

Harvest time!

With harvest underway, fields of ripe grain, tall cornstalks and soybeans turning brown recall Jesus' words to the disciples: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38).

Nowadays farmers use fewer laborers and bigger machines than in decades past. But what about harvests of faith? Leading people to know God's love can't be done "mechanically." Studies show that newspaper ads or door-hangers left anonymously are less effective at bringing people to church than a warm personal invite.

Right after urging his disciples to pray for harvest workers — in a classic instance of "You might be God's answer to your own prayer!" — Jesus sends them out as those very laborers! How will they work the harvest? Not by guiltting people into faith. Not by pronouncing judgment or Biblical law. But by using Jesus' authority to counter evil, illness and brokenness among those they befriend.

Ponder and pray about where Jesus is sending you as his laborer to cultivate and reap Christian faith and assurance of God's love.

THE PERSECUTED CHURCH: Malawi

God is Moving among the Yao People

VOM workers report with joy about a movement of God happening among the Yao people in Malawi, Mozambique and Tanzania. Once considered an “unreachable” people group, today there are more than 4,000 believers among the predominantly Muslim Yao people. Breakthrough came about five years ago. Prior to that, there were only three dedicated believers working among the Yao. Something shifted and new Yao Christians chose to stay in their communities while being persecuted instead of fleeing. Their presence, and the forgiveness and love they have demonstrated, caused many hearts to be open to the good news. Now, entire villages are following Christ and some of the old mosques are being used as churches. Praise God! And pray for those who continue to labor among the Yao.

Continue to pray for area churches: Ebenezer Presbyterian, St. John’s Lutheran, First Lutheran, United Methodist, Holy Redeemer, Our Saviors Lutheran, Temple of Jesus Christ, Hispanic Church and Emden. Ask God to continue to move through His church to the glory of His kingdom. Remember—we are part of God’s kingdom and need to always be following Him.

Are you continuing to pray that God would use us to share His love and the Good News of the Gospel with our community? Pray that the presence of God will shine through us, the Emden Church Family, and that He will use us in His Kingdom will.
