- c. Russia's two influential political parties, the Union of Right Forces and the Liberal Yabloko Movement, agreed To unite their organizations into a strong right-wing coalition. They propose to have a common list of candidate the next parliamentary elections.
- d. The finance ministers of various states in Nigeria got together and demanded that the federal government declare its source of income. They also wanted to know the formula by which the revenue is distributed various state governments.

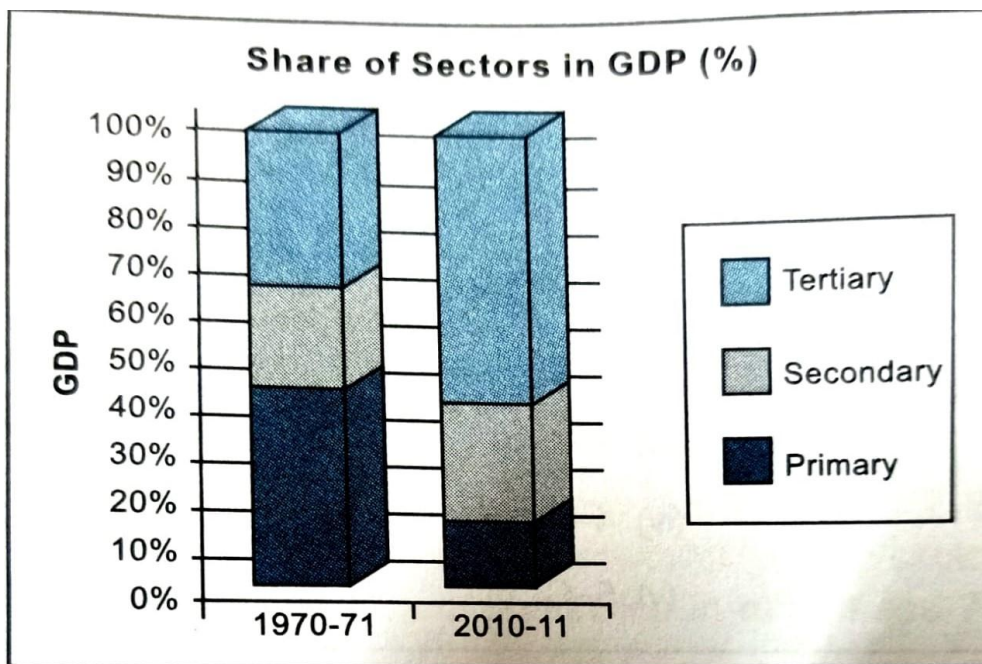

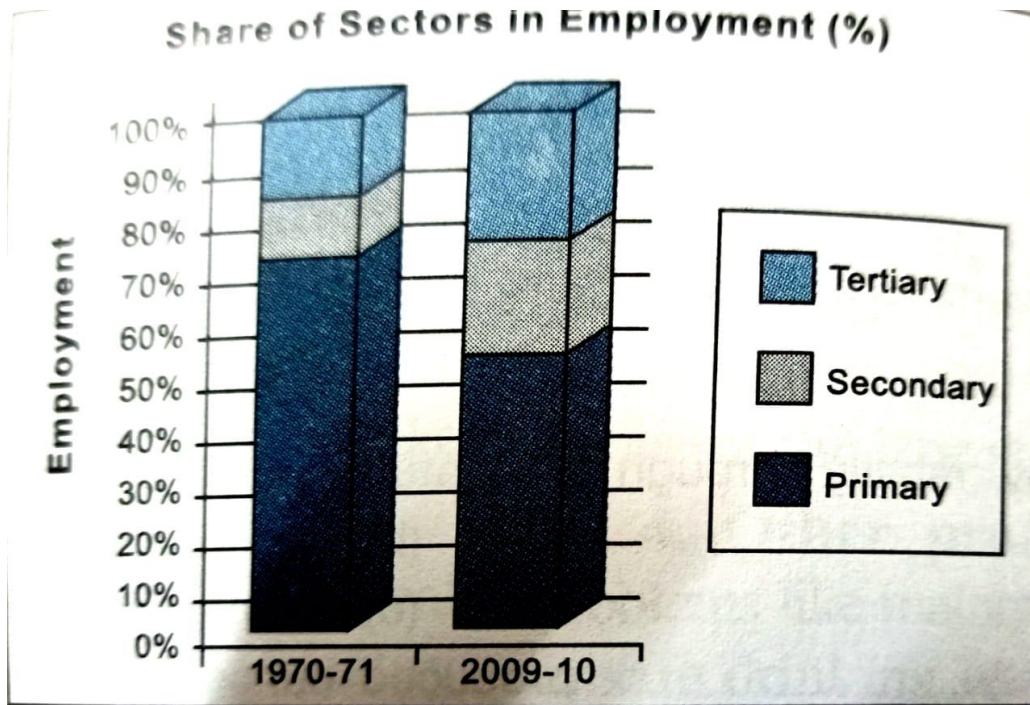
