From April 8 to 12, 2025, Zermatt will once again become an international music stage. Over 130 shows from around 70 national and international Acts await visitors. Music lovers from all over the world travel to Zermatt to experience one of the largest acoustic festivals. But the festival not only offers a unique experience for international guests – as always, the festival is also intended to be the final highlight of a successful winter season for the local community.

A festival with national and international appeal

Since its inception, Zermatt Unplugged has established itself as the most important festival for acoustic music in Europe. With a new brand identity and a comprehensive national and international media campaign, the festival and the 2025 program have been marketed since December. In addition to traditional media channels (online and offline), exciting (media)

Partnerships are being used. For example, the festival is also being communicated nationally and internationally through a presence on SWISS aircraft.

This exclusive setting will once again be faithfully recreated at the Mont Cervin Palace and offers visitors the opportunity to experience the unmistakable jazz sound of Ronnie Scott's All Stars. On five evenings, the musicians will perform the Early Show, while the Soul Family will bring their "Soho Jazz Club vibes" to the Late Show. Admission is available with the Unplugged Pass (subject to capacity).

Taste Village – The festival heart of the village

The Taste Village and the Foyer Tent are the vibrant heart of the festival. Access to the festival grounds is free for Zermatt residents with a Blue Card.

The Taste Village offers not only numerous bars and food stalls from local vendors, but also the two restaurant chalets of CERVO and the Hoteliers Association, offering delicious food. Here, visitors can enjoy a relaxed atmosphere.



Enjoy Zermatt specialties and get in the mood for the concerts or while away the evening. The foyer tent also offers a wide selection of food and drinks, including the Lucerne Hotel Management School's Wine & Food Lounge. In the evenings, live concerts provide additional entertainment and a harmonious festival

The younger festivalgoers are also well catered for: The Kids Village awaits with a varied program, organized in collaboration with the Mattertal Youth Office, among others. Instructions for the population

In the last issue of "Zermatt Inside," the series of articles on natural phenomena began with "avalanches" and presented the corresponding behavioral instructions.

This article will deal with the natural event "earthquake" and a power outage lasting several days and will present the corresponding cantonal instructions for action.

Dealing with a natural event, whether recurring or rare, requires personal preparation. Those who are prepared react more calmly and prudently to the situation.

Therefore, the municipal leadership team has decided to present natural events and the corresponding behavioral instructions. This article addresses behavior in the event of an earthquake, as well as a power outage (blackout) lasting several days.



Earthquake and blackout

Earthquakes are events that occur in Switzerland and are often only marginally noticed because they are usually weak and short. However, Valais has the highest seismic hazard in Switzerland. The Rhône Valley, for example, is located in zone Z3b, where tremors with an intensity of 8 to 9 are possible and can cause severe damage. An earthquake near Sion with a magnitude of 6 on the Richter scale could cause damage amounting to 4.5 to 10 billion Swiss francs.

In the western and eastern regions of Valais, earthquakes with an intensity of 7 to 8 can occur, causing moderate to severe damage.

The Visp valleys, including the Matter Valley, are located in a zone with a high risk of earthquakes. A severe earthquake can also lead to a blackout lasting several days.

Therefore, the guidelines for earthquakes and blackouts are presented. These can be found on the website of the Cantonal Office for Civil Security and Military.

Power outage – when the lights go out (blackout)

A blackout lasting several days would have serious consequences for the population and the economy, as it would amount to a widespread shutdown. This would affect, among other things, filter systems/ pumping stations for drinking water and wastewater, businesses, transactions, lighting, heating, signaling, public and private transport, information media, communications, and telecommunications.

Not to mention access to the healthcare system and maintaining public



Emergency meeting poin

In the event of an event such as a prolonged power outage or a power shortage, the usual information channels such as mobile phones, radio and television may only be available to the population to a limited extent or may no longer be available at all.

The authorities must provide the population with alternative information options for these and other cases. This need was one reason why the cantons, in cooperation with the Federal Office for Civil Protection (FOCP), designed the emergency meeting points as a new and flexible tool for civil protection.

In the event of an incident, the emergency meeting points are activated by the authorities and the public is informed. The emergency meeting points serve as the public's first point of contact in the event of major incidents, disasters, and emergencies. At the emergency meeting points, the public receives information about the current situation and can make emergency calls if the usual means of communication are no longer functioning.





Flood protection Lüegelbach

In June 2024, the Lüegelbach stream overflowed its banks again and flooded the cantonal road in Spiss near the village entrance. Several hundred cubic meters of material were deposited on the road. Fortunately, there were no injuries.





However, in comparison to the event on October 15, 2000, the Vispa River did not back up this time, thus preventing major consequential damage.

Protective measures Lüegelbach

Planning for the protection measures for the Lüegelbach stream began over 25 years ago. Unfortunately, the project suffered several setbacks over time and had to be revised accordingly.

For the upcoming publication, a total of more than More than 12 variants were examined and evaluated. Last fall, the best possible solution was identified, which now serves as the basis for


The main objective of these protective measures is to prevent flooding in residential and commercial areas of Zermatt, which could be caused by a backflow of the Mattervispa River as a result of debris flow events from the Lüegelbach.

The current project was carried out in close cooperation with the cantonal and federal authorities and continuously optimized. This plan envisages reconstructing the Lüegelbach stream below the rock face, heading downstream. The approximately 25-meter-wide main channel will channel debris flows of up to 25,000 m3 into the Vispa River. Due to the enormous forces of the debris flows, some embankments must be protected/reinforced with concrete blocks.


The normal flow from the Lüegelbach is channeled into the Vispa River via a low-water channel designed as naturally as possible. The natural design of the low-water channel will eliminate deficiencies in the existing Lüegelbach, such as concrete walls, concrete sills, crossings, and catchments .

The construction of an avalanche control dam along the Lüegelbach stream, now part of threcipality of Zermatt, was abandoned due to its very limited protective effect, in contrast to the massive impact on the landscape and the existing, valuable flora and fauna.

Two galleries are planned to protect the cantonal road from avalanches and debris flows in the Schusslaui - Lüegelti section. These will be planned and implemented in a separate project. The measures in the Lüegelbach stream are compatible with the two gallery projects, and the planning is being coordinated

Nature and Landscape The

planned measures affect a site listed in the Federal Inventory of Dry Meadows and Pastures of National Importance (TWW). Through optimization measures (steeper slopes, local narrowing, etc.) and the removal of the avalanche control dam, the area affected by the planned measures could be reduced from a total of 2.33 hectares to 1.52 hectares. Of this, 1.22 hectares (instead of 1.44 hectares) are located in the dry meadows and pastures. within the Federal Inventory

As part of the project, the existing habitats and natural values were examined and mapped. The Lüegelti area is of great importance for protected, endangered, or priority plant and animal species. It therefore fulfills a balancing function in the natural environment and plays a key role in the networking of biotopes worthy of protection.

For planting after completion of the construction work, the existing vegetation sods/ Turf tiles are temporarily stored and reused. Seed from nearby locations in and around Zermatt is also used for the

In addition to the measures within the project perimeter, compensation measures are also planned in the surrounding area. These consist of restoring overgrown dry meadows and pastures by clearing them of bushes and restoring their long-term value through adapted management. In addition, a GIS-based management tool will be developed that will serve as a basis and tool for ensuring the future quality of the dry water meadows in Zermatt.

During the construction phase, the work will be intensively supported by environmental construction monitoring to minimize the impact on the surrounding dry meadows and pastures.

Hazard map after measures

The hazard map by measures shows the impact of the project on the hazard situation. Compared to the current hazard situation, the risk posed by debris flow deposits in the Spiss area due to the backflow of the Mattervis-pa can be significantly reduced. After the measures have been implemented, a residual risk remains for the Spiss area. Currently, this area faces a medium to significant risk. Flooding on the right and left banks of the residential area up to the Wiesti Bridge can be prevented. The significant risk (red zone) is limited to the debris flow channel area after the measures have been implemented.

Storms of June 2024 – Hiking trail Zermatt – Âlterhöüd – Trift severely affected

The severe weather in June 2024 brought persistent heavy rainfall in the southern parts of Valais due to persistent southerly

Zermatt was particularly affected, where the Triftbach stream overflowed its banks on 21 June 2024 and caused considerable damage to Buildings and infrastructure behind and made the Zermatt - Trift hiking trail impassable.

In addition to the damage in Zermatt,

The storm severely damaged the Zermatt – Âlterhöüd - Trift hiking trail and the associated access to the popular mountain inns . From Zermatt, the trail leads across meadows dominated by mountain agriculture and climbs in several switchbacks through the mountain forest to the Edelweiss mountain inn. The trail then follows the Trift stream, crosses it at the Stelli Bridge, and then reaches the Trift mountain inn.

Events of June 21, 2024

Below the restaurant Edelweiss came

During the heavy rainfall on June 21, 2024, a severe landslide occurred that completely destroyed the hiking trail for about 200 meters. The landslide extends from the Triftbach stream in the north to the exposed rock ledges in the south and

leaving behind a gully characterized by erosion and rockfall. The mountain forest in this area was completely destroyed.

Between the Hotel Edelweiss and the Trift mountain restaurant, the hiking trail was washed away in

several places by the Trift stream, partly down to the

The Stelli Bridge was completely submerged during the event , leading to erosion of the supports and the side connecting walls . The bridge was only just about to be washed away. Unfortunately, the damage caused by the storms made several passages


The roads were so impassable that no temporary solutions could be built. The inns were no longer accessible directly. Major detours had to be taken



Hiking trails were inspected and measures for restoring the affected sections were developed. Initial measures in the area of the Stelli Bridge and shortly before the Trift mountain inn were thus implemented before the onset of winter

After the snow melts in spring 2025, a metal staircase will be built below the Edelweiss mountain inn to overcome the rocky slope and bypass the landslide to the south. The staircase will bridge a steep drop of approximately 20 meters. In addition, the damaged Stelli Bridge will be dismantled and replaced with a new one. The remaining measures will be completed as quickly as possible after the snow melts so that the hiking trails are fully accessible again in time for the summer





Partial revision of the "train station area"



Creating affordable housing for locals.

As early as December 2024, the public was informed about the planned rezoning of the station roof.

Zermatt's tourism development has led to a sharp increase in demand for housing. In addition, due to the Second Home Act, apartments under the old law are increasingly being used as second homes. Locals and seasonal workers, who have little access to affordable housing, are particularly affected. The municipality of Zermatt therefore sees an urgent need for action.

To help solve this problem, BVZ Holding AG plans to make the MGBahn station roof usable for primary residences . The existing station area offers ideal conditions for high-density development in a central location. According to BVZ Asset Management AG, 76 apartments are already being rented near the station and in the Gornerhaus, more than 80% of which are used as primary residences.

Rents are considered moderate, and subletting is contractually prohibited. The new development will be exclusively primary residences.

Contents of the partial revision

The planned partial revision proposes a rezoning from the zone for tourist buildings and facilities to a core zone (Zone KC) to allow for the construction of primary residences on the roof of the MGBahn station. This rezoning will not create a new building zone, as the site is already

is allocated to an existing building zone for tourism use. This is a change of use within an existing building zone. The Department for Spatial Development

This was confirmed during the preliminary examination.

The construction will create 70 primary residences, which must fit into the surrounding development structure Within the new zone, the development regulations of the core zone apply. A high level of urban planning and architectural Quality is ensured by the provisions of the building and zoning regulations (including materials, roof pitch, etc.).

About the procedure

Public participation pursuant to Article 33 of the Federal Planning Act (KRPG) has already been conducted. Public publication in the Official Gazette took place on November 15, 2024. The public had the opportunity to review the preliminary draft and submit written suggestions. During the public consultation, the municipality was informed of two concerns regarding the impact on the overall revision, as well as a request to regulate bicycle parking.

The dossier was also submitted to the canton in autumn 2024 for The preliminary examination was submitted. The latter expressed a positive opinion on the partial revision. In summary, it was concluded that the requirements for a partial revision were met.

It was determined that the rezoning does not require multiple compensation for building land, as it is a rezoning of building land and not a new zoning. Thus, the planned partial revision will not penalize other landowners by establishing additional reserve zones.

Feedback from the public and the canton's preliminary opinion were taken into account, and the dossier was adjusted accordingly. Among other things, the noise situation was analyzed and the requirements for protection against natural hazards were clarified.

Public consultation began with publication in the Official Gazette on Friday, March 14, 2025. The documents have been available for public inspection since then. The public was also informed about the partial revision at an information event on March 26, 2025. Specific questions were clarified during consultation hours on March 27, 2025.


The public review period lasts a total of 30 days. The documents can be viewed at the Building Department during regular business hours or online on the municipality's website until Monday, April 14, 2025.

After the public consultation, the population will finally be able to vote on the partial revision.

Stone by stone – start of the renovation work



The renovation of the historic traffic route, including the heart of the route between Blatten and Zum See, will begin in summer 2025.

The hiking trail, which leads from Furi via Schwarzsee and Trockener Steg to the pass, is listed in the inventory of historic transport routes in Switzerland as a site of national importance. The structure, which has been affected by gradual decay over the years particularly the paving and dry-stone walls—must be restored with appropriate expertise, craftsmanship, and care.

Renovation work to preserve cultural assets

This summer, the municipality's technical services department, together with experienced dry-stone masons, will begin the first phase of the renovation. In addition to minor repairs in the Furi – Zum See section, the slope-side retaining walls between Zum See and Blatten will be cleared of bushes, largely dismantled, and professionally renovated.

Cultural landscape significance

A dry stone wall is always an important witness to past and present farming, culture, and human labor. Furthermore, with its countless niches, it is a valuable habitat for animals and plants. Therefore, the restoration not only restores the structure itself but also enhances the cultural landscape in its immediate surroundings.

On April 25, 2025, at 7:30 p.m., the Alts-Zermatt Association invites you to a presentation at the "Im Hof" school building. The project manager responsible for the upcoming renovation work (Adrian Kräuchi, Landplan VS AG) will speak about the inventory of historic transport routes, completed and ongoing projects in the Canton of Valais, and in particular, the history of the Theodul Pass, the renovation work, and the associated challenges of the current project.

The dry stone wall has numerous bulges and loose stones and has therefore lost stability, but also ecological and

Zermatt Waste Disposal – Recycling rate above the Swiss average




Zermatt Entsorgung looks back on a successful year in 2024. A total of 8,320 tons of waste and recyclables were collected an increase of over 4% compared to the previous year (7,987 tons). Particularly pleasing is the recycling rate of 60.43%, which is significantly above the Swiss average.

PET collection

The PET collection in Zermatt is having a great impact. In addition to the commercial collection point in Spiss, private households can also dispose of their PET beverage bottles at the public waste collection point disposal sites in specially provided containers

This measure paid off: Over 74 tons of PET were collected in Zermatt last year – equivalent to more than 2.6 million beverage bottles. For this impressive achievement, the municipality of Zermatt was awarded an environmental certificate by PET Recycling Switzerland.

In addition to plastic, PET bottles and cutlery, glass, cardboard and other fractions are also disposed of in it.

Despite various measures (communication, posters, stickers, additional operating containers, hand dispensers), the situation has hardly improved.

For this reason, it is even being considered to abolish the collection of kitchen waste at public collection points.

School social work in the inner Mattertal focuses on preventive Media education

School social work in the inner Matter Valley supports children and young people in learning how to use digital media consciously and responsibly.

> In our increasingly digitalized society, it is important that young people can use media competently. The school region and the school social work department of the inner Mattertal are actively committed to this.

to promote these skills and to teach students the skills to use digital media in a reflective and responsible manner

Today, children and young people are growing up in a world where digital media plays a central role – whether through social networks, online games, or online school assignments. To best prepare them for the challenges of this digital world, school social work focuses specifically on media education.

A prevention project has already been successfully introduced and implemented in recent years The goal is not only to teach students how to use digital media, but also to specifically strengthen media literacy. This includes critically examining information and images, conscious use of social networks, knowledge of digital rights respectful behavior in virtual spaces, and promoting creative ways of using the internet.

Through age-appropriate, practical, and playful project sessions, students in grades 3H to 11OS are familiarized with key topics in the spring and thus actively involved in the discussion. We place particular emphasis on the reflective, yet child-friendly use of digital media. To support balanced leisure activities with and without digital media, the youth work center of the Inner Matter Valley is also involved in the upper grades



In addition to school support, parental involvement is also a central component of media education.

Parents play a crucial role in teaching their children how to use media consciously and responsibly.

They accompany their children through the digital world, help them recognize risks and opportunities, and can reflect on digital experiences together. By actively engaging with their children's media, combining education and entertainment, and exploring digital worlds together, parents not only

strengthen media literacy, but also





To the glory of our Creator – The Sisters of Mary

The days are getting longer, the mountain slopes are turning green—and we look forward to hikes with magnificent views and spring flowers. Marmots peek out cautiously, and birds sing their praises to their Creator with a variety of melodies. Those who are privileged to live in wonderful mountain scenery can marvel all the more often.

Do we remember to express our thanks to the One who planned all this with hymns and prayers? He awaits and rejoices when we turn to Him personally and praise Him with all our hearts.

In many places in Switzerland – not least in the

Zermatt area – you will find small, inconspicuous
Sign: With a Bible verse or a song verse
is reminded of the Creator. On a hike, one climbs laboriously

up many bends – the path continually reveals new vistas – and unexpectedly one finds oneself before a praise tablet.

Around 30 praise panels in Zermatt

There are around 30 praise panels in and around Zermatt , for example, on the Gornergrat route or on the Klein Matterhorn. Those who don't go up there often need only follow the Zmuttweg trail to spot one (it's best to keep looking back toward the village so you don't miss it). Further on, on Bodmen, there's another one – and those taking the return route via the Gorner Gorge will discover two more, one of them in English. Or at the Arben bivouac , where experienced mountaineers can read: "The works of the Lord are great, a wonder to all who delight in them" (Psalm 111:2).

Still accessible to us, and a favorite spot, is the cross on Hohliecht. Seven years ago, a new praise plaque was erected here – prompted by a chance encounter with Viktor Perren Jr. while we were out tending the plaques the previous year. We love to hike the magnificent ridge trail further toward Trift.



Where do these praise tablets come from?

The idea originated with Mother Basilea Schlink, founder of the Evangelical Sisterhood of Mary with its motherhouse in Darmstadt, Germany. The Swiss branch is located on the Hemberg in the canton of St. Gallen. (www.kanaan.org).

Such panels can be found in other parts of the world, from the Grand Canyon to Kilimanjaro, and from the Norwegian fjords to the English cliffs. But it was the unique Swiss landscape that inspired them. The primary concern remains the glorification of God, for what artist is not recognized when considering their work?

Wherever the Creator is praised, blessings are unfailing for people: lives have even been saved when desperate people came across a sign at the right moment and suddenly realized: God sees me, God loves me – he has a way out for me too.

Back then, Mother Basilea could hardly have imagined how climate change would be on everyone's lips today.

Nevertheless, she wrote as early as 1960:

Oh father, let your world last a little longer and the beauty of your creation will not perish. Instead of destroying, we want to praise.

Yes, Father, that Your creation is not soon destroyed, grant that a crowd of praise may now honor You and praise endures destruction.

We ask, let countless be ignited, who all dedicate their lives to you, to glorify Your name.

Let's use the summer months for this.

It's been 18 months since I wrote about artificial intelligence (AI) here and had the computer generate an image of me and the Matterhorn. Admittedly, it didn't bear much resemblance back then, neither to me nor to the Matterhorn. That was a year and a half ago-given the rapid development in the field of AI, that's the equivalent of half a century. Don't worry, I won't create a new image today, although... No! Today I want to draw attention to the diverse opportunities that Al offers us.

And yes, it's about increasing efficiency, it's about fun, but not only that. Let's stick with efficiency for now. Have you

Already have a subscription to an LLM (Large Language Model)? If not, get one now: The basic version is free from most providers like ChatGPT, Copilot, Perplexity, or DeepSeek . It allows you to use

Generating images or composing songs, support with writing, with knowledge transfer (note: LLMs are not always 100% accurate, so use your brain) and gives tips for all situations in life, be it private or at work.

That's a good start. But how can I use AI even better for myself? Well, Al is essentially nothing other than the ability of machines to replicate human intelligence based on mathematical formulas. This means that Al systems are capable of learning from experience, recognizing patterns, and responding flexibly to new situations. But to do this, these systems need data—lots of data!

Examples of AI use in tourism include analyzing hotel booking data to develop targeted marketing campaigns and better understand guest

Or optimizing operating hours and guest flows at the mountain railways. Or operating a 24/7 chatbot that responds to individual guest needs.

The more data we have, the better we can utilize artificial intelligence And this holds immense potential: from self-driving taxis and buses to dynamic pricing and sustainable management of our destination's energy and water consumption.

The future belongs to those who are willing to explore and utilize the possibilities of artificial intelligence. Let us seize the opportunities together, develop innovative business models, and transform our

lead a sustainable and successful future. Be open, curious, and courageous - the journey has only just begun.

What has happened so far...

and may not be financed using these funds.

Once upon a time... a handful of people from the inner Mattertal with a vision:

to connect the living space of Zermatt with that of Täsch and Randa and to create a shared, unique experience space for residents and visitors alike. What began with a few highly motivated minds around a table quickly gained momentum, became a task force, and ultimately culminated in the founding of an association for this purpose in August 2023: the association "360 Degrees Outdoor - Living and Experience Space Inner Matter Valley" with

Representatives from the three communities as well as various outdoor service providers, the driving force from the beginning.

Since the founding of the association – which has since become the "Initiative Mattertal.Aktiv" and is chaired by Dario Perren – various workshops have been held with the goal of engaging with the respective interest groups and identifying the needs of the people of the inner Matter Valley. These meetings have resulted in individual projects that were deemed particularly valuable, and the office, headed by Nicole Diermeier, is now responsible for pursuing them. The focus is primarily on assessing feasibility, developing project-specific business cases, and addressing all planning aspects – this is the mandate of SECO and the Innotour funding concept, which support and finance the initiative together with the RWO (Upper Valais Development Fund). The implementation of the individual projects, in turn, must take place outside of this framework

However, since the ambition extends beyond planning experiences for the region, individual projects have already been implemented, such as the gentle redesign of the left bank of the Schalisee, which was enhanced last June with new barbecue areas, seating, hammocks, and sun sails and is a popular and popular local recreation area. The wooden Nature Ninja Warrior course, designed by Samuel Anthamatten, was also well received by young and old at the cantonal mountain guide festival in mid-June 2024. In keeping with the sustainable development of the adventure area, it will be permanently installed at a new location, thus becoming part of an overall concept of outdoor activities in the Täsch-Randa corridor.

What's going on?

Next steps include bringing The Edge (a virtual climbing experience on the Matterhorn with mountain guide Samuel Anthamatten and Red Bull athlete Jeremy Heitz) back home from the Lucerne Museum of Transport, thus creating an attractive indoor experience and a rainy-weather option. An exciting hybrid golf experience for everyone, a ropes course, and various nature experiences around the forest festival grounds in Randa are also being explored. These could serve as a link between the two communities, creating a cross-activity mobility concept that connects the entire inner Matter Valley. This will open up a world of nature experiences, in the spirit of holistic and gentle development that takes the needs of residents into account and thus brings added value to the region.

The new campsite in Täsch also offers a wide range of options, both in terms of different types of accommodation and gastronomy, but also in terms of leisure activities with various activities for which the campsite could serve as a kind of base camp.

Where do we want to go?

The development of an overall master plan aims to connect the inner Matter Valley region through existing and emerging offerings. The goal is to generate sustainable added value for locals beyond the tourism mandate and create year-round job opportunities. The planning will give rise to new business models, which in turn will create jobs and thus help shape the future of the inner Matter Valley.

Gornergrat Railway

Gornergrat Bahn provides the bike transport

The Gornergrat stands for unique experiences in nature. To further strengthen this position, the Gornergrat is committed to a nature-oriented hiking and excursion destination starting in summer 2025 and will discontinue bike transport.

This step contributes to the sustainable development of the Gornergrat and reduces conflicts between bikers and hikers. It also improves the guest experience by providing more seating. This decision is in line with the company's strategy and strengthens the positioning of the Gornergrat as a nature-oriented destination . The GGB already took initial steps to regulate bike transport in 2020. At that time, transport was limited to the early morning and late evening hours to minimize conflicts between bikers and hikers . Analysis of recent years has shown that demand for bike transport remained low, while the bike transport facilities noticeably limited transport capacity for all other guests. Especially in the morning, the trains are often at capacity, leaving many guests unable to find a seat.

On the other hand, the facilities designed to transport up to twelve bikes were occupied by only six to seven bikes at most, even during peak months and times. On average, only one to two bikes were transported per trip on the routes where bike transport was possible.

By discontinuing bike transport, approximately 50 additional seats can be made available per hour. This is a clear advantage for the vast majority of travelers who want to experience the Gornergrat as a hiking and nature paradise.

In addition, this will defuse the existing potential for conflict on the mountain.

Zermatt remains a biker destination

For bike fans, the Zermatt – Matterhorn destination offers a variety of trails and Routes that can be reached by other means of transport and on which the mountain world can be experienced and explored by bike. The bike routes on the Gornergrat between Zermatt and Riffelberg are also still accessible, but are no longer accessible by the Gornergrat Railway. These routes can still be explored independently.









Maintenance work in the Glacier Palace the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise



For more than 20 years, the Glacier Palace has been one of the The most fascinating attractions of the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise. Approximately 15 meters below the surface of the eternal ice stretches an impressive world of shimmering ice sculptures, glittering crystals, and mysterious crevasses. Existing ice sculptures are continually being restored, and new ones are created by ice artists. With great dedication and craftsmanship, unique ice creations are continually created, amaze-ing guests from all over the world.

Due to the constant movement of the glacier, the entrance area has changed over the years, necessitating adjustments. To facilitate access and counteract the increasing gradient, the entrance is currently being leveled and, for the first time, equipped with a staircase and a corresponding stairlift. This ensures barrier-free access and makes access more comfortable and safer for all guests.

Despite the temporary restrictions caused by the construction work, Europe's highest destination – the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise – remains open to visitors. The viewing platform, the Cinema Lounge, and the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise Restaurant remain open. It also serves as the highest starting point for a unique skiing experience.

Intensive work is currently underway in the entrance area of the popular Glacier Palace at the Matterhorn

Glacier Paradise. The maintenance work, which is expected to last until the end of April, is intended to make visits even more comfortable and safe for guests. The focus is on improving the entrance area.






History of Zermatt

The first skiers appeared on the Theodul Pass in 1902. As early as 1923, it was decided to hold an annual international summer ski race there. The races alternated between Switzerland and Italy.

There was even a ski jumping competition on the Theodulhorn. The Valtournenchers participated in several ski races in Zermatt in the following years. This developed into

A truly friendly relationship. The winter sports resort of Breuil-Cervinia didn't even exist back then; there was only an alpine pasture.

Oldest ski ar

Switzerland's most famous summer ski resort on Plateau Rosa is also the oldest in the country. The spectacular view of the Matterhorn above Zermatt was like a ma-

As early as the 1950s, the first skiers left their tracks in the snow, even during the summer months.

But it wasn't Zermatt guests who were enjoying the fun of summer snow gliding, but rather skiers from Breuil-Cervinia in Italy. At that time, the Zermatt ski area only extended as far as the current station at Schwarzsee. Access to the Theodul Glacier from Zermatt did not yet exist. However, the area was already accessible from the Italian side by the end of the 1930s via the cable car to Testa Grigia. Thus, from the 1950s onwards, the area of the Plateau Rosa, located on Swiss soil, was used by the Italians.

Operators were equipped with several glacier lifts. No fewer than six lifts were in operation three decades later.

In Zermatt hands since 1979

In the mid-1960s, the Theodul Glacier was accessed from Zermatt via the Trockener Steg. Switzerland's longest glacier drag lift was built at the Furggsattel, followed by a continuous lift chain all the way to Testa Grigia in the early 1970s. However, it wasn't until the opening of the cable car to the Klein Matterhorn in December 1979 that Zermatt took over the entire Theodul ski area. This was a bitter blow for the Italian company Cervio SA, which had operated the facilities until then. Even the Turin press reported on it. The following summer, all remaining Italian platter lifts were replaced with more modern and efficient systems, and the ski area was expanded to the 3,899-meter-high Gobba di Rollin. To this day, this remains the highest point in the Alps accessible by cable car.

Redesign of the adventure playground at Leisee

Starting this summer, the adventure playground in the family-friendly adventure park on Sunnegga near Leisee will shine in new splendor.

The newly designed facility reflects Zermatt's fascinating flora and fauna and brings visitors closer to the impressive mountain world surrounding the idyllic Leisee. With a well-thought-out concept that combines play, exercise, and a connection to nature, the playground blends harmoniously into the family-friendly ambiance of the Leisee.

The playground was designed in close collaboration with one of Switzerland's leading playground manufacturers with the goal of creating a diverse, visually appealing, and sustainable play area. It combines adventure, nature experiences, and relaxation, offering locals and guests, young and old, a perfect environment for playing, exploring, and socializing. Each piece of playground equipment meets the safety standards for children's playgrounds and is unique, made from durable materials that guarantee years of fun. The wooden playground equipment was developed and produced in Switzerland – predominantly from local materials. Particular attention was paid to short transport routes and close collaboration with regional partners to ensure resource-efficient construction. This sustainable approach is in line with the strategic goals of Zermatt Bergbahnen and reflects the three pillars of sustainability: economic, ecological, and social.

The entrance area itself invites children to jump and romp around with four trampolines integrated into the lawn.

The Viking swing allows for a shared swinging experience and ensures a special level of fun. The highlight of the new facility are the two volcano towers that form the center of the new playground. The smaller tower symbolizes the world of mountain railways with a "funicular" as a climbing route. From there, a balancing course connects the entire facility in a playful way. A jungle rope bridge also leads to the larger volcano tower, where children can climb up through space nets and then whizz down a curved slide.

The top section of the tower represents an eagle's nest in which an eagle lands.

Another eye-catcher is the climbing marmot, which overlooks the lake with watchful eyes. This lovingly designed play structure can be climbed from inside and outside and offers children a place to hide – while parents can still keep an eye on them. Surrounded by edelweiss jump boards and a marmot spring device, it provides an ideal area for the youngest visitors.

In addition, two speaking tubes provide a playful communication experience – conversations across the playground are thus possible in a special way.

Around the playground, comfortable hammocks invite you to relax and enjoy the view of the impressive mountain scenery.

Decorative wooden figures of Valais Blackneck goats and Blacknose sheep add visual accents, provide additional climbing opportunities, and are also perfect as photo subjects.

The adventure park at Sunnegga also offers barbecue areas for cozy get-togethers, the wooden ball track that opened last year, a wooden raft, and exciting water features. The blend of adventure, relaxation, and nature makes the adventure park at Sunnegga a unique place for the whole family—perfect for an unforgettable family day out amidst the Zermatt mountains.
