We value your prayers. Here are some prayer requests:

1. Our night-guard Julius who became a Christian is no longer working for us because we had to make a switch from that guard company for other reasons. But we will still be talking to him and meeting him to encourage him and help him grow in his faith. Julius continues to read the Bible and discuss it with his girlfriend and other friends. He has stayed strong and not gone back to his alcohol addiction. He is preparing and saving money in order to get married. We believe his faith is very real, but some bad habits are hard to change. We had regular frustrations with him concerning negligent work and dishonesty. But we kept on forgiving him and being patient with him. We know God is working in his life and Julius will keep growing in his faith and character. We ask that you keep on praying for him and his other friends who got saved, some of whom we are able to talk to from time to time and others who have moved away from Soroti.
2. Please pray that the government here would renew our work permits, and would do it within a short time before our current work permits expire.

The Persecuted Church: Syria Church Serves Needy in Homs

A church in Syria recently distributed food packages to 100 displaced families near the city of Homs. Many families had come to the church seeking help, so ministry teams visited the families at home to verify their need before assembling and distributing food parcels containing items like olive oil, cheese, pasta, fava beans, rice and spices. Most of the families who received the food packages do not receive help from any other source. “We thank the Lord ... and pray He will help us be able to offer help to more families whose lives were changed and damaged by the war,” said the church’s pastor. Help them in their want and joy for food for their physical needs but more than that, that they hunger for the Lord more. Pray that those receiving the food aid will experience the love of Jesus, and pray for the believers in Syria who are caring for others in Jesus’ name. Protect, provide for, comfort, strengthen, encourage & guide them. May they stay strong, united in faith, committed to Christ & growing in numbers & maturity. May they keep showing Christ's love to these families.
