child supports the others with their strengths.

For teachers, too, new faces always bring change to the school system. The quality of the school and the children's learning success depend significantly on the teachers, as they bear a great responsibility. What's needed are teachers who teach with passion and competence, who engage in dialogue and collaboration with their colleagues, who continue their training, and who question their own views when their class isn't achieving the desired learning success.

Here, too, cooperation between the individual components is required.

Parents are also faced with a great deal. Families must navigate the balance between overprotection and neglect, unplanned free time, boredom and online gaming, a carefree school career and the pressure of grades, and much more.

A balancing act that demands a lot from each individual, but is, on the whole, achievable together.

Above all, it was necessary to ensure that the infrastructure was suitable for Zermatt Unplugged and to create anchoring options for the tents

Construction work is largely complete . The robust gravel lawn still needs some time to fully grow in, as do the trees along Obere Mattenstrasse.

In the future, the population will have access to a facility with plenty of greenery and various installations :

- Benches and loungers as well as mobile planters with trees throughout the area

A school doesn't just run like this. For a school like ours to function so well, it needs a well-coordinated school administration and dedicated teachers who see their profession as a calling. The first day of school is a big event for every child . Full of anticipation, the youngest children are busy with their new school bags, which they pack and unpack several times a day. The newly purchased paints are used to paint and draw and the first day of school can hardly be waited for.

Attending kindergarten for the first time, or transitioning to primary school or secondary school, isn't just a moment for the children—you as parents will also be thinking a lot long before that. Most parents approach this event with mixed feelings: pride mixed with sadness, hope with worry.

But one thing is certain: Zermatt School is ready! The classrooms have been cleaned and shine with renewed splendor. The renovation work in the Triftbach Hall is progressing on schedule and will be ready for physical education classes on time. All teachers have been hired for the 2017/2018 school year, which is now beginning, and they are eagerly awaiting their start.

The timetables have been created and promise some highlights!

Preschool children can now benefit from the "Primokiz" project, in collaboration with the Jacobs Foundation . Language education through the "Wunderfitz und Redeblitz" project will also continue. The promotion of language teaching at preschool age as a means of comprehensive integration into society will be further promoted and will be intensified in the future with parental involvement.



A lot of new things are coming up for the students.

An important milestone will be reached in the fall of 2017. The future of the aging primary school buildings must be clarified. A decision must be made between various options: building a new school in Zermatt, renovating the existing school buildings, or relocating the secondary school to Täsch . All of these options have their merits, advantages, and disadvantages. However, they all have one thing in common: this is a generational project that can only be implemented with significant financial effort .

Furthermore, the question arises whether the desire for additional available locations and an "auditorium" corresponds to a need and whether

these can therefore be implemented independently of the discussion about the additional

future school operations and location.

With this in mind, I wish all of us that we can make a groundbreaking decision for our school this fall, one that will optimally serve our children and their education for many years to come.


I wish all schoolchildren and teachers much success and perseverance for the new school year and a few more relaxing days until school starts on August 16, 2017.

Reporting absence

- If a child cannot attend class due to illness, the
 Parents should inform the class teacher personally (please not via SMS!) before the start of lessons.
- It is not enough to ask a neighbor's child to report the incident.
 If the class teacher cannot be reached, the absence must be reported to the school secretary.
- If neither the teacher nor the school administration has any reliable information about the whereabouts of a child shortly after the start of school and even after attempts to inquire, the school administration will inform the police, who will then take the necessary precautions.
- By strictly monitoring children's attendance at school, we prevent truancy and determine the whereabouts of children, while also enabling us to respond quickly to accidents on the way to school.

The norm is diversity

TARGETED IMPLEMENTATION OF TEACHING CONCEPTS

Diversity – heterogeneity – belongs in our school is the norm and represents

Schoolchildren, teachers, parents, school authorities and school management faced with the most diverse challenges, everyone wants a good school,

which guarantees learning success.

Diversity in teaching

Schools have always had to deal with equality and diversity. When we talk about diversity in the classroom, this applies not only to the social but also to the individual differences of the children. While 23 nationalities and a wide variety of languages are represented at the Zermatt school, children with a wide variety of backgrounds attend classes. The students are growing up in a fast-paced world characterized by diverse lifestyles, forms of living, and work models. Families must navigate between overprotection and neglect, planned leisure time, boredom and online games, between a carefree school career and the pressure of good grades, and so on.

In class, children bring varying levels of prior knowledge to the individual learning content:

Some can read and do math when they start school, but are still unable to contribute much to the class community; others need different amounts of time for the same learning task or respond differently to learning methods. Some learn more visually and with images, others absorb content better through their ears; one can concentrate better, is easily inspired and motivated, while another struggles with hyperactivity and is constantly restless.

One child prefers individual work, another learns best when the teacher sits next to him, and another needs additional learning materials.

In the classroom, there is not only a diverse range of languages.

Teaching concepts

Instruction that addresses all children takes into account that learning in school is heterogeneous, i.e., diverse. The days are over when all children wrote the same word in the same space at the same time with the same writing utensils, and were then learned and tested in the same way.

Today, teaching concepts are needed that do not view the existing diversity as a "disturbance," but rather allow for diverse learning processes, learning paths, and learning outcomes. In the classroom, the children live together, can learn from each other, and actively and responsibly support each other. The students' individual competencies and strengths are fostered. To ensure this success, teachers provide differentiated learning plans, homework, and teaching materials, and use a variety of teaching methods. This is pedagogically, methodically, and didactically demanding and requires careful planning and preparation.

The teacher is the focus

An impossibility? What must schools do today to cope with the norm of diversity? A global analysis



End of school

A study by New Zealand educational researcher John Hattie (Visible Learning) on teaching quality has scientifically confirmed an old truism: The quality of a school and children's learning success are significantly linked to the teacher. Educational researcher Prof. Dr. Klaus Zierer writes: "It's the attitude of the teachers that counts. More important than what teachers do is how they do it." What is needed are teachers who teach with passion and competence, who exchange ideas and collaborate with their colleagues, who continue their training and question themselves when their class isn't achieving the desired learning success. Hattie writes that teaching cannot be successful without respect and appreciation, care and trust. How do we perceive schoolchildren as human beings? What image of humanity guides us? Are grades the most important thing to us, or do we also measure progress? How do we, as teachers, welcome newly arrived children—be they from the Valais, Switzerland, or children with a migrant background? Do we treat high- achieving children differently than those with learning disabilities? We must be able to answer these attitude-based questions: indeed, the search for answers to such questions sharpens the profile of our school.

The relationship between teacher and schoolchild, which is based on cooperation,

Appreciation and acceptance are therefore one of the most important factors for successful learning.

Cooperation

The teacher and the relationship are crucial, but so is cooperation: students, parents, teachers, school administration, and authorities. The student themselves, with their abilities and talents, are the primary factor for learning success. A second factor is the parents' home: If the child grows up in an environment where everyone involved views education and school as an important, lifelong, and enjoyable task, and where they find the time and opportunity to devote the appropriate amount of time and effort to the children, this has a positive effect on learning success.

The teacher has little influence over these two factors. According to Hattie, class size, school leadership, the number of lessons, and a modern school building with an attached daycare center, cafeteria, double gymnasium, and theater all have a positive influence on school quality. The effect only becomes apparent when people bring these structures to fruition through good and fair interaction.

According to Hattie, the "magic word" for a good school does not mean "me and my class, my child and my school and my teacher," but rather "we and our school." We are all called upon to make our personal contribution to a

to provide a good school where diversity is a reality.

With the guiding principle "Dealing with Diversity" chosen by the school administration for the coming school year, the Zermatt school is embarking on a path to better meeting the standards of a "good school."

This succeeds:

- with the support of the community and the population, who support the school ideologically and provide the necessary resources;
- with the regional education strategy adopted by all participating partners, which is being implemented gradually;
- thanks to the parents, the majority of whom trust our school and work constructively with the teachers;
- with the help of teachers who see their profession as a vocation and want to provide good teaching every day in the classroom with the schoolchildren and who question and improve their task together in pedagogical teams;
- and last but not least thanks to inquisitive, interested, motivated and willing-to-learn students who want to discover and understand the world.

In school, diversity is the norm.

Are we prepared not to look backwards, but to look forwards with careful openness and to remain fit for change?



Authorization requirement for light motor bicycles with pedal assistance

IMMEDIATE REMOVAL OF THE AUTHORISATION REQUIREMENT FOR E-BIKES

traffic regulations, the placing on the market of light motorcycles with Electric pedal assistance requires approval.

Currently, around 700 light motorcycles with electric pedal assistance are already operating in Zermatt. Due to public demand and current implementation practices, this permit requirement will be adjusted and simplified as part of the revision of the traffic regulations.

Change effective immediately

At its meeting on July 13, 2017, the municipal council decided that e-bikes no longer require special registration permits to operate within the village. Specifically, this means that lightweight motorized bicycles with electric pedal assistance are treated the same as regular bicycles.

However, only e-bikes with an electric motor with a maximum power of 0.50 kW, a maximum design speed of up to 20 km/h and any pedal assistance that operates up to a maximum of 25 km/h are permitted.





Attractive financial year for the community of Zermatt

GOOD RESULT DESPITE DIFFICULT MARKET ENVIRONMENT

The Burgergemeinde Zermatt generated in the past financial year with a total turnover of CHF 29.6 million at the previous year's level. Due to the cost savings made, cash flow (internally generated funds) improved by CHF 1.4 million or 46%.

to CHF 4.4 million. The Burgergemeinde Zermatt closes the financial year with a financing surplus of CHF 2.8 million.

After two extremely difficult years caused by an unfavorable economic and political environment, the municipality of Zermatt was able to improve its results in the past fiscal year despite the still critical tourism conditions. While total revenue remained virtually unchanged at CHF 29.6 million, the generated cash flow increased to CHF 4.4 million.

The community closes the financial year with a balanced result.

In the past fiscal year, a total of CHF 1.6 million was invested in financial and tangible assets. The focus of these investments was on the new Ristorante Pizzeria Rothorn and the Riffelhaus 1853. These investments were financed exclusively from the company's own resources.

Net debt decreased by CHF 1.8 million. The equity ratio increased by 0.5% to 24.7%. This represents a good equity ratio compared to the industry average. It should also be noted that the Burgergemeinde's balance sheet includes considerable hidden reserves (e.g., investments).

Matterhorn Group with a successful financial year

The hotels and restaurants of the Zermatt community – which operate under the name Matterhorn Group – look back on a very successful financial year. Operating income for the hotels and restaurants remained at the previous year's level at CHF 28.9 million.

While a decline in overnight stays was recorded in Valais and Zermatt , overnight stays at the Matterhorn Group hotels increased by around 11%. In addition to the 3100 Kulmhotel Gornergrat, the Grand Hotel Zermatt in particular recorded strong growth.

Matterhof and Riffelhaus 1853 recorded an ari increase in overnight stays. As a result, ur accommodation revenue increased by duapproximately CHF 600,000, or 7.7%, to CHF 8.1 million.

Revenue in the Retail/Shops segment also improved slightly to CHF 1.9 million. Mainly due to the unfavorable snow and weather conditions at the beginning of winter, revenue from the catering sector fell by 2.8% to CHF 16.7 million.

However, consistent cost management significantly reduced costs by CHF 1.4 million. Compared to the previous year, cash flow from hotels and restaurants increased by CHF 1.4 million , or approximately 49%.

Financial year 2016/2017 started promisingly

The winter of 2016/2017 developed positively. April, in particular, significantly exceeded expectations. Overall, the Matterhorn Group's earnings increased by

around CHF 2.0 million. Despite the existing uncertainties regarding the current summer, due to the

A historical film in a historic location

THE ZERMATT FESTIVAL & ACADEMY GOES STEEPLY UP - TO AN ALTITUDE OF 2,883 M


The Zermatt Festival & Academy offers this year many highlights, including the projection of the historical film «In Storm and Ice» by Arnold Fanck in the Monte Rosa Hut.

The Alpine Symphony "In Battle with the Mountains, Part 1, In Storm and Ice," in images by mountain film pioneer Arnold Fanck, will be shown in the Monte Rosa Hut. This location was not chosen by chance. In 1920, the film crew carried their heavy film cameras to near the present-day Monte Rosa Hut. This means that it didn't even exist in this form back then.

The location was chosen as a film projection site because the film crew set off for the Lyskamm from the then-existing Bétemps Hut, built in 1895. The images captured on film are absolutely spectacular by today's standards: pictures of mountaineers climbing over enormous seracs with mighty snow caps.

Glacier nostalgia in the Monte Rosa Hut

Never before in 1921 had such images of the high alpine world around the Monte Rosa massif, including a view of the Matterhorn, been seen in cinemas. Patrick Peikert of the Zermatt Festival explains it this way: "We show this film every year as part of the festival program. But always at a different location. This year we're going back to the scene of the event." This will allow alpinists to compare the glacier condition today with that of almost 100 years ago. The film is accompanied by music by Paul Hindemith.

the English. The woman was very happy and pleased with the quick, charming, humorous, and precise information. In any case, she thanked me profusely and with a hearty laugh.



World's longest suspension bridge open

FIVE COMMUNITIES AND SPONSORS MADE THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE HIKING TRAIL ATTRACTION POSSIBLE

The pedestrian suspension bridge above Randa is 494 meters long and the absolute world record holder. Now Hikers with a head for heights can reach days again without detour from Grächen to Zermatt.

The Europaweg is one of the most beautiful panoramic trails in Switzerland. The view of the four-thousand-meter peaks, including the

Matterhorn and Weisshorn, is unparalleled. The two-day hike also offers fascinating flora and fauna: chamois, ibex, edelweiss, gentian, eagles, and bearded vultures.

Those heading north from Zermatt will see the panorama of the Bernese Alps, with the Lötschental landmark, the Bietschhorn, in the distance, And those starting from Grächen will practically be walking towards the Matterhorn.

Long planning phase

The old suspension bridge has since been dismantled. It was inaugurated in 2010, but was only open to hikers for a few months. The reason: The Grabengufer is constantly in motion.

Due to the risk of rockfalls, the bridge had to be closed. But the former mayor of Randa, Leo Jörger, was not discouraged: "It was clear to me that a bridge had to be built again," he explains.

Thanks to his efforts, the planning phase was seamlessly transitioned to construction, with construction beginning on May 15, 2017. The driving force behind the completion, including the extensive search for sponsors, is Paul Summermatter, councillor of Ran-

"The bridge's importance for tourism cannot be overestimated," he emphasizes. The authorities of the five municipalities along the Europaweg-Grächen, St. Niklaus, Randa, Täsch, and Zermatt — share this view . They all made significant financial contributions to the bridge.

Now hikers can forget the long detour around the Grabengufer with over 500 meters of elevation down into the valley and back up again - now they can cross the world record suspension bridge.

Upswing in the valley

The Europahütte's warden couple are already looking forward to the additional hikers: "After the old suspension bridge closed, we experienced a 60 percent drop in overnight stays," says hut warden Marcel Brantschen. But things are looking different now: "We already have bookings from guests who are coming because of the new suspension bridge." The CEO of the Grächen Tourist Board, Dr.

Berno Stoffel says: "The new suspension bridge not only makes the Europaweg safer and easier, but also significantly more attractive. I am convinced that this will give the trail a second spring ."

Bridge name from the main sponsor

A large portion of the necessary capital. approximately CHF 750,000, was raised through a large-scale sponsorship effort . The main sponsor gave the bridge its name. It is now called the "Charles Kuonen Suspension Bridge."

Replanting of the Riffelalp

For the first time, cows from a new alpine cooperative are grazing again between Schweigmatten and Riffelboden

I To the delight of guests and locals, cows are grazing on the Riffelalp again . A new alpine cooperative was founded specifically for this purpose. The initiators

It is not just about the use of land and animals, but above all Tradition.

For example, there was the "hut warden" of the Riffelalp Resort, Hans-Jörg Walther: "Years ago, we had an entertaining conversation during a wedding reception, where we realized it was a shame to see Riffelalp without cows. One thing led to another," he said on the occasion of the cow raffle. Cow raffles? Yes, things are always democratic and fair among the Alpine farmers; it's known throughout Switzerland from the so- called "cheese-sharing" (Käseteilen). And even Fortuna can hold her protective hand over it.

The cows randomly assigned to stay on Riffelalp are named Diana, Patricia, Furka, and Anja. Paul Julen from Tradition Julen has also enthusiastically joined in the effort: "Now that the cows are grazing on Riffelalp again , we are maintaining the Valaisan culture of alpine farming," he emphasizes. He adds with a laugh during the raffle: "Every cow gets a bell. These are real, genuine cows, all with real 'horns'!"

The newly founded corporation is called "Riffelalp Alpine Farming Cooperative." Zermatt families who want to have more than just a supermarket-like relationship with the cows and the resulting meat are participating. Also participating are cheesemaker Mirjam Gobba and her husband Reto, Ruedi Julen, Andreas Perren, and others.

Roland Ammann is the cowherd. He has cared for the cows on the Stafelalp for three years. Now, he stands with the cows every morning at 6:00 a.m., checking their health and constantly building new fences so they can graze fresh grass from their tails up to the Riffelboden. Roland Ammann observes daily the positive response the cows receive. "It's incredible how many tourists watch and photograph the cows ," he says. There are bikers who stop, and hikers who happily stay with the cows for half an hour to admire them. "In tourism, clichés and reality are often very close together," says resort director Daniel Luggen. " It's all the more wonderful when we can present real cows in front of the Matterhorn."

The cows belong to the traditional breeds Simmentaler (light brown and white), Evolèner (brown and white), Original Brauncattle (light brown to beige) and Herens (reddish -dark brown to black), known as Valais fighting cows. However, they are unaware that they also have tourist value.

25 cows on the Alp

The alpine pasture was stocked with 25 "galten," milkless cows and seven calves. They all spend a

happy summer on the pasture. In September, depending on the weather, all are brought down from the pasture. Nine then give birth to their calves, and 16 are slaughtered.

With the alpine pasture grazing, an old tradition has been revived. For 15 years, no cows have grazed the Riffelalp. Now, one no longer has to wonder why the area is called "Alp." The Alpine cooperative sees this first summer grazing as a test run. If all goes well, they plan to perhaps allow dairy cows to graze again in the coming years and produce cheese on site.

The fact that this entire cow farming is also a genuine cow experience that brings joy is demonstrated by the fact that there is already a cow WhatsApp group among the cow owners.
