The «Matterhorn Cervino Speed Opening» is gaining momentum

In autumn 2022, the time has come: The first cross-border Ski World Cup races in World Cup history will be held on the "Gran Becca" course, newly designed by Olympic downhill champion Didier Défago. The start will be at Gobba di Rollin above Zermatt at 3,800 meters above sea level, while the finish will be above Cervinia at Laghi Cime Bianche in Italy at 2,865 meters above sea level.

«Matterhorn Cervino Speed Opening»: A descent that leaves nothing out

"In addition to the unique panorama, the untouched nature, and of course the view of the Matterhorn, the course itself is also impressive: We have created a downhill run that has it all – from jumps to wide curves and gliding sections to speed elements, it leaves nothing out," says race designer Didier Défago. The course runs on Swiss and Italian territory. Largely on the glacier and in front of breathtaking cliffs, the

"The descent consists of pure gliding sections, large and fast downhill turns, and more technical sections with high speed and varied jumps. The elevation gain of 935 meters, the height itself, the length of almost 4 kilometers, and the combination of natural and artificial snow will present the athletes with additional challenges," Défago is convinced.

«Gran Becca» and its unique highlights

They were looking for a course name that represented the two regions, the two ski resorts, and the mountains in which these races are held. In the Aosta Valley, the Matterhorn is often called "Gran Becca" – the great peak – in the local dialect. Since the Matterhorn accompanies the athletes from the start to the finish, it quickly became clear to the organizing committee that the downhill course at the foot of the Matterhorn should be called "Gran Becca."

Concentrated know-how as a guarantee of success

"With Swiss-Ski, the FISI, the team of experts from Val Gardena responsible for the sporting organization of the races, Didier Défago as piste planner and Pirmin Zurbriggen as advisor and ambassador, as well as the key people in the local organizing committee, we have the necessary experience to organize a top event in the coming months," says Franz Julen, President of the Matterhorn Cervino Speed Opening.

Information from the Organizing Committee

Four World Cup downhill races will be held in Zermatt/Cervinia in autumn 2022. The two men's downhill races will take place on October 29 and 30, 2022, and the two women's downhill races on November 5 and 6, 2022. At least two downhill training sessions will be held from Wednesday to Friday before the races . The men's teams will stay overnight in Zermatt, the women's teams in Cervinia.

The draw for the starting numbers and the prize distribution will take place on Friday and Saturday evenings in Zermatt and Cervinia.

In both locations, a "World Cup atmosphere" will be created in a "World Cup Village."

Noise abatement regulations – Entry into force of partial revision

The current noise abatement regulations (LBR) have been continuously adapted over the past 40 years to meet the needs of businesses, the public, and guests.

The more recent partial revisions in 2005, 2008, and 2009 primarily concerned changes to construction times and construction work, which was also the case in the current partial revision, among other things.



On 7 December 2021, the general assembly unanimously adopted the partial revision of the noise abatement regulations.

At its meeting on April 6, 2022, the Council of State approved this revised noise abatement regulation, which subsequently entered into force. The following article outlines the key changes to the new regulations.

Due to the short construction periods in May and October, noise pollution is exceptionally intense during this time.

Many jobs that are carried out throughout the year elsewhere are confined to a tight time frame in Zermatt

This is further restricted by the annual closures. The construction and ancillary industries have little time to breathe - the deadlines are so tight . Clear, predictable conditions can help

The construction period will now be extended to 20 working days. This means that instead of the previous "four weeks" including closure days, there will now be 20 working days excluding closure days. This will give developers, planners, and the main and ancillary construction trades more breathing room and greater planning security. However, noise levels must not be excessive during this period.

The previous provisions under Article 6, Paragraph 1, Letter e) (closed days) were too vague and left considerable room for interpretation. This led to legal uncertainty. Due to the short regulatory construction period and the work bans on Saturdays, the possible working days were again restricted, especially for the construction-related trades .

· Pick hammers weighing up to 10 kg can now be used in buildings on closure days, always in compliance with all reasonable protective measures against noise

Development sites are becoming increasingly rare. As a result, more and more plots are being accessed via so-called access tunnels . It is in the nature of things that these are rarely used during the limited construction periods pursuant to Article 6, Paragraph 1.

The excavation work must be carried out within the normal excavation time. Further advancement, as well as the handling of the excavated material (gravel), will take place after the excavation time inside the access tunnel. This allows the most noise-intensive work to be carried out underground, with minimal disturbance to the surrounding area. The partially revised LBR actively influences the coexistence between

Hospitality industry

Nighttime peace and quiet is of central importance. The revised Article 4 of the LBR now incorporates the provisions regarding peace and order in front of hospitality establishments, analogous to the cantonal law on accommodation, catering, and retail trade in alcoholic beverages

· The new provisions better outline the duties and responsibilities of the operating license holders and define their area of responsibility more precisely than is the case in cantonal law.

The revised Articles 10 and 11 LBR restrict music or the use of sound

· From 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. there is a night-time quiet period. Doors and windows must be closed during this time so that the sound is limited to the interior of the hospitality establishments and does not escape outside.

Zermatt has been named Europe's best ski resort several times in a row. Après-ski fun is an important aspect of operating a ski destination. However, this should not come at the expense of the tranquility-seeking locals and guests.

New regulations have been established to define and permit après-ski music, but also set clear limits on sound. Details of these mandatory measures, as per Appendix 1 of the LBR, will be provided in the "Zermatt Inside" issue this fall

Overall concept for the Zermatt project area – a reconstruction of the railway infrastructure in stages

Major long-term changes are looming in the area around the MGB and GGB train stations. As part of the overall Zermatt Project

Area concept, Matterhorn Gotthard Infrastruktur AG, in collaboration with the municipality of Zermatt, examined options for the future railway facilities. The best option identified offers a glimpse into the future.

Täsch-Zermatt Tunnel

In 2019, the Täsch – Zermatt tunnel was designated by Parliament as a road The strategic development program for railway infrastructure (STEP) has been included. As a project of Matterhorn Gotthard Infrastruktur AG (MGI), the tunnel is to be completed by 2035 with federal funding from the railway infrastructure fund. The necessary determination of the ideal position for the tunnel portal was used as an opportunity to incorporate the renovation of various railway facilities in Zermatt into an overall concept. This concerns the MGB and GGB train stations, the freight transport facilities, and the maintenance facilities of the MGB and GGB. Many of these facilities will reach the end of their service life in the next 20–50 years. The municipality of Zermatt was involved in this process in order to best accommodate existing needs.

Objectives of the overall concept

In developing the overall concept, in addition to the railway's concerns, the requirements of the destination were also taken into account, such as the function and design of the station square and Bahnhofstrasse, freight logistics, settlement development, the natural hazard situation, and tourism. The interests of the various transport users should also be taken into account in the

Concept must be coordinated.

Renewal in stages

As a result of this process, a development variant was developed that best meets the needs of all stakeholders. The first step will be the Täsch-Zermatt railway tunnel.

Currently, project work is underway to define the tunnel entrance and exit. The expected commissioning of the

The Täsch-Zermatt tunnel is planned for completion in 2035. Only then can the new rail freight facilities and the new maintenance facilities for MGB's rolling stock be built outside the station area. This is considered a prerequisite

for the subsequent redesign of MGB's station. The station is to be relocated slightly north of its current location to allow for better traffic flow on the station square

To improve freight logistics (service center), the Grüebe project is being pursued with the private landowners. The road freight handling planned for this service center, among other things, can now be planned and implemented independently of the commissioning of the Täsch-Zermatt rail tunnel.

The future maintenance facilities for MGB's rolling stock, as well as the new loading facility for various oversized goods and construction materials, are being built in Schafgraben. These are already handled at this location and then transported onward, primarily by GGB. The future of GGB station can only be envisaged after 2040.

An overview of the stages with time horizon can be seen in the graphic at the top (planning phase: light, implementation phase: dark).

No short-term improvement. The overall

concept provides clarity about the interdependencies and the necessary time horizons of the individual stages or partial expansion steps. These show that no substantial improvements will be possible in the Zermatt train station area over the next 15 years. Implementing the proposed development variant will make it possible to remedy existing deficiencies in the long term. This will also significantly enhance guest reception and massively improve traffic flow.

The overall concept has been summarized in these few sections. Further informational events are planned. Public involvement is also essential and will be addressed as soon as the planning stage is sufficiently mature.

Zermatt's Energy and Climate Strategy lists the goals and outlines measures in various areas by which the EWG can achieve them. The strategy also includes the building standard binding on the authorities. This serves as a guideline for construction and focuses on

based on accepted standards and labels such as the Minergie standard.

Municipal buildings and facilities represent a particularly important area of action. The EnerCoach tool records the heat, electricity, and water consumption of municipal buildings annually. Monitoring makes consumption visible to identify any irregularities. Furthermore, the consumption of different buildings can be compared. Monitoring thus provides guidance for identifying buildings in need of renovation and initiating optimization measures. The EWG began its journey to becoming an Energy City back in 2014. At that time, the buildings' consumption values were recorded retroactively up to 2010.

The success in promoting renewable energies and increasing energy efficiency can be demonstrated by two examples :

Heating oil savings

In recent years, the municipality has placed particular emphasis on replacing fossil heating systems. For example, the existing oil heating system in the wastewater treatment plant was replaced with a heat pump that utilizes wastewater heat. In the Terminus/Zollhaus building and the Parish Center/Triftbachhalle, the oil heating systems were replaced with pellet heating. In addition, renovation work has been carried out on various buildings in recent years to reduce heat requirements. The various measures taken by the municipality

de led to a reduction in heating oil consumption of approximately 75% between 2010 and 2021. This is illustrated in the adjacent graph.

Development of heating oil consumption in the EEC

Replacing heating oil leads directly to a reduction in CO2 emissions.

tosses. While almost 900 tons of CO2 were emitted in 2010, this figure fell to 230 tons in 2021, corresponding to a reduction of approximately 75%. The new Walka school building continues these efforts and will meet the Minergie-P standard, including a PV system on the roof.

Street lighting

Another energy-efficiency measure is the conversion of street lighting. Since 2015, the municipality has been working to convert the existing street lighting to LED technology. Currently, 46% of the street lighting is already equipped with LED technology. This has already reduced energy consumption by around 50%.

Precarious housing situation in Zermatt

"Mr. Meier, where can I sign?" the young waitress asked her supervisor. He pointed to the line, thanked her, and shook her hand. She looked at him excitedly: "So I'll see you on Monday." Delighted, she turned around and hurried away. Mr. Meier stood there with slumped shoulders. This was already the second person to sign an employment contract with him and was now looking for an apartment. Mr. Meier knew the problem. Several dozen employees were desperately searching for accommodation. He had heard a real estate agent say that the last studios were gone by the end of October. There were two studios still listed on the Zermatt Tourism website, but they had been there for a year or two. There must be a reason for this, Mr. Meier thought.

What had always been a challenge escalated to such an extent at the end of 2021 that companies felt the painful consequences. Employees left again, before the season began.

Desperate search for staff, desperate search

for accommodation

On the one hand, employers already have a hard enough time recruiting staff. On the other hand, they now have to

They also help them find accommodation. The result: Many candidates will never take up the positions.

There are simply no apartments for them. Those employees who provide accommodation have to compensate for this staff shortage and are often stretched to their limits, with the result that quite a few are turning their backs on the tourism industry. And once again, Zermatt is mourning the loss of several apartments for locals . In addition, there are new businesses, new hotels with new employees.

Those who have made provisions benefit

Decades ago, some entrepreneurs managed to invest their capital in real estate in Zermatt, often in studios for their own employees. Now they're profiting from the situation and can include the reference "WITH ACCOMMODATION" in their job postings.

Families are also affected

The housing shortage affects not only seasonal workers, but increasingly also local families. We're talking about rents of over three thousand francs a month. For many, paying this with wages from the service sector is hardly possible anymore.

Airbnb

Airbnb is demonized worldwide as the culprit of the housing shortage. But Airbnb is merely a symbol of the digitalization of our economy.

If this platform did not exist, another one would certainly have stepped in.

Commute?

From Zermatt, it's all downhill. Finding housing there is often just as difficult as it is in Zermatt. Since the pandemic, Lonza has massively expanded and recruited. The effect is that even in the valley floor, housing is now almost impossible to find.

An appea


If we succeed in making Zermatt a 365-day destination again, businesses will be able to stay open longer, employees will be able to be employed year-round, and accommodation will be able to be rented year-round, without interruption.

Anyone who has spent a fortune on an apartment in recent years is naturally entitled to a return on investment. But there are also many for whom it wouldn't matter so much. We appeal to you: a free apartment for employees means we can hire more people, we can provide better services, guests are happier, and staff cope better. It's about Zermatt's future as a place to work and live.

We run the risk of offering the best Alpine product possible, but stifling the vital engine that brought us here in the first place: our residents. We must act.

The young waitress in our example has applied for another job next winter. Will things turn out better this time?


After a thorough analysis, the experience and know-how will be reviewed in autumn 2022 and a decision will be made on the next steps.

Increase in fines for violations of traffic regulations

Since 30 March 2022, the new bus

The list of penalties for violations of the Zermatt Municipality's traffic regulations is now applicable. The municipal

council passed a resolution on this proposal at its

meeting on March 17, 2022.

Decision of the municipal council

The municipal council agreed that in the future, the weight of the vehicle should be the deciding factor in the decision on the amount of the fine.

Comparison to the old traffic regulations: The old

regulations categorized the fines based on truck size . However, this unit of measurement was abandoned because categorization by weight is more appropriate and thus simplifies the determination of the fine amount.

The new fine catalog: The following

table shows the different levels of fines depending on the weight of the vehicle. It will also be irrelevant whether the violation is a private or commercial trip.

Scan and pay online: Zermatt regional police switch to digital fine system.

The Zermatt Regional Police are switching to a new system for recording and processing fines. Fines will now be recorded online, and a ticket will be issued containing a sequential number and a QR code.

Scanning the QR code will take you to a secure portal where all details about the issued ticket are anonymously displayed. The ticket can also be paid directly by credit card or Twint.

Time flies, and the students in grades 1H – 4H have already been taught by their teachers in the temporary school for 16 months.

On February 1, 2021, 200 first-cycle students moved into the temporary school building in Obere Matten. The 16 school containers house 19 rooms, designed to provide quality instruction and sufficient physical activity. The pavilion on the opposite side is also used by the school.

All rooms are 90% booked. The missing weekly gymnastics class will take place outside.

The location in the heart of the village is highly valued by students, parents, and teachers. The school administration draws a positive conclusion.

School Professor

Moving to temporary accommodation always involves some complications. Cherished habits must be abandoned. The classrooms are 15 square meters smaller, and materials and furniture must be sorted out, disposed of, or temporarily stored. Instead of cupboards, there are shelves in the rooms. The blackboards are interactive, and most are height-adjustable.

The staircase is located outside. The cloakrooms for three classes are somewhat cramped. The walls are thinner than usual, and the pedestals are not very noisy.

It is a temporary solution, but with a little improvisation, it is quite manageable. Teachers and schoolchildren have become accustomed to their temporary arrangement.

and are satisfied, especially since the new premises in the school building «Niww Walka» will be completed in 2023 and 2024 In the meantime, an original name has been found for the temporary school —

School proficiency. Professional instruction takes place in the rooms , and the residents feel at home.

Playground

The playground is located between the school prof(f)isorium and the school pavilion. It is bordered to the west by the tennis courts and to the east by Obere Mattenstrasse. It is approximately 800 m² in size and offers sufficient space before and after school, as well as for staggered recess. The parking spaces for bicycles and kickboards are fully occupied. A box of toys is available for the children to use during recess. Only softballs are permitted for soccer on the playground. Stilts, rings, ribbons, pedalos, and juggling equipment enable active recess. The playground can be expanded if necessary by additionally using the space in the sports arena. In the winter of 2020/21, the children enjoyed playing over the piles of snow on the

We were delighted to have a natural ice rink. It wasn't set up at the time due to the pandemic. Despite the various events taking place in the sports arena, constructive interaction is possible, and school operations are minimally disrupted.

Sports and Exercise: During

the construction of the "Niww Walka" gymnasium, there will be one less gym class per week available. Teachers have developed a lesson plan to compensate for the lack of off-site gym classes.

Sports and physical activity are encouraged during the kindergarten's Forest Day. An exercise course was set up, the "Chrome" sports field and the sports arena were used, skating and hockey were played on the ice rinks, and additional hikes, as well as "Rutscherli" and sledding afternoons, were held. The weekly gymnastics lesson was moved to

The schools in the school region are on the way to achieving this and want to continue to actively promote the health of their students . Therefore, the school administration was presented with the "Schulnetz21" award plaque on April 21, 2022, during a parents' evening on the topic of "media."

SchoolNet21

"School Network 21" is a cantonal network of health-promoting and sustainable schools. It supports member schools in their long-term commitment to health promotion, education, and sustainable development. The goal is for schools to create healthy learning, living, and working environments. At the cantonal level, "Health Promotion Valais" is responsible for coordinating School Network 21. Prevention Officer Denise Ruffiner is responsible for this and has awarded the label as part of the

At the 9OS parents' evening, the following message was presented: "We are delighted to welcome the Zermatt-Täsch-Randa school region as the 13th member of the Upper Valais School Network 21."

Health promotion in schools

Health promotion and prevention are integrated into the Curriculum 21 and are taught in the following subjects from kindergarten through 11OS: "Physical Activity and Sports," "Business, Work, Household," and "Nature, People, and Society." Specific topics are addressed in class: How do I eat healthily? Who am I? How do I deal with media? etc.

Furthermore, the dental nurse visits the classrooms twice a year. School health officers perform their duties and examinations in the classrooms, in addition to the essential collaboration during the pandemic.

The schools hold their tried-and-tested apple break twice a year . For example, during the first apple break campaign

400 kg of apples were eaten in the fall (!). Exercise breaks take place in the classroom , and a box of play equipment is available during recess on the playground near the temporary school building in Obere Matten.

The Media Days in April, led by the school's social worker and in cooperation with the Mattertal Youth Work Center (JAST), aimed to teach children and young people how to use media responsibly. Parents were informed about online safety, sexting, and leisure activities in general at various information evenings.

The focus was on the role of parents as role models and the risks and opportunities of the media.

The focus of the coming school year will be on the topic of "Energy School." Health promotion projects will be included in this topic area.

The Mattertal Youth Work Center meets the diverse needs of young people in the region. Youth work includes coaching and counseling, prevention, youth association work, and regional and supra-regional project work.

Open youth work is a comprehensive field that supports young people on their path to independence. To cover the diverse activities, such as club work, regional projects, and counseling, sufficient full-time positions are needed. In May 2022, Melanie Engler was hired as a 60% position (to train as a social worker), thus strengthening the team at the Mattertal Youth Work Center

What youth work achieves

Open youth work is committed to ensuring that young people are integrated into the community, feel comfortable, and participate in the processes of our society. Involving young people in the processes of our society means prioritizing resources over deficits, building self-esteem, creating identification with society, integrating, and promoting health.

Due to social change and new demands, the needs of young people are also changing, which in turn requires youth work to adapt to these changes.

The Mattertal Youth Work Center would like to introduce its new employee and has therefore asked Melanie Engler a few questions.

What interests you about youth work?

Working with people of different ages and sociocultural backgrounds makes everyday work interesting and educational. We gain insight into different subcultures and the worlds of thought and experience of

People and can inspire them and let them inspire us . For me, there's nothing more exciting.

I have worked for many years in political campaigning, youth work, project management, communications, and as a journalist. I also have experience working with clients in the health sector and

in tourism, children's and adult education, and in an international environment. In my daily work, I was constantly interacting with different target groups. Observing, reflecting, and meeting people on an equal level in different languages was my daily business. During this time, I was able to learn a great deal about people's psychology, behavior, and motivations, and I was able to sharpen my ability to shift perspectives. I was happy about the news. For me, it meant

Naturally, I had to rent an apartment in the region so I could be close to my clientele, feel the pulse here, and get to know the region better. The Matter Valley, with its nature and mountains, is impressive and a tourist magnet for people from all over the world. I'm looking forward to exploring the hidden places here. Since my school is in Lausanne,

I will still be in the Bern region a lot to commute from there.

What do you wish for the young people in the region?

The young people should have a place where they can be themselves and exchange ideas with their peers. Through joint projects and leisure activities,

they should strengthen their confidence in their own abilities and sense of responsibility, hone their social skills, and cultivate tolerance and respect for their environment.

What are you most looking forward to?

What I'm most looking forward to is collaborative creative projects.

I 'm looking forward to getting to know the young people and their world, to being a part of it, and, of course, to experiencing nature in the Matter Valley.

I hope to contribute my diverse skills and professional experience, contribute to cultural diversity, and perhaps bring a breath of fresh air from outside Switzerland

Bicycle move 2022

Thefts are also not all reported. This means that even after the police find the bicycles, they cannot be returned to their owners.

These abandoned bicycles block the scarce

parking spaces and negatively impact the village's
appearance. For this reason, the "Bicycle be char
Relocation" project is launching for the seventh time this 2/2221.

Marking and indentation

All bicycles in the municipal area Zermatt will be served by a

orange self-adhesive tape. If the bicycle is still in use, the owner must remove the tape to prevent it from being registered as abandoned by the Zermatt Regional Police.

is registered. Bicycles that are still marked with a band after 30 days and are therefore unused will be confiscated by the regional police.

Review and assignment

The confiscated bicycles are kept for 30 days. The regional police collect the relevant data and also check whether the bicycles have been reported stolen in the past. If bicycles can be identified, the owners are informed directly.

To be returned to the owner, the owner must provide proof of ownership, e.g., a purchase receipt. A fee of CHF 20 will be charged for this service. You can contact us at: 027 966 nig2/gear.

Reuse

All uncollected bicycles will be handed over to the OPRA association after the storage period . The association will then return the bicycles to their original condition.

When temperatures rise again, the general public enjoys a barbecue outdoors.

However, cantonal and regional regulations must be observed.



In the canton of Valais, open fires are strictly prohibited according to cantonal law . This applies to both traditional barbecues and the burning of green waste or construction waste. However, barbecues are permitted in Zermatt, provided the regulations are observed.

Legal framework

Cantonal legislation stipulates in the "Forest and Natural Hazards Act (kGWNg)" that fires in or near forests are prohibited throughout the canton. Except for fire pits officially designated as such by the municipalities .

Furthermore, according to the cantonal "Environmental Protection Act (kUSG)", there is a general ban on burning any type of waste (including green waste and construction waste) outdoors.

Violations of the relevant instructions will be punished, and any interventions by emergency personnel will be charged to the perpetrator. It is also important that the instructions of the authorities and emergency personnel are followed in all

General fire ban due to dry periods

As a result of prolonged dry periods, the canton may impose more extensive restrictions (general fire bans, including for barbecues, charcoal grills, fireworks, etc.). These are published in the official gazette and generally disseminated through the media.

Forest fire risk and air pollution

The reason for this restrictive approach is primarily the high risk of forest fires, wildfires (dry forests and meadows), and peatland fires in Valais, which leaves relatively little room for maneuver. However, with regard to the incineration of any type of waste (including green waste and construction waste), air pollution and, more broadly, soil pollution also play a significant role.

Barbecue fun in Zermatt and Täsch

However, outside of the general ban on fires due to drought, there is no need to miss out on the barbecue fun.

As already mentioned, there is the option of using the official barbecue areas. The municipalities of Zermatt and Täsch, as well as Zermatt Bergbahnen AG and the magazine "Schweizer Familie," now provide eight barbecue areas of this type in both municipalities, which are maintained and supplied with firewood during the summer.

- « Swiss Family» barbecue area near the Mettel Bridge, Municipality of Täsch
- « Swiss Family» barbecue area in the Täsch-Schali area, Municipality of Täsch
- · Fireplace Schalisee, municipality of Täsch



Adjustment of the tourist tax in the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination

After the members of Zermatt Tourism decided to adjust the tourist tax from 3 to 4 francs, the residents will now decide

Residents of the destination will vote on the tourist tax adjustment. The municipalities of Randa, Täsch, and Zermatt will decide on the matter at their general meetings in June.

The tasks and expectations financed by the tourist tax have steadily increased in recent years . A shortfall can be identified in two areas in particular : the financing of investments and the operation of digital infrastructure, and the financing of guest entertainment through events. To ensure that Zermatt Tourism remains a powerful organization in the future , capable of successfully supporting and implementing information, projects, and events in addition to professional marketing , the tourist tax needs to be adjusted.

The adjustment will generate approximately CHF 1.5 million in additional revenue, based on an estimated 1.8 million overnight stays . The additional revenue will flow into the

Event management, on the other hand, the adaptation represents an investment in the destination's digitalization: Here, the Zermatt-Matterhorn destination has already gained a significant lead, which needs to be further developed. The tourist tax adjustment secures the financing of major events in the destination in the long term and also creates scope for action, for example, in supporting tourist infrastructure or guest information. Events serve to entertain guests and contribute to greater added value and greater awareness of a destination. In summary, they increase the attractiveness of a destination; this benefits both guests and service partners. In terms of the advancement of digitalization projects, guests will benefit in the future from better information, easier booking and information retrieval; they will be guided comprehensively and according to their interests through the destination's offerings. At the end of the day, the host or hostess will also have more time to engage with the guest, as they gain time through automated administration.


Zermatt Tourism recommends adopting the tourist tax adjustment and thanks everyone for their support. The goal is to implement the adjustment by November 1, 2022. Following a positive vote at the primary assemblies, the new tourist tax regulations must still be approved by the State Council.

A group of Zermatt service partners recently went on a study trip across Switzerland. Trips like these are valuable, as they show that our competitors aren't sleeping. Seeing other great offers is inspiring and motivating to make our own product even better and more customer-friendly.

These anniversaries underline the success factor of the events in the destination Zermatt – Matterhorn

The February issue of "Zermatt Inside" already featured the Gornergrat Zermatt Marathon, which has been running for 20 years. But that's not all: several events are allowed to

celebrate an anniversary this summer. The sustainability of these events demonstrates that they contribute significantly to the added value within the destination and to its success.



The Matterhorn Ultraks celebrates its 10th anniversary in August 2022

In 2013, the Matterhorn Ultraks was launched to replace the legendary Matterhorn Run. At the start in the church square, 882 adults and 93 children set off on the 16 km, 32 km, or 46 km courses. Ten years later, the number of participants has tripled, and runners are clamoring to secure a bib number. The three races include a vertical run and a

Extreme course, which has become the benchmark for sky running worldwide, has been added. The anniversary is being celebrated by the

"VERTINIGHT," a vertical race intended as a homage to the Matterhorn Run. The runners will run from Zermatt to Schwarzsee at night – the

The public will be able to follow their progress by the light of their headlamps . "Who would have thought, when we took over the torch for the Matterhorn Run in 2013, that the event would reach such proportions?" said organizer Michel Hodara.

But: "There's no reason to stand still. The adventure will continue for many years to come."

Zermatt cable cars

Spectacular cable car transport through Zermatt

On June 22 and 29, 2022, a spectacular heavy-duty transport will take place in Zermatt. Two new suspension cables for the Furi – Trockener Steg aerial tramway will be transported to Furi station, distributed over two trucks. It is the first transport of this magnitude since the early 1980s.

In total, the two trucks with the ropes weigh around 130 tons.

The transport of the new suspension cables begins a few days earlier in eastern Switzerland on Lake Constance, where they are wound onto the reels at the manufacturer Fatzer in Romanshorn and loaded onto the trucksFindelbachbrücke. Since a truck with the entire cable



Fondue rides on Swiss cable cars are nothing new.

In 2019, however, safety recommendations were replaced by a new standard, which meant a ban on gondola rides with flammable liquids. The Swiss Cable Car Association recently developed a uniform industry solution, which also allows Zermatt's "Fondue on the Rope" to resume. It will take place this summer on July 15.

Four people at a time can enjoy the experience during the return journey from Zermatt to Trockener Steg, including Valais wine, a variety of appetizers, cheese fondue, a variety of desserts, and a Valais digestif. Departing at 6:30 p.m., the mountain backdrop in the evening light frames the special train ride.

Those who prefer a special morning ride with culinary delights will enjoy the gondola breakfast. This year, it takes place on Sunday, August 14th.



Summer on the Gornergrat

Starting at the end of June, 120 Blacknose sheep will once again graze on the Gornergrat, and guests can easily find them at any time thanks to a live map. New this summer will be a "Meet the Sheep" event.

A themed trail will be created between Gornergrat and Riffelberg, where guests will learn even more about the woolly four-legged friends.

After a two-year break, the sunrise rides on the Gornergrat are taking place again.

Meet the Sheep at Gornergrat

Between June 25 and September 10, 2022, around 120 Valais Blacknose sheep will once again graze on the Gornergrat. As was the case last summer, shepherdess Deborah will delight guests with interesting facts about these woolly four-legged friends from Tuesday to Sunday from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Guided hikes in cooperation with ZERMATTERS will also take place on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. July to September 10, 2022.

This summer, a 4-kilometer-long Meet the Sheep themed trail will be created between Gornergrat and Riffelberg, which can be comfortably hiked in around 1.5 hours. It leads through eleven stations from Gornergrat to Riffelberg and is marked on the "Meet the Sheep" map with hiking symbols. On site, the trail is identifiable by cairns. The QR codes found at each cairn contain videos, facts, and figures about the typical Valais sheep. The trail also offers interesting information about alpine grazing, the flora and fauna of the Gornergrat, and the Gorner Glacier. At each station, knowledge is tested in a quiz, and by entering the correct answer, trail visitors can, with a little luck, win three days' holiday in Zermatt.

Sunrise rides on the Gornergrat

The popular sunrise cruises will take place again this summer; every Sunday between July 11 and August 21, 2022.

The moment the sun reaches the Matterhorn is incomparable. Guests experience a moment for eternity, watching the sunrise at Riffelsee and listening to the guide's fascinating commentary, followed by breakfast at the 3100 Kulmhotel Gornergrat.

Repair of Zermatt train station



The current train station in Zermatt was built in 1984/85. Now, necessary repairs to the railway infrastructure must be implemented.

The project consists of 3 stages.

Stage 1: Platform roof renovation (June – July 2022)

The waterproofing of the platform roof will be repaired in a targeted manner. The covering will be removed across two joints perpendicular to the roof over a width of approximately 1 m to repair the underlying waterproofing. All cracks in the covering on the roof will also be freshly grouted.

The repairs are scheduled to begin on June 6, 2022, and will last until the end of July at the latest, depending on weather conditions.

Stage 2: Track construction marshalling yard / Dismantling of the Track 3 cleaning pit (May 2023) In May 2023, track construction work is planned

The work is planned for the marshalling yard area. As part of the project, two switches connecting the MGB network with the GGB network will be replaced, and one switch will also be demolished. The cleaning pit beneath track 3 will also be partially demolished as part of this work . The track construction work, including switch replacement, must be carried out at night for operational reasons .

In addition to the track construction work, the surface in the marshalling yard area (AlpinCar-go) will be replaced

Stage 3: Platform renovation (October 2023)

In October 2023, during the total closure, resurfacing work will be carried out on the platform between tracks 5 and 6, as well as tracks 3 and 4. In addition to the new surface on the platforms, the entire Zermatt station will be equipped with tactile safety lines (guide lines for the visually impaired).

The planned repair measures will enable smooth interaction between public traffic and railway operations in Zermatt for the coming years.

New multiple units for the Gornergrat Railway

At the beginning of April, the first of the new multiple units for the Gornergrat Railway was transferred from the Stadler factory in Erlen to the Bockbart freight terminal in Visp.

A few days later, the "POLARIS" (POpular LAndscape Railway In Switzerland), harnessed between two MGBahn locomotives, was brought to Zermatt.

Since then, the commissioning phase has been in full swing. Extensive test runs and so-called profile runs are scheduled for this summer, during which it will be determined whether the train can complete the entire route without collisions. Meanwhile, the "POLARIS" has already made its first appearance on the Gornergrat.

The new trains are particularly customer-friendly and barrier-free. The vehicles feature low-floor entrances, a modern customer information system, and can travel faster and are smoother. Furthermore, the multi-purpose compartments offer more storage space for winter sports equipment and bicycles.

Water supply – Water, our daily bread

Until the 18th century, Zermatt was called "Prato Borni," which means "meadows in the source region."

The village fountains

Until 1901, very few houses had running water. For washing or cooking, water was obtained from the only two wells the village possessed at the time: the "zem Chriiz" well and the "am Stitzje" well. Zermatt also had no sewer system at that time. The toilet drains ended in a shaft, which was cleaned and emptied once or twice a year. Around 1885, one of the largest houses, "ds alt Schtäffupeterhüüs" (today's Central), burned down. To extinguish the fire, the Triftbach stream was dammed and the water diverted through the middle of the village to the source of the fire.

In 1900, a syndicate was founded to design and implement a water supply and sewerage system. The municipality alone would not have been able to carry out such a project at the time. So, the municipality joined forces with the Visp-Zermatt-Gornergrat Railway and the Alexander Seiler company. The contract was won by

de the water from the Triftbach. It was a bit murky at first, but the first steps had been taken. Eight new wells and 14 hydrants were distributed throughout the village.

The water supply

The introduction of the new water supply almost caused a small uproar: Because the old village well, the starting point of all village news, lost its value and many

Citizens this place, where one can so beautifully «hengar-

te" (chat) could, didn't want to miss. In 1921, the railways and Alexander Seiler sold their shares. The town council then acquired a stake in the company. On July 15, 1922, the first clear and clean drinking water bubbled through Zermatt's pipes. The quality of Zermatt water was now equal to mineral water. The first proper regulations for water and sewerage were approved by the town assembly on March 23, 1923. These regulations were revised in 1972 and are still valid today.

Today, Zermatt, at an altitude of between 2,500 and 1,900 meters above sea level, boasts approximately 133 springs in 13 source areas, with over 45 km of spring pipelines, 31 km of transport lines, and a 47 km long pipeline network. The water supply is managed by an operations manager, a network manager, and three operating employees. Thanks to its abundance of water, Zermatt is 100 percent self-sufficient in pure spring water. On seasonal peak days, up to 35,000 people are supplied with drinking water. Water consumption in 2021 amounted to 1,400,981 cubic meters!

Water quality

The laboratory values of 146 water samples collected in 2021 showed an average water temperature of 4 degrees Celsius. Furthermore, the water is soft because it flows mainly through crystalline rock such as gneiss and granite, and

so it does not absorb lime. However, due to the rock, it contains calcium and sulfates. Zermatt's drinking water contains

Furthermore, there is virtually no nitrite, nitrate, or uranium. The microbiological values are also extremely low compared to the Swiss average and far below the legally prescribed tolerance level.

Conclusion: Water consumption works as long as we do not pollute and contaminate the water in the natural cycle return!





New cabins for the Matterhorn Express



More comfort and simplified operations on the Matterhorn Express.

154 "Omega 3" cabins, which are slightly lower and have been in use for over 20 years, were replaced with elegant "Omega 4" cabins featuring the latest technology. This standardizes all 260 Matterhorn Express vehicles on the Zermatt – Furi – Schwarzsee – Trockener Steg route to the same cabin type , providing guests with a particularly pleasant journey and simplifying operations starting this summer .

The approximately 154 "Omega 3" cabins were released for sale in December 2021 and were completely sold out within a few hours. At the end of May, the sold cabins were picked up by their new owners. At the same time, the new "Omega 4" cabins were transported to the valley station on Schluhmattenstrasse, where they will be available from mid-June 2022, following the completion of the overhaul.
