New school building for Zermatt – a generational project



The Walka I to III school buildings no longer meet current requirements; they are to be demolished and replaced with a new building. If the residents of Zermatt approve the CHF 46.85 million commitment loan in the ballot on August 25, 2019, construction is expected to begin in spring 2021.

The new building is placed into the slope, fits perfectly into the environment and creates new qualities.

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Added value for school and community

The Walka I to III school buildings, built between 1958 and 1972, are now in dire need of renovation. The first study to examine a possible renovation was submitted to the Zermatt municipality.

Sustainable investment in the future

In addition to the requirements of the educational mandate, the new construction also the cantonal building standards regarding fire protection, earth safety, accessibility and energy efficiency.

The building complex will include 22 classrooms for the re Regular classes, various specialist and special rooms, rooms for the daycare center, a cafeteria with space for approximately 140 people, a gymnasium, a school library and a small stage for events with up to 150 seats. Multifunctional facilities are available for groups and clubs. Training rooms are planned, and thanks to clear structures and short distances, optimal operations will be possible. With the new building and its wide range of uses, the Matterhorn village is not only investing in its youth, but is also increasing its attractiveness as a location and creating important space for the whole of Zermatt. Occupancy of the new Walka school building is planned for August 2024.

Smooth school operations during the construction phase

In order to have as little impact on school operations as possible, the construction pro The project is divided into two phases. In the first phase, Walka I and Walka If will be dismantled and the corresponding new sections will be constructed. In the second phase, this will be done for Walka III. This way, with a mini School operations at Walka III will be maintained for the time being, despite considerable effort. Temporary school buildings will be constructed for the remaining students on the "Obere Matten Süd" (behind Haus zur Matte) and on the meadow north of "Le Mazot," ensuring smooth school operations throughout the entire construction phase. Voting on August 25, 2019

For the new building, the municipal council requests the right to vote a commitment credit of CHF 46.85 million. The residents of

Zermatt will vote at the ballot box on August 25, 2019. The canton will contribute CHF 5.1 million to the new construction project. If voters approve the proposal, construction is expected to begin in spring 2021. The municipal council is aware that this is a significant investment: the pressure to renovate is great, and the need for action is urgent. "We must face the situation and not pass the project on to the next generation. Thanks to healthy municipal finances, the new school building, along with other upcoming major projects, can be realized without raising taxes," says Biner-Hauser.

On August 19, 2019, school starts again!

> New school-goers and experienced school-goers face the start of school with different expectations and desires. To ensure the transition is as successful as possible, it is important for children

They are accompanied by adults who support and encourage them, but who also give them the chance to gain their own experiences.

The school's mission is to create an environment for children that motivates and challenges them , offering them the opportunity for individual, differentiated learning. Supported by competent and motivating teachers, they make everyday school life as interesting and educational as possible, so that learning becomes an experience and ultimately leads to success

At this point, a big thank you goes out to the teachers . Sometimes, their dedication is not sufficiently appreciated by schoolchildren, parents, the public, and the authorities . The diverse demands of our changing society, which are taken for granted, unfortunately contribute to the fact that the teaching profession sometimes appears unattractive and

This logically leads to a certain teacher shortage. Fortunately, thanks to the model of our partner school, the Valais University of Applied Sciences, all positions in Zermatt were filled for the new school year

The outstanding performance of Valais schools in the Switzerlandwide comparison of basic skills in language and mathematics in grades 4, 8, and 11 is considered proof that public schools have no reason to fear comparison with private providers . This is especially true given that public schools have a social mandate to educate, support, and integrate all children, both the best and the weakest

The introduction of Curriculum 21 enables public schools to better face the challenges of the future and also encourages them to act with more confidence and demonstrate what they are capable



With a view to the upcoming ballot vote on the new school building "d niww Walka" on August 25, 2019, I personally hope for overwhelming approval from the electorate for this generational project as a sign of solidarity and a commitment to

Project «Partner School» – Valais University of Teacher Education

At the start of the school year, various schools in Upper Valais, including the Zermatt primary school, are launching the "Partner School" project in collaboration with the Valais University of

Teacher Education.

The third year of study at the Valais University of Teacher Education is undergoing a structural change: Two teacher trainees will take over a school class together. In addition to joint teaching sessions, they will alternate attending the scheduled courses at the University of Teacher Education in Brig and teaching their assigned school class onsite. The pairs will be supervised by a trained intern teacher, the school administration, the inspectorate, and the Valais University of Teacher Education

The project was originally scheduled to start in the 2020/2021 school year, with a teacher in training teaching a class in collaboration with their intern teacher. The acute shortage of teachers throughout Switzerland, and especially in Upper Valais, forced those responsible for the Department of Education

jurisprudence, the Directorate of Pedagogical University of Valais and the school management to seek new opportunities. The launch of the "Partner School" project was brought fo ward to the 2019/2020 school year.

All teachers in the third year of study at the PHVS work in tandem to teach a school class in five Upper Valais municipalities

Because despite early searches - throughout the Switzerland and southern Germany up to

to Luxembourg – as well as increases in working hours and the assistance of returning employees, the situation in Zermatt could not be completely

This solution now means that no classes have to be merged and no major restructuring of the school's organization has been necessary.

At the partner school, the trainee teachers are given the opportunity to immerse themselves in the teaching profession in all its facets (from teaching to parent-teacher meetings to supervising recess) and to assume responsibility. From the very beginning, they are involved in the entire school operation, integrated into the grade level team, and responsible for teaching their assigned class . This allows them to gain firsthand experience of the current challenges facing teachers . They are supported by qualified

The teachers and the faculty advisors from the Valais University of Teacher Education work closely with the newcomers during the courses. The school class is taught in tandem for four weeks

Then there is a phase in which one teacher teaches the class for a week while the other teacher attends the theoretical training, after which the lessons are again held in pairs.

Last school year, the concept was implemented on a trial basis at Zermatt Primary School from February to June 2019 and at the kindergarten during a teacher's maternity leave. The experience was consistently positive, and the findings are being incorporated into the "Partner School" project.

The concept deserves our support; it enables motivated young people to gain a deeper insight into daily practice and valuable experience with their

From the classroom to the ring

and throughout Switzerland. The aim is to spend an educational, creative, interesting and integrative week with the children, teachers and care team on the topic of circus - the community experience for the school is the main focus.

The focus is on the positive energy of the collaboration, which should remain palpable for a long time. The good feeling that everyone has achieved something special together should have a lasting effect.

In total, this extraordinary school week offers 31 workshops, from dance and magic to slapstick and juggling, with even fakirs performing under the circus tent. Groups will handle the promotion, catering, and ticket sales. Students can enroll in various groups in advance (September)

If possible, the children should decide on their project group regardless of age and class.

Each school group is led and supervised throughout the week by a teacher and an animator from Circus Balloni . Together, they rehearse the various circus acts with the children and support the performance with the necessary materials (costumes, music, makeup, props, etc.).

Finally, after the dress rehearsal, the circus program will be performed before the audience on Thursday evening and Friday morning. Parents and children will receive further information at the beginning of the school year.

Good school – what

does that actually mean?

What makes a good

institution is assessed,

school.

Everyone can share their personal school experiences and know what a good school must be, should be, or could be. Understandably, everyone wants a good school—parents, politicians, teachers, school administrators, and, last but not least, students. Depending on

The definition of a good school can vary greatly depending on personality and values: Is it important to be taught a lot of material? Is the focus on perception and appreciation as a person? Is it acceptance and reputation in the class? Is a good learning environment or learning success the most important thing?

The region's schools are constantly developing their profile

The educational strategy, which reflects the objectives of the schools in Zermatt and the Täsch/Randa's defined goals for the next ten years, as well as the annual program, which establishes the pedagogical development priorities, point the way. The focus at our schools is on promoting social skills, whether in the classroom or in joint projects; the individual support of all schoolchildren (projects: support kits, dealing with diversity); the implementation of competency-based teaching using the new Curriculum 21; the professional development of teachers; the use and handling of digital media, IT and its applications; and quite simply: learning! Regular performance comparisons with other schools (e.g., annual examinations) show that we are on the right track.

Active teaching inspires, encourages and challenges

Classes in which the teacher mostly stands in front of the blackboard to deliver lectures are a thing of the past. The learning content sticks better in the long term when children learn through discovery and action. This is achieved with the new teaching materials "NaTech," "Zahlenbuch," "Die Sprachstarken," "mille feuilles," "Schule und Tourismus" (www.wallis2030.ch), "explore-it," or with digital learning programs . Live, on-site learning takes place at extracurricular learning locations such as the forest, the school library , language exchanges with schools in Lower Valais, visits to hotels and restaurants, career days, and the national Future Day . Lessons have changed: Students sometimes learn

They work independently using weekly plans, learn in groups or projects, give presentations, work on various programs, and complete a wide variety of tasks. The children and parents receive feedback from the teachers in the form of assessment interviews and grades – they are encouraged and challenged, and lessons have become more individualized, differentiated, and active.

Knowledge is important –
Competencies are crucial
Human knowledge is evolving
explosively, estimated to have doubled

It changes every five years. Schoolchildren can only acquire a fraction of the world's knowledge.

Students acquire a solid foundation of knowledge within the clear structures of the classroom, even though jobs will emerge in the future for which there is no training today.

The Curriculum 21 takes up these developments: It is certain that in addition to basic knowledge and the thorough acquisition of the four cultural skills of reading, writing, arithmetic and media competence, it is crucial to teach children the art of active living.

They learn to gather information, evaluate it, and learn to make assumptions and draw conclusions. Students practice working in teams, for example, setting goals in their own learning journals and finding strategies to achieve them . Today, the acquisition of personal, social, subject-related, and digital skills is more important than the mere accumulation of knowledge .

Living and learning together

Diversity is the norm in our school region, a success of years of integration efforts. Our schoolchildren come from 23 nations, and in addition to German, 16 different languages are represented in the school buildings. Student integration in Zermatt is

A successful process since the 1980s, children learn for later life: to live in diversity, solve problems together, contribute to the classroom atmosphere, integrate into the community – and become team players. Projects such as the Week Against Racism, joint cultural, play, and sports events (circus week, St. Martin's Day celebration, carnival parade, "sing with us," ski days, brass band, UBS Kids Cup, class camp, clean-up day, graduation ceremony) are the glue of daily coexistence in school life.

and with the teachers, a culture of greeting, and an appreciative classroom atmosphere reflect the mood in our school buildings and classrooms. Parents are invited to take an interest in the school, whether through parent-teacher meetings, the kindergarten's forest day, as spectators at a musical performance, or through active participation in the parent forum.

Even if things aren't going so well, it's often the tone that makes the music, so that constructive solutions can be found together with the support of the teachers or school social workers.

The analysis by educational researcher John Hattie – he examined more than 800 meta-analysis-analyses, which in turn included 50,000 individual studies – to the question of what constitutes good teaching. "We passionately discuss the external extractures of schools."

Learning experts. They teach the children individually, provide high-quality instruction, and work daily for their well-being. The teachers meet the high standards with dedication; good teachers are the key to success. According to Hattie, a school is only as good as the people who work for it, and for this, our teachers deserve respect and recognition for their valuable work!

Free tuition

Following the Federal Supreme Court's ruling of September 2017, the Council of State has clarified the free nature of education during compulsory schooling.

«The parents provide for their child

only the personal belongings

and equipment»

This means that all costs related to instruction must be covered by the municipalities. Exceptions are meals for extracurricular events and the food necessary for the subjects of economics, labor, and household management.

The municipality of Zermatt has largely adhered to the principle of free provision, covering the costs of school trips, ski days, swimming lessons, photocopying fees, book rental, and more. In addition, starting with the 2019/2020 school year, all costs will be borne by the municipality. Parents only provide their child with personal belongings and equipment.

The school materials are provided by the school administration in co-operation in cooperation with the teachers. They buy the material and give it to the children at the start of the school year . The material belongs to the municipality and therefore remains in the classroom over the summer holidays and is

Needs supplemented

According to the regulations, parents cover the costs of school bags, pencil cases, slippers, aprons, cups, water bottles, gym bags with clothes and shoes, and recess (bags and snacks). This also includes clothing and equipment appropriate for the school environment and the season (e.g., forest trips, ice skating, skiing days, swimming lessons). Teachers will provide a list of materials for this purpose.

For extracurricular events such as school transfers, the school charges students CHF 16 for meals. Any additional costs are borne by the municipality. If a student intentionally damages or loses equipment, the parents will be charged.

The changes will take effect at the beginning of the new 2019/2020 school year. Parents are welcome to contact the school administration if they have any questions.

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

Report on the Grand Council sessions May and June 2019

Many interesting matters have been dealt with in the Grand Council recently.

This issue provides a summary of the May and June sessions.

As every year during the May session, naturalizations are carried out. In May 2019, 750 new Valais citizens were naturalized. The majority were naturalized in Lower Valais.

Cantonal Construction Secretariat

For years, the cantonal building secretariat and the cantonal building commission have been criticized by the

The Valais population. The Audit Committee has been commissioned to prepare a corresponding report. The existing procedures are significantly lengthening the processing of building permits within the canton's jurisdiction. There is a great deal of misunderstanding and discontent among

, planners, businesses, and private individuals. A corresponding motion was passed by the Grand Council with 101 votes in favor and 18 against

Spatial Planning Act: There

was great discontent in the Grand Council because the approved text of the cantonal structure plan was allegedly subsequently amended by certain parties, adversely affecting Valais. The Federal Council has apparently approved the cantonal structure plan as of May 1, 2019, albeit with reservations. The municipalities must now define settlement boundaries within the next two years. Furthermore, an additional 300 hectares of building land are to be rezoned.

The version approved by the Federal Council contains significant changes in key sections of the structure plan law compared to the cantonal version.

Equal pay for women

A cross-party motion called on the State Council to legislate that state-supported companies adhere to the principle of equal pay. The Grand Council rejected this motion by a vote

Irrespective of this motion, the Charter of the Council of State will come into force on 1 September 2019. From this date, public procurement

Companies subject to the supervisory authority must provide evidence of equal pay.

Mountain Railway Act

Following a decision by the Grand Council on the cantonal mountain railway law, a motion was already passed in 2011 for submission to the State Council for processing. This new law, which had to overcome several hurdles, was passed with 98 votes in favor, 8 against and 13 abstentions.

The Cantonal Financial Inspectorate is responsible for the control of the Mountain Railway Fund. Any losses incurred by the Mountain Railway Fund on loans and guarantees are borne by the Canton of Valais.

chen supports have long been normal.

Motor vehicle taxes for mountain railways

The law exempting mountain railways from motor vehicle tax was passed in a single reading. The Grand Council debated the changes to the law for an hour. The impact on the mountain railways is minimal. 400 snow groomers across the canton are

The tax savings amount to CHF 150 per vehicle, which generates a revenue loss for the canton of just CHF 60,000.

A long-running discussion began on a comprehensive assessment of motor vehicle taxes. Rebates or tax cuts should also apply to electric vehicles.

Ultimately, the vote on the amendment to the law was passed with 98 votes in favor and 24 against.

Martin Gilles from Sitten was elected as the new President of the Grand Council for the legislative year 2019/2020 with 114 votes.

Oliver Turin was confirmed as First Vice President with 112 votes. Manfred Schmid from Ausserberg was elected as the new Second Vice President from Upper Valais with 107 votes.

Crételonge Prison

The Granges prison, built in 1931, is in need of renovation. The current negative conditions for staff and inmates are no longer acceptable. A new building with a main building with 80 cells and an annex for the women's prison with 24 places is to be constructed. In addition,

the center for deportation prisoners needs to be adapted

The federal government will cover 35% of the CHF 41 million total costs. The costs for the canton amount to CHF 27 million. This financing is provided by the newly

established FIGI Fund of the Canton of Valais.

Public Prosecutor's Office

The focus was on the public prosecutor's office. Internally, the public prosecutor's office repeatedly made headlines due to various problems and turmoil. Therefore, the Grand Council appointed a special public prosecutor to investigate the matter

At the last Citizens' Assembly, the Zermatt Civic Community was able to look back on a successful 2018 financial year. Total sales increased by 4% to CHF 34.3

million.

After improving results for the fourth consecutive year, the past fiscal year was also satisfactory. Total revenue increased by CHF 1,456,000, or 4.4%, to CHF 34,316,000 compared to the previous year . This represents the highest revenue in the history of the Zermatt Civic Community. Cash flow increased by 1.6% in the reporting year, amounting to CHF 5,218,000, or 15.2% of total revenue. The Civic Community closed the fiscal year with a profit of CHF 227,000.

Investments

In the past fiscal year, a total of CHF 6,821,000 was invested in financial assets and property, plant and equipment. The focus of these investments was on the Grand Hotel Zermatterhof (CHF 3,870,000) and the Hotel Schwaffzegenerated cash flow improved by 1.3% year-on-year to CHF

The balance sheet total increases by TCHF 2,330 to TCHF 102,560. Net debt increased by CHF 2,103 thousand, or 0.3% of the balance sheet total. The equity ratio remained almost unchanged year-on-year (-0.3%) at 24.2%. This is a good equity ratio compared to the industry, especially

especially because the balance sheet of the community contains considerable hidden reserves (e.g. investments).

The public-law part of the community generates an annual income of CHF 846,000. The community's result is positively influenced by the higher financial income (dividend from Zermatt Bergbahnen AG). After taking into account costs before depreciation, the cash flow amounted to CHF 65,000 (7.7% of revenue). The public sector segment therefore closed the fiscal year with a break-even result.

Operating income from hotels and restaurants increased by approximately CHF 1.24 million or 3.8% to CHF 33,500,000.

All business segments contributed to the positive result. Accommodation revenue increased by TCHF 671, or 7.1%, to TCHF 10,106. Gastronomy revenue also increased by TCHF 648 (+3.6%) to CHF 18.8 million. The property rental segment also recorded an increase in revenue (+TCHF 10).

5.15 million, or 15.4% of operating income.

After taking into account the increased depreciation (+TCHF 54), the hotels and restaurants of the Burgergemeinde Zermatt achieved an annual profit of TCHF 215.

Matterhorn Group AG

The Zermatt Civic Community, as a public corporation, pursues an almost exclusively private commercial purpose by operating hotels and restaurants. As a result, a complex and at times cumbersome organizational structure has developed over time. In June 2018, the Civic Assembly laid the foundations for a modern and future- oriented restructuring . Firstly, it approved the merger of the Matterhorn Group with Matterhorn Group Management AG to form Matterhorn Group AG, and secondly, it authorized the leasing of the hotels and restaurants to Matterhorn Group AG. Accordingly , the real estate will remain with the Zermatt Civic Community, while the operation of the hotels and restaurants will be outsourced to Matterhorn Group AG, a whollyowned subsidiary of the Zermatt Civic

Due to weather-dependent yield fluctuations, the Citizens' Assembly of 13 December 2018 also decided to dissolve the Hörnlihütte Zermatt Foundation and to renovate the Hörnlihütte

with active and passive members back into the civic community.

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Destination Zermatt – Matterhorn

Unique things about Zermatt – Origin of the community

The village at the foot of the Matterhorn was first documented under the name

"Pratobornum" as early as
1280. Later, the village was
also known as "Vallis de Pra
Borno," "Vallis de prato Borno,"
and "Praborne," each with the
same meaning: "pasture in
the source region" or "pasture
in the border regions."

ZERMATI

The municipal seal still bears the name "VALLIS PRATO BORNI" today. The current name "Zermatt" is thus derived from the German translation of the Latin origin "Prato Borni."

The first German names

Until the 19th century, the

were probably mentioned in documents from 1495 and 1544. They

were «zer mat», «zer Mat» or «zur Matt».

various spellings, only then did they agree on the current

spelling "Zermatt".

History

In the 13th century, Zermatt , along with its inhabitants, goods and common land, was under the sovereignty of the Bishop of

Bishop of Sitten. Historical records show that the clergy at that time transferred or leased their rights to various secular lords.

However, the inhabitants of Zermatt have always had certain rights of use and administrative freedoms of their own, which they maintained even under the servitude of foreign masters.

They therefore considered it appropriate to divide the entire population, including all goods, forests,

and common land, into four quarters: "Hoffero," "Win-

chilmattero," "Muttero," and "Aroleitero."

This division caused discontent among the population.

As a result, the districts, except for "Aroleitero,"
merged their properties again .

The disputes between the districts, especially with the «Aroleitero» district, lasted

continued until a ruling by the mayor of the combined districts on March 8, 1555, established the legal status. Over the course of the following four centuries, more and more Zermatt residents succeeded in buying themselves free from their lordships and tithes.

The first redemption took place on 1 December 1538 and brought more than half of the population freedom. The heads of these 115 families joined together on January 25, 1540

in the church of Zermatt to form the first congregation in a Meiertum.

On July 2, 1576, another 35 redeemed families formed a second community with the same statutes. On March 4, 1579, the

The two communities were united into a farmers' guild with carefully drafted rules. The last 39 households, which became vacant on December 23, 1618, also established their own administration according to these regulations on January 21, 1621. From then on, there were three different communities in Zermatt with their own jurisdiction. However, the established constitution already applied to the entire valley, i.e.

valid for all three communities and remained in place until 1798. On 14 June 1791, the three communities merged into one

The act of 1555 was thus repealed, and the forests, common lands, Alps, and mountains, along with their game animals, were declared common, undistributed property.

The civic community of Zermatt was born from the cradle. The previous constitution of January 21, 1621, and the peasant guild rules of March 4, 1579, were in force. Seven years later, the French under Napoleon invaded Valais and put a bloody end to this legal status: the entire territory of today's canton of Valais was incorporated into France.

Only after the fall of Bonaparte in 1814 did Valais regain its freedom as a republic and was able to join the Swiss Confederation in 1815.

The use of the burgher estates was still the cause of a

A split among the citizens of Zermatt. To finally settle the disputes, the high government of the Canton of Valais sent the governor of Visp to Zermatt. Under his supervision, the two parties signed the first treaty in the town hall on May 12, 1867.

The Municipality . Municipalities

were probably first established and spread during the French Revolution . The first document of the Zermatt Municipality (then called "Munizipalitet") was drawn up on June 2, 1851. Consequently, this legal form came into force in Zermatt just three years after the Swiss Federal Constitution.

The tasks of the two communities became more and more diverse as the village grew.

more extensive and comprehensive. As the burgher community increasingly developed into an administrative body for the burghers' assets, the municipal community evolved into the political municipality, now known as the residents' community. For many years, the burgher community and the municipal community were under the same administration. However, under the influence of increased growth, the concerns of the burgher community became increasingly differentiated. Therefore, in 1969, it separated from the municipality and established its own administration.

at of arms

The coat of arms of the municipality of Zermatt depicts a yellow lion standing on two of three hills. The heraldic animal is flanked by two five-pointed stars. The background color is red. The symbolic power of the lion has always been reflected in various coats of arms.

It is assumed that the Zermatt lion was "borrowed" from the coat of arms of Vespia Nobilis (district capital Visp) as a symbol of district affiliation.

Zermatt Tourism

The five minds behind Zermatt Tourism's target groups

Sporty skiers, pleasure-loving hikers and mountaineers, active families, well-traveled Matterhorn visitors, and nature-loving mountain bikers. These are the five target groups of Zermatt Tourism's marketing strategy. Five product managers are responsible for managing these segments.

It's well known: The Zermatt-Matterhorn destination recently revised its strategy. To ensure that Zermatt Tourism's marketing strategy remains optimally aligned with the overall destination strategy , the marketing strategy was also adjusted. The target group "alpinists" was added to the "pleasure-oriented hikers" segment. The MICE (meetings , incentives, conventions, and exhibitions) segment , however, is no longer actively pursued. Thus, the five segments targeted by Zermatt Tourism's marketing are: sporty skiers, pleasure-oriented hikers and alpinists, active families, well-traveled Matterhorn visitors, and nature-oriented mountain bikers . One person at Zermatt Tourism handles each of these segments.

This means she develops advertising campaigns, creates bookable packages and offers with service partners, and manages media trips. The most important marketing activities are also listed on ZTnet. The five product managers (PM) introduce themselves below.

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

Several construction projects are currently underway in the Sunnegga-Rothorn area. Repair work on the Rothornbahn pylon began last summer and will be completed this summer. This and next summer seasons, construction workers will be making their daily journey toward Rothorn to complete further construction projects.

The problem child Support 1

Last summer, the Rothornbahn's pylon 1 had to be realigned and stabilized due to terrain shifts at the base of the pylon. However, the work on the pylon is not yet fully completed. The entire pylon is now being mounted on a rail system. Thanks to

This system will allow future terrain shifts to be compensated for quickly and without prolonged cable car shutdowns. The work is expected to be finally completed in November, ensuring that nothing stands in the way of the Rothornbahn's punctual opening for the start of winter.

Snowmaking systems

In 1984, Zermatt's first snowmaking system was built between Sunnegga and Blauherd . Since then, this system has reliably produced artificial snow for 35 winters. Now the time has come to replace it . The reasons for the replacement measures are leaks in the piping system and the technology no longer meets requirements. The replacement system will guarantee significantly more economical, efficient, and environmentally friendly snowmaking .

Furthermore, the snowmaking system in the "Upper National" area will be repaired this fall. Last December

In December, a pipe burst there, which must be repaired for the coming winter season.

New Kumme gondola lift


Next summer, various construction crews will be at work in the Unterrothorn area. The 10-seater gondola lift from Tuftern via Tufternchumma to the Unterrothorn will be built throughout the summer season.

Commissioning is planned for the 2020/2021 winter season .

Despite the increased construction activity in the Unterrothorn area, the Blauherd–Rothorn cable car will start operating

according to the regular timetable . Since construction transport in the area is being scheduled as much as possible during off-peak times, the mountain cart and kickbike services will be available in summer 2020 , albeit with minor time restrictions. The entire Unterrothorn area is expected to

Increased traffic volumes as well as noise and dust emissions are to be expected and caution is advised throughout the construction site area.


New Photopoint Gornergrat

Zermatt Tourism

This is what's happening at Bonfire

In the destination-wide digitalization project Bonfire, various projects are running in parallel. Here is an overview of the current status.

Whether it's tourist tax billing, table reservations, or voucher systems: a lot is happening in the digital world of the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination.

Electronic reporting system

Some hotels and holiday apartments are already calculating their tourist taxes using the new electronic

Reporting system, the so-called zTerminal. Currently, interfaces to all PMS (Property Management Systems) do not yet exist. Zermatt Tourism recently launched a survey to determine which PMSs are in use at the destination.

After evaluating the feedback, further interfaces will be created and accommodation providers will be informed.

Destination voucher

The aim is to introduce a voucher that a guest can buy from Zermatt Tourism and use at any

Redeemed at the destination. This does not preclude service partners from continuing to offer their own vouchers in their product range.

The provider for the destination voucher has already been determined; implementation will begin soon. Zermatt Tourism will cover the entire system costs. In return, acceptance partners will pay Zermatt Tourism a two percent commission on redeemed vouchers . The money for

Unredeemed vouchers will be reserved by Zermatt Tourism and used for the intended purpose.

Once the system is implemented, Zermatt Tourism will clarify with all service partners who would like to participate.

Matterhorn Apr

The Matterhorn app has been downloaded by over 60,000 people in seven months . It is constantly being expanded with various new features. For example, the app will also be available in French starting in August. Furthermore, various new tickets can be booked in the app – those for Zermatt Bergbahnen AG always with a five percent discount. The panoramic map has also been expanded and has a new, dynamic design. It shows which hiking and biking trails are open and where they lead. Starting in August, restaurants will have a reservation button that will take guests directly to the restaurant's table reservation website, if the restaurant requests this.

Table reservation system

The system for destination-wide table reservations has already been finalized: Aleno makes it possible to detect double reservations. This means that a guest cannot book tables in two different locations at the same time.

This reduces the risk that a guest reserves a table but subsequently fails to show up. Aleno will be integrated into the Matterhorn app in the coming months.

If a guest wants to reserve a table, they can do so directly in the app. For restaurants that use other systems, table reservations unfortunately cannot be embedded directly in the app; the link to the website remains. Zermatt Tourism will soon approach restaurants to inquire about participation.

Automatic campaigns

Service partners should have the opportunity to benefit from information emails from Zermatt Tourism . Zermatt Tourism prepares news and relevant information for guests. To avoid the same effort , service partners can accept the offer that Zermatt Tourism send emails to guests on behalf of the service partner . In concrete terms, this means, for example, that guests of a particular hotel do not receive the destination newsletter, but rather the same content in the design of the specific hotel. Depending on the selected offer, the service partner can add their own topic blocks . The same applies to automatic campaigns, such as the automatic sending of an email after a purchase or reservation. If a guest books a room,
