fitted and in good condition. Horse Show Management and licensed officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. CDS, USDF, USEF makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, that any protective headgear and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involved inherent dangerous risk and as such no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
26. ADULT & JUNIOR / YOUNG RIDERS: Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. You must specify on the entry which section you are entered in A (Am) or Jr (Junior)/Young Rider (YR). **Riders claiming amateur status must have a USEF Amateur Card.**
27. UNRATED CLASSES: CDS only recognized shows may offer unrated classes including but not limited to USDF Intro tests, USEA Eventing tests, Western Dressage tests, Leadline classes, etc. The mandatory helmet rule shall apply. Riders and horse owners in unrated classes at CDS only recognized shows must 1) be a member of CDS or 2) pay the non-member fee and complete the CDS non-member information form.
28. TEST OF CHOICE CLASSES: Horse/rider combinations may enter each Test of Choice class a maximum of one time. If entering a second test of choice class, the provisions of DR119.2 and WD102.2 apply.
29. STABLE AVAILABILITY: **No stabling is available at this show. All entries must pay the Grounds Fee.**
30. SHARPS CONTAINER LOCATION: The sharps container will be located in the show office.
31. ARENA DIMENSIONS AND FOOTING: Show arena is 20 m x 60 m. Show arena may be shortened to 20 m x 40 m for USEF Introductory, and WDAA Introductory and Basic Level classes. A warm-up arena of at least 100 ft x 200 ft is provided. Footing consists of mainly sand and DG in the show arena and in the warm-up arena. Only those horses entered in the show are permitted use of the show facilities, warm-up arena and show area. All horses on the show grounds must wear competition numbers. No lunging in the warm-up arena.

32. **DOGS:** Exhibitors are encouraged to not bring dogs to the show. If a dog must come to the show they are required to be on a leash at all times.
33. **PARKING:** All trailers are required to park in the designated trailer area as defined on the map. No trailers are permitted to park in any other areas. Cars are permitted in designated areas. Cars are allowed in trailer parking only if necessary, but need to be polite and courteous to the trailers.
34. **CDS HIGH SCORE PONY AWARD:** The high scoring pony at Training - Grand Prix (Freestyles, Walk Trot excluded) at each CDS recognized show will receive a High Score Pony Ribbon. To be eligible, all ponies must have a current USEF DRESSAGE Pony Measurement Card. If the pony is measured at a show and receives a temporary show measurement, that measurement will be good for all CDS shows during that show season. CDS also offers a Year End Award to the Highest Scoring Pony in Open, Amateur and Junior Divisions. If interested in participating in this program, please include a copy of the pony's USEF Dressage Pony Measurement Card.
35. **CDS HIGH SCORE PARA RIDER AWARD:** The high scoring para rider at all levels and tests, excluding freestyles, will receive a High Score Para Rider Ribbon from CDS. To be eligible, riders must be members of CDS and provide a copy of their Dispensation/Classification Certificate.
36. **DAILY HIGH POINT AWARD:** Daily High Point Awards will be given to the horse/rider combination that earns the highest score. High Point Awards will be given in the following categories:

Dressage Open

Dressage Amateur

Dressage Jr/Yr

Western Dressage Open

Western Dressage Amateur

Western Dressage Jr/Yr

Dressage scores may be earned from Training Level through Grand Prix. Western Dressage scores may be earned from Basic Level through Level 5 tests. Scores earned at Introductory Level (both traditional and Western Dressage) and all freestyle tests do not count towards high point awards.

#### **2026 Year-End Awards**

All riders in good standing are eligible to qualify for year-end awards for our 2026 season! To qualify, each horse and rider combination must:

1. Pay a one-time \$50 nomination fee on or before the day of our last show (August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2026)
2. Attend a minimum of 2 out of the 3 shows.
3. Earn at least 2 scores of 60% or higher per level you are competing in (2 consecutive levels allowed per horse and rider combination).

Scores will automatically be tracked throughout the season. All Intro through Grand Prix, and Intro through Level 5 divisions will be awarded (Open, Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider). At a minimum, Champion and Reserve Champion for each level/division will be awarded.

## Regional Adult Amateur Competition

**MISSION:** The mission of these competitions is to provide an opportunity for all CDS Adult Amateur riders to qualify and compete against others of similar skills and experience. The regional nature of these shows will help to provide our membership with a developmental path for gaining competitive experience, promote excellence and increase awareness of and support for the Chapters.

### GOALS:

#1 – For the Chapters: These regional or “mid” level adult amateur competitions are designed to promote and enhance awareness and participation by the CDS Chapters, provide State level support in funding and advertisement, and a chance to generate funds at the chapter level.

#2 – For the Riders: These competitions will provide a positive “introductory” show experience for some, which will hopefully be a stepping stone to bigger things, while offering the other more experienced amateur riders a warm-up for the Championship Show.

#3 – For the Whole Organization: These competitions are designed to bridge the gap between the local chapter shows with individual year end awards programs and the tremendously difficult, top caliber competition at the Annual CDS Championship Show.

**LOCATIONS:** Three Regional CDS Chapter Adult Amateur Competitions will be held each year, one in each of the regions as defined in the CDS bylaws; north, central and south.

### ELIGIBILITY:

- Participants at the RAAC shows must be current members of CDS, must have a USEF Amateur Card under Dressage Rules, and must be 22 years of age or older.
- The horse owner must be a current member of CDS.
- Qualification is for an amateur rider/horse team.
- To be eligible to compete, the \$25 registration fee for each horse and rider team per level MUST BE PAID to the CDS Central Office by close of business no later than 12 days prior to the first day of competition at the regional show entered.
- Scores earned before paying the fee will count provided the payment is received at the Central Office prior to close of business as specified above.
- 2026 Qualifying Opens: September 3, 2025 at any show with CDS recognition.
- 2026 Qualifying Closes: 12 days prior to the first competition day of the regional show entered.
- Scores earned at the CDS Championship Show will NOT count towards qualification.
- Horse/rider teams who qualify MAY compete in ONLY ONE regional competition

Qualification scores must be earned at CDS recognized shows and are as follows, scores can be earned at any test of the level:

- 3 scores from 2 judges at Introductory C of 65% or higher, USDF Intro C only, Novice only
- 3 scores from 2 judges at Training Level of 60% or higher, any test
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 1st level of 60% or higher, any test
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 2nd level of 60% or higher, any test
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 3rd level of 60% or higher, any test
- 3 scores from 2 judges at 4th level of 60% or higher, any test
- 3 scores from 2 judges at PSG - Grand Prix of 60% or higher

Elite horse and rider teams that have won either Champion or Reserve Champion at the CDS Annual Championship Show at Training and 1st Levels are not eligible to compete in the RAAC shows at that level. Elite Adult Amateurs are riders that have competed in a CDS Championship Show. Novice Adult Amateurs are riders who have never competed in the CDS Championship Show. ROSES Award neck ribbons will be awarded in three divisions for the High Percentage Elite and Novice Rider 50 years of age and older who officially sign-up for the division prior to their RAAC ride. Divisions: Basic through First; Second through Fourth; and FEI.

I AGREE to release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

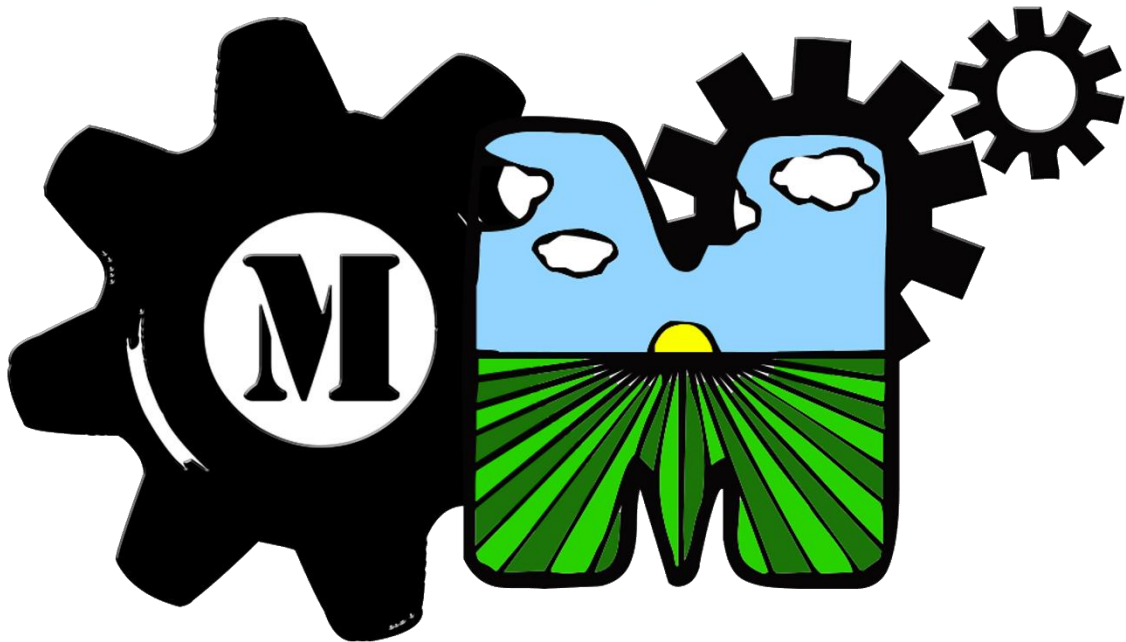
