

### In operation day and night

If advertising had been placed, it would have cost CHF 21 million. An amount the destination could never have afforded. Of course, the lighting campaign also cost money. But above all, it involved a lot of sweat. "A small team of six people worked day and night to communicate the message to the world. The media and opinion leaders don't report on a campaign on their own. A lot of work goes into it," says Simona Altwegg. Work that – we can already say – has paid off for the entire Zermatt-Matterhorn destination. Arguably more than any marketing campaign that would have been completely lost in the competitive market this summer.

#### Matterhorn lightin

Light is hope: In this spirit, Zermatt illuminated the Matterhorn every evening from March 24, 2020, to April 26, 2020. The projected motifs included slogans such as "hope," "solidarity," and "thank you," national flags and cantonal coats of arms, as well as symbols such as a heart, a globe, and mountaineers reaching out to each other. A total of over 80 motifs were projected.

The goal of the campaign was to give people around the world a sign of hope during the coronavirus crisis, to show solidarity with those affected, and to express gratitude to those helping to overcome the crisis. Each motif was accompanied by a message explaining what a particular motif means and why it was chosen. It was always about the people, never about political reasons.

The project was initiated and funded by Zermatt Tourism. Gerry Hofstetter was enlisted to implement it. Since 1999, the light artist has been transforming buildings, monuments, landscapes, and mountains into temporary works of art. The illuminations were barely visible to the naked eye from Zermatt, but were revealed in long-exposure photographs.

### New lesson times in primary school

In 2015, the Zermatt schools introduced block times to ensure uniform school hours for families as well as for pre- and after-school care.

As part of the harmonization and increase in the number of lessons in 1H (1st Kindergarten) to 16 lessons, the lesson times had to be adjusted to the block time models specified by the Department of Education . Class start and end times will be standardized; all grades start at 8:15 a.m., and school ends at 4:00 p.m. (including Fridays).

#### 1H/2H (Kindergarten)

The children attend classes during 16 lessons (1H) or 24 lessons (2H). All children in 1H/2H have a school holiday on Wednesdays.

German lessons for foreign language children (DfF) are now taught integrated into the classroom under the guidance of a second teacher.

The kindergarten's forest days take place on Mondays (1H/2H1,3,4) or Fridays (1H/2H2,5) from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.



The schoolchildren attend classes for 28 lessons. It lasts from 8:15 to 11:30 a.m. and from 1:30 to 4:00 p.m., with no school on Wednesdays.

## Temporarily unused drinking water installations – Ensuring hygiene

The measures to contain

Coronavirus had to In March 2020, schools, sports facilities, swimming pools, hotels, restaurants and other buildings throughout Switzerland will be closed or their use will

be severely restricted.

The coronavirus is not transmitted through drinking water. However, the effects of the Corona crisis pose an indirect threat to drinking water and its consumers.

If the intended operation of the drinking water distribution systems cannot be guaranteed for several weeks, the increased stagnation of the drinking water increases the risk of legionella infestation and the excessive growth of other microorganisms.

The necessary measures to ensure perfect drinking water quality are described below.

#### Maintaining proper operation

#### Every three days, all withdrawals

Open all fittings in the building one after the other (preferably from bottom to top) and empty the water

Cold and hot water for at least 30 seconds to let customers flow away.

The circulation pump must be running the entire time.


Switching off the power supply should be avoided. Cooling of the installation material can lead to leaks

pipe connections and subsequently lead to water damage.

#### Decommissioning and shutting off the building's drinking water installation

In exceptional cases, it must be checked whether all or part of the building's hot and cold drinking water installation can be shut off and the circulation pump switched off.

The procedure for decommissioning and shutting off the water supply must be determined jointly with the water supplier and a plumbing installer



#### Shut off and empty the Building drinking water installation

For hygiene and corrosion protection reasons, shutting off and draining the building's drinking water system is not recommended. Only when there is a risk of frost should the affected pipes be shut off and drained.

When restarting, the water must be at least

to achieve temperature stability. It is

Open the taps simultaneously to ensure sufficient flow in the distribution lines. Flushing is performed separately for both the cold and hot water systems. Avoid aerosol formation.

After restarting the system, the hot and cold water installations should be checked for Legionella.



## Bicycle move 2020

Remove abandoned and broken bicycles – create more parking spaces.

Throughout Zermatt, there are many unused and neglected bicycles parked. These are rarely or never used and are left somewhere for extended periods by their owners, or even forgotten. Thefts are also not all reported. This means that the police cannot match found bicycles to their owners. These abandoned bicycles block the scarce parking

spaces and negatively impact the village's appearance . For this reason, the "Bicycle Relocation" project is launching for the fifth time this

Starting in mid-July 2020, all bicycles in the Zermatt municipality will be marked with an orange selfadhesive tape . If the bicycle is still in use, the owner must remove the tape to prevent it from being registered as abandoned by the Zermatt Regional Police. Bicycles that are still marked with a tape after 30 days and are therefore unused will be confiscated by the Regional Police .

#### Review and assignment

The confiscated bicycles are stored for 30 days. The regional police collect the relevant data and also check whether the bicycles have been reported stolen in the past. If bicycles can be identified, the owner is informed directly. In order for the bicycle to be returned to the owner, the owner must provide proof of ownership (e.g., a purchase receipt) . A fee of CHF 20 will be charged for this return. Please

All unclaimed bicycles will be handed over to OPRA after the storage period. OPRA will repair the bicycles and donate them to charity.

## Launch of the first Repair Café in Zermatt

Repair instead of throwing away. Starting in September, you can bring your broken or defective devices, clothing, books, and much more to the Repair Café and have them repaired.

#### Repair as a countermovement

Time and again, products with only minor defects that can be repaired with relatively little effort end up in the trash. In many cases, repair is not considered, is not worthwhile, or is not possible according to the manufacturer's specifications. More and more Repair Cafés are showing that this is only partially true, and that over half of all products can be repaired. The Repair Café Switzerland was created in collaboration with the Consumer Protection Foundation (SKS), which has been supporting and promoting Repair Café initiatives in German-speaking Switzerland since the beginning of 2014.

Protecting your wallet and the environment: Repair Cafés offer the opportunity to take concrete action against resource depletion, the throwaway economy, and growing mountains of waste . Visitors also learn how to repair devices and that there are creative solutions for almost all defects. As a positive side effect, the experience is easy on the wallet, new contacts are made, and you can relax over coffee and cake.

### The FEA Zermatt Association

(Family-friendly offers in Zermatt)

Founded in 2011, the sponsoring association FEA Zermatt has grown over

the years and currently operates three childcare services. These include the

Marzipan Nursery (for infants and toddlers), the Puderzucker Daycare Center (from school entry to the end of primary school), and the Nikolai Childminder Network.

#### The FEA family is growing

The FEA Zermatt family is growing, and with it comes change. Preparations for the integration of the Kinderparadies daycare center and the Regenbogen daycare center are in full swing and will be completed in summer 2020

This expansion requires unified leadership in economic and organizational areas

At the beginning of the year, the planned expansion of FEA Zermatt led to restructuring in the management area. With the goal of clearly separating the financial management of the association from the educational management of the individual operations, the opportunity arose to hire a management team for FEA Zermatt. This allows the team leaders to focus clearly on their area of expertise, namely

Michelle Schwerv was hired as the executive director, focusing primarily on the organizational and financial management of all service areas. Her responsibilities also include collaboration with the board and the municipality of Zermatt, as well as communication with the affiliated municipalities regarding the Nikolai childcare center.

The team leaders who have already started their work are Dolores Graven at the Marzipan daycare center and Anik Zeiter at the Puderzucker daycare center. They will also act as each other's deputies.

Corinne Julen will take over as team leader of the Kinderparadies nursery and Regenbogen daycare center from July 1, 2020 .

The team leaders are the pedagogical managers of the respective service areas and are responsible for operational management, the allocation of childcare places and are the contact persons for the parents who are leaving the child.

Fabienne Biffiger, an experienced employee, will remain as the childcare coordinator. She coordinates childcare placements with childcare providers in Nikolaital and serves as the contact person for childcare providers and parents leaving the child.

#### New location for "Marzipan" and "Icing Sugar"

The Marzipan Nursery and the Puderzucker Daycare Center will relocate, as their existing leases will end in April 2021. A new location has already been found, and the "Alte Backstube Biner" is expected to become the new permanent location for both childcare facilities by the end of the year

#### New appearance

The FEA Zermatt association's corporate identity has remained unchanged since its founding . With the integration of the two  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{new}}$ businesses, Kinderparadies and Regenbogen, the board decided to give the FEA a new look and thus directly integrate the two new businesses into a common design.







#### Why an "Alts Zermatt" association?

When planning and designing the 2019 cultural trail from Zermatt via Herbrig to Mutt, we (IG and experts) once again became aware of the rich, in part unique

ancestors left behind: the oldest known barn

Europe from 1261, located on the Herbrigen, the medieval hamlet of Mutt, which has been preserved practically in its original state, etc. This heritage must be preserved. But it's not just buildings that are in focus.

There are numerous historical sources and literature from and about Zermatt, oral traditions, a rich treasure trove of legends, wayside crosses, fountain troughs, and old photographs of the Matterhorn village. These must be preserved from oblivion and preserved for posterity.

#### What is the purpose of the new association?

- 1. Researching, collecting, preserving, documenting and distributing means of the cultural and historical heritage of Zermatt and its surroundings.
- To this end, the association chooses appropriate methods such as exhibitions, publications, lectures, films or digital channels.
- 2. The research and preservation of the old building fabric and the accurate dating of old buildings.
- 3. The creation of an archive for historical writings, documents and old photos (both in digital and printed form).
- 4. Publication of research results on the association's website or in book form, depending on available financial resources.

These results should be made accessible to communities, schools, locals, quests and history researchers

Through financial support of the association, its objectives can be scientifically

The association pursues non-commercial purposes in all its activities. All income of the association is to be used exclusively for this purpose

to be used for non-commercial purposes.

Therefore, the association "Alts Zermatt" was founded in March with the following board: President René-Michael Biner, actuary Klaus Julen, treasurer Josef Taugwalder, and deputy chairmen Viki Perren and Nicola Erpen. 
After much deliberation, the JuBla team has decided to cancel this year's camp. We deeply regret this and hope for your understanding.

### "cœur wallis" - Save lives!



Since December 2018, the Zermatt Regional Police has been a member of the "cœur valais" association. This association was founded to ensure rapid assistance in the event of cardiac arrest in Valais and to increase the chances of survival for those affected.

For the Zermatt Regional Police, blue lights and sirens don't necessarily mean a duty to ensure security, peace, and order in their area of operation. When necessary, they are called upon by the "cœur valais" association and can also provide professional first aid in an emergency. They have been in operation for two and a half years.

#### Every minute counts

In cardiac arrest, time is the enemy. Rapid cardiac massage and defibrillation, along with prompt medical attention, are of utmost importance. According to estimates, the chances of survival after cardiac arrest decrease by 10% for every minute that nothing happens.

#### Save live

An example from last year illustrates how important this association can be . Thanks to the emergency call received from "cœur valais," the regional police were on the scene within a short time. The officers were able to save the life of a woman who had suffered cardiac arrest.

## Unique Biker: The Art of Riding

To raise awareness among bikers, e-bikers, and e-scoote riders about careful riding, Zermatt Tourism has launched the Unique Biker project.



We're all familiar with scenes like this: Numerous visitors stroll through the village, but cyclists don't dismount, instead making their way through the crowd—"slaloming around the pedestrians," you could say. Or a female cyclist suddenly comes speeding around a blind corner.

Such incidents are not only dangerous, but also impair the well-being of guests and tarnish the image of the Zermatt-Matterhorn holiday destination, which prides itself on its low-impact mobility. Therefore, Zermatt Tourism has launched the "Unique Biker" project to minimize inappropriate behavior by cyclists.

A booklet available online containing seven golden rules raises awareness among bikers, e-bikers, and e-scooter riders and encourages them to ride carefully. It states, for example, that pedestrians always have the right of way in Zermatt, changes of direction must be signaled with your hand, you must never ride faster than 20 km/h, even downhill, and that headlights and taillights are mandatory in the

Gornergrat Railway

### The Gornergrat Railway will be back in operation from 6 June

After the Gornergrat Railway (GGB) had to be suspended on March 14 due to official orders, guests will be allowed to travel to the Gornergrat again from June 6.

A prerequisite for resuming activities is a protection plan, which is currently being developed in detail. The plan is based on the general guidelines of the Federal Office of Public Health. The two most important recommendations are compliance with hygiene and social distancing rules. Where social distancing rules cannot be observed, face masks or protective masks must be worn.

In the stations and on the trains, customers are informed about the protective measures via notices and displays on the monitors.

In the first step, the Gornergrat Railway will run hourly from 7:00





Together with the municipality of Zermatt, the Burgergemeinde (Citizens' Community) and the Zermatt mountain railways, the Gornergrat Railway has decided to restrict bike transport on the Gornergrat starting this summer (June 8, 2020).

Cyclists can take their bikes on the Gornergrat Bahn daily between 4:00 PM and the end of service. This is because the hiking and biking trails—especially on the Gornergrat–Riffelsee–Riffelberg route—are not separated, which has led to frequent conflicts between hikers and bikers in the past.

### Why was this measure implemented?

The encounter between hikers and bikers has led to increasing misunderstandings in the past, and there have been increasing complaints. Since there are currently no plans for a separate bike trail between Gornergrat and Riffelberg, this restriction is an attempt to accommodate all segments.

#### Which is the first train to transport bikes?

The first connection for transport from Zermatt to the Gornergrat will be every hour, starting on June 6, at 4:24 p.m.

#### What applies to the Bikepass and Peakpass offers?

The restriction also applies to holders of bike and peak passes.

Although bike transport is included, bicycles may only be transported on the Gornergrat Railway from 4:00 p.m.

The restriction applies to everyone, including local residents, annual pass holders, and GGB employees and partner companies.

## June 6, 2020: Full speed ahead!

On May 27, the Federal Council gave the green light for the reopening of the mountain railways. The engine of alpine tourism can be restarted starting

June 6, and the Zermatt Bergbahnen are looking forward to starting the summer season, albeit with a slight delay.

To ensure the safe use of the cable cars and the long-awaited return of tourists to the mountains, the Swiss Cable Car Association, in consultation with industry representatives, has developed a safety concept that has been approved by the Federal Council. Zermatt Bergbahnen will adapt its operations to these measures and also appeal to guests' personal responsibility and solidarity.

When using the cable cars, the protective measures for public transport and the hygiene rules of the Federal Office of Public Health must be observed. The most important protective measures are as follows:

- Keep your distance in station buildings, cabins and other public areas
- If the two-meter distance rule cannot be observed , wearing a hygiene mask is recommended in accordance with the BAG guidelines .
- Buy tickets online if possible. When paying on-site, prefer electronic or contactless payment methods.

Observe the general hygiene rules of the BAG Wearing face masks is voluntary; passengers without face masks will also be transported. Those without a face mask can purchase one at the Zermatt Bergbahnen AG counters and kiosks, as well as at the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise restaurant.

#### Hygiene and safety in the wards

At all stations, it is possible to clean your hands with either soap and water or disinfectant . Small bottles of disinfectant can also be purchased at the stations, kiosks, and in the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise restaurant. Surfaces and objects such as payment terminals, ticket or card readers, door handles, railings, or shelves that are touched by several people are regularly and thoroughly cleaned , and public areas are ventilated. Especially in the ticket counter and boarding areas for the cable cars, there may be



### Redemption – The people buy themselves free from the nobility

In the oldest document known to us from October 1280 from Zermatt concerning the sale of a meadow in Findeln

The village was referred to as

"Pratobornum" in the then official language, Latin. Shortly

afterwards, in a document dated 16th

In August 1291, the year of the founding of the Swiss
Confederation, we find the name
"Vallis de Pratoborno".

#### ratobornum-Matt

The Latin word "Pratum" means "mat ." "Borne" in French dialects means "fountain or spring." The translation of Pratobornum is "mat" in the source area. "Source area" refers to the various streams Findelbach Gornera, Zmuttbach, and Triftbach, which join to form the Mattervispe in the source area of "the Matte".

At the end of the 15th and beginning of the 16th century, we find the German village name «Matt» on the land table in the famous chronicle of

first Christmas month of 1538 from the Werra family.

The separation of the 39 families from the noble Perrini family took place on April 4, 1562. The remaining 39 families bought themselves free from the noble de Platea family on Christmas Day 23, 1618.

These redemptions included not only the high and low jurisdiction, but also the fiefdoms, taxes, ground rents, guilds and marmots, in short, all the rights of the former rulers and their families.
