Mountain bike tourism in Zermatt

Alpine mountain bike tourism is predicted to have a great future.

Experts expect that biking will become a central element of summer tourism. In a manual published in 2016, the SwitzerlandMobility Foundation also states that mountain biking has evolved from a trend to a popular sport over the past 25 years . The sport is incredibly important for both leisure activities and summer tourism .

Zermatt has also been tackling this summer outdoor trend for some time now. In recent years, a mountain biking strategy has been developed in the Matterhorn village, which is currently being implemented in stages.

Several infrastructures specifically designed

for mountain biking , which are gaining increasing importance , as well as modern tourism offerings tailored to this user group, were implemented, particularly last year and this year .

To date, bikers have access to around 100 kilometers of marked mountain bike trails in the Zermatt mountains.

On page 10 of this issue of "Zermatt Inside," a photo gallery provides readers with an impression of the moderately difficult tour from the Gornergrat down to Zermatt. The continuation of the new bike trail from Zermatt to Visp, which opened in mid-July, also offers fascinating views.

The fact that the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination is serious about expanding its biking offerings and thus aims to sustainably revitalize summer tourism is also demonstrated by the inauguration of the so-called Moos Trail on August 27, 2016. Furthermore, a major event for bikers will take place in the Matterhorn village in mid-September 2016. The Perskindol Swiss Epic Bike Race starts in Zermatt , which promises to position the destination as an attractive mountain bike destination both nationally and internationally .

A school year with many highlights

EMANY SMALL AND LARGE HIGHLIGHTS ACCOMPANIED THE 2015/2016 SCHOOL YEAR

Focus areas in orientation and primary

The Zermatt schools have started the new school year with an expanded school administration and a wide range of tasks and challenges.

For the pupils of the primary and orientation schools as well as their teachers, the lessons were the main focus of everyday life, which challenged everyone, be it the first steps in the German language or daily learning, dealing with the subject matter and perseverance as well as the necessary "bite" when things got difficult at times.

This year, the orientation school placed a lot of emphasis

In the primary school, in addition to the usual extracurricular activities in the areas of sports (ski and cross-country skiing week, etc.), culture (reading night, Zermatt Festival, garden project, etc.), and parish life (path of reconciliation, first communion, confirmation), various class camps and cross-class projects (for example, the 3H baked Grittibänze together with the 10th OS) were realized, an atmospheric Christmas concert was performed, and the children and parents were sensitized and trained by the school social workers in the use of digital media.

Furthermore, the teachers of the 1H/2H classes performed the musical "Räuber KnatterRatter" with their schoolchildren, and the teachers of the 4H played their way into the hearts of the numerous audience with their students with the musical

CONCLUSIONS ON DISPOSAL BEHAVIOUR

For almost four years now, the revised waste regulations based on the polluter pays principle have been implemented in Zermatt. Since its introduction, the population's waste disposal behavior has changed, which has also had an impact on the recycling rate. This has increased from just under 20% to a pleasing 60%.

Regional education strategy for the communities of Zermatt – Täsch – Randa

Another highlight is the development of a joint education strategy for the Zermatt – Täsch – Randa school region.

With a regional education strategy, the municipalities of Zermatt, Täsch, and Randa are defining the priorities of their education policy for the next ten years. The goal is to offer the children and young people of the three municipalities good educational opportunities and optimally prepare them for work and life. To achieve this, it is necessary for the key stakeholders (schools, parents, politicians, employers, and associations) to network and jointly assume responsibility for the implementation of the education strategy.

On November 19, 2015, around 30 representatives from schools, parents, politics, and businesses in the municipalities of Zermatt, Täsch, and Randa worked together to develop the topics relevant to them for the education strategy. The results were subsequently compiled in collaboration with the school president and the school management team into the following four key areas.

condensed into fields of action (see box below).

Danica Zurbriggen Lehner (Deputy Head of Primary School), as project manager, worked with the respective stakeholder groups to fine-tune the strategic directions. The committee supplemented these with action areas that clearly indicate which group of people each strategic direction applies to.

Following a consultation with stakeholder groups, the regional education strategy was submitted to the authorities for approval. All three municipalities approved the education strategy, meaning that planning for its implementation can now begin. The respective stakeholder groups will formulate, schedule, and implement concrete measures for the implementation of the education strategy, beginning with the 2016/17 school year. The entire process is being supported by a team from the Management and Systems Development department of the Institute for Media Education and Continuing Education at the University of Teacher Education Bern.

Basic script replaces the «Schnüerlischrift»

SIMPLE AND CLEAR

At the beginning of the 2016/2017 school year, basic script will be gradually introduced in primary schools (3H-8H) in Upper Valais. Teachers in grades 3H and 4H are currently being trained and will begin writing in basic script with their students starting in August. The introduction to the primary school level is scheduled to be completed in the 2018/2019 school year.

Contemporary writing instruction

The topic of school handwriting has occupied cantonal education officials, teachers, and parents in recent years. In the Germanspeaking cantons, the current school handwriting is being replaced by a modern, semi-connected script, known as basic handwriting. The acquisition of legible, neat, and fluent personal handwriting remains an essential task of schools. Furthermore, emphasis is placed on ensuring that children develop a healthy, relaxed posture and pen-holding position when writing.

From basic writing to personal handwriting

Previously, children first learned stone script (print script), then fully connected script (Schnürlischrift) with some new letters, and then developed a personal, usually only partially connected handwriting. This detour will be eliminated in the future. The letter forms of the basic script are learned unconnected and gradually partially connected. Connections are placed individually by the students where they support

fluency. The so-called Swiss-German basic script helps children learn a personal handwriting more easily through natural movement sequences.

3H/4H

Simple, clear writing. The letter shapes remain the same throughout all school years. In 3H, the following letter shapes are introduced:

Revision of waste regulations

DECISION WILL BE MADE AT THE BALLOT ON 25 SEPTEMBER 2016

Since 1 December 2012, the revised waste regulations based on the polluter pays principle have been in use.

To date, the total quantities of the individual waste fractions have changed massively, which is also reflected in the recycling rate, which has increased from just under 20% to 60% (as of December 31, 2015).

Based on experience gained from the behavior of the polluters, the gross and net costs of each individual waste fraction have now been precisely determined. These show which waste fractions do not cover costs and to what extent.

In order to allocate these net costs to the individual fee categories in a fair and fair manner, adjustments to the waste regulations are essential. The following significant changes are being proposed:

Abolition of the discount system on the basic fee

It has become apparent that since the implementation of the waste regulations, several hundred private and business containers have been in use, resulting in additional costs for the collection service. Anyone who has their own business container on private property will no longer receive a discount on the basic fee.

Elimination of private containers

From now on , all private households and residential buildings must properly dispose of their waste at public waste disposal sites . The containers previously provided free of charge and placed on private property (for all types of waste) will be confiscated.

Emptying of company containers only with fee seals

Until now, commercial and catering establishments could dispose of their business waste in their containers using fee-based waste bags or seals.

They are only allowed to dispose of their business waste in their containers using fee seals.

In the future, applications for a company container will be made through the municipality of Zermatt (EWG) at oliver.summermatter@zermatt.net. Delivery will then be handled by our waste disposal partner, Schwendimann AG.

Introduction of a collection label

The collection and emptying of company containers incurs additional annual costs for EWG amounting to CHF 310,000. To cover these costs on a polluter-pays basis, a new collection label is being introduced. This must be affixed to each container when it is emptied, regardless of size or type (business waste, glass, tin cans, organic waste) . These collection labels can be obtained from EWG's Finance Department (other drop-off locations are currently being investigated).

Tariffs with bandwidths

Until now, any change to the fees had to be approved by the general assembly. With the introduction of tariff ranges, the municipal council will now be granted the authority to adjust the basic and recyclables fees annually within these ranges, depending on the special funding needs.

Formal adjustments

Some formal adjustments/additions were also made to the regulations, including definitions of the financial provisions for special financing and fees.

Information events

Between 26 July 2016 and 4 August 2016, several information events were held to inform the public about the changes to the new waste regulations.

Advisory meeting

Citizens will discuss the revision of the waste regulations at the extraordinary general meeting on August 16, 2016.

Voting on September 25, 2016

The final decision on the revision of the waste regulations will be made at the ballot box together with the federal referendum on September 25, 2016.

Homologation

The introduction of the new municipal regulations will come into force after homologation by the Council of State, presumably retroactively from 1 January 2016.














Intergenerational project

ANIMALS IN OUR ENVIRONMENT

The hedgehog

A SMALL ANIMAL IN THE MIDDLE OF A LARGE TOURIST COMMUNITY

In our region, hedgehogs can be found up to 1800 meters above sea level, which is a European altitude record. A widespread hedgehog population can be found throughout the Matter Valley.

Adult hedgehogs are approximately 24 cm to 28 cm long and weigh 800 g to 1500 g.

The back is covered with gray-brown spines with light-colored tips. The belly, head, and legs, however, are covered with hair. Hedgehogs are found throughout Europe and even in Iceland, where they were deliberately released by immigrants.

Nutrition

Hedgehogs are crepuscular insectivores. They feed on beetles and their larvae, as well as earthworms, snails, spiders, millipedes, and, rarely, carrion. Plant food or fruit is only consumed by chance, for example, if there is a worm in an apple, or in times of need.

Hedgehogs, on the other hand, will happily eat cat food they find. Milk, on the other hand, causes stomach aches and diarrhea and should not be given to hedgehogs. In general, wild animals should not be fed milk.

If the food source suddenly dries up, they can no longer survive.

The hedgehog is a cultural follower, meaning it thrives in the company of humans. It takes little to make the hedgehog comfortable with us.

A little disorder in our gardens and hedges and he finds much of what he needs to survive.

The hedgehog's senses are very well developed . It has an excellent

the sense of smell. His hearing is also well developed. However, his eyesight is only moderate.

Protection

The hedgehog has developed an effective strategy for defense against enemies. It quickly rolls itself into a ball. It uses its spines as a defensive shield, and it also has an impenetrable spiny shell. It can remain in this defensive position for several hours.

Dogs, badgers, and foxes quickly abandon a hedgehog if it is tightly curled up. Eagle owls and other owls can pierce the spiny coat with their sharp talons, making them more or less easy prev.

However, the hedgehog's greatest enemy is humans. Cars run over many animals, so even curling up in a ball doesn't help. Human intervention in nature, such as removing leaves, mowing, and generally keeping green spaces clean, also causes problems for hedgehogs when searching for food and hiding places.

With relatively simple measures such as leaving piles of leaves in autumn and winter or planting native plants, hedgehogs can live well even near people.

Reproduction

The hedgehogs' mating season is between April and August. The young, an average of four to seven, are born blind and deaf. They are lovingly nursed and cared for exclusively by their mother for about two and a half months. After this time, the young hedgehogs are independent and



are cared for by their mother only once or twice a day. Then the youngsters look for a home of their own

Anyone who finds hedgehogs on the side of the road or near insurmountable obstacles should rush to their aid. Carry the hedgehog across the road and take it to safety in the forest, meadow, or elsewhere. Young hedgehogs may be embarking on their first explorations . They should be kept away from roads or dangerous

obstacles, but otherwise left to their own devices. The mother is usually not far away, and the young ones adapt very well to their surroundings.

Hibernation

Since hedgehogs cannot store food because they live primarily on animal food, they hibernate. It is important that they have built up sufficient fat reserves in summer and autumn to survive the winter.

They look for a dry and sheltered place.

The hedgehog stuffs its nest so full that it's impossible to put everything back in once it's been emptied. It primarily eats leaves, hay, or any other dry material it can find. During hibernation, the hedgehog lowers its body temperature to 5 to 6 degrees Celsius, and its heart rate drops to only eight to nine times per minute.

It is possible that hedgehogs will wake up from their hibernation when the weather thaws in winter. If you find one, you can feed it cat food and release it under a wooden table or a large pile of brushwood that offers sufficient dryness and protection . The prickly friend will build itself a new nest and lull itself into hibernation.

MGE Not only did the Visp-Zermatt line celebrate its anniversary, but also the twinning of the two railways, the Matterhorn Gotthard Bahn (then BVZ) and the Fuji Kyuko Railway in Japan. On July 22, the twinning anniversary was celebrated as part of the 125th anniversary celebrations in Zermatt. In September 2016, a delegation - consisting of the municipality and citizens' community of Zermatt, Zermatt Tourism, and MGBahn - will pay a visit to the Fuji Kyuko Railway in Japan .

The 100th anniversary of the Visp-Zermatt railway line also marked the beginning of the twinning of the BVZ with the Japanese company Fuji Kyuko Co. Ltd. Fuji Kyuko operates the tourist railway line that leads to the foot of Mount Fuji. In addition to the railway line, the company offers numerous other tourist services: two theme parks, hotels, golf courses, passenger transport with around 500 buses, mountain railways, boats, etc. This collaboration is extremely valuable for MGBahn. In addition to the sporadic exchange of personnel, marketing cooperation and project support are currently being expanded. On July 22, a delegation from Japan participated in the celebrations for the 125th anniversary of the Visp-Zermatt line, thus honoring the 25-year twinning of the two companies. Japan The Fuji Kyuko is planning a new railway from its terminus Kawaguchiko (approx. 700 meters above sea level) to the so-called "5th station" of Mount Fuji (at 2305 meters above sea level). The length of the railway line is approximately 30 kilometers. Compared to the MGBahn, the distance and elevation gain are roughly equivalent to the journey from Visp to Riffelalp. Today, the 5th station is only accessible by road, has around three million visitors annually, and is the most important

The starting point for climbing Mount Fuji. Mount Fuji has been a World Heritage Site since 2013, which is why the idea of replacing the road with a railway was born.

Various delegations from the Mount Fuji World Heritage Committee have already visited the Gornergrat, including engineers from the partner railway. MGBahn is supporting the project with technical expertise. The goal is to open the line by 2025.



The system, with a load capacity of approximately 8 tons, is now transporting all construction materials for the new mountain station and pylon 3 from a 650 $\rm m^2$ intermediate depot at Laghi Cime Bianche. While the final blasting work is still underway at the mountain station, concrete work and support construction at the new valley station at Trockener Steg are already in full swing.

The Zermatt Bergbahnen employees responsible for the palace help the two artists wherever they are needed, thus receiving valuable tips from the professionals along the way. So, there's plenty to look forward to with the Heringer sculpture, which can be viewed at 3,883 meters above sea level from around the end of August.

BENCH NO. 5 AT FURI NEWLY HAS THE INSCRIPTION OF AN INTERNATIONALLY BRANCHED FAMILY

There are 250 benches around Zermatt . Guests can have a personalized message inscribed on a

brass plaque, which will remain for five years or longer . Eduardo Schindler's family has thus put down visible emotional roots in Zermatt.

What are emotional roots? Eduardo Schindler's family members have held Swiss citizenship since 1987. His great-grandparents emigrated from Switzerland to Chile.

Eduardo Schindler, born in Chile and now the head of his family in Switzerland for decades, came to Geneva to study in 1982. There he met Daniela, a student from Italy.

Eduardo and Daniela fell in love, married, and came to Zermatt to ski for the first time in January 1986. The stay was organized by the University of Geneva.

Decades of loyalty between guest and host

The young couple stayed with Ruedi and Marianne Julen at the Hotel Europe from the university .

"That's when we absolutely fell in love with Zermatt," Eduardo Schindler raves about their first stay in Zermatt.

This was on the occasion of the installation of bench no. 5 a few weeks ago. But let's start at the beginning. Even back then, the young couple appreciated the view of the incomparable Matterhorn, the car-free village, the atmosphere, the friendly people, and their hosts . This first stay became a long story for the family, who have lived in Zurich since 1987 : 30 years of regular annual stays, always with Ruedi Julen in Zermatt. When the three children were still small, they usually came over New Year's Eve . For about ten years now, all family members, including the now grown-up children Kilian, Shona, and Janick, have been meeting in Zermatt during the third week of February. Sometimes, they also

For decades, the gondola ride to Furi, followed by a return hike through the sparse larch forest

The spot where bench no. 5 now stands was always a favorite of the family: Here, you can see the mighty Matterhorn and enjoy a clear view of the village. Here, people shared many stories and looked together into the past and the future.

And of course we took photos.
During his usual February visit this year, Eduardo
Schindler discovered that there was no plaque on
bench No. 5. He immediately knew: "This bench
should become a symbol of our most beautiful
moments, which have occurred over all these
years in Zermatt," he enthuses.

This is evidenced by countless group photos from various years. On July 1, 2016, mother Daniela, son Kilian , and father Eduardo gathered in Zermatt again to witness Zermatt municipal employees installing the bench and the shiny family sign.

ZERMATT TOURISM'S EVENTS CALENDAR OFFERS AN INTERNATIONAL PLATFORM

The event calendar is a good platform.

Members of Zermatt Tourism can now make entries directly and independently on ztnet.ch.

Events organized by service providers depend on good communication. Guests need to know what they can do during their stay in the destination . Village tours, special dinners, children's entertainment, or other activities aimed at a broader audience can be found in the Zermatt Tourism events calendar . Organizers must remember to list their event on ztnet.ch.

Using the web form, events can be entered in German, English, and French. Important: the earlier the entry, the better the communication. The entry contains information about the 5 Ws: what, when, where, which source, and further information.

The event calendar shows which events are already listed, some of them long-term. Those making entries should follow the guidelines available on ztnet.ch . The following information must be provided: the title of the event: a description of up to 700 characters, the venue, dates, times, organizer, website, advance ticket sales (if applicable), and more. Images can also be uploaded. They should always be in landscape format.

Unfortunately, flyers are not possible because the text on them is confusing as an image element.

In the foreseeable future, Zermatt Tourism will no longer send emails to subscribers in the destination informing them of events. Therefore, it is important that service providers keep their entries up to date. "If you want to lay golden eggs, you have to communicate well," says Edith Zweifel, Media and PR Manager at Zermatt Tourism. Success requires that you first consider the time constraints.

The communication process is considered carefully. Only then comes the organization of the event. Anyone who waits until the last minute to handle communication will find themselves in a difficult situation, as the organization leaves barely any time left for office hours.

reservice providers, speakers, and organizers agree: To keep up with the changes in the digital world, everyone needs to continue their education. The "e-Fitness Impulse 2016" symposium set the course for the future e-fitness program of the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination.

"It was the most important day of the e-Fitness program's year," emphasized Pascal Gebert. His statements left no room for doubt: "The communication culture of the digital world is changing all of our corporate cultures."


Many in attendance watched, spellbound. And then came the papal election of Francis in 2013—the moment was followed spellbound by those present, but also captured on their cell phones...

This means for tourism professionals: "Those who position their product clearly can secure their place in the future of the internet," says Bauhuber. Or, to put it the other way around: Those who don't position their product clearly ultimately have to pay dearly for their presence. However, those who are well positioned are automatically included, "even if they are very small," according to Bauhuber's insight. For the service providers in the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination, this means presenting themselves individually with distinctive images and texts. This is the only way to be noticed in the internet world.

individual design of a website that are important. "The website will soon be dead anyway," predicts Florian Bauhuber. It's the content that counts. Based on these insights, the 40 people who participated in the symposium split into groups to discuss the future of digital communication in the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination and in their own

Time From Strategy to practice: The Zermatt –Matterhorn destination strengthens summer tourism under

major bike event: The Perskindol Swiss Epic mountain bike stage race starts in Zermatt in mid-September .

The new Zermatt-Visp bike trail opened in July . The Moos Trail will be inaugurated on August 27. And the next major event for bikers starts on September 12 in Zermatt. These new offerings and the major event are in line with the destination's strategy to boost summer tourism. This also includes the offerings for mountain bikers. They generate overnight stays and utilize the existing infrastructure to its full potential. Furthermore, the major event in September will raise the profile of Zermatt-Matterhorn as a national and international mountain bike destination .

Perskindol Swiss Epic with Nino Schurter

The six-day Perskindol Swiss Epic stage race runs from September 12th to 17th, 2016. It features mountain biking on the finest single trails, surrounded by a magnificent Alpine backdrop, past historic irrigation channels, through golden larch and pine forests, and through traditional mountain villages. Alongside many ambitious recreational mountain bikers, various top-class professionals, including multiple world champion and overall World Cup winner Nino Schurter, will be at the starting line.

This year, the race is about to be held for the third time. While the destination Zermatt-Matterhorn was the finish in 2014 and 2015, the order is reversed this year. Participants will be in the Matterhorn Village from September 11th to 13th. They will arrive on Sunday afternoon and, after checking in at the rider briefing at 5:30 p.m., will be welcomed by the Swiss Epic organizers and the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination, including municipal councilor Romy Biner-Hauser.

Construction work on the finish area of the Obere Matten, however, will begin on Saturday.

Prologue from the Unterrothorn

The two-person teams are expected at the finish area of the Obere Matten between 11:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Supporting program on Monday evening

The Mattertal Bike Club is organizing a "Like-a-Bike" race for the little ones (up to 5 years old, starting at 5:15 p.m.) as part of the program. Those a little older (6-12 years old) can take on a challenging obstacle course (from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m.), which they must complete as quickly as possible. Participation is free; registration takes place on-site (from 4 p.m.). Various non-cash prizes are up for grabs.

The prologue rankings will be announced at 5:30 p.m. To satisfy hunger and thirst, a festival restaurant with local delicacies will be set up on site. The local organizing committee and the Mattertal Bike Club are looking forward to a large turnout from the local community.

First stage to Leukerbad

The first stage towards Leukerbad starts at 8 a.m. on Tuesday morning from Obere Matten. After Romy Biner-Hauser gives the starting signal, the participants head back towards Furi. Via Zmutt and the Yovo Trail (Herbridg), the mountain bikers reach the newly developed railway trail
