Revision of waste regulations – renewed homologation procedure

The revised waste regulations of the municipality of Zermatt (EWG) have been pending before the cantonal administration and the Valais State Council for homologation since auteman വെട്ടി will be refused. Due to the model waste regulations for Lower Valais drawn up by the Canton of Valais, our homologation was postponed and delayed.

> In the meantime, the EWG has made the necessary adjustments in accordance with the cantonal model regulations and received the necessary positive preliminary opinions from the cantonal authorities . In addition, the price regulator's opinion had to be requested, which it delivered to us at the beginning of February 2018.

Provisions in the cantonal model regulations are mandatory

The State Council has obliged the municipal council to adopt the definitions from the cantonal model regulations, as

Fee schedule, adjustments / Delegation of competences

The delegation of authority to the municipal council for tariff adjustments within the defined fee ranges is provided for in the cantonal model regulations and must be adopted.

Basic fee for apartments - new

The canton's preliminary report stipulated that the apartments could not be charged a flat rate, but rather had to be divided into different sizes. The apartment sizes are taken into account accordingly in the category.

Basic fee for restaurants / hotels

Implementing the cubic capacity (m3) calculation basis is simply not feasible. In buildings where there are at least two different basic fee categories (e.g., residential, commercial, or restaurant), the cubic capacity can no longer be applied. And this applies to almost all buildings in Zermatt.

For catering establishments (restaurants, dining rooms, tea rooms, bars, dance halls, snack bars, canteens) - accessible only to guests - the basic fee is now calculated based on the main usable area. The basic fee for hotel establishments (hotels, bed-and-breakfast hotels, hotel-style apartments, and qualified tourist- style apartments) is now calculated based on the number of beds per establishment.

Commercial enterprises

There will be no changes to the calculation of the basic fee for commercial enterprises

Costs for each individual category remain unchanged

It should be noted that the breakdown of total costs per waste category among private households, restaurants, and commercial establishments presented at the general meeting on August 16, 2016, has not changed. From the restaurant category, only the previously identified hotels are now selected and listed separately.

Voting on June 10, 2018

At its meeting on March 8, 2018, the municipal council approved the revised version of the waste regulations for submission to the extraordinary general meeting on April 24, 2018, where the public will discuss the revised version. Citizens will vote on whether to accept or reject the revised version at the ballot box on June 10, 2018.



The public will have to decide on the new waste regulations and fee schedule in June 2018.

Solar system – a pioneering project

With the construction of the new 3S cable car on

Trockener Steg, Elektrizitätswerk Zermatt AG (EWZ) in cooperation with Zermatt Bergbahnen AG (ZBAG) has realized a pioneering project.

Solar modules have been installed on the exterior of the new cable car's valley station to generate energy.

Next summer, parts of the facade of the mountain station will also be fitted with solar modules. EWZ has been exploring additional renewable energy sources to supplement its daily electricity production for years. With this goal in mind, the photovoltaic (PV) system project at the new 3S cable car was launched with ZBAG, a project that is very unique in its nature and form at this alpine altitude.

Important preliminary clarifications

When planning a PV system, careful and precise preliminary clarification is required. The location of the system, the area of the solar modules and also

the possible solar radiation is of great importance.

The construction of the facility at almost 3,000 meters above sea level places increased demands on materials and technology. Weather influences such as wind, ice formation, and hail must also be taken into account when selecting the materials.

Construction of the solar system

On the south and west facades of the valley station of the 3S cable car, a total area of 485 solar modules with a total output of 135.8kWp were installed on an area of 914.1m2. After all the materials were delivered, the PV system on Trockener Steg was completed in three weeks. The cost was approximately CHF 550,000.

Functionality of power generation

The energy is generated by the sunlight hitting the solar modules. The resulting direct current is converted into alternating current by inverters and fed directly into the grid.

This will produce approximately 157,200 kWh of electrical energy per year . This corresponds to the annual electricity needs of approximately 35 households. At the same time, COÿ emissions will be reduced by 23.4 tons per year.



For example, it's not about the lack of solar modules, but rather about natural light sources. This ensures that the interior of the facility is optimally covered with daylight, while at the same time, the use of electric lighting can be reduced to a minimum.

Commissioning

The new photovoltaic system has been in operation since January 30, 2018. Energy production through February 28, 2018, was 13,134 kWh, resulting in COÿ savings of 6,959 kg.

In the February 2018 issue of "Zermatt Inside," Eva Jenni interviewed Alcindo Freitas da Costa, who has roots in Portugal. In this issue of "Zermatt Inside," she wants to learn more from Swedish native Aleksandra Tomic about the background to her new choice of home and work.

Where are you from and/or where were you born?

"From Sweden, Värnamo."

Where do you currently work?

«I am a self-employed entrepreneur and run the Café Petit Royal in Zermatt.»

In what context did you first hear about Zermatt? When was that?

"When I attended the hotel management school in Neuchâtel. I studied there from 1996 to 1998."

What was your personal motivation for coming to Zermatt?

«As part of my training, I fell in love with a local during an internship in Zermatt. That was in 1996.»

Do you still remember the first meeting in Zermatt?

If so, which ones are they?

"With the hotel manager at the Schlosshotel Alex, where I took a position. She was an open-minded and friendly person."

How do you like to spend a day off?

"We love being outdoors, often in the mountains for skiing and hiking. Every now and then, we also spontaneously go away."

What is your favorite place in Zermatt and the surrounding area?

"The water conservation area between Schwarzsee and Stafelalp. It's wonderful there in the summer; you feel like you're in the Hobbit. And the kids can let off steam here."

Which Valais specialty do you like best?

"The Cholera Cake."

What makes Zermatt so special for you and what keeps you here?

"The combination of beautiful nature, safety, and tourism, where you can develop your business."

What would you recommend to a new resident?

"I would recommend having some fun first, but then orienting yourself a bit towards the locals who have lived here for a long time. They lead a 'normal'

Life. Otherwise, it quickly leads to a spiral of fun, sports, and partying, and before you know it, many years have passed.

That means not losing sight of real life, with all its temptations here."



What does integration mean to you?

"Becoming a part of society doesn't mean giving up one's origins or one's own traditions. But one must be willing to engage with the new society, learn from it, and participate in its traditions. Those who don't do this ultimately harm themselves by failing to build trust. Without trust, there can be no communication and, ultimately, no pleasant coexistence."

If Zermatt were a kingdom and you were the queen, what would you want to change?

"We do so much for tourists here that I would support the lives of the locals. Be it with events, a sports center, or a public swimming pool, which would, on the one hand, bring the locals, who come from so many cultures, together, and, on the other hand, would also give our children the opportunity to be outdoors more and do things together. Because I have the feeling that only those children whose parents financially support it (ski camps/sports camps, etc.) actively participate. Children, especially teenagers, who mostly come from foreign families, are often left to their own devices and then get bored on the playground. They don't ski, play tennis, or ice skate. And perhaps I would introduce a tourist-free day. Just for locals, who could enjoy their beautiful home alone."

Anyone who travels to Lusitania today, the poetic name used by the Portuguese national poet Luís Vaz de Camões (1525 to 1580) for his empire on the Atlantic, will experience only a shadow of its former greatness.

Within a few decades, the seafaring nation conquered a world empire in the 15th century, spread out into the distance, and then lost itself at home.

This describes in simple words the tragedy of Europe's last colonial power, whose history so vividly reflects the karmic interplay of becoming and passing away, in other words, of ruling and serving.

History – we sense this even among the simplest people in the

able to keep pace with the rest of Europe.

A mixed impression

First-time visitors are presented with a mixed impression. A state-of-the-art, EU-funded highway and road network, which is barely damaged by frost in this temperate climate, may, at first glance, suggest a certain economic miracle mentality. But a look behind this scenery soon reveals a more austere aspect: The Atlantic coast beckons like a magnet, but development, with the exception of a few up-and-coming small towns like Viseu, shies away from the mountainous northeast. Away from the economically favored coasts and cities, there are neglected villages, often inhabited only by older people.

A picturesque small town in a bucolic

region. The pretty town of Castro

Daire, situated at the foot of the Serra de Montemuro, is traversed by the Rio Paiva and has a population of approximately 5,000. It is the capital of the district (concelho) of the same name in the Viseu District in northern Portugal. The venerable town has held city rights since the late Middle Ages and, as an administrative center and schoolhouse for the rural region, plays a role similar to that of Brig in Upper Valais. As its historic center reveals, Castro Daire looks back on a turbulent history. The conquerors passed through the door handles of the region; it has been influenced by Ibero-Celtic, Roman, Visigothic, Moorish, and, since the 12th century, Portuguese, but also occasionally Spanish.

The historic town and its expansive mountainous surroundings offer everything for a flourishing tourism industry. Both the elegant district town of Viseu and the historic town of Lamego are only 30 kilometers away. While the former attracts with the best quality of life in the country, the latter boasts many attractions. The surrounding area even boasts

Thermal springs, and the great attraction is the charm of the many idyllic villages scattered throughout the area, which have retained their rural charm. As in Asturias and Galicia, there are also granaries built on stilts, protected by stone slabs against the predatory mice .

The landscape is breathtakingly beautiful, the people are friendly, but there simply seems to be a lack of motivation to promote tourism. One hotelier complained that the salaries in Switzerland, which he couldn't compete with, are partly to blame. Money is flowing back, he said, but it's precisely the most talented people who are moving away. The majority of Portuguese guest workers in Zermatt also come from this vast, mountainous region.

«Sailing ships in the desert»

It's not without a certain tragedy: While exploring the uphill surroundings of the small town, we come across handsome villas in remote villages. Overconfident trophies of successful and arduous work abroad. Who can blame the energetic returnees for their pride in showing off their skills? But their houses are reminiscent of sailing ships stranded in the desert, for they can neither be rented nor sold in this archaic, rural region, and the children of the returnees, who grew up in Switzerland, have long since adopted a more urban lifestyle, the likes of which only Viseu could offer.

Conclusion

Because so many Portuguese have chosen the upper Matter Valley as their home, all Zermatt residents are warmly recommended to visit this diverse country on the Atlantic coast with its friendly people . The impressions gained here could lead to more mutual understanding and the breaking down of barriers.

In Zermatt, special regulations apply during construction periods.

Construction periods spring and autumn 2018

The municipal council sets the construction schedule for the current year. Out of consideration for Zermatt's roads and bridges, special transports may not exceed the maximum permissible total weight of 26 tons (vehicle and load).

In accordance with municipal regulations, the use of motor vehicles (trucks, single- axle tractors, and motorized carts) and construction machinery, as well as drilling, blasting, and trenching operations, is permitted only during specific periods (construction periods). Helicopter flights are subject to the provisions of federal law and the agreement of April 13, 2004, between the municipality (EWG) and Air Zermatt.

Permitted construction periods spring 2018

Approved period

Wednesday, April 25, 2018 to Wednesday, May 30, 2018 in the evening (early construction site installation on Monday, April 23, 2018 and Tuesday, April 24, 2018 – special transports in this context require approval).

Permitted construction periods autumn 2018

Approved period

Monday, October 1, 2018, to Wednesday, October 31, 2018, evening (early construction site installation on Friday, September 28, 2018 – special transports in this context require approval).

Uniform operating times

The following standard operating times apply to motor vehicles, construction machinery, and drilling, blasting, and excavation work: 7:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. (Mon–Sat)

Restricted periods for journeys with combustion engines

From 1 July 2018 to 31 August 2018, no permits will be issued for special transports with vehicles with combustion engines in and through Zermatt.

As of December 1, 2018, no permits will be issued for special transport for construction purposes.

restrictions

1. Motor vehicle traffic / construction machinery

No transport operations using vehicles with combustion engines are permitted on Saturdays, Sundays, or public holidays. Excavated material may not be removed on Saturdays.

2. Crane removal/November

The removal of cranes by helicopter in November is permitted on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays of the 3rd and 4th weeks of November upon written request.

General provisions

1. Application

Applications for special driving permits must be submitted in writing to the Security Department at least one working day (Monday to Friday) and at least 24 hours before the start of the journey. Applications submitted later will not be processed until the following day.

2. Weight limit

All trucks used require a permit . Excavation material transports and special transports must not exceed the maximum permissible total weight of 26 tons . Three-axle vehicles up to this weight are permitted

weight limit (total weight) permitted.

3. Premature site installation

Special transports carried out as part of the early construction site installation using trucks and other vehicles with combustion engines require approval.

4. Site installation plan

A construction site installation plan must be submitted to the EEC Construction Department.

5. Blocked days

On these days and on public Sundays and holidays, motor vehicle traffic, the use of construction machinery and the carrying out of drilling, blasting and excavation work are generally prohibited.

6. Speed

The maximum permitted speed in urban areas is 20 km/h for all vehicles

7. Truck transport goods

Trucks may only transport excavated and demolition material. Where space permits (except on public land), trucks should deliver building materials, components, and components to the construction site from which the excavated material is being transported during the excavation period.

8. Transport tracked vehicles

Tracked vehicles, except those with rubber tracks, may only be transported on low-loading wagons. The tracks must be cleaned beforehand. A written request must be submitted to the EEC Safety Department in advance.

9. Street cleaning

To avoid contamination of municipal roads and paths, the construction site access road must be asphalted or concreted. This measure is to be carried out on a

A width appropriate for vehicles and along the entire length from the road to the construction site (max. 50 metres) .

Appropriate measures must be taken to ensure that no dirt gets onto the road when leaving the construction site .

Companies whose construction site exits cause excessive pollution of public roads will be billed for the resulting special expenses according to the client's external rates.

The violation of the regulations will be fined additionally. In addition, the provisions of the traffic regulations apply.

In special cases, the municipal council may grant additional demand measures.

10. Penal provisions

Violations of the above provisions shall be punished with a fine of between CHF 50 and CHF 5,000, unless the penal provisions of federal or cantonal laws apply.

- Connection and location, time, to the public sewerage system or drinking water supply;
- Request for digging in public areas (supply and disposal supply lines of any kind in accordance with the form "Application for permission to carry out excavation work in public road areas".
 Note: the infiltration areas must be kept free from soil compaction);
- In the case of street lighting interruptions and work on them: proof of adequate lighting in the public area.

Requirements for traffic management and construction site traffic

- Traffic management on public roads and paths adjacent to the construction site during the construction period;
- Traffic management on the construction site (supply and disposal) and handling of goods handling;
- Paved parking spaces for vehicles used in the main and auxiliary construction trades;
- Use of public land by means of the application form «Use of public land» including a fully completed application form; this also applies to the attachment of installations to public candelabra and traffic

boards or the removal of fences;

Curriculum 21 is just around the corner

In the coming school year 2018/2019, the Curriculum 21 is just around the corner in Upper Valais. Teachers and school administrators are currently undergoing further training, and preparations are being made to ensure that schools are ready for Curriculum 21 in autumn 2018. Regular reports and updates on the progress of this work will be provided here.

Why a Curriculum 21?

In 2006, voters approved Article 62, paragraph 4 of the Federal Constitution with a large majority.

This mandate requires the cantons to harmonize the objectives of the educational levels . To implement this mandate, all cantons must revise their curricula. The 21 German-speaking and multilingual cantons have decided to do this jointly and launched the Curriculum 21 project. The joint development of Curriculum 21 preserves cantonal sovereignty over elementary schools . The cantons have the option of adapting Curriculum 21 to their needs. In Valais, for example, the topic of "Tourism, Business, and Agriculture" will be a key focus.

The Curriculum 21 is an instrument for harmonizing primary schools and not a school reform.

A curriculum defines what students learn in each subject area and in each cycle. It establishes obligations and serves as a basis for the development of teaching materials, a planning tool for teachers, and a basis for their training and professional development.

At the same time, it shows subsequent schools, training companies or parents what children and young people should know and be able to do at the end of each school year.

How is Curriculum 21 structured?

Most current curricula are structured according to school levels, although the cantons have different classifications. Across Switzerland. three cycles have been agreed upon, which are compatible with the school levels in the cantons: Cycle 1: Elementary School and 1st/2nd grades; Cycle 2: 3rd-6th grades; Cycle 3: 7th-9th grades (old counting method). For the end of the 2nd primary school year, the end of the 6th grade, and the end of compulsory schooling, mandatory basic competencies (also known as National Educational Standards) are specified for the language of schooling, foreign languages, mathematics, and science; these competencies apply to all language regions. The subject areas of Curriculum 21 are based on the curricula currently used in the cantons and reflect the latest technical and didactic developments Western Switzerland (PER). The canton has made adjustments

Knowledge - Skills - Will

Curriculum 21 describes what pupils learn during compulsory schooling in the form of competencies.

To acquire a competency, three things are needed:

The knowledge and understanding I need to solve a task.

This also includes analyzing and structuring information

The ability and skill to use and apply the knowledge practically so that I can

Want

The willingness to acquire and apply attitude and mindset, knowledge and skills.

The Curriculum 21 places greater emphasis on linking and applying knowledge, skills, and abilities. Students should not just accumulate factual knowledge, but above all be able to apply it. Teachers design learning environments and teaching units that are rich in subject matter and employ diverse methods; they also lead the class and support students in their learning with pedagogy and subject-specific didactics.

From kindergarten to the end of compulsory

schooling

For each competency, the development of knowledge and skills is described in stages. Basic requirements are specified. Many students then work on the

Competency levels. The cycle's mandate defines which competency levels must be worked on.

The Curriculum 21 is structured as a subject-specific curriculum. It shows how skills are developed from kindergarten through the end of primary school. As before, lessons in the first cycle are strongly oriented towards the children's development. They promote motor development, perception, temporal and spatial orientation, imagination and creativity, as well as language and the children's means of expression. Play is also central to learning in the first cycle in the Curriculum 21.

When and how will Curriculum 21 be introduced?

The canton of Valais has decided to introduce the curriculum for Upper Valais in autumn 2018. Lower Valais is already orientating itself towards the

for Upper Valais. All cantons have approved its introduction and are preparing for it. Some cantons began the implementation in the 2015/2016 school year; the majority will introduce the curriculum in the 2018/2019 school year. Avalanche barriers Schweifinen

Last summer, work began on the avalanche barriers in the Schweifinen area at 2,300 meters above sea level. Work is expected to continue until autumn 2019.

History of origin

Historical records of avalanche events date back to 1931. At that time, snow masses slid across the entire width of the slope.

In the winter of 1945, the tracks of the Matterhorn Gotthard Railway were buried over a length of 157 meters, and the following year, the avalanche cone was as wide as 1,000 meters. By February 1961, a total of nine further avalanches had been recorded in the register. Based on these findings, over 60 years ago,

construction of the first protective measures has begun.

Recent past

At the foot of the rock face «Turuwang» three rows of new avalanche barriers were installed in autumn 2009. Internal structures were built, which are clearly visible from the village. In the same year, several rockfall nets were installed and earth dams were built above the freight depot and the Air Zermatt base. In the summer of 2010, the fourth

In the following late summer, a rockfall destroyed several avalanche barriers below the «Wiiss Hôre» at a height

of approximately 2,800 m above sea level. Thanks to the excellent cooperation with the relevant cantonal authorities, the repair work was carried out quickly and without red tape.

The total length of the structures erected in the "Schweifine" area to date is over 7 km. The construction costs of the rockfall nets, dams, and snow drift walls included amounted to over CHF 12 million.

Starting on July 24, 2015, the building permit application documents for a further expansion phase were available for public inspection for 30 days. On October 29, 2015, the cantonal building commission granted

mission granted the building permit and the State Council approved the project on June 22, 2016. At the same time, the municipality of Zermatt received a commitment from the federal and cantonal governments to contribute 86% of the total costs , amounting to just under CHF 2 million. Air Zermatt AG and the Matterhorn Gotthard Bahn are also contributing.

contribution to the production costs.

In the winter of 2016/17, the work was put out to tender and the contracts awarded. Part of this work was already completed last summer. The construction site is located in the immediate vicinity

to the hiking trail at an altitude of approximately 2,300 m above sea level. The approved work is scheduled to be completed by autumn 2019.

Future

The municipality of Zermatt is doing everything in its power to ensure that protection for the population and infrastructure can be continually increased. However, this depends on the financial resources made available by the federal and cantonal governments.

At the same time, the bridge serves as a gateway to an entire part of the village. This repeatedly leads to dangerous situations.

Security aspect

In recent times, there have been increasing reports of near misses between vehicles and pedestrians in the area of the

Tourists try to take the obligatory souvenir photo of themselves with the Matterhorn in the background, but they often forget that they are in the area of a sometimes heavily trafficked road.

The electric vehicles are comparatively quiet. At the same time, the noise level is somewhat higher due to the nearby stream and other surrounding influences. Since Zermatt is car-free, but not traffic-free, guests are lulled into a false sense of security. The normal safety procedures

"Look, listen, walk" are sometimes forgotten . These are the main causes of dangerous situations.

comfort

A steel staircase currently connects Schluhmattstrasse and the riverside path . The structure is outdated and needs to be replaced. To ensure residents and visitors of the "Steinmatte" neighborhood have a more convenient connection to the local green bus service , the existing steel staircase will be replaced with a modern solution. The size of the new passenger elevator was chosen to accommodate strollers and bicycles .

Schluhmattstrasse offers the possibility of creating three taxi stands. This will reduce waiting times for passengers and shorten travel distances.

After the municipal council approved the project, the planning application was published in the official gazette on December 22, 2017. One objection was received during the 30-day public consultation period.

To avoid delays, preparations for awarding the individual contracts are underway concurrently with the approval process . As soon as a legally binding construction decision is made, the contracts with the companies will be concluded.

realization

Implementing this seemingly simple construction project presents several challenges for the planners and contractors. These include:

- tight space conditions;
- limited access along the riverside path;
- Steepness of the terrain;
- existing traffic routes with possible temporary diversions;
- Construction work along the waterway;
- existing infrastructure and plant lines;
- etc.

The municipality of Zermatt hopes that construction work can begin in spring 2018. Every effort is being made to ensure the completion and commissioning of the passenger elevator before the 2018/2019 winter season. However, this is partly dependent on the ongoing building permit process. Furthermore, the contracts must be awarded in accordance with public procurement regulations . For individual contracts, an appeal against the award decision could lead to delays.

Many private individuals have for several

years with their bring-Customer card at the brings

collection points, waste fractions subject to a charge and then collected by the residents

Zermatt municipality (EWG) received an invoice. In January 2018, all brings customer cards held by private individuals were canceled.

In recent years, the EWG's finance department has increasingly been confronted with having to issue invoices to private individuals for waste disposal costs ranging between CHF 0.50 and CHF 2.00.

This expenditure was disproportionate and made little sense. This circumstance was addressed with the introduction of a new clearing system in the EEC.

Since January of this year, private individuals have only been able to dispose of bulky waste and other waste categories subject to payment at brings collection points in cash.

Cancellation of «Private Customer Card»

For this reason, all pr-

vat-brings customer cards were canceled in January 2018 and are no longer valid since then. Each affected private individual was contacted in writing in advance and informed of this.

Disposal against cash payment still possible

The disposal points (mobile-brings and brings collection brings collection point in Spiss) are available to cash or invoice.



Private individuals are still available for cash payment during the published opening hours

Commercial enterprises – no change

There are no changes for commercial businesses. They can continue to deliver their waste, which is subject to a fee, to the brings collection point in Spiss, either by cash or invoice.

Portuguese families who were present.



Report from the Grand Council

The main topics of the March session were the cantonal structure plan, "Sion 2026" and the financing of the third Rhone correction.

Monday began with the debate on the third Rhone correction. Were the

While the project was budgeted at CHF 2.5 billion in 2015, just three years later, the cost has already reached CHF 3.4 billion. Various opinions even speak of costs of up to CHF 10 billion by the time of completion. The most discussed criticisms were that the project was far too large, too luxurious, and far too expensive, as well as wrongly planned.

was planned.

The biggest point of criticism, however, concerned the municipalities' contribution obligation, as envisaged in the draft. Municipalities were to cover 5% of the total costs. The respective amounts for each municipality are determined using a complex distribution key. With 66 votes in favor and 60 against, the bill passed.

The Grand Council narrowly rejected the taken

Numerous amendments

The first reading took place on Friday. 73 amendments had to be processed. During the discussion, it was decided to exempt businesses from the contribution obligation and to allocate 2% of the total costs to municipalities instead of 5%.

The remaining balance will be covered by the canton.

Furthermore, the costs were capped at CHF 2.4 billion. Finally, after lengthy debates, the financing bill was passed with 125 votes in favor, 1 against, and 2 abstentions.

Marathon: Cantonal Structure Plan

The cantonal development plan, on the other hand, was discussed with great emotion. On Tuesday, the marathon of work on it began.

This encompasses the entire issue of rezoning. Unfortunately, all the others cannot be discussed in detail here. After three days and four debates, the new master plan was adopted with 93 votes in favor, 19 against, and 14 abstentions. It will now be submitted to the Federal Council for review and approval before the municipalities must implement these complex requirements.

"Olympia 2026" receives broad

"Olympia 2026" is a clear-cut decision in the Grand Council. With 73% approval, the positive signals for the CHF 100 million loan were set. Of this, CHF 60 million will be allocated to the expansion of existing infrastructure and CHF 40 million.

into safety. Of the CHF 60 million, CHF 20 million will be used for the renovation and expansion of the Fiesch holiday village. CHF 12 million will be used in Goms for

Earthmoving and the construction of snowmaking systems. CHF 39 million are needed for the construction of a ski stadium and snowmaking systems. CHF



A further four million Swiss francs will be needed for earthworks in Veysonnaz. Six million Swiss francs are earmarked as a reserve. The reading on Friday marked a clear commitment to the "2026 Olympics." 101 members of the Grand Council voted in favor of the motion, with five abstentions, while 22 voted against. Until Friday, it remained largely unknown who would sign the host city agreement with the IOC. State Councilor Favre stated that the Canton of Valais would sign it with the city of Sion.

Snow groomers, mercury and store opening hours

In the future, mountain railways will no longer be required to pay motor vehicle tax for their snow groomers. The motion, proposed by the C parties, was passed with 98 votes in favor and 24 against.

The mercury story at Lonza Visp continues to trigger very lively discussions . There have been calls for full transparency

should be created and everything should be investigated, going back to the early years. The creation of a PUK was demanded, but this was rejected by the Council. The Audit Committee (GPK) has been tasked with reviewing all measures already implemented by the State Council. Project – Upgrading of the Gant glacier foreland

Time and again, interventions in our valuable natural environment and landscape are necessary in connection with construction projects, such as protective structures, the construction of reservoirs, ski slopes, or bike trails. To compensate for these interventions, alternative measures must be proposed and implemented in accordance with federal and cantonal nature conservation legislation.

This portfolio of

In the past, it was customary for building permit applicants to propose a compensation measure at the same time as submitting their building permit application , or alternatively , to make a corresponding compensation payment. If a compensation payment was made, the funds flowed into cantonal-wide compensation projects.

In 2016, the municipal council therefore decided to measures is intended to ensure that the compensation payments can be reinvested directly locally. The projects cover the following areas:

- Flora and fauna
- Cultural landscape/Alpine meadows/fields
- Repairing landscape damage
- Dry meadows and pastures

Detailed concept for upgrading Gant

The first project to be tackled will be the upgrading of the glacier foreland in the Gant area. The entire project perimeter is located within the modern

chen glacier foreland. Due to the retreat of the Findel Glacier, more and more so-called "pioneer vegetation" is settling here.

At the same time, the area has been heavily influenced by humans in recent decades, not always with consideration for the newly established vegetation.

The goal of the improvement project is to repair landscape damage and restore natural habitats . This will sustainably strengthen the flora and fauna that have settled in the glacier foreland.

Improvement of water supply to Grünsee

The Grünsee almost dries up in summers with little rainfall, which was last observed last year.

To ensure a constant water flow into the Grünsee, a plastic pipe has been used for almost 20 years. This plastic pipe is now to be partially


be replaced by an open water pipe and, where no other option is available, buried in places.

Removal of waste / installations Power plant construction

Concrete remnants and scrap iron still bear witness to the power plant's construction in the 1960s. These waste and installations are being removed and properly disposed of.

Implementation

The project is intended as a replacement measure for the ongoing construction projects " Riffelberg Trail Bike Route " by the municipality of Zermatt and the "FIS Ski Slope" by the Zermatt Bergbahnen . The municipality, as the affected landowner. welcomes the project and has approved the specific construction project, which was submitted to the cantonal building secretariat at the beginning of March . The municipality of Zermatt hopes for timely approval of the measures so that they can be started as early as this summer.

What would you miss about Zermatt if you didn't live here anymore?



Kumme chairlift – what's next?

After the destruction of the Kummelift in January, initial options for

reconstruction were discussed.

In the early morning hours of January 9, an avalanche broke loose on the western ridge of the Oberrothorn and

thundered down into the Tufternkumme. There, the snow masses tore away the valley station of the Kum-

and destroyed it almost completely. Only the anchor shaft and the substructure remained standing; the wooden structure and electrical components were, quite literally, swept away. Since the ski area was closed, there was no danger to either skiers or employees . The damage was only discovered by employees of Zermatt Bergbahnen AG the day after the avalanche . A bitter loss for the ski area.

Zermatt's oldest chairlift

The Kumme chairlift was, alongside the Siala chairlift in Laax, the first single-cable gondola lift in Switzerland with detachable triple chairs and opened on December 18, 1982. Over the course of 35 winters, many a motivated snow sports enthusiast enjoyed the 1,036-meter ride up to the Unterrothorn.

Back in 1984, the valley station escaped an avalanche and survived the damage relatively unscathed. Only the control booth had to be relocated to its original location.

The fact that this facility was now destroyed by an avalanche is a testament to the massive snowfall that fell this January.

The master plan and the approved zoning plan of the municipality of Zermatt already include a railway system from the «Tufternkehr 2'120m above sea level» via Tufternkumme to

Unterrothorn is planned. This facility is intended to serve the Tufternkumme and Tuftern areas, as well as the slopes of the Unterrothorn . The Board of Directors of Zermatt Bergbahnen AG has now decided to conduct the necessary investigations as part of a preliminary project for this facility.

The technical capabilities of the proposed lift type (chairlift) will be clarified, taking into account the requirements regarding transport capacity, station concepts, etc. A prerequisite for project implementation is a continuous snow-covered slope on the Tuftern-Kumme ski area.

Implementation date uncertain

The Board of Directors of Zermatt Bergbahnen AG is convinced that a new, optimized transport system, along with the expansion of snowmaking facilities, will comprehensively enhance the Unterrothorn, Tufternkumme, and Tuftern areas . However, for planning reasons, implementation is not expected until 2020.





Priority boarding on the Gornergrat Railway

On the Gornergrat Railway, passengers can now book priority boarding, which allows them to board before all other passengers. Seats are not assigned and can be freely selected by the passengers.

After a successful test phase last summer, priority boarding will be definitively introduced from summer 2018.



The ride on the Gornergrat Railway is not just a transport to 3089 m above sea level, the ten-kilometer journey itself is an experience. While the cog railway with

As the train winds its way uphill at a maximum speed of 30 kilometers per hour, the view of the mountains is impressive. When the Matterhorn appears in all its glory behind the large panoramic windows, guests are overwhelmed and pull out their phones and cameras. To help guests choose the best spot for photography or simply to enjoy the view, the Gornergrat Railway will soon offer priority boarding.

Priority boarding allows passengers to board ahead of all other passengers. This is already common practice among airlines, also known as "Speedy Boarding or Fast Lane." Those who choose priority boarding are allowed to wait in a separate sector and board the train first with the other priority boarders. Guests are free to choose their seat, meaning they get

No fixed seat is assigned to the reservation, but a seat is always guaranteed. Exclusive access can be booked for any train from Zermatt to the Gornergrat; no reservations are possible for the return journey. Guests can use the exclusive access until ten minutes before departure.

Book sive boarding and have three minutes to board the train before all other guests.

This offer is only valid for individual travelers of up to nine people. The supplement for a desired train can be purchased up to two months before the travel date. The supplement can be purchased online in the Gornergrat Bahn webshop, at the Gornergrat Bahn sales points in Täsch, or at the Gornergrat Bahn ticket counter.

The surcharge costs CHF 10 until 12:00 noon and CHF 5 after 12:00 noon and is valid on the Zermatt–Gornergrat route (oneway). Seats are limited to 110 people per train.
