Our true power source
The story is told of someone who plugged a power strip into itself and then couldn't understand why the system wouldn't turn on! We get a kick out of such tales, yet how often do we try to "power" our own lives? We frequently think we need to be the source of our own strength, joy, peace, energy and wisdom.
Jesus doesn't teach us to find life within ourselves – or in any human being or earthly circumstance, object or philosophy. Rather, calling himself the good shepherd, Jesus says, "I have come that [my sheep] may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).
We don't access that abundant life by "plugging into" ourselves. Instead, Jesus invites us to plug into his power – and joy, peace, hope, truth – through prayer and Scripture, worship and service, fellowship with other Christians and the beauty of God's world.

When we can't find Easter
Easter is the most joyous Christian holy day ... except when it's not. What do we do when our mood isn't what we think it "should" be? The kids are sugared up, we're juggling family gatherings (and maybe conflicts), our everyday challenges remain, and festive hymns – however rousing – fail to lift our spirits. We wonder, "What's wrong with me, that I can't seem to find Easter?"
Been there, done that. And it's okay. *You're* okay.
Jesus' resurrection doesn't scoop us out of our troubles, but the death-defying Christ walks through them beside us, on our own Emmaus road (Luke 24). We aren't alone. When we can't find Easter, Easter somehow finds us – if not on this designated Sunday, perhaps two days from now, or next week or mid-May. Watch for it; keep your heart open. Christ is risen indeed – and you shall be too.

Tailoring Program Helps Transform Lives

A group of women who were disowned by their families after coming to faith in Christ are now receiving vocational training that will help them support themselves. Upon graduation from the VOM-supported program, the women will be equipped to set up a small tailoring business. *“These women have been transformed spiritually, physically, morally, emotionally and socially,”* said the VOM partner who oversees the program. He said the women are also active witnesses for Christ in the town where the training center is located. *“Through their effective evangelism,”* he said, *“we are getting ready to baptize 15 converts.”* Praise God for His work in these women’s lives, and pray for the success of their new businesses.

Are you continuing to pray that God would use us to share His love and the Good News of the Gospel with our community? Pray that the presence of God will shine through us, the Emden Church Family, and that He will use us in His Kingdom will.
