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





Wundrig sii – Learning through discovery

"Those who are curious learn. Those who learn remain curious; they never stop learning." © Alfred Selacher (*1945), Swiss bon vivant

Curiosity vs. Indifference

Adults think in terms of results, but children learn differently; they have their own motivation to learn. Almost all children are naturally curious and willing to question things in order to find out as much as possible. As long as students ask their questions about "why," they are willing to learn. They want to experience everything and

Know how one thing relates to the other. "Curiousness" as a principle of discovery and lifelong learning is of great importance in a highly structured, digitalized, and mediatized world. Curiosity is the counterpart to indifference.


Discovery learning – a

pedagogical principle

apples," "wind," or "water" for themselves before they are subsequently discussed, practiced, and tested. Naturally curious, children want to find out as many things as possible. The famous "why" questions prompt further questions and occasionally push parents to their limits. Discovery learning uses this natural curiosity to explain the world to students step by step, making things easier to understand. The great advantage is that children and young people discover things for themselves. Learning based on their own experiences is much more deeply ingrained in their memory than when everything is simply presented and explained. Teachers and parents guide the students through the learning process, but the actual discovery lies with the children and young people themselves

Confrontation tasks

Within the framework of Curriculum 21 and competency orientation, the process model (Wilhelm, M., Luthiger, H. & Wespi, C., 2014) utilizes the principle of inquiry-based learning. Learning begins with an encounter with a problem or phenomenon (e.g., a butterfly). For example, the topic of "butterflies" begins with observing them, ideally in nature, and asking questions such as "why?", "how?", and "why is that?"



in the center. A newspaper headline can be the starting point for learning about the effects of bacteria (" People die in hospitals every day because of resistant bacteria - resistance renders the latest antibiotics ineffective.") What is the problem? Why is this so? What happens to the bacteria? Can this be

The encounter with questions of the everyday world forms the starting point for the development, practice, and transfer phases. Confrontation tasks can be applied to everything from simple phenomena to highly complex research assignments; they form the basis for "learning to learn."

Being curious – a motivation for learning

How can we determine whether a cyclist is traveling faster than the water flowing in the Vispe River? Why is milk white? How can we determine prime numbers? Curiosity is an

important driver of learning and personal development.

It motivates us to ask questions and to engage with the unknown. Curiosity is a key skill for lifelong learning and discovery. Interest is a decisive driver of our actions. With increasing age

the danger of losing some of our curiosity about the world and its phenomena. This curiosity can be nurtured by regularly allowing ourselves to have and gaining new experiences, reading and learning, and being open to new information.

"Wundrig sii" in the coming school year

In the new school year, schoolchildren, teenagers, teachers, and parents all have their own "confrontation tasks": walking to school alone, finding and exploring the classroom, being taught by a kindergarten teacher for four mornings, getting to know the new school class and many children in the "Niww Walka" (school walk), learning independently at various levels and in the regular class of the orientation school with many specialist teachers, fostering interest in career choices observing rules, getting to know lunch, meeting and working with the new school administration, recognizing letters, learning to read sentences, understanding complex texts, figuring out how to read plans, mastering digital tools, learning to play a musical instrument.



Flood events Summer 2024

The municipality of Zermatt has been intensively involved in repairing the damage caused by the floods in summer 2024 this year as well. Acceptance of all immediate measures following the 2024 events, in collaboration with specialist planners. contractors, and the cantonal authorities, was scheduled for the end of July 2025.

Here is a brief overview of completed, ongoing, and future work:

Findelbach

The work to restore the original condition (immediate measures) in the area of Moosstrasse up to the Vispa junction was completed in mid-July 2025.

The objection to the flood protection concept has been withdrawn. This means that nothing now stands in the way of the building permit for the construction of the "Bodmen" sediment retention facility. Preparations for implementation will begin immediately upon receipt of the legally binding planning approval.

Work to repair the catchment for the "Bodmen" irrigation system and raise the embankment wall in the area of the du Pont restaurant to Haus Spirit is currently underway. This work is expected to last until the end of August 2025.

In recent months, the crown of the embankment wall along Bachstrasse in the area from Triftbachstrasse to the Zum Sted bridge was renovated and a new road surface was installed.

A section of the Sunnegga Bridge was dismantled in early July 2025 to mitigate the flooding problem in this area. The removed

will probably be reassembled in late autumn to make the parking area available for the winter season.

On March 26, 2025, the State Council approved the relocation of the current bus turnaround point at Zen Stecken to "Chro-me." Therefore, the plan is to replace the existing ski bridge at the current end of the "Furi-Zermatt" ski slope and, on the other hand, to

Implementing adaptations in the area of the existing bus turnaround . This project will impact the flood situation in the Zen Stecken area.

The dossier for reducing the risk of flooding and debris flow has been submitted to the cantonal authorities for consultation. The dossier will then be submitted to the Federal Office for the Environment for a further opinion. If the opinion is also positive, the next step will be public consultation.



Station roof –

Has the opportunity been missed?

We take a look back at the results of the ballot vote on July 6, 2025. The municipal council failed to convince Zermatt's voters to approve the planned rezoning of the station roof. The question of why, which cannot be conclusively answered, remains unanswered.

Voter turnout

Voter turnout in the ballot was 42%. This indicates that 58% of eligible voters did not express their opinion on the rezoning. In numerical terms, out of 2,722 eligible voters, just under 1,600 did not vote. Why is voter turnout so low?

Affordable housing

The issue of affordable housing in the Matterhorn village is heating up emotions

and discussions have been going on for several years. It's a topic that concerns not only Zermatt—it affects the mountain regions, the cities, and our neighboring countries equally.

The construction of affordable housing on an already built-up area is a key

The aim of the settlement development is to move inwards. The local council has clearly decided in advance the Matterhorn Gotthard Railway project.

The EWG has secured 18 apartments for EWG employees in the form of a Letter of Intent – this was done in anticipation of securing living space.

Perhaps retirement apartments or assisted living facilities could also have found a place.

What should we do now?

Time is usually helpful in reviewing the situation—time to reflect. What was not understood, what were the decisive factors, where were possible mistakes made, were the facts understood, should the project be resubmitted, and the crucial question of how to proceed now. We will provide information about the next steps in due course.

Informing is also a point which the Municipal council on its list of challenges

How can we convince with factual arguments and information while taking into account the emotional and partly historical

How can we resolve concerns? How do we bring the obligation to deliver and receive, so important in communication, to a common denominator?

Zermatt has some homework to do for the future.

Decisions are pending for the next generations.

Decisions need to be carefully considered and approached with foresight. Broad support among the population is necessary for this.

And finally, we are challenged by the question "Zermatt, quo vadis?" A question that accompanies and preoccupies the inhabitants. "Zermatt, where are you going?" deserves broad discussion and support. Targeted

Surveys will help gather opinions and take them into account accordingly .

We must forge a path for the future of Zermatt together so that our Matterhorn village can continue to offer the living space that means so much to us.

However, the decision of the electorate is democratically accepted.


BVZ Holding AG focuses on further projects

With this decision, residential use on the station roof is off the table, but work on other projects in Zermatt and the Matter Valley will continue as planned.

The focus will now be on other projects, such as the Mattertal Tunnel and the implementation of the Gornergrat nature-based adventure mountain. The management and value retention of the existing properties in Zermatt, which currently comprise 76 apartments, will also be continued.

BVZ Holding AG will also continue to work towards finding solutions to the housing problem in Zermatt and will be involved in other projects in the destination.



Consciously enjoy instead of carelessly disposing of

On average, each person in Switzerland throws away 330 kilograms of food per year— a total of over 2.8 million tons. This waste affects us all.

Every day, valuable food ends up in the trash – whether at home, in stores, or in restaurants. Even in our own homes, bread, fruit, vegetables, and fresh leftovers are thrown away even though they're still edible. Every product contains water, energy, and transportation – resources that are wasted. This not only pollutes the environment, but also the climate: Around 10% of greenhouse gases worldwide are produced by food waste. And the loss is also noticeable financially: Over 600 Swiss francs per person are literally thrown away in the trash every year.

Households as the key to change

One third of avoidable food losses in the

In Switzerland, private households produce as much chocolate as 900 bars of chocolate – equivalent to about 90 kg per person. Households are therefore a key lever for reducing food waste.

Why food ends up in the trash

The reasons are varied: excessive purchases, improper storage, uncertainty about expiration dates, spontaneous menu changes, or lack of time. The temporary use of many households also plays a role in living space: Especially in vacation homes, food is often left behind upon departure and ends up unused in the trash.

Energy from what we

throw away

In 2024, Zermatt Entsorgung collected a total of 1,967 tons of kitchen waste – equivalent to 1,967,000 kilograms of organic material.

From this bio-organic waste, as well as manure and slurry from regional agriculture, electricity is produced at the Matterhorn Biogas plant in Zermatt, which supplies approximately 200 households for a year. This close connection between agriculture and organic waste forms a symbiosis: it closes the loop on resources in our region. Instead of disposing of waste, it is used as valuable raw materials – this is the circular economy in action. This way, new energy is created from what was once garbage, which sustainably supplies the village while simultaneously reducing environmental pollution.

Food and circular economy

A wonderful example is the school's annual apple campaign . Around 400 primary school students are provided with 400 kg of apples per year. The resulting waste is collected and recycled in the biogas plant. The resulting fertilizer is then spread on meadows and plantations. This closes the ecological cycle. Therefore, it is all the more important that food waste is disposed of in the biocontainers (red lids) without bioplastic bags. Because the plastic ultimately ends up in the field and eventually reused.

on your own plate. Remember not to throw food waste in the trash, as its high water content reduces the energy yield in the waste incineration plant

What can I do? Tips for everyday life – how to waste .

Shop mindfully: Plan your menu and write a shopping list . Buy fresh, local produce instead of bulking up. With the "Too Good To Go" app, you can save food from being thrown away and save money.

Store properly: Meat, fish, and dairy products belong in the coldest part of the refrigerator. Vegetables should go in the crisper drawer, and bread and bananas should be stored unrefrigerated. Wrap opened products securely or freeze.

Use leftovers creatively: Leftovers can be used to make soups, casseroles or salads.

Expired ÿ discard: Keep an eye on supplies and place products with a short shelf life at the front. The minimum

Best before isn't a throwaway date. Look, smell, taste! Trust your senses and avoid unnecessary food waste.

Pass it on instead of throwing it away: Food you no longer need doesn't have to end up in the trash— others are often happy to receive it. Simply share food with neighbors, friends, or via food-sharing platforms—or start your own swap group.





Furi remains Furi – also with a view to the future

The municipality of Zermatt is revising its town planning. The municipal council also wants to provide more housing for the population.

The municipal spatial concept therefore envisions Furi as a future settlement center with increased development. Furi is intended to retain its current character and develop an organically growing and vibrant settlement structure in the future. However, current zoning regulations, building regulations, and limited access do not currently permit this development and no longer meet today's requirements for contemporary living – they therefore need to be adapted.

The central question was: How can the Furi area continue to develop so that it remains compatible with the area, sustainable and livable for locals?

Study Commission

To provide a thorough answer to the above question, the municipality of Zermatt launched a study commission in 2023/24. Four interdisciplinary teams – consisting of architects and landscape architects – developed visions for the possible future development of Furi. A broadly based evaluation committee comprising representatives from the municipality and the canton, as well as experts from architecture, landscape architecture, and local and transport planning evaluated the submissions.

The contribution of the team "Atelier Summermatter Ritz with Büro + and Vogt Landschaftsarchitekten" was unanimously convincing: A clear structure with graduated density, careful integration into the topography, and realistic implementation regulations were crucial. The focus was on strengthening the area as an independent, high- quality ensemble.

Further development of the winning project

The winning project was further developed into a benchmark project. A set of rules was also developed that describes the basic structural forms, materialization, open space concept, mobility, and use. The goal is to preserve the identity of the Furi area while simultaneously creating space for contemporary housing for locals. In particular, the definition of a hamlet core, the concentration of density within the center, and the reduction of buildings as a transition to the landscape were further refined.

Inclusion of landowners


A participation event with the Furi landowners will be held at the beginning of September 2025. Development ideas, the indicative project, and the regulations will be presented and discussed. The landowners' concerns will be received and submitted for review and possible adjustments.

Presentation of the Furi study commission


On October 2, 2025, the municipality invites the entire Zermatt population to a presentation of the study's results and their further development. The results will be presented in the Triftbachhalle from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Models, plans, and visualizations will provide insight into the development ideas.

The focus is not only on information, but also on dialogue: Feedback from the public will be recorded and, where possible, taken into account in the further development of the local planning process. The goal is to ensure that the Furi area can be further developed in a familiar way that fits well with Zermatt.

"Giuseppe is a chef with heart and soul. Even after all these years, he enjoys being in the kitchen," says Tamara. The menu is small but exquisite: homemade pasta, seasonal daily specials, and, of course, Swiss classics like Rösti or, in winter,

Cheese fondue. "We prefer to offer less, but fresh and to perfection." Regionality and quality are our top priority.

The dual role of host to restaurant and hotel guests is demanding: "Flexibility is key, also for the team. We are currently building up our team step by step because we want to achieve the same level of quality that was known under our predecessors."

The friendly couple recently took over the Blue Lounge at Blauherd and brought with them a noticeably new energy.

Nadine, a Zermatt native with extensive mountain experience, and Pascal, who ran a bar in Switzerland for eleven years, made a conscious decision to take this step: "We wanted to build something together where we would enjoy going every day." The culinary concept is deliberately uncomplicated. "We focus on simple, honest cuisine. Our aperitif platters, the pinsa (pina), the finest burgers, or a good glass of wine on the terrace are often enough to make our guests happy."

Despite the relaxed atmosphere, the two place great value on professionalism. A strong team spirit is central. "Only when we enjoy working here as a team can our guests feel it, too." The atmosphere is honest, direct, and warm. "When a guest tells us they feel at home with us, that's the greatest compliment for us."

And what does the offer look like for locals? "There are many ideas – but in general, it is particularly important to us that the locals feel truly at home with us. We are always happy when they find their way to us, and we are happy to show our generosity." The view, the ambiance, and the hospitality make the Blue

Lounge is a real insider tip, even for locals.

Pascal sums it up: "Deliver instead of blather. Good things take time." But anyone who has ever been here immediately senses: The two are well on their way to achieving just that.

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Matterhorn Gotthard Railway

Barrier-free through the Mattertal: For access without borders

The Matterhorn Gotthard Railway (MGBahn) is investing extensively in the accessibility of its stations.

The background to this is the Disability Equality Act (BehiG), which aims to provide everyone with access to public transport. The renovations are also progressing in the Matter Valley - with a clear timetable, but also major challenges.

Equal access for all. That is the goal of the Disabled Persons Act (BehiG), which has been in force since 2004. It obliges transport companies to adapt their infrastructure so that people with disabilities can use it independently and without assistance . MGBahn embraces this responsibility and has been working for several years on remodeling its stations.

tions. Of a total of 43 stations on the 144- kilometer-long MGBahn network, 31 have already been successfully adapted - with raised platform platforms, ramps, tactile guidance systems (elements such as guide strips, knobs, or grooves that can be felt with the feet or a cane, thus enabling safe movement), and new information systems.

Renovations in the Mattertal: three stations in focus

In the Matter Valley, the stations St. Niklaus, Herbriggen and Randa do not yet meet the requirements of the BehiG. The project dossiers for the reconstruction of these three stations are available and are currently with the Federal Office of Transport (BAV) and are undergoing the complex and time-consuming approval process.

Planning approval for the Randa station is expected first in 2026. After that, the work can be put out to tender and construction can begin. According to current planning, the work in Randa will extend over the years 2027/28.

The project for the St. Niklaus station was made public last spring. Thanks to careful planning and the involvement of the stakeholders, especially the municipality, no objections were received . Planning approval is expected in 2027, allowing work to begin in 2028/29. The dossier for the Herbriggen station is currently undergoing preliminary review by the Federal Office of Transport (BAV). Feedback from the BAV is expected later this year. Based on the results of this preliminary review, the final dossier will then be prepared and submitted to the BAV for approval. Construction of the Herbriggen station is not expected to begin until 2029.

The implementation schedule is ambitious and tightly timed. The work will be carried out in stages, coordinated with timetables, seasonal conditions, and technical feasibility. To minimize disruption to passengers, the majority of the work will be carried out underpasses.

The line between Visp and Täsch will only be closed to rail traffic for work that absolutely requires an interruption, and a rail replacement service will be organized. Due to the lower frequencies, this is planned for the autumn, as in previous years . In addition to the station reconstruction, several maintenance projects are running in parallel, such as the renovation of engineering structures and road renewals in the Matter Valley, to ensure long-term safety and availability. Where possible, synergies with the Canton of Valais will be utilized.



«One month to go» until the big Bike highlight in Zermatt

The UCI Mountain Bike World Championships are just around the corner. The anticipation of top-class biking right on Zermatt's doorstep is growing with each passing day.

The Matterhorn Village will host the Short Track discipline on September 8th and 9th. An exciting supporting program for visitors and locals alike has been developed over the past few months around the two training and race days. Be there!



The Cross-Country Short Track is a spectacular race format with short, spectacular overtaking maneuvers, intense climbs, high speeds, technical sections, and explosive sprints – ideal for spectators and TV cameras. However, the discipline is clearly different from the downhill-oriented enduro scene and can be classified as a "gentle" version of mountain biking, where physical ability takes precedence over technical riding skills.

World Championships are held in four categories (Elite Men, Elite Women, U23 Men, U23 Women). Each race lasts approximately 20 minutes, so multiple laps are completed, which noticeably enhances the spectator experience. The circuit in Zermatt has a circumference of 1.3 kilometers and approximately 70 meters of elevation gain. Appropriate training opportunities are held before the races, and a qualifying round may take place on Monday

Approximately 2,000 to 3,000 spectators are expected at the site each day. The event will be located within walking distance of the village in the "Zen Stecken" area (see visualization) and will take place almost exclusively on existing paths to program The races will take place on the Zen Stecken site, around the Zermatt power plant and the Tradition Julen stables, with appropriate infrastructure and a spectator area. The few structural changes will be dismantled immediately after the races.

Zermatt in the showcase of Swiss television

With the Bike World Championships, the Canton of Valais aims to strengthen the mountain bike value chain and promote mountain biking at various levels. This includes the route network, events, youth development, advertising, coordination, accommodation, shops, clubs, schools, bookable offers, and transport companies.

Zermatt also sees the Bike World Championships as an opportunity to further strengthen the positioning of the bike segment and, above all, to use the event for its own communications purposes. Up to 20 media Artists and athletes from over 30 nations are expected to attend the major event in the Matterhorn village.

In addition to three disciplines, the elite races in Zermatt will be broadcast live on Swiss television, thus broadcasting the Matterhorn and the region to the whole world.


The Bike World Championships in Zermatt are operationally organized by a local organizing committee, which is composed primarily of experts from

External expertise is also called upon for specific requirements. For example, in the area of "Race Operations," the two experienced crosscountry specialists Philipp Waldis and Andy Wirth from Lenzerheide were hired. The two professionals are responsible for the sporting events and race schedule and have extensive experience in organizing World Championships and World Cup races in the Short Track discipline.

The Mountain Bike World Championships in Zermatt are also intended to be an event where the local biking community and the village population in general can meet. A rich supporting program (see box on page 23) will accompany the races, including culinary delights from various Zermatt partners, musical entertainment, a DJ, an autograph session, a public tour of the course, a bike show, and several other activities.

The countdown has begun! Zermatt plans to





A further step toward digitalization and user-friendliness.







In recent months, comprehensive tests have been conducted on the functionality, usability, and user experience of the smartphone ticket. Selected test groups moved around the resort exclusively with the digital ticket and provided feedback via an online form. Various sources of error were identified and gradually resolved. In close collaboration with Skidata, the system has been continuously optimized to ensure stable and user-friendly operation. The digital ticket requires neither mobile data nor a constant internet connection — it even works in airplane mode as long as Bluetooth and GPS are active. The additional battery consumption for modern devices is around 10% per day, depending on the model.





Introduction starts in summer – expansion follows

Over the next few weeks, the smartphone ticket will be introduced in the Zermatt area for activities such as summer skiing, biking, and single rides. The smartphone ticket can also be used for season and annual passes , but this new ticket type initially only works in the Zermatt area. Cervino SpA plans to replace its access readers for the 2025/26 winter season , enabling a seamless digital user experience throughout the Matterhorn Ski Paradise. A simple, convenient, and future-oriented solution for all winter sports and mountain enthusiasts, developed and implemented in constructive cooperation between the three service partners: Zermatt Bergbahnen, Zermatt Tourism, and the Matterhorn Gotthard Bahn / Gornergrat Railway.



How the smartphone ticket works

The smartphone ticket can be conveniently purchased online or at one of the sales points in Zermatt. Before first use, the digital ticket is scanned into the Matterhorn app and activated at the touch of a button on the day of use. Thanks to Bluetooth Low Energy, the smartphone communicates directly with the access gate and opens it without having to remove the smartphone from your pocket. This new type of ticket thus offers the full functionality of a KeyCard.





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History of Zermatt

Approved without discussion The high mountain railway to the summit of the Matterhorn



The Matterhorn project is deemed "good" and approved.

On August 22, 1890, Federal Councillor Emil Welti, head of the Postal and Railway Department, received explosive mail: "Application for a concession for the construction of the Zermatt high mountain railways to the Gornergrat and the Matterhorn." was the title of the submission.

Less than two years later, the way was clear for what was arguably the world's most spectacular railway project. The National Council and the Council of States approved the construction project in 1892, without discussion and in a fast-track procedure. In the last quarter of the 19th century, engineers, entrepreneurs, and speculators competed with each other with sensational concession requests.

Envy fueled

Switzerland was gripped by mountain railway fever during the Belle Époque. Each of these construction projects stoked envy in other regions. And because competitors in nearby Savoy were coming up with plans to build a Mont Blanc railway, the Jungfrau and Matterhorn projects received political support. The Matterhorn Railway was even supposed to bring the final triumph of technology over nature, with a terminal station at 4,478 meters, the highest mountain railway station in the world.

Advertising with superlatives


"A railway to the Matterhorn would be a first-class attraction for all of Switzerland!" The Zermatt High Mountain Railways' concession application was full of superlatives: "The sensational panoramic view from the Matterhorn is of moving grandeur." Parallel to the Matterhorn project, the initiators favored a project titled "Zer-


matter high mountain railways», the development of the Gornergrat in a first stage.


Engineer Xaver Imfeld and co-concessionaire Leo Heer-Bétrix praised the "platform" at the summit of Zermatt's landmark as a near-perfect summit station. The buildings were deliberately kept at ground level so as not to visually detract from the striking summit. The gigantic "Matterhorn High Mountain Railway" project was to be completed in just two four-year periods.

"This time will be absolutely necessary for the construction of the large shaft at the Matterhorn (railway tunnel) and the construction of the cable car through it. Meanwhile, the connecting lines to Moos and Zum See will be built in the first year, the cable cars to Riffelalp and Schafberg in the second, and the cog railways to Gornergrat and Whympershütte in the third. These lines will be gradually put into operation, with the Matterhorn cable car connecting after the fourth year of construction."

Whatsapp channels as new Tool for internal destination communication

Zermatt Tourism is tasked with providing the destination's permanent residents and service partners with information via internal channels, both on a daily basis and during extraordinary events, so that they can orient themselves and organize themselves accordingly. A significant adjustment is now underway.

Until now, subscribers have had an internal Newsletter in text form with information such as street closures, updates on cable cars and lifts, room searches, calls for participation, etc., or have been informed of extraordinary events via SMS service.

Zermatt Tourism regularly reviews its communication tools and adapts them to the current situation. In this process, those responsible are ultimately

It has become apparent that some tools are no longer up to date or have become too prone to failure - especially in the case of extraordinary events. Therefore, Zermatt Tourism is reorganizing its destination communications and, after careful review, is able to present a new solution .

From September 1, 2025, internal destination communication, both on a daily basis and in the event of extraordinary events, will be ensured via the WhatsApp messenger service in the form of channels.

Why WhatsApp?

Whatsapp is widely used among the population and guarantees broad distribution.

- · Whatsapp messages can be easily forwarded and shared.
- · Whatsapp allows you to no longer distribute information exclusively via text, but to enrich it with images, videos, voice messages or further links, thus providing more meaningful and efficient information
- · Whatsapp is free.
- · Whatsapp proved its worth last Easter weekend, with heavy snowfall and power outages.

The feedback from this ad hoc communication was exceptionally good.

To ensure that the information reaches the recipients in an orderly manner, Zermatt Tourism has opted for the following two channels:

Quick guide to subscribing:

- 1 Scan the QR code
- 2. Press «Follow channel»
- 3. Top right, the notifications via bell on mute or unmute

Attention: When subscribing to a channel for the first time, notifications must be activated so that new messages can be received via push

The individual channels are displayed in the WhatsApp app in the "News" grid at the bottom left in the "Channels" section. The public is responsible for ensuring that the channels are configured so that the desired information is available.

also arrive. Furthermore, the link to the channel (top left next to the notification bell) can be easily shared and disseminated with just one

These two WhatsApp channels are a one-way communication between the five major service partners: Zermatt Tourism, Zermatt Bergbahnen AG, Gornergrat Bahn, Matterhorn Gotthard Bahn, the local community, and the local community. Subscribers cannot write in these channels, but can react to individual content using emojis.

Both WhatsApp channels can now be subscribed to via the respective QR code and are mandatory starting September 1st . The old channels will no longer be served from this date. Zermatt Tourism will again draw attention to this with various reminders on various channels throughout August . Starting August 11th, communication will run for three weeks in parallel via existing channels and simultaneously via the two WhatsApp channels Matterhorn Info and Matterhorn Alert.

Effective September 1, the Zermatt Tourism newsletter (internal reporting), the hazard app, and the SMS service will be discontinued. What will, of course, remain for information within the destination: the current and proven village newspaper, Zermatt Inside.

The two newly introduced channels will be subjected to a detailed analysis after at least six months. Zermatt Tourism reserves the right, in consultation with its

service partners, to adjust the WhatsApp channel structure from this point onward if the information obtained requires it. The public will, of course, be informed accordingly.
