and the ongoing adjustments required due to the COVID-19 situation. Thanks to the numerous offers and experiences available for online booking, the destination was always able to respond nimbly. The conversion rate—purchases made via zermatt.ch, newsletter subscriptions, or clicks on advertising banners—was nearly 80 percent, far exceeding the target. These success figures underscore that the powerful message of "Home of Winter" is working.

"Together we are school"

The school administration regularly selects an annual theme, which is lived and implemented throughout the school year. The motto "Together we are school" is intended to enable students, parents, teachers, and the school administration to cultivate, expand, improve, and strengthen their relationships. Living together is the focus.

Diversity is the norm: Our children and young people come from 23 nations and speak 16 languages. The students are growing up in a fast-paced world characterized by a wide variety of lifestyles, forms of work, and work models. Families are navigating their way between quarantine and family life, overprotection and neglect, busy leisure time, boredom and online games, between a carefree school career and the pressure of good grades, and so on. The children bring different levels of prior knowledge to class: Some can read and do math when they start school but are still contributing little to the classroom, others need more or less time for the same learning task, or respond differently to learning methods. Some learn more through sight and images, others better absorb the content through their ears.

One can concentrate better, is easily inspired and motivated, another struggles with restlessness or disinterest. Individual work is more beneficial to one

One child is more likely to be responsive to school, another learns best when the teacher sits next to them, and another needs additional learning materials. "Together we are school" requires that diversity be practiced in the spirit of respect and tolerance

Relationship

A strong relationship between the teacher and the children and young people has been proven to strengthen learning success (see John Hattie's study "Visible Learning"). A supportive classroom climate,



Collaboration, support, and appreciation enable good teaching. Expert, advisory discussions between parents and teachers are crucial. Through mutual exchange, difficulties can be discussed directly.

Professional face-to-face communication is more profitable than any WhatsApp chat.

The school teams plan and reflect on lessons together. The teachers strengthen and support each other. Mutual classroom visits, professional exchange, and joint professional development enable sustainable teamwork. Pedagogical and communityoriented tasks are part of the daily work of the school administration. They are responsible for communication within the school according to

Joint projects across all levels, such as "Energy School," "Healthy School," sports days, musical events, school relocations, excursions, and team events, promote cohesion

With the guiding principle "Together we are a school," the school continues to live respect, tolerance, and team spirit in everyday life. This is achieved:

«D'niww Walka» –Construction work is on track

A lot has happened since construction began: heavy construction machinery has arrived, school noise has given way to construction noise, and school buildings have disappeared.

Work on the new "D'niww Walka" school building is on track. The demolition of the Walka I and II school buildings, as well as the gymnasium, was completed in mid-June. Excavation of the foundation pit is well advanced, and in the northern section, the base depth (deepest point of the excavation) has already been reached. Several tons of rock material have been removed. The slope-side wall of the foundation pit is largely complete and already rock-stabilized. The first phase, with 12 boreholes for the geothermal probes, has also been completed.

The groundbreaking ceremony will take place at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday afternoon, November 9, 2021. The public is cordially invited to attend. Further information to follow.





Kindergarten forest days



For seven years, the kindergarten children have spent a school day in the forest every week. This project was initiated in 2014 by the kindergarten teachers. The forest as a learning environment offers exciting encounters. On the first weekend in September, the "Forest Sofa" and

The "forest square" underwent a small "renovation" with the support of the parents.

Forest as a place of learning

The forest offers countless learning and play opportunities that can't be replicated in the classroom . The focus is on direct experience of the natural environment: What does a tree small like?

How do wood, grass, stones and bushes feel?
Gross and fine motor skills are promoted . The journey to the "forest sofa" is an experience in itself; the children learn to walk on uneven forest ground, climb over tree trunks, balance, and more. Building with branches, leaves, and stones encourages creativity, resulting in interesting "huts" and works of art. The schoolchildren observe ants, encounter wild animals, recognize forest sounds, see how the forest changes in autumn, look for tracks in the snow, and regularly expand their knowledge. Furthermore, the children are not distracted by predetermined toys; they are encouraged to talk to one another, play, and build relationships.

Parents' Day

Parents' Day took place on the first weekend in September . This year, the teachers were again supported by 30 parents and their children. The "forest sofa" was furnished with new stakes and branches.

see and reinforced. Parents and children collected and stacked wood, the area was cleaned, and the utensils, from magnifying glasses to shovels , were cleaned. Afterwards, a small aperitif was held and a picnic was held. The municipality's technical department, under the direction of Amédée Fux, replaced the ground around the fire pit and removed large stones. The area around the "forest sofa" is now tidy and explicitly ready for the schoolchildren. The "forest sofa" is not intended for public picnics or as a fire pit.

Monday and Friday is forest day

On Monday morning or Friday morning – depending on Class – the young "forest researchers" meet with their teacher at the temporary "Obere Matten" and

walk towards Blatten. Equipped with weatherproof clothing, a backpack, food, and a water bottle, they begin the one-hour walk towards "Väschpertola" in the hamlet of Blatten. There they gather on the "forest sofa," a seating area made of branches that the teachers and parents built. Then the lesson (guided activity) begins: Today, the "forest sofa" is finished being built and the individual rules are discussed. Afterwards, the children have a picnic, roast food, or cook with their teacher. This is followed by a short free play sequence, followed by a guided activity, in which they practice the word "forest."

Afterwards the square is cleared up and everyone walks back to the church square.

organization

The forest days take place whatever the weather. They run from mid-August to mid-November and from April to the end of June. If the weather doesn't permit, a mini forest day with a walk and refreshments will be held in the classroom.

The forest is full of secrets, waiting to be discovered by children. In an age of media overload, a day in the forest is a meaningful addition to kindergarten, as the experiences gained in the forest are very valuable.

E-bus operation – relocation of various bus stops

In autumn 2020, the adjacent bus stops had to be relocated due to the new construction of the Getwing Bridge.

Specifically, the stops for both bus lines at the Getwing Bridge were temporarily relocated. At the same time, a solution was sought to optimize these two former stops in the future.

Bus stops merged

The solution was found and implemented by creating a combined stop. This is now located on the side of the bridge.

ckenpfeilers West of the Gornergrat Bahn (near Hotel Zer Mama) and runs around this pillar into Getwingstrasse (towards the train station).

In the future, passengers heading towards the train station and towards the "Matterhorn glacier paradise" will be served at the same stop.

Thanks to this solution, the former bus stop for both the Bergbahnen line and the Winkelmatten line at the East Pillar of the Gornergrat Railway could be removed.

More space and security

This implementation will provide pedestrians and slow- moving traffic with more space and visibility on the busy Getwing Bridge , optimizing the safety of all road users.

Service dog «Q»

"Q" von der Guldenburg, the service dog of the Zermatt Regional Police, works alongside his handler throughout the entire Matter Valley operational

area. The Zermatt Regional Police is the only force in Upper Valais to have a service dog.

The Zermatt Regional Police's service dog is a Belgian Shepherd. "Q" is now 8 years old and has been working with his handler for 6.5 years. Off-duty, "Q" is well integrated into the family, because even a service dog needs a change of pace from his not always easy job as a police dog.

Training

Together with his dog handler,

"Q" completed his training with the Federal Border Guard. Since then, the four-legged police officer has been deployed in drug-related interventions, in searches for people, and as a guard dog.

Missions

The use of «Q» always occurs during a first intervention. Thus, it has

To date, they have participated in over 400 operations , ranging from simple personal checks to the search for

missing persons.

On-call service

Like a police officer, the police dog "Q" is on call. He may be called out with his handler during the night to search a house.



Additional service dog

A police dog brings significant advantages to the daily work of the regional police—whether on night duty or in daily interventions. This has been repeatedly reflected in the experiences of recent years.

Police dogs have become indispensable in daily operations. For this reason, the Zermatt Regional Police will soon be adding a second police dog to their force. This will ensure safety, peace, and order throughout the operational area.

Old Barn – renovate and preserve

For several decades now, the Stadel Group has been committed to preserving these architectural witnesses to our past. This saves the buildings from decay and preserves them for future generations.

In recent years, priority has been given to restoring entire groups of buildings. For example, the majority of the buildings in the hamlet of Eggenalp (BZ) were renovated in the early 1990s. The hamlet of Herbrigg has also been renovated, and buildings in the hamlet of Zmutt are currently being restored.

In recent years, this has contributed to the preservation of around 300 buildings. Now that a large part of the barns and granaries have already been completely renovated, the preservation of the stable barns is now also being addressed.


The selection of the barns to be renovated is carried out by the Technical Department of the municipality of Zermatt, always in cooperation with members of the Cultural Commission.

The protection and preservation of these important elements of our cultural heritage must continue. For this purpose, additional renovation and cultural funds are currently being examined, which should also be available to private individuals for the renovation of buildings within the building zone.

Cutting bushes and branches

The municipality of Zermatt repeatedly observes that shrubs and branches from private property overhang the roadway or obscure the view of road users on public roads and paths. This can cause obstructions for pedestrians and drivers and also negatively impact snow clearing operations by the technical service.



The space up to 4.50 m above the roadway must be cleared.

No complete evacuation possible

Recent winters have shown that the heavy snowfall has caused countless branches and bushes to protrude into public spaces. This has made snow clearing in some areas extremely difficult, as vehicles could not drive to the side of the road due to the overhanging branches and other debris.

At the same time, the bodywork of the vehicles and the side mirrors are often damaged by these branches, which leads to unnecessary maintenance and repair costs for the vehicles.

Cut back or tie together

To minimize this and accommodate snow removal, the Technical Services Department has already trimmed back a few shrubs and branches in recent years, in consultation with the respective landowners. In the majority of cases, the landowners have tied or trimmed their shrubs and branches themselves.

Duty of the landowner

According to Article 172 of the cantonal road law, branches extending onto roads must be trimmed annually by the owner to a height of 4.50 meters above the roadway. The authorities may require complete pruning of branches if traffic safety requires it.

The municipality of Zermatt draws the attention of all landowners to the need to cut down or tie together all bushes and branches that extend beyond their properties and onto public land.


Cape law

The technical service staff reserve the right to trim overhanging branches and bushes in the event of failure to comply, based on the Road Traffic Act and the provisions of the Civil Code. The municipality of Zermatt thanks the public for their cooperation and understanding.




In 2020, Claudia Beaufort completed her part-time MBA in Hospitality at the École hôtelière de Lausanne with top marks.

Burgerholz: The underestimated resource

There is enormous untapped potential in Zermatt's Burgerwald forests. A pilot project by the HES-SO Valais aims to demonstrate how the wood can be used to benefit the destination and the climate.

Stéphane Genoud wants to change the world. And anyone who listens to him soon realizes: the energy expert and professor at the Valais University of Applied Sciences (HES-SO) is serious about it. With the vision of Nobel Prize winner in economics Elinor Ostrom and the active support of Noemi Imboden, his research assistant, he was able to win three partners in Valais for his pilot project: the forestry companies in Val d'Anniviers and Riddes, and the community of Zermatt. But how does Genoud intend to change the world, and isn't the scientist setting the bar a bit too high?

"Not at all," says Genoud, quickly becoming specific. There's enormous untapped potential in the Valais forests, 85 percent of which belong to the civic communities. The local timber, which cannot be profitably processed due to low prices on international markets, will be used locally, primarily as construction timber and energy wood. The trees will be harvested and further processed here, for example, to power a local district heating network or for the construction of public infrastructure.

As a first step, Genoud and Imboden now want to investigate how the forest is currently used in the participating areas and how this use can be optimized in the future. First, an inventory of the current use of the forest will be drawn up in its five functions (energy wood, timber for construction, biodiversity, protective function, and social/tourism). Subsequently, the theoretical and effective potential of the forest will be analyzed to determine how much wood can actually be extracted from the forest each year without compromising any of the uses. Once this potential

is known, it is determined how value creation can best be designed. What is already clear is that jobs should remain in local forestry companies, the money should remain with the local communities, and private end customers could one day receive clean energy at a fair price. Stéphane Genoud sees energy wood as a great opportunity to at least partially replace oil heating systems.

Timber instead of concrete when it comes to the construction industry is his second motto. Wood is a resource that plays an inherently important role in reducing CO2 emissions. Heating with wood is CO2-neutral because the same amount of carbon dioxide is released during combustion as the trees removed from the atmosphere during their lifetime. Therefore, the same amount of CO2 is released into the environment even when the wood rots unused in the forests.

"Wood is a huge, untapped resource," says Zermatt's mayor, Andreas Biner. They were immediately willing to participate in the HES-SO project, especially since they had been considering similar options for some time. Recently, the conventional oil heating system at the Grand Hotel Zermatterhof was replaced with a pellet heating system. This reduced the CO2 emissions of the entire Matterhorn Group AG from 3,360 tons of CO2-eq greenhouse gases to 2,401 tons of CO2-eq greenhouse gases per year. The wood for the pellet heating system is obtained from the management of Zermatt's citizen forests and processed into wood pellets without chemical additives by Matterhorn Pellet AG, in which the citizen community also holds a stake. Furthermore, the proceeds from the sale of the pellets to third parties are immediately reinvested in the ecological management of the citizen forests.

HES-SO Professor Stéphane Genoud also thinks in terms of concrete value creation cycles, derived from the principles of Nobel laureate Ostrom. She explored the question of how natural resources can be used collectively. The fact that historic civic communities play an important role in this is not a contradiction for Genoud—quite the opposite. As forest owners and as organizations rooted in grassroots democracy and historically established, civic communities are ideally suited to broadly support this project and develop it further. Genoud sticks to his ideal and laughs: "I want to change the world—together with 'dinosaurs."







Destination Zermatt (Zermatt History)

Zermatt under church punishment – The conflict with the Prince-Bishop



The parish church of Ernen, dedicated to Saint George.

The original inhabitants, the Celts, left their own cultic and religious customs in Valais and Zermatt. With the arrival of the Romans, who lived on both sides of the Great St. Bernard Pass, Christianity gradually took root among the locals through the influence of Christian soldiers and followers. Small groups formed modest communities. Over time,

more and more people converted to Christianity. It is believed that the evangelists advanced from the neighboring Aosta Valley to the Matter Valley to spread their message.

In the 3rd century, Christianity was declared the state religion in Italy, marking the origin of the Catholic Church.

Bishop behind bars

A millennium later: Bishop Witschard Tavelli resided in Sion from 1342 to 1376. He was not only the spiritual leader, but also Count and Governor of Valais. He increasingly ceded secular power to his friend, Count Amadeus VI of Savoy.

He resided in the bishop's castle of Tourbillon and increasingly seized control of secular affairs. This was a thorn in the side of the Upper Valais noble families, who were mortal enemies of the bishop, as well as the Upper Valais patriots. They stormed Tourbillon Castle in 1360 and forced Count Amadeus to make peace on March 31, 1361.

They demanded the release of all the bishop's castles in exchange for compensation of 13,000 gold guilders. The majority of the Upper Valais population approved the treaty, but not those of Visperterminen, St. Niklaus, and Zermatt. The bishop attempted to change their minds and came to Ernen with a large entourage

On October 16, 1361, the annual St. Gallus Market was held in Brig . The talk of the day was the Savoy Treaty between the bishops. A threatened uprising ensued. The enraged market traders went to Ernen as night fell and surrounded the inn of the bishop and his entourage. During the ensuing confrontation, there were deaths and injuries. The bishop was arrested and imprisoned. The ecclesiastical prince remained imprisoned for eleven weeks. The consequence: five parishes, including Zermatt, were excommunicated. Services, the administration of the sacraments, and church burials were prohibited.

Following these events, the bishop met with the affected parishes on January 4, 1362, for clarifying discussions. An agreement was reached. The bishop had to request absolution at his own expense.

The feud between Georg Supersaxo (left) and Matthäus Schiner was the cause of the second excommunication. Disgruntled Catholics imprisoned their Prince-Bishop in Ernen for eleven weeks. The consequence: Zermatt and four other congregations are excommunicated.





to ask the Pope. The papal bull of absolution was issued in Avignon on April 28, 1362. A general amnesty was agreed upon, but also pardon, impunity, peace with all victims, and even remission of outstanding interest.

Excommunicated for the second time

Not quite two centuries later, the Zermatters were again excommunicated. They were initially loyal followers of Cardinal Matthäus Schiner. Georg Supersaxo, however, did not fail to raise them against the cardinal.

In 1517, they are said to have been particularly prominent in their hatred of the regional bishop and contributed to his escape. The Pope excommunicated the entire parish on January 12, 1518.

The most astonishing thing about it was that the rebellious Zermatters had endured four years without sacraments and priestly burials . It wasn't until June 18, 1522, that Pope Adrian VI lifted the interdict. This was probably partly due to fears that the parish might embitteredly join the new believers during the ongoing Reformation.



Matterhorn Gotthard Railway / Gornergrat Railway

The Gornergrat Railway's Riffelbordgalerie needs to be renovated

The 792-meter-long Riffelbord Gallery is located between Riffelalp and Riffelberg. It was built in 1940 and expanded in several stages.

Masonry piers were constructed against the slope. A steel structure consisting of columns and longitudinal beams was erected on the valley side.

After decades of good service, the gallery now needs to be extensively renovated and refurbished.

Preliminary work

In advance, the existing cable duct and the

The top of the wall on the uphill side was demolished. The cables were temporarily laid in slotted conduits. A gravel shoring had to be constructed on the downhill side for the work on the cable duct.

Road renewal

The first phase of the road renewal lasted from August to mid-September 2021. The second phase of track construction began immediately afterward and is expected to be completed by mid-September 2022. During the renewal of the roadway, rails, sleepers, and ballast will be replaced. The track renewal will be carried out in night shifts, with an 18-meter section being renewed at a time. Parallel to the track construction work, road drainage and work on the cable duct and the uphill wall crest are also taking place. Two stream culverts in the gallery will also be replaced.

Renovation of the building structure and slope stabilization

In a further step, from 2023 to 2026, the gallery will be renovated. This includes the upstream masonry pillars, the steel structure for the roof, including the steel supports on the downstream side, and some repair work on the roof structure. This will be followed by slope stabilization. To localize slope movements, measurements have been taken regularly in spring and autumn since 2018. These include deformation measurements of the

individual structures, as well as inclinometer measurements. The latter reveal deformations in the subsurface with high precision. For this purpose, a measuring tube is firmly anchored in the ground.

Challenging logistics and planning

The construction work is being carried out during normal operation and therefore presents a major challenge, particularly from a logistical perspective. For the first construction phase, "Track Reconstruction 2021," from August to mid-September, the adjacent ZBAG track was used for transport . During the second construction phase, "Track Reconstruction 2022" (upper half of the gallery toward Riffelberg station), all logistics must be ensured via the tracks . Due to the limited space in the gallery, only suitable construction machinery can be used. This poses an additional challenge for the track reconstruction.

The work steps must be planned meticulously so that the road can be reopened for GGB operations each morning.
