



New counter opening hours

As part of a pilot phase, the counter opening hours in the community center have been adjusted since February 1, 2022.

We would like to inform you about the significant changes since October 1, 2022

New: PET collection

At the public collection points

PET bottles can also be disposed of starting October 1, 2022. These containers at public collection points are intended for private households only. Commercial and service businesses will continue to dispose of their PET collections in the designated PET bin at the Spiss

New: Commercial collection points

From 01.10.2022, public

Collection points Obere Matten, Untere Mat-ten and Wiesti three commercial collection points

There, commercial and service businesses can dispose of their paper and cardboard waste instead of the collection points in Spiss . Compared to the previous collection system (only in Spiss), commercial and service businesses now have three collection points available in the village

Trimming bushes and branches

During the summer months, the shrubs and trees grow in the garden.

Unfortunately, some branches sometimes extend into public traffic areas, which can lead to various problems.

Obscured view

Branches and bushes can obstruct the view of the public obscure public roads and paths, which may cause obstructions for pedestrians and drivers.

Snow removal

In addition, snow-covered branches and bushes protrude into public spaces due to the weight of the snow . This makes snow clearing by the technical service department very difficult in many places, and municipal vehicles cannot drive to the side of the road. In addition, vehicle bodies are often damaged by the overhanging branches and bushes, leading to unnecessary maintenance and repair work on the vehicles.



Duty of the landowner

According to Article 172 of the cantonal road law, tree branches extending onto roads must be trimmed annually by the owner to a height of 4.5 meters above the roadway. The authorities may require complete pruning of branches if it impairs road safety.

The municipality of Zermatt draws the attention of all property owners to the need to cut down or tie together all bushes and branches extending beyond their property and onto public land .

Cape law

The technical service staff reserves the right to cut down overhanging branches and bushes in the event of failure to comply, based on the Road Traffic Act and the provisions of the Civil Code.

The municipality of Zermatt thanks the population for their cooperation and understanding.



It won't be long now before the first snow falls in Zermatt again.

The technical service employees then start early in the morning with their machines and clear the streets and paths of snow.

This is a fundamental decision that the local council made some time ago. Some welcome this decision, while others long for magical, white streets. In this and the next issue of "Zermatt Inside," we would like to report in detail on the illegal clearance, along with the associated challenges, problems, and advantages.

Why illegal eviction?

In recent years, the municipal council has decided to carry out what is known as "black snow clearing" in winter, thus completely clearing all traffic areas in Zermatt of snow. Although this decision enjoys broad support and is welcomed by many, the three main motives, and especially their implementation, are not understood by everyone:

Climate change

The higher and fluctuating temperatures are also a reality in Zermatt. One day it snows, the next it rains. During the day the sun shines and the temperatures are mild, while at night the meltwater freezes again. Ice forms within a very short time. Daily maintenance work is ruined by the temperature fluctuations. For this reason alone, snow-covered roads without ice are history.

Ensuring road safety

Due to the icing caused by fluctuating temperatures and the potholes in the snow cover created by vehicles, there is an increased risk of accidents for all road users.

Need for mobility/ensuring a proper transport network

During peak season, Zermatt resembles an Alpine town, catering to between 30,000 and 40,000 guests and residents. Transportation needs are enormous, especially during the winter season. Modern people also tend to walk less, which also leads to an ever-increasing increase in traffic within the town. These two traffic drivers must be addressed with a safe and well-maintained road network. If the snow is left on the roads, the heavy traffic, fluctuating temperatures, and private salt use will create potholes in the snowpack. This hampers the flow of traffic.

Pollution on the streets

The snow falls to the ground on the cleared streets and in no time an unsightly village scene emerges – pedestrians wind their way through a layer of

Brown slush. But how does it actually form? The snow comes into contact with the salt on the road, which draws water out of it, and the watery snow mixes with dirt on the ground. But where

All that dirt? To get to the bottom of the matter, the municipality of Zermatt commissioned Fuag-Forum Umwelt AG to conduct a dust and sludge analysis in the summer of 2018. Samples of the fine material were taken from various locations in the village and subsequently analyzed. The results of this analysis were published in the January 2019 issue of "Zermatt Inside ." It was determined that the dirt originated from two main sources.

Abrasion of asphalt

Spikes on electric vehicles and bicycles constantly wear away the asphalt on the roads. On Triftbachstrasse, approximately 10 mm of wear was measured annually. Even this fine abrasion remains on the roads. Since there are hardly any construction sites in Zermatt during the winter, the dust in winter is mainly due to asphalt abrasion.

Spreading of construction site dust :

Zermatt has several unpaved roads and construction dumps. Despite clear regulations, some construction site access roads are not paved. The heavy traffic spreads dust, especially fine dust, throughout the village.

So how do you avoid the streets covered in brown mud?

The streets need to dry and be cleaned.

- · To dry the roads, the weather must cooperate. On the other hand, increased use of salt can accelerate the drying process. However, it is not the goal of the municipality of Zermatt to pursue excessive use of salt.
- Rubber scrapers are used to remove as much mud as possible from the streets. This, of course, requires more manpower.
- In cooperation with Wyssen Strassenunterhalt AG, the streets are cleaned as long as temperatures permit. The road sweeper can only be used when the outside temperature is above 5°C. An agreement exists that gives priority to the municipality of Zermatt over other Wyssen customers, allowing two road sweepers to be deployed in Zermatt within 24 hours.

Fine dust on the roads must be minimized as much as possible.

- · Black clearance eliminates the need for spikes.
- · The construction site access roads must be tarred.
- · Washing the subfloors of all construction vehicles when they leave the construction site or landfill minimizes the spread of fine dust.



Questions for Christoph Steffen, Deputy Head of Technical Services

Why doesn't the municipality of Zermatt purchase its own sweepers?

The purchase price of such a vehicle is approximately CHF 700,000. Added to this are the costs of approximately CHF 50,000 for annual external maintenance work. The purchase is therefore quite expensive, and the machines can only be used to a limited extent.

In addition, there is a lack of space to accommodate the vehicle .

Can't you leave the snow on the street in Bahnhofstrasse?

That would be nice, but unfortunately it is not feasible due to the location and the heavy traffic on Bahnhofstrasse. Bahnhofstrasse is north/south facing and therefore enjoys several hours of direct sunlight.

exposed to radiation - even in winter.

The snow begins to melt, and the meltwater refreezes as soon as the sun disappears. All the technology beneath Bahnhofstrasse also influences the layer of snow. Sewage, drinking water, and stormwater pipes, as well as power lines, internet, and telephone lines, are embedded in a large channel beneath Bahnhofstrasse. Where energy flows, heat is also released. The released energy is enough to slightly warm the street, creating a dual effect: first, the sun's radiation from above, and then the heat from underground. Within a very short time, a thick layer of ice forms, and all maintenance work is constantly undone.



And, as already mentioned, the constantly fluctuating temperatures lead to the same problems – the disaster would be even more dramatic if it rained during the winter months. The snow cover leaves rainwater with nowhere to drain, and the snow and water mixture freezes. This is what happened in January 2018.

In addition, pedestrians and electric vehicles carry salt from side streets, causing the snow to become powdery. In conclusion, traffic safety can no longer be guaranteed on a snow-covered Bahnhofstrasse.

Can you avoid using salt?

No, the use of salt is inevitable . In the December issue of "Zermatt Inside," we will report in detail on the importance of road salt in clearing illegal traffic.


The meeting zone as a plus for Zermatt

The expected benefits of this "largest meeting zone in Switzerland" include, on the one hand, a standardization of traffic regulations and thus a significant reduction in traffic signage in the town. Furthermore, improved parking regulations could enhance the town's appeal. The meeting zone regulations would lead to clearer right-of-way rules and significantly simplify signage in the long term. This could further enhance Zermatt 's attractiveness for visitors.

Important requirements such as the speed limit of 20 km/h already correspond to the currently applicable traffic regulations.

The Signalisation Ordinance describes the meeting zone in Article 22b:

- 1 The "Passenger Zone" sign (2.59.5) indicates streets in residential or commercial areas where pedestrians may use the entire traffic area. They have the right of way over motor vehicles, but must not unnecessarily obstruct them.
- 2 The maximum speed is 20 km/h.
- 3 Parking is only permitted at the

Parking is permitted only at locations marked by signals or markings.

The general parking regulations apply to bicycles.

Start of construction of the new Zermatt power supply

The Moos substation and the distribution network will be renovated and expanded in stages until summer 2024.

The medium-voltage distribution grid in Zermatt is currently supplied with electrical energy by the two substations in Spiss and Moos. The feed-in to the Moos substation comes from the 130 kV Grande Dixence line and serves only as an emergency feed-in. It is only used during maintenance work or malfunctions on the 65 kV high-voltage line between St. Niklaus and Zermatt or at the Spiss substation. Due to the constantly increasing energy demand and ever-increasing peak loads , the two substations will soon reach their capacity limits and have also reached their technical service life.

What exactly is a substation?

In our power grids, electrical energy is provided at different scales.

For example, electricity is distributed supra-regionally throughout the canton via the 65 kV high-voltage grid. Regionally, energy is distributed within the municipal area via the 20 kV medium-voltage grid, before reaching our electrical outlets via the 230 V or 400 V low-voltage grid. Substations are needed to convert the voltage between these different grids from high to medium voltage, while transformer stations convert the electricity from medium to low voltage.

Expansion in several stages

Valgrid, the operator of the supra-regional distribution grid, Grande Dixence, and Zermatt Electricity Works have jointly examined various options for renewing and strengthening the Spiss and Moos substations. The result was that both substations and their cable connections should be rebuilt to ensure long-term power supply.

must be built or expanded. The expansion will take place in several stages, with the Moos substation being rebuilt first, followed by the cable connection, and finally the Spiss substation, for which the location issue still needs to be clarified.

Security of supply through network expansion

From October 2022 to summer 2024, the company will

The Moos power plant, including the cable connection
between Spiss and Moos, will be renovated and its capacity
expanded. The connected capacity of the existing connection
to the Grande Dixence pipeline will also be increased. This
allows it to be used as an emergency feed for the entire inner
Matter Valley in the event of a malfunction, depending on the

operating status of the Grande Dixence pumping stations .

From the substation level onwards, the power grid is structured according to the N-1 principle. It must be able to withstand the failure of one element (minus one) without interrupting the power supply. This way, if one transformer fails, another takes over, and one defective line is replaced by another. The renovation of the Moos substation and the new Spiss-Moos cable connection will increase the region's supply security in the long term.

UW Moos becomes a fully-fledged Substation through the new cable connection

Spiss-Moo

In view of the upcoming expansion,

A new pipe block was built between the two substations five years ago . This leads from $\,$

From the Spiss substation to the Howette, through the tunnel onto the hiking trail, and from there over the Findelbach Bridge to the Moos substation. As part of the substation renovation, a 65 kV cable will be installed in the existing conduit block, carried out in four stages from spring to summer 2024. This cable connection will transform the new Moos substation into a fully-fledged substation, continuously feeding energy into Zermatt's medium-voltage grid.

Schnyder Ingenieure, as overall project manager, have assembled an interdisciplinary project team that will jointly implement the expansion by summer 2024. As a first step, the

The Moos substation was expanded into a fully-fledged substation with a connection to the 65 kV grid.

Due to the increased space requirements, a completely new building will be constructed, harmoniously integrated into the existing topography, approximately 200 meters from the old building in the area of the Findelbach station's freight handling area. This is an ideal location, already developed and located directly next to the existing cable systems. After the construction of a new 65 kV cable connection between the two substations, the old Moos substation will be completely dismantled and the terrain renaturalized.

The final stage will be the renovation of the Spiss substation.



Children in the car – secure them properly!

According to TCS statistics, 300 children are involved in car accidents every year, with every second child not being

If a child seat is missing in a car, the child is three times more likely to be seriously injured or killed in an accident. The Zermatt Regional Police repeatedly find that children are not properly restrained. The vehicle is then stopped and not allowed to drive until the child is properly restrained. They also consider filing a report with the Department of Road Traffic and Maritime Affairs.

For children who are less than 150 cm tall and/or younger than 12 years, a child restraint device (child seat) is mandatory in the car.

Child restraint devices (child seats)

Babies up to 1.5 years old should be transported in a baby seat for as long as possible. This should always be rear-facing and ideally installed in the back seat. If the baby seat is installed in the front passenger seat, the front airbag must be deactivated.

In child seats according to the new ECE-R129 standard, children up to 15

Months of age should be secured rearward-facing. A child seat upgrade to the next larger group should only be implemented when the baby's head extends beyond the seat.

Toddlers between 1.5 and 4 years old can be transported in a forward-facing child seat, usually with its own harness system . It is important that the child seat is securely attached to the car.

A change to the next larger category is only advisable when the child's head protrudes beyond the child seat.

For children between 4 and 12 years of age, it is best to use a child seat with

Backrest. A simple booster seat is permitted, but offers no protection in the event of a side impact.

For **children over 150 cm tall or 12 years of age, a** standard seat belt may be used in cars. The rear seats remain the safest places for children.



Transporting children by bike

Many families are out on the road with their children by bicycle.

However, such trailers, child seats, and cargo bikes have many weak points. The German Automobile Club (ADAC) subjected these means of transport to a crash test (under extreme conditions) and found that safety deficiencies were evident in all systems in a collision with a car or electric vehicle .

It is important to keep these three most important tips in mind: $\cdot \mbox{ Use a bicycle trailer (especially protects in case of a fall)}$



Guests from near AND far

Overseas guests may only account for around 20% of all hotel overnight stays, but they are of great economic and long-term importance to tourism.

This is unfortunately too often forgotten in the political debate. A brief overview.

"Sustainability" is a currently important mindset. However, with the noticeable impact of climate change, ecology is dominating.

And in the pre-election campaign, parliamentarians hope for better electoral chances with proposals aimed primarily at their own audience. The focus is on the "bad" guests from the long-distance markets and the "bad" tourism professionals who try to attract them.

In doing so, the depth of profound, multi-layered sustainability and the opportunities that lie particularly in long-distance market tourism are misunderstood.

Travel is a basic need and always involves resource consumption. If we want to prevent this, travel would have to disappear completely; long-distance travel would have to be banned.

This would primarily affect the more than 2.2 million Swiss citizens who travel overseas each year. However, we could not prohibit the 3.1 million long-distance market visitors from traveling.

They would continue to come to Europe and (perhaps)

skip Switzerland. Or travel through it only by bus

with short stops at tourist hotspots. We would no longer have any control or creative options. We would completely relinquish control.

Through our presence in long-distance markets and collaboration with local tour operators, we can strengthen our focus on individual travel, promote sustainable travel, and ensure that guests from overseas visit Switzerland when and where it is best for them and us. Our sustainable marketing is based on four pillars:

The "Swisstainable" sustainability movement, with its mandatory threestage program and sustainable travel offerings, is also being implemented. Comprehensive and evenly distributed tourism thanks to visitor management, and year-round tourism is being ensured (longdistance market guests also travel during the off-season, during the week, and in rainy weather).

The increase in the length of stay, which is particularly contributed to by long-distance market guests who stay a few extra nights in Switzerland after the long journey. They also travel more frequently and sustainably using public transport.

"Finger-pointing" at overseas visitors is therefore shortsighted, little more than sensationalism. Consistently sustainable tourism marketing demands more than a trivial bar Because modern marketing goes much deeper than banal

Frequency boost. Demand management goes hand in hand with demand stimulation. We know the tourism industry and service providers are behind us. Together, we'll put this conviction into action. Let's talk about it, share our experiences, and learn from each other. So that long-distance guests can continue to benefit sustainable Swiss tourism.

Matterhorn Gotthard Railway

Railway line in the Mattertal will be banned for four weeks

Every year in autumn, the MGBahn railway line in the Mattertal is closed for several

weeks.

But why?
"Zermatt Inside" spoke to Egon
Gsponer, Head of Infrastructure
and Deputy
Manager talked about the
background.



Zermatt Inside: The MGBahn line in the Matter Valley will soon be closed again

for several weeks for construction work. Is this necessary?

Egon Gsponer: The line closures affect not only the Matter Valley, but also other sections of the MGBahn. This year, for example, the line between Fiesch and Oberwald in Goms.

As a mountain railway, we have a very demanding and maintenance- intensive route network. Furthermore, all stations must be converted to be barrier-free in accordance with the Disability Equality Act. We spend around CHF 100 million annually on this. For many of the necessary works, a temporary line closure makes absolute sense, even if it has its disadvantages.

ZI: Why?

EG: There are several reasons for this. The closures allow the work on the tracks and stations to be completed in one go.

Construction companies can work continuously for several weeks in multi-shift operations, seamlessly continuing the previous day's activities and thus achieving higher quality work. This is partly due to the much better lighting conditions during the day. Furthermore, the necessary construction machinery and materials do not have to be transported to the construction site repeatedly. All of this makes construction work and site logistics more efficient and cost-effective.

ZI: Okay, from the MGBahn's point of view, that's understandable. But for travelers to and from Zermatt, bus journeys are a rail replacement.
certainly less comfortable, and residents near the construction sites are exposed to

EG: We are aware of the inconvenience for both the travelers

We are very aware of this for both the benefit of both the affected residents and the affected residents. Nevertheless, we believe it is the best option of all.

noise and dust emissions for several weeks

ZI: You have to explain that to us.

EG: If we didn't close the line and didn't complete the work in one go, the reconstruction would have to be carried out in small sections over several months of the year. For safety reasons, this would require the establishment of speed restrictions at the construction sites throughout the entire period. This would lead to delays and dissatisfaction among passengers, because, for example, connecting services in Visp could no longer be maintained.

ZI: And what about the residents?

EG: Since normal rail operations would prevail during the day, work would be possible almost exclusively at night. As a result, there would be some quite intense noise emissions during the night for several months. I don't think anyone really wants that. Out of consideration for local residents, we are conducting noise-intensive activities during the daytime whenever possible during the line closure.

ZI: And why does the closure always occur from mid-October to mid- November?


EG: There's a reason for that, too. Experience shows that during these weeks, due to the shoulder season, fewer guests are traveling than usual, and the Glacier Express is paused during this time.

ZI: Finally – what and where are the biggest construction sites in the Mattertal this year?

EG: The largest projects are road renewals in the municipality of St. Niklaus at the Blattbach Tunnel between Schwiedernen and Mattsand, and between Mattsand and Herbriggen. In addition, the cantonal road underpass in Visp towards Stalden will be comprehensively repaired on the closed section.

The new 2023 edition offers truly magical moments.



The cozy Ferdi-Stube. Those who wish can end the evening there in peace and quiet with musical accompaniment.





History of Zermatt

Gregor Brantschen – Pastor, poet and composer

Gregor Brantschen was born on February 12, 1894, the son of Daniel and Agnes, née Zumtaugwald, in Randa and grew up in the hamlet of "Wildi." The Brantschen family was one of the oldest and largest families in Zermatt. One branch moved to Täsch at the beginning of the 17th century and later to Randa.

Visp deanery. This position evidently left a lasting impression on the people of Zermatt. From then until his death, he was in

Priest. He subordinated everything to this life's calling,

including music. From 1957 to 1968, he was also Dean of the

Zermatt simply "the dean".

Composer and poet

His musical talent was recognized by Dean Brantschen His grandfather Thomas and his father Daniel were organists in Randa. His father, Daniel in particular, served the parish as organist at the age of eight

As a composer, he created both ecclesiastical and secular chants, as well as many instrumental pieces. His ecclesiastical works for various festivals include numerous

masses. The choirs of Blatten and

Zermatt still sings many of his hymns today. An Easter celebration without "Christ is risen" would be

unthinkable for both communities. But Gregor Brantschen was a modest priest. On his 25th anniversary

For his priestly jubilee, he composed a mass under the pseudonym "Pastor" as a composer.

For the Lord and the street sweeper

Conducting the choir with a cigar

In 1935, he founded the Trachtenchor from members of the church choir . Since Gregor Brantschen was fond of a good cigar Pastor Gregor Brantschen on a birthday.

He was not averse to this, and it is said that he occasionally conducted this choir with a cigar in his hand. He wrote his works for high and low, for God and the street sweeper.

He experienced a high point in his artistic career on November 3, 1957, with the award of the Upper Valais Cultural Prize. Gregor Brantschen will remain unforgettable far beyond Zermatt as a zealous pastor and outstanding composer .

From 1908 to 1915, the young Gregor attended the college in Brig and studied theology at the seminary in Sion. He was ordained a priest on August 3, 1919. As a young priest, he served as a pastor in Blatten in the Lötschental Valley.

In 1928, the bishop appointed him pastor of Zermatt . He held this difficult office for 29

years until 1957. From then on he was chaplain there before retiring in 1975. However, he continued

in the Matterhorn village. As long as his health permitted, he took on the role of temporary assistant. On June 6, 1987, Gregor Brantschen died at the advanced age of 93 in Zermatt,

where he was laid to rest.

Priest and Dean

Gregor Brantschen was a highly esteemed and affable priest who also possessed a healthy sense of humor. When the Zermatt community awarded him the honorary citizenship, he said in his acceptance speech, somewhat mischievously, that the community had now given him something he had always been: a Zermatter!
