

Voting instructions for the municipal council elections (proportional representation)

The pre-printed ballot papers can:

- \cdot be used unchanged , ie the party receives as many votes (party votes) as Names (candidate votes) and blank lines (additional votes) are listed.
- \cdot be **changed** by crossing out preprinted candidate names . This means these people do not receive a candidate vote. The now empty line counts only as a vote for the party (party vote). Or by panachage, meaning candidates from other lists are written on the ballot. These candidates thus receive your candidate vote, and their party receives your party vote.

A blank official ballot paper can:

- \cdot be supplemented with the name of a party and up to a maximum of seven official candidates . Each supplemented candidate receives one candidate vote. Empty lines are counted as party votes for the listed
- · be supplemented with candidates without a party name . The supplemented candidates receive one vote, and the empty lines are not assigned to any party.

Important:

Each ballot must contain at least one name of an eligible candidate. There may not be more names on the ballot than there are seats available

Cumulative candidate listing (listing an existing candidate twice) is not valid under either proportional or majority voting. The subsequently added candidate will be deleted.

President / Vice President (Majorz)

You will receive the preprinted ballot papers and one official blank ballot paper for each election . You can use the ballot paper with a preprinted candidate's name or an official blank ballot paper.

The majority system is a majority vote for the direct, personal election of representatives . The Citizens'

Council election is now held according to the majority system: with an absolute majority in the first round (those candidates who receive more than half of the valid ballots are elected) and a relative majority in the second

Judges and Deputy Judges - Silent Election

If only one list is submitted, all candidates on that list are elected without a ballot (Article 205, Paragraph 1 of the German Constitutional Court Act). Only one list of candidates was submitted for both the judge and deputy judge elections. Roman Henzen was thus elected as judge and Fabian Imboden as deputy judge without a ballot, thus by secret ballot.

Legal provisions

The cantonal law on political rights (kGPR, 160.1), the cantonal ordinance on postal voting (kVbStA, 160.102) and the State Council resolution of 4 March 2020 (StrB) provide information on the applicable provisions.

Election material

Voters received the documents for the municipal council and citizen council elections separately, by separate mail. These include the ballot papers, one voting envelope (labeled with the respective election), one return slip (for the municipality/citizen council), and one transmission envelope (for the municipality/citizen council). For the elections on November 29, 2020, which will coincide with a federal vote, voters will receive the voting materials in separate transmission envelopes.

Postal voting

The envelope can also be placed in a sealed ballot box at the municipal office/citizen's office before the election (opening hours: Mon–Fri, 8:30–11:00 a.m. and 2:00–4:00 p.m.). On the last Friday before the election, the offices are open until 5:00 p.m.

Please return the ballot papers for the municipal council and citizen council elections separately using the appropriate return slip and the corresponding envelope.

Voting at the polling station on the respective Sunday

As an eligible voter, please use the voting materials provided to you. If these materials are missing, a new ballot envelope will be handed to the voter in question, into which they can place their ballot.

Any conversation between voters, any consultations other than those held in the office, any distribution of ballot papers, any actions aimed at catching votes or obstructing the free exercise of the right to vote are prohibited in the polling station (Article 39, paragraph 2 of the StrB).

Constructive feedback

On 11 September 2020, the municipality of Zermatt (EWG) presented the revised and expanded

Map supplemented the Zermatt spatial planning concept (ROK) for the interested public.

Involve the population as early as possible

"It is important to the municipal council to involve the local population right from the start when we define the overarching principles for the further development of Zermatt," explains Anton Lauber, Head of Spatial Planning and Environment. Therefore, a public event was held prior to the official participation process, and the draft spatial concept map was presented.

Parallel to this spatial concept map, which is binding for the authorities, the landowner- binding and parcel-specific land use planning (building zoning plan and regulations) is being revised. According to Anton Lauber, the public approval process for the local planning revision is scheduled to begin in 2021. This schedule will allow the legally prescribed deadlines for the revision to be met.

Qualitative development of Zermatt in the foreground

Zermatt's attractive center is one of the municipality's focal points. To ensure that this already densely built-up area retains its appeal for future generations , targeted and forward -looking development is required. This will keep room for maneuver and preserve the important qualities of open space in Zermatt's townscape. The municipality's car-free status should be used as an opportunity, and conditions for pedestrians and cyclists should be further optimized. Zermatt, with its unique conditions and characteristics, requires individually tailored solutions. Those involved are aware of this and are motivated to find these solutions together with the community.

In order to familiarize citizens with the various aspects of the new spatial planning concept , the municipality set up four information points at the information event, each of which also provided space for discussion: two on the topic of settlement areas and primary residences, one on the topic of settlement quality, and one with a focus on mobility.

Settlement area and primary residences: Overall view versus individual interests

At the information desk on the settlement area, those responsible explained that the focus for qualitative settlement development – according to the draft spatial concept map – is in the center of Zermatt. In the undeveloped outer areas (Howete, Bodmen, Aroleit, Findeln), however, fundamental considerations for long-term development must be made. The criteria for managing these outer reserves are considered: the status of development, suitability for development, the townscape and landscape, demand, and location. In the discussion with those present, it was particularly emphasized that the overall vision for the further development of Zermatt is conflicting with numerous individual interests.

To address the challenge of affordable housing for locals in Zermatt, spatial planning approaches are also possible. The approach of creating financial incentives for primary home construction has attracted particular interest.

Open space, settlement quality, townscape: quality

This information point made it clear that the existing open spaces are important to the people of Zermatt. The currently existing green spaces and open areas in the residential area are considered highly significant. Those present are aware of their importance for the quality of life and living in Zermatt, but they also recognize the conflict with the economic interests of the landowners.

Other important retreats for some Zermatt residents are the hamlets and alpine pastures. These atmospheric, high-quality settlements are intended to remain as quiet refuges used with minimal tourism.

The value and significance of historic building groups and individual structures are also recognized. Those present advocated allowing a certain degree of change (conversion, conversion). This should prevent the maintenance of the buildings from being neglected to the point where they can only be demolished.

Mobility and transport:

E-taxis versus bicycle traffic versus pedestrian traffic

The limited space in the streets of Zermatt was highlighted by all participants in this discussion

The interaction between e-taxis, bicycles, and pedestrians is a source of danger in many places.

The ideas put forward for decongesting and thus optimizing these conditions were very diverse: one-way traffic in the city center, a ring road for e-taxis, additional access and relief roads, for example, for the Tuftra area, or a direct connection from Howete and Zer Bännu to Spiss. Several attendees suggested relocating the post office from the city center to reduce vehicle traffic on Bahnhofstrasse.

The permeability and accessibility of the residential area for pedestrians and cyclists (and partly for e-

Taxis) is, according to feedback, particularly in the area

Wichelmatte. It was suggested that some private paths be made publicly accessible here, as well as along other routes in the center. Tunnels should also be considered to provide public access to certain areas.

Dealing with feedback

to the spatial concept map

The EWG's spatial planning working group will record and review the results of the event on the spatial concept map , and the municipal council will approve any adjustments . Suggestions regarding building and zoning regulations will be incorporated into the further process. Feedback from the Mobility and Transport department will also be forwarded to the

forwarded to the responsible EEC transport planning office.



Replacement construction of Getwing Bridge

The existing road bridge was built more than 50 years ago (1968). The steady increase in vehicle traffic, everincreasing vehicle loads, and advancing age have taken their toll on the structure.

During a thorough assessment of the bridge's condition in May 2015, several serious deficiencies were identified. A comprehensive structural review of the bridge resulted in a weight restriction, which was immediately announced. Furthermore, the streambed in the area of the bridge shows severe abrasion damage caused by the debris carried by the Vispa River.

Subsequently, various investigations were conducted to determine whether the bridge could be renovated, relocated, or needed to be replaced. Several aspects influenced the decision: the clearance height under the Gornergrat Railway bridge, studies regarding urban traffic, and a revision of the flood hazard map. The results showed that renovating the existing bridge was not an option and that a new replacement was necessary.

The Getwing Bridge is the busiest traffic junction in Zermatt. A replacement bridge at a different location could avoid costly detours via temporary structures.

Therefore, the possibility of relocating the bridge to a new location was also examined. However, it immediately became apparent that, due to the complex intersection situation, a relocation would entail ongoing disadvantages for traffic and pedestrian safety reasons . For this reason, the municipal council opted for a replacement bridge at the existing location.

This made it possible to shorten the schedule significantly.

The approval process and the awarding of the contract for the

The replacement construction will not significantly increase the flow capacity under the new bridge. However, the project offers the assurance that the discharge volume can be increased in the future by lowering the riverbed or raising the embankment in the area of the new bridge.


To increase the durability of the new concrete components in the base area, a special protective layer made of ultra- high-strength fiber concrete (UHPC) is also applied. This counteracts the aforementioned abrasion.

No objections were submitted during the public consultation for the new construction project between March 13 and April 14, 2020. The State Council issued the planning approval decision on September 8, 2020.

The Getwing Bridge is the most used

transport hub

in Zermatt.



The Vispa River carries significantly less water in winter, so there is no danger of flooding during this time. Therefore, the months of November to April must be used for work on the streambed. The municipal council has approved the following construction program: In November 2020, the water of the Vispa River will be diverted into a channel in the streambed so that the work can be carried out in dry conditions. Demolition of the existing bridge will then begin. All work that would restrict the flow of the Vispa River must be completed by May 2021.


During the construction period, passage will be restricted due to the limited space. In addition, many pedestrians and cyclists pass through this area. Traffic can travel over the two temporary bridges with occasional restrictions to road width and visibility. The existing bus stops cannot remain in place during the construction period. Buses heading towards the train station and Spiss stop between the Hotel Perren and the Snowboat. Unfortunately, the bus stop heading towards Winkelmatten and Matterhorn Glacier Paradise must be temporarily suspended. Before construction begins, the existing waste shelter will also be optimized to ensure disposal with as few major restrictions as possible. The necessary preparatory work has already been completed.

According to the construction program approved by the municipal council, the new bridge is scheduled to open to traffic at the end of July 2021. Final work will then be carried out, and the dismantling of the temporary structures is planned for November 2021.

Information, maps, and the current event schedule will be posted on the Zermatt municipality website. Two information points will be set up on site for passersby. Important information, such as traffic disruptions, will be published in the Zermatt Tourism newsletter.

Trimming bushes and branches

We repeatedly observe that bushes and branches from private property protrude into the traffic area on public roads and paths or obscure the view of road users.

This can cause disruption to pedestrians and drivers and also negatively impact snow clearing operations by the technical service.

No complete evacuation possible

Recent winters have shown that the large amounts of snow caused countless branches and bushes to protrude into public spaces . This made snow clearing in some areas very difficult, as vehicles could not drive to the side of the road due to the protruding branches and other debris.

At the same time, vehicle bodies and side mirrors are often damaged by these branches, which leads to unnecessary maintenance and repair costs for the vehicles.

Design of the sports arena environment



The cooling tower shines in a new wooden cladding



The new site with integrated smelting pit

In spring and summer 2020, some construction and renovation work in the area surrounding the Obere Matten sports arena was already started and completed.

cooling tower

Between summer 2007 and autumn 2019, there was an outdoor climbing wall on the east façade of the cooling tower.

Recently, the general use of the climbing wall and the required structural and technical condition no longer met the prescribed safety requirements.

For economic reasons, it was decided to renovate the facade and cover it with wooden cladding . Discreet exterior lighting is also integrated into the cladding.

Paving work at Haus Whymper – artificial ice rink/tennis courts

In order to meet the constantly changing needs and ensure the good condition of the public facilities , the materialization of the existing surfaces had to be reconsidered.

The planned project was realized and implemented in two stages in autumn 2019 and spring 2020 .

The existing pavements were removed and replaced with suitable pavements. A new wheelchair-accessible access road provides access to the retirement home, and the terrain was also adjusted.

The smelting pit was also renovated and optimized. The infiltration of surface water was ensured by installing a retention tank .







Winter campaign focused on superlatives



HOME OF WINTER.



Through images and short videos, this year's winter campaign for the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination immerses guests in a winter wonderland. It also convinces with facts.

Uncertainty is currently dominating the economy, and tourism in particular. It is still unclear from which markets and under what conditions guests will visit the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination this winter. What is certain, however, is that Zermatt is demonstrably among the best in many areas of winter tourism: be it the range of slopes, the gastronomy, the hospitality, the snow reliability, or the hours of sunshine. And this year's winter campaign for the destination is based precisely on these facts.

Home of Winter

The destination confidently calls itself "Home of Winter" in its campaign, showcasing its superlatives and the diverse range of activities it offers. While skiing remains Zermatt's mainstay, other activities such as winter hiking, snowshoeing, sledding, and cross-country skiing are particularly popular this winter. This is because it's expected that Swiss people, who usually fly to the seaside in winter, will spend their holidays at home this year.

Snow globe for fairytale world

A snow globe depicting a magical winter landscape serves as a symbol of "Home of Winter" and snow reliability. It appears on all products in the winter campaign. Campaign images and short videos are being produced and will be displayed online and on e-boards in major train stations such as Zurich, Bern, and Lausanne. Communication on Zermatt Tourism's own channels—particularly in the newsletter and on social media—accompanies the paid advertising.

Ten percent more Matterhorn

As part of the winter campaign, destination vouchers with increased value will once again be sold for a limited period . Just like in May of this year, guests who purchase a destination voucher will receive an additional voucher worth ten percent of the purchased voucher. Unlike last time, however, this gift voucher is only valid until the end of the 2020/21 winter season, so the winter business will directly benefit. Zermatt Tourism will inform visitors via internal message when the promotion starts. All service partners are encouraged to use the promotion as an opportunity to score points with regular guests.

Combined forces

For the first time, all major players have joined forces for the campaign: In addition to Zermatt Tourism, Zermatt Bergbahnen AG, the Zermatt Hoteliers Association, the Gornergrat Bahn, the Zermatt Apartment Association, and Zermatters are contributing to the funding. However, there is also agreement that they do not want to participate in the big advertising battle. Rather, the top product should convince guests.

Digital tourist tax billing

Accommodation providers have until January 1, 2021, to switch to the digital system for calculating tourist tax.

Starting in 2021, administrative fees will be charged for the analogue system.



Many accommodations in the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination already use the digital registration system. This means that guests' registration form data is transmitted electronically to Zermatt Tourism. Based on this data, the system creates tourist tax invoices and generates detailed, anonymized statistics on the destination's current and future occupancy. How many beds are occupied? Where do the guests come from? And for what period are guests currently booking? This information about their own operations will be available to accommodation providers in the future and is useful for targeted marketing with minimal wastage.

All accommodation providers must switch to digital registration by January 1, 2021. From then on, billing must be recorded electronically in accordance with the municipality's tourist tax regulations. Those who fail to do so will be charged by Zermatt Tourism starting in 2021.

To switch to the digital system, hoteliers and holiday apartment owners are asked to visit the website www.ztnet.ch/Digitales-Meldewesen and book an appointment for a meeting with Denise Wiedmaier, the Bonfire project manager at Zermatt Tourism .

Corona winter and the future of biking

The destination's major service partners regularly meet together to discuss the destination strategy and the resulting issues.

This happened at the strategy group meeting at the end of September. The discussions focused on lessons learned from the summer season, bike tourism, and the framework for the winter season.

The Zermatt-Matterhorn Destination Strategy Group meets every six months to review the goals set and analyze ongoing projects. This was also the case on September 21, 2020. Representatives of the municipalities, railways, accommodation providers, businesses, and Zermatt Tourism reviewed the past summer season and identified areas with potential for improvement.

Winter with COVID-19

The meeting focused not only on looking back, but also on looking ahead. The strategy group addressed questions such as: How will the winter season unfold with COVID-19? What framework conditions need to be created? What should apply to après-ski? At the same time, it agreed on a concrete recommendation, which it forwarded to the task force of the Canton of Valais.

Mountain bike tourism remains important

Another point of discussion was the destination's bike strategy. Here, too, common ground was found. There is agreement that the focus will continue to be on mountain bike tourism, that the focus must be on separating hiking trails from trails, and that the network should be expanded. The main target group is leisure bikers who enjoy the landscape, the cable cars, and the restaurants. But adventure seekers are also welcome.

Mountain bikers and biking families should find something to offer in the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination.

The next meeting of the strategy group is planned for spring 2021.



Construction work between Visp and Täsch



Due to construction work, the MGBahn line between Visp and

Täsch will be closed from October 12 to November 8 inclusive. Replacement buses will operate according to the timetable. Travelers should nevertheless

Plan your time accordingly.

The closure was deliberately scheduled for autumn, when traffic is less prevalent. The total closures allow the necessary work to be carried out efficiently . Thanks to the continuous work , construction machinery can be used continuously, eliminating the need to repeatedly transport it to the site and prepare it for use. Furthermore, noise emissions can be limited for a limited period of time. Construction work is taking place at Kalpetran Station, on the roadway between St. Niklaus and Mattsand, and on a retaining wall in the Kipferwald forest.

Information and tips for residents and travelers

MGBahn apologizes to passengers for the inconvenience and any delays, as well as to residents of the affected communities for any noise emissions. Noise- intensive activities will be carried out during daytime as much as possible.

The buses scheduled for rail replacement are scheduled according to the train timetable. Notices at the affected stops provide information about the disruptions, the replacement service, and the bus departure points.

Due to the unpredictable traffic situation, adherence to the timetable and connections cannot always be guaranteed. All travelers – especially those returning from Zermatt – are therefore advised to allow sufficient time in advance or to switch to an earlier connection . To accommodate the high passenger volume on the section between Visp and Zermatt, up to six replacement buses will be deployed for individual trains.

La Maya-Gornergrat Railway Replacement: Preparatory

work for the replacement of the La Maya culvert (GGB overpass over Riedstrasse) began in September and will be completed in October. Work will be carried out in day shifts. The noise level is typical for construction sites.

From November 2nd (6 a.m.) to November 6th (11 p.m.), the culvert will be replaced during a total closure of the GGB. To ensure that this time window can be fully utilized for track construction, the overhead line work will be carried out in night shifts . The overhead line will be dismantled on Sunday, November 1st, from approximately 6 p.m. to midnight, and the new overhead line is scheduled for the night of Friday, November 6th, to Saturday, November 7th, from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. The overhead line work will cause minimal noise emissions.

The replacement of the culvert must be carried out from 2 to 6 November 2020, Riedstrasse will be closed from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. Pedestrians will be diverted via Brunnmattgasse.

Access to the St. Georges level crossing will be ensured by security personnel from Brunnmattgasse during the closure .

Zermatt cable cars

Record result was within reach



Zermatt Bergbahnen AG held this year's Annual General Meeting, for the first time since its founding, without the in-person participation of shareholders. The reason for this was the current situation related to the coronavirus. Despite the almost three-month closure from March 13 to June 6, ZBAG achieved a stable result. However, the lockdown did not leave ZBAG completely unscathed.

The dry and beautiful summer of 2019 is reflected in the new record figures. June and July saw new record results. August , September, and October were within the range of previous years. In addition to individual travel, sales of leisure packages such as Peak Pass, Bike Pass, and tours developed positively. From November onwards, guests were offered the best conditions.

for winter sports, and the optimistic expectations for the winter business were fully met in the first half of the season. The number of first-time daily admissions in December exceeded the previous year's figure, and a new record was even set in January. February also delivered outstanding results.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Italian government ordered the closure of the ski resort in Cervinia/Valtournenche on March 8, 2020. On March 13, 2020, the lockdown in Switzerland also

Fact. Due to this cessation of operations during a key season for the company, transport revenue in the winter sports business fell by 20.18%, or CHF 10.7 million, compared to the previous year.

At the end of the fiscal year, the following figures emerged: Operating income amounted to CHF 64.9 million, which was CHF 11.2 million, or 14.7%, below the previous year's result. The key figures, EBITDA at CHF 31.1 million and cash flow at CHF 27.3 million, are satisfactory given the current crisis situation. Even under the current conditions, these are absolute record figures in the mountain railway industry.

The impact of the COVID-19 crisis is clearly visible in the 2019/2020 annual financial statements . Nevertheless, the business performance in summer 2019 and winter 2019/2020 demonstrates that the consistent implementation of the goals of the 2022 Strategy is delivering the expected success.

Despite the lockdown, the principal banks were willing, together with ZBAG, to continue with the planned two major investments totaling approximately CHF 60 million. Based on this decision, the Board of Directors had already approved the

In 2020, the decision was made to continue construction of the Testa Grigia – Klein Matterhorn tricable gondola and the associated "AlpineX" project, as well as to begin the Kumme gondola project, including the snowmaking system . If everything goes according to plan, the Kumme gondola will begin operations on December 20, 2020, in time for the upcoming winter season .

Without the shutdown and considering the snow and weather conditions until the end of April, the excellent result from the previous year could have been exceeded again and the magic mark of 80 million operating income would have been within reach.

Advance of the Gorner Glacier – An unpleasant neighbor

At the end of the 18th century, according to oral accounts by the grandchildren of Johann Jakob
Lauber, who lived with his family near Zer Briggu (towards the bridge),
the Gorner Glacier was only seen peeking out from behind the
Riffelhorn like "a white goat." This statement should be taken with caution, however, because the earliest known depictions indicate that the Gorner Glacier was completely covered by snow towards the end of the 18th century.

was more stretched.

Traveling with a camera lucida

The first topographically accurate depiction of the Gorner Glacier was created. This pencil sketch is an extremely valuable document in the history of glaciers because it precisely records the topographical conditions and the extent of the Gorner Glacier at that time. John F.W. Herschel (1792–1871) achieved near-photographic accuracy by using a so-called camera lucida.

A device with a square prism for drawing objects from nature. The Basel artist Samuel Birmann (1793–1859) created a watercolor in 1825 depicting the so-called Boden Glacier, which was created outside the present-day glacier foreland. Birmann drew with photographic precision.

The ice giant's relentless advance continues

We owe the first impressive description of the advancing Gorner Glacier to the Strasbourg teacher and archaeologist Christian Moritz Engelhardt, who was impressed by the massive, fissured mass of ice. He also referred to the destructive effect of the glacier, which had grown significantly in the preceding years. In the same year, the late Romantic landscape painter Johann Rudolf Bühlmann (1812–1890) also visited Zermatt. On one of his aqua-

In his detailed drawings, he included not only the glacier but also the buildings of the hamlet of Zer Briggu, located on the flat valley floor , as well as the wooden bridge connecting the two banks of the Gornera. Among other things , a two-story house and a stable barn are depicted. The house is most likely that of Johann Jakob Lauber, who is mentioned in Kronig's "family statistics." The buildings stood within the glacier foreland, approximately 50 meters from the high-stand embankment of 1859.

A glacier conjuration and the end of the

Alp Im Bode

The Gorner Glacier continued to advance unabated throughout the 1840s , spreading terror among the valley's inhabitants. To avert the ongoing destruction and threat to cultivated land and houses, Father Johann Peter Schulzki initiated a glacier ban at that time. However, the glacier ban was unsuccessful, as, according to contemporary witnesses, the Gorner Glacier expanded more than ever before in the following years. The Im Boden alpine pasture presumably disappeared permanently beneath the ice around 1842. In any case, it is documented that the pasture no longer existed by 1848.

In 1859, the ice flow finally came to a standstill. According to eyewitness accounts, this marked the end of the Gorner Glacier's roughly 60-year advance. The glacier advanced by 580 to 640 meters during this period.


