



## Lack of teachers pragmatic solutions sought

**Zermatt and the Täsch/** Randa school region are facing a The third year of study at the Valais University of Teacher significant challenge due to a shortage of teachers.

The third year of study at the Valais University of Teacher significant challenge due to a shortage of teachers.

> The school administration, in collaboration with the municipal and school presidents of the three municipalities, the school inspectorate, and the Department of Education, sought pragmatic solutions . Since January, the primary school administration has been searching for teachers in Switzerland and abroad

Due to the shortage , the proven "Partner School PH Valais" concept will be reinstated in the 2022/23 school year . Two students in training will take over a class at the Zermatt kindergarten in tandem. Students from the Täsch/Randa school region will also attend grades 7H and 8H in Zermatt. This solution, and thanks to the teachers' willingness to teach larger classes, can mitigate the teacher shortage to a minimal extent, especially since people without appropriate diplomas will be employed for very small positions in the subjects of Textile Design and Intensive German .

### Project «Partner School University of Teacher **Education Valais»**

In the 2019-2021 school years, the "Partner School" project was successfully implemented in Zermatt schools in cooperation with the Valais University of Teacher Education . In the coming school year , several classes in Upper Valais will again participate in the Tannheimer Tal (Tennize) tarting in August. The shortage of teachers has caused concern among those responsible for the Department of Education and the Pedagogical

The University of Valais was encouraged to optimise the project and improve the framework conditions.

study and practice were linked even more closely. The project aims to provide students with a "live" entry into professional life, with careful supervision and advice from the school administration, a teacher on placement, and a course that is even more closely aligned with everyday school life . Lesson preparation, parent-teacher meetings, team discussions, classroom management, joint planning, team teaching, etc., are all responsibly prepared and implemented ars. These valuable experiences are not possible in the lecture

Anja Teysseire and Patricia Truffer will teach grades 1H/ 2H3 in collaboration with the kindergarten team . We wish the two trainee teachers much success in combining their studies and careers.

Pupils of 7H and 8H from Täsch/Randa attend classes in Zermatt

Despite extensive efforts, two vacant positions in the Täsch/ Randa school region could not be filled for the upcoming 2022/23 school year , neither with teachers nor with PHVS students. The primary school administration has sought suitable solutions.

In discussions with the partners involved, a pedagogically and organizationally sensible interim solution was found for the school region : four schoolchildren from 7H and the entire 8H from Täsch and Randa will attend classes in

Schoolchildren and parents have already had experience with changing schools in recent years

to Zermatt. In the 2022/23 school year, two fifth-graders each will be placed in the classes of Roman Imboden and Julia Graven, and fourteen sixth-graders will be placed in the classes of Alois Summermatter and Char-

leen Muhs in Zermatt. This solution is only possible because the teachers are willing to teach larger classes. They deserve praise and recognition for this extra work. Thanks to the redistribution, there will no longer be any need to teach classes with 30 children in the school region. The decision was also made

Alongside various energy-related projects, the slogan "We are full of energy " will be used throughout the school year and serve as a guide for children, young people, and teachers in school and teaching development.

An energy school is a school that engages with the topic of energy in depth, regularly, and holistically—both in class and throughout its school operations. For this commitment, it can receive the "Energy School" award from the Energy City association, which can then be recognized again every four years.

### Become an energy school

Zermatt schools undergo a year-long process to become Energy Schools and strive to meet specified criteria. The "Energy City" sponsoring association provides support and various tools. Zermatt schools embed the sustainable use of resources in the school culture (school mission statement), implement an annual program of energy activities, and integrate the topics of energy efficiency and renewable energies into their curriculum.

### "We are full of energy" – part of school and teaching developmen

A "school full of energy" is an organization that critically examines itself and moves forward, dares to try new things, and doesn't stand still. In the spirit of quality assurance, the school administration has set itself the goal of actively engaging with its own school and teaching culture with the necessary energy and motivation, defining measures, and implementing them throughout the school year. This is done in line with the pedagogical development priorities that the Department of Education has set for the schools of Upper Valais for the 2022–2026 school years:

- · Dealing with heterogeneity (diversity)
- · Assessment
- · Digitization
- Media and IT implementation of the module curriculum
- Introduction, implementation and supplementation of teaching materials in German, Nature/Human/Society and Textiles, Technical and Visual Design

Based on this, the school administration has developed a four-year school program and set priorities. Dealing with heterogeneity is a high priority every year due to the diverse composition of the student and teaching staff. However, in 2022/23, the focus will primarily be on competency-based support and assessment . In 2023/24, the Zermatt, Täsch, and Randa schools plan to further develop their digital transformation efforts and consolidate the implementation of the "Media and Information Technology MIA" modular curriculum.

Furthermore, the construction of the new school building "Niww Walka" is progressing, and the recruitment of teachers with appropriate diplomas for the primary schools are issues that require considerable energy from the school administration and the local community , in keeping with the motto: "We are full of energy."



## Smartwatches – sensible use

During the past school year, teachers and school administrators have increasingly observed that children are being equipped with smartwatches and AirTags so that parents can always know where their little ones are.

Many are lulled into a false sense of security, and children become unsettled. The school administration has defined clear rules regarding the use of cell phones and smartwatches and, as part of the annual media projects, has raised awareness among parents, children, and young peoplexaphoconictribate sustlead ficking it all hoead idea this!"

Parents trust their children less to be independent, but they need to be able to experience autonomy, learn that they can go out alone and therefore have to remember when to come home . This helps children develop positive self-esteem and

Let's briefly recall our own youth: We would wander through the village in the afternoon or build huts in the forest, play soccer in some meadow or hide-and-seek in the neighborhood, drink water from the well , or go to the "street." It rarely happened that we told our parents about it in the evening, and they would have shown concern.

Family X is considering whether to buy a color smartwatch for their older boy when he starts kindergarten. "It would give me a sense of security knowing I can see where my boy is if he comes home late," says the father.

Experts, however, explain that these devices only provide a false sense of security. AirTags, cell phones, and watches, for example, could fail due to a dead battery. Parents are sending the wrong message to their children: "You can't make it out there alone."



The colorful smartwatches are modern, everyone has one and you can do a lot with them: They count the steps and They measure your pulse, which can be used for chatting and filming. Parents even call children during class about trivial matters. This is fun for the children, but it also poses data

AirTags are sewn into kids' clothes or hung on their school bags in case they get lost . They can be used to track backpacks, wallets, and other items thought to be lost . Once the phone and AirTag are connected, the user can use the app within Bluetooth range to trigger an audible alarm on the tracker or conveniently locate it using a map. With a little skill, it's also possible for other phones and tablets located

Teachers, classmates, or the school class are also tracked using this technology, and their current location is transmitted to parents in real time: "Class X is currently in the gym, is now on its way to the school building, has now finished class, Teacher X is still talking to my child... etc." This violates

school administration has defined clear rules for the use of cell phones and smartwatches and discussed them with the students. The use of digital devices is prohibited before and after school on school grounds, during recess, and during class time . All devices must be turned off on the school grounds and in the school building and stored in school bags.

Smartwatches are not worn on the wrist or are left at home, AirTags are unwanted.

As part of the various media projects, we talked to the children about opportunities and dangers in the environment. use of digital media and sensitized parents to this topic at information evenings.

Schools encourage moderate and correct use of digital media and offer support. Therefore, it is important that parents talk to their children about the use of the internet, tablets, cell

phones, tags, and smartwatches and set boundaries.

### App «parentu» facilitates access to hard-to-reach parents

### The app for informed parents has been used in the municipalities of Randa, Täsch and Zermatt since 2019.

The "parentu" app informs parents in 13 languages about topics such as growing up, education, and raising their children. The app provides over 300 age-appropriate content for children from birth to 16 years of age. Birthday. An evaluation by the Zurich University of Applied Sciences (ZHAW) confirms that the "parentu" app is perceived as extremely helpful by parents and professionals, even reaching those who are difficult to reach. In 2021, "parentu" was actively used by 32,000 people, and 159,000 push notifications were opened.

### **Evaluation confirms impact**

August 2022

The ZHAW evaluation summarizes the impact as follows:

· «parentu» reaches parents who do not speak foreign languages and who have little education · Parents who speak a foreign language use the app's content in a similar way to non-native parents. They find the app easy to use, rate the quality of the content as good for their families, and see the app's multilingual nature as an important advantage



## **Recycling centers**

From 1 October 2022 the collection of recyclable materials (disposal and recycling) in Zermatt will no longer be carried out by Schwendimann AG, but directly by the municipality of Zermatt (EWG). In the future, the containers will be collected and emptied using standard municipal electric vehicles.

For this task, EWG has acquired new infrastructure equipment, which must be put into operation. Between September 12, 2022, and September 27, 2022, the existing Schwendimann AG containers and presses will be removed and immediately replaced with new ones based on a sector plan.

The replacement of all containers for municipal waste, glass or cans in the village and the outlying areas will be carried out as follows:

To ensure a smooth exchange, we ask commercial and service companies to make their containers or compactors available for emptying or exchange on the specified dates.

### Exchange of bio-container / used oil container

The organic waste containers and waste oil containers will be exchanged directly on the regular collection days between September 12, 2022, and September 27, 2022. Users of the organic waste containers are asked to make all existing organic waste containers with blue lids available for exchange during this period .

### Mountain huts - helicopter transport

Mountain huts that own operating containers can have them flown down to the valley by helicopter on their regular transport flights and exchanged as of September 1, 2022.

### Settlement of pickup stamps

No collection stamps are charged for exchanging company containers or compactors . Only for municipal waste will a seal fee be charged if the company container is more than half full.



This will eliminate the complex collection system required only for these five locations . These collection points will be closed without replacement until further notice.

PET bottles will also be available for disposal at public collection points starting October 1, 2022. These containers at public collection points are intended for private households only

## Diverse economy and better quality of life

Zermatt and Täsch want to become more attractive as a business location and place to live. In May In 2022, both municipal councils approved a concept and implementation plan for "Location Development and **Promotion in the Inner Matter** Valley." A lot of work now

"Location development and promotion" are dazzling terms. The first step is to advertise a motivated and communicative person who In many places, this primarily involves attracting new companies

Some people understand this with nice sweeteners, while elsewhere they stand for good local politics per se. Following the style of Täsch and Zermatt, the new location policy is intended to make the Inner Matter Valley a place to live and work, as well as an economic hub.

The location will be specifically upgraded as a complement to the recently founded cooperative for the promotion of affordable housing.

Joint location development and promotion is also a priority of the current tourism strategy for the "Zermatt – Matterhorn" destination. It defines more attractive living, working, and residential conditions as "positions for success" and calls for the promotion of municipal cooperation. It is important to both municipalities that the different starting points in Zermatt and Täsch with regard to living and working are always duly taken into account.

The implementation plan now provides for a total of eleven measures that will be implemented gradually starting in autumn 2022. They range from information and networking activities to marketing measures and optimization of the planning and regulatory framework and public

will be responsible for processing and coordinating the planned measures in a mandate or employment relationship.

In the future, it will also serve as a contact and advisory center for all those who want to advance the Inner Matter Valley with entrepreneurial and other innovative ideas

The concept and implementation plan for the new location policy were developed by a joint commission of authorities starting in mid-2021. Mario Fuchs, Annette Fux, and Judith Mooser (Täsch), as well as Romy Biner-Hauser, Anton Lauber, and Stefanie Lauber (Zermatt), participated From now on, the commission will assume strategic management of the joint location activities and oversee the specialist office. An expansion of the commission to include key partners from the region is already being considered.

### Fair cost sharing

Implementing the planned measures entails gross costs of a good CHF 100,000 per year, including the full costs of the specialist department and external contracts. The cost estimates do not include possible contributions from the federal government, canton, or other agencies, which should be addressed as soon as possible to co-finance individual measures. Such third-party funding would provide corresponding relief for both municipalities . Either way, the commitment is likely to be economically worthwhile, as the measures will ultimately increase jobs and income in the Inner Matter Valley.

the municipality of Täsch will cover 40 percent . The fact that the two municipalities have equal voting power on the steering committee is part of the deal.

With the launch of a joint location policy and the simultaneous establishment of a housing development cooperative, the municipalities of Zermatt and Täsch have taken a major step toward closer cooperation. However, for the success of both projects, it is important that as many local and regional companies, associations, and private individuals as possible contribute and participate in the joint activities.

## The new municipal flag

On Corpus Christi, the new parish

The flag was blessed and inaugurated. It was then ceremoniously carried through the village by the flag bearer in procession.







The preparatory work and research took some time, as we wanted to incorporate the history of its predecessors into the new flag. Due to the elaborate handwork involved in the flame-patterned flag, production also took time. But we believe this time was worth it.

The flag was produced by Heimgartner Fahnen AG. It is square, measuring 200 by 200 cm (the old one was 20 cm smaller), and made of pure silk. The pole loop bears the dates 1854, 1964, and 2022. The upper ribbon clearly reads "the lively community of Zermatt" on both sides.

The old flag from 1854 already bore this inscription, with "Zermat" spelled with only one "t," and this inscription should be preserved as a contemporary witness. Our ensign, Viktor Perren Jr., checked with This Fetzer of the Idiotikon regarding the spelling and received the following answer: An officially regulated orthography of the German language has not existed for very long; the first Orthographic Conference to establish uniform rules with participants from the German Empire, Austria, and Switzerland took place in 1876 (without result), and the Duden dictionary, commonly used as the standard, was published.

Common rules for spelling were first established in 1880, and it wasn't until the 2nd Orthographic Conference in 1901 that common rules for spelling were established. Before that, writers probably oriented themselves toward an ideal or a spelling that they considered standard (for example, the 1854 flag reads "Gemeinie" (community), not the dialectal "Gmein").

However, because there were no general rules, many variations in spelling still occurred in the 19th century without being considered spelling errors (even the spelling Zermat instead of Zermatt cannot really be considered an error).

That the 1854 Zermatt flag now reads "leblich" instead of "löblich" is not surprising, since Valais is one of the regions where the "ö" is rounded to "e" and the "ü" to "i" (hence, "Hiischer" and " mege" as in most of Germanspeaking Switzerland). Since "löblich" naturally comes from "lob" (praise), the spelling with the umlaut "ö" is obvious, but the person who inscribed the flag in the 19th century based this word on the local pronunciation.

Finally, there remained the question of the possible flag godmother. We learned that a flag godmother is only customary for club flags, but not for community flags.

## Course on invasive neophytes in Zermatt





The multi-leaved lupin (Lupinus polyphyllos) attracts attention with its splendid flowers, but is a feared infestor of pastures, especially in mountainous areas, which thereby lose their value because the lupin is poisonous to livestock.



They are colorful, bloom magnificently, attract butterflies, impress with their symmetry, and adorn many of our gardens.

We're talking about neophytes. You've probably seen the plants pictured here before. Neophytes are invasive, non-native, new plants that were intentionally or inadvertently introduced to Europe after the discovery of America in 1492. Many of the plant species introduced since then (around 550 species) are unproblematic and have integrated well into the Swiss flora, or we use them as food, like potatoes, corn, or tomatoes.

However, around 45 species are spreading massively at the expense of our native flora because regulatory factors such as parasites or competing species are lacking in their new habitat. Invasive neophytes pose several threats and problems:

- · Human and animal health: allergies, asthma, burns, toxicity
- Safety: Destabilization of river banks and road embankments, damage to existing infrastructure/ buildings etc.

Public or private sector: damage to infrastructure, decline in production, etc.

- Loss of specific biological diversity (fauna and flora), disruption of the balance of native ecosystems, etc.
- Land use restrictions: impact on the cost of construction projects, loss of land value, etc.

These plants are often planted as attractive garden plants and can then establish themselves in the wild. This process is considered one of the main causes of biodiversity threats. Our gardens play a major role as pathways for invasive plants such as butterfly bush, lupine, and annual fleabane.

### Basis for the local planning revision

Following the establishment of planning zones, the preparation of the density and open space study, and the updating and supplementation of the spatial planning concept in 2019, the EWG has now prepared the draft of the local planning revision.












### Jens Grichting, what connects the wine

One of them is certainly the geographical proximity; we're both Valais destinations – it's just a stone's throw away for our guests. Furthermore, we share the same philosophy: we both strive to be "best in class" and stand for very high quality.

Of course, the restaurateurs and winemakers also

and winemakers very well. We greatly value the collaboration with Zermatt Tourism; the team is very dynamic and open to new ideas that offer guests added value and a unique experience. If Zermatt could grow vines, they would probably have very good wine of their own. But since this isn't possible, they rely on partners from the valley.

Who should attend a wine tasting and what should be taken into account?

The wine tastings in Zermatt are aimed at anyone interested in regional products, who wants to learn something about wine, or simply enjoy a good time. Finding the right wine isn't that complicated; it's all about paying attention to your own taste. Basically, what tastes good is good. Simply put, you first pay attention to the color. You hold the glass up in the air and observe the wine's color intensity. Then you smell the wine and ask yourself how it smells, swirl the glass, and smell it again. Then you taste. These are the three factors: eyes, nose, and mouth.

### How did wine culture originate in Valais – or in

Since World War II, the village has developed into a true winegrowing village, with viticulture being promoted, which is naturally also linked to the exceptional terroir. About 10,000 years ago, a rockfall occurred in Salgesch, resulting in very nutrient-rich soils, which were naturally ideal for viticulture.

Afterwards, the Grand Cru, today's hallmark of Swiss wine, originated in Salgesch. The Grand Cru was introduced because people at the time wanted to reduce volume and increase quality.

By "maximum grams per square meter" Restrictions made it possible to increase the quality of the wine.

How do Valais winemakers compare internationally? What can Valais wine do that other regions can't?

Valais certainly has a superb terroir, and its geography is also very interesting – there's no other place like it in the world. We have a very large variety of varieties, which is very special; in Valais, even very small, indigenous varieties with their own unique character can be cultivated. Furthermore, the roots in agriculture are very important; the people of Valais enjoy working hard and are therefore all the more pleased with the

very well known, which is due to the quantities we can produce here. 99 percent of Swiss wines are consumed regionally. This is a good thing, as it results in fewer deliveries and keeps the ecological footprint low.

Swiss wine is unfortunately not available abroad

We're right in line with the trend – guests increasingly want more products from here, from the region.

## Pastor Ruden – **Church lord and Tourism pioneer**

Zermatt church lord Joseph Ruden made history as a pastor, tourism pioneer and hotelier.

Joseph Ruden was born in Zermatt on September 9, 1817, the youngest child of Moritz and Katharina Ruden- Kronig. He came from an old Zermatt family. The family line has been traced back

After completing his compulsory schooling in his hometown,

Jesuit college in Sion. There he was considered an excellent student. In the seminary at Valeria he prepared for the

### **Priest in Zermatt and Naters**

On September 22, 1840, Bishop Moritz Fabian Roten ordained the young Zermatt native a priest. After his first mass in his hometown, the new priest was called to the parish of Naters for six months to serve as pastor. He served his first pastorate in Erschmatt from 1841 to 1845. In 1845,

Ruden was appointed parish priest of his home parish by Bishop Peter Joseph de Preux . He served as village priest in Zermatt for two full decades . These were the "golden years of mountaineering," culminating in 1865 with the first ascent of the Matterhorn and the tragedy that accompanied it .

On November 4, 1865, he transferred to the pastorate in Naters. At the same time, he also served as dean of Brig. In 1874, he resigned as pastor, but continued to serve as an assistant pastor for several years. In 1879, he retired to Zermatt. From 1881 to 1882, he served as parish administrator in Zermatt. His health was already severely impaired. He died on March 7, 1882, at the age of not even 65.

### Tourism pioneer and hotelier on Riffelberg

During his time as pastor of Zermatt, he witnessed the annually growing number of tourists visiting the burgeoning tourist destination. As a far-sighted man , he realized that the emerging tourism industry represented an opportunity for the local population . This economic opportunity had to be seized. As a reminder: In 1852, Josef Anton Clemenz from Visp opened the Hotel Mont Cervin. In 1853, hotel pioneer Alexander Seiler leased Josef Lauber's inn – later the Hotel Monte Rosa. He acquired the flourishing business in 1854 and expanded it.

Pastor Ruden likely anticipated the development of tourism early on. He shared the view that the community should also enter the hotel industry. However, his idea initially fell on deaf ears. So three Zermatt priests took the initiative: Joseph Ruden, Joseph Kronig, and Mathias Welschen decided to initiate the construction of a mountain hotel on the Riffelberg . It opened in 1854 and was leased to Alexander Seiler. In 1862, the builders sold the "Riffelhaus" to the community. Finally, in the 1870s, the tireless Joseph Ruden was the driving force behind the construction of the flagship hotel, the "Zermatterhof," by the community. Pastor Ruden lived to see its opening in a prime location in the village

### The Chronicler

Reverend Joseph Ruden not only made a name for himself as a parish priest and pioneer of emerging tourism . He also wrote the first chronicle of Zermatt and its history, along with family statistics. This work remains the

most important historical source about the period of feudal rule and the redemption from these foreign



### Practical and sustainable

In autumn 2023, the new valley station building is to be As well as the cable car from Zermatt to Furi , the project will be completed by the end of 2019. "During the planning, we placed great emphasis on practicality," says Markus Hasler, CEO of Zermatt Bergbahnen AG. "The entrance to the Matterhorn Express and the cable car will be at ground level and barrierfree," Hasler continues. An underground transshipment point for material transport and, with the completion of the Matterhorn Alpine Crossing, also for baggage logistics, will ease traffic congestion on Schluhmattstrasse.

The wood-clad building will also serve as the new administration building for Zermatt Bergbahnen starting in autumn 2023. New office space will be created on the floors above the ticket hall on the ground floor and the ski lockers on the first floor. The new valley station will be constructed to the Minergie-P standard.

### The next construction steps

The demolition work around the Talsta building The construction work is currently still ongoing. Work is also already underway at the Furi mountain station, and Garaventa AG will begin installing the new supports for the aerial tramway at the end of September.

### The new cabins

The ride in the cabins of the new cable car from Zermatt to Furi already promises plenty of fresh air .

Cabins with a capacity of 100 people are planned . The highlight will be the standing platform on the roof of the cabins, which will give guests an unobstructed view of the Matterhorn and plenty of fresh air during the ride. wind offers.
